### 10 REGIONAL PROJECTS

Since 2002, Serbia has benefited from the Council of Europe's co-operation programmes.

Working closely in collaboration with Serbian authorities, the Council of Europe has provided support to important reform initiatives across various key domains. These include strengthening the independence and the capacity of judiciary, promotion of equality and non-discrimination, penitentiary reforms, freedom of expression and of the media, education, combating trafficking of human beings and measures aimed at preventing economic crime. Serbia also plays an active role in the regional programmes of the Council of Europe addressing key areas such as Roma empowerment, fight against cybercrime, and human rights education (HELP).

# **KEY ACHIEVEMENTS**

### Reform of the judiciary for better justice

More independent judiciary and autonomous public prosecution thanks to constitutional and legal amendments aligned with the Venice Commission opinions. Upgraded mechanisms for the protection from undue influence based on best Council of Europe practices.

**Improved national implementation of the European Convention on Human Rights** through enhanced judicial dialogue between the European Court of Human Rights and national courts and support to execution of the European Court of Human Rights judgments.

### Prevention of money laundering and terrorist financing in Serbia

Comprehensive National Risk Assessment of money laundering and terrorism financing established, as well as the sectorial risk assessments in areas of virtual assets and real estate.

# **KEY ACHIEVEMENTS**

#### Upgraded measures to prevent and combat trafficking in human beings

Improved identification of and assistance to human trafficking victims. Higher awareness of labour and child trafficking.

### Better and widespread education for democracy

The Reference Framework of Competences for Democratic Culture (RFCDC) was included as integral part of Education Strategy 2030 and connected with ten curricular subjects in unique Guidelines distributed to 1 800 schools.

### Enhanced institutional protection of freedom of expression

Freedom of expression enhanced in the judiciary, police and media regulatory authority, and policy formulation on addressing disinformation and journalist safety developed.

### Improved social inclusion of Roma

The Roma population empowered to make decisions and implement positive changes trough smallscale community initiatives. The trust and co-operation between Roma and relevant institutions at the local level improved.

### Improved treatment of persons deprived of their liberty

Enhanced capacity of the police to adopt human rights-based approaches to policing and prevention of ill-treatment. Improved resocialisation of prisoners with emphasis on vulnerable groups (juveniles, women, and persons with mental health problems).
