# Handbook on the protection of children against sexual exploitation and sexual abuse in crisis and emergency situations

**The event is organised within** the Council of Europe's project on <u>Preventing and protecting children</u> <u>from violence including in the digital environment in the Republic of Moldova</u>. It contributes towards achieving the Project's intermediate outcome 1 "Law enforcement and the judicial sector effectively investigate and prosecute child sexual abuse cases in a child-friendly manner and according to European standards".

In 2022, the Council of Europe and ECPAT International joined forces to prepare Country Overviews covering the states Parties to the Council of Europe Convention on the Protection of Children against Sexual Exploitation and Sexual Abuse ("Lanzarote Convention"). The Country Overviews are prepared in close collaboration with the national authorities and are based on the information submitted through the <u>General Overview Questionnaire</u>, the recommendations adopted by the <u>Lanzarote Committee</u> in its <u>monitoring rounds</u> and additional desk-based research to take into account the progress recently made. The document on the Republic of Moldova is the second in the series of the Country Overviews to be published this year.

ECPAT International is a global network of more than 124 civil society organisations, in more than 100 countries, working towards the vision of ending the sexual exploitation of children. With over 30 years of experience in engaging and managing multi-stakeholder processes and partnerships at the national, regional and global levels, ECPAT works to end the sexual exploitation of children.
