social inclusion of refugees through youth work **AIMS AND OBJECTIVES**

YOUTH.TOGETHER seeks to reduce the risks of social exclusion and violence that young refugees, especially minors in transition to adulthood, are exposed to. It supports the social inclusion of young refugees and their access to education, self-development and autonomy through youth work and non-formal education activities. The centre-piece of YOUTH.TOGETHER is a long-term training course (LTTC) for youth workers, young refugees and social workers/educators active in reception and hosting centres for minors, or other social and educational facilities for, or involving, young refugees, especially those in transition to adulthood.

Objectives of the LTTC

- 1. To support the social inclusion of young refugees and their communities, based on approaches and practices of intercultural learning and human rights education as applied in youth work projects
- 2. To combat misconceptions and discrimination against refugees and asylum seekers while fostering a deeper understanding of the causes, context and experiences common to many people who are forced to flee their home country
- 3. To address shortcomings in the protection and access to rights of young refugees in key areas across Europe, including reception centres, educational and placement institutions
- 4. To support and enhance the quality and visibility of youth work projects and interventions in support of the social inclusion and integration of young refugees, with a specific attention to projects involving migrants and refugees in transition to adulthood
- 5. To apply and disseminate youth policy measures and work practices in support of the migrants and refugees in transition to adulthood, based on the Council of Europe recommendation for the protection of this specific vulnerable group of young people
- 6. To support the emergence and development of refugee-led youth organisations and projects and the participation of refugees in mainstream youth organisations, including national youth councils
- 7. To support the implementation of the Council of Europe Action Plan on protecting refugee and migrant children through youth policy and youth work.

About the introductory seminar

The first residential seminar will take place from 25 November to 2 December 2018 at the European Youth Centre in Strasbourg and will bring together 35 participants. The seminar is prepared and organised so as to address the following objectives:

- 1. To identify challenges and needs for social inclusion of young refugees in the local contexts of the participants;
- 2. To introduce key concepts and practices of human rights education in projects with young refugees;
- 3. To introduce the institutional and normative instruments of the Council of Europe related to social inclusion of young people in projects with refugees;
- 4. To develop a common understanding of the role and value of youth work for social inclusion of young refugees;
- 5. To support participants in planning and developing local projects for social inclusion of young refugees based on the principles of youth participation, social inclusion, intercultural learning and human rights education;
- 6. To clarify the educational, political and institutional nature of YOUTH.TOGETHER and the long-term training course as an important part of it;
- 7. To establish a foundation for cooperation among the participants based on understanding and respect of equal dignity and diversity of participants;
- 8. To support, prepare and review participants' individual learning needs, expectations and objectives related to their role and projects.
