

The 3rd Winter Academy (2025) features two parallel courses, and participants can sign up to one of them. The event also includes study visits and shared training activities between the two groups.

Imprisonment and Restorative Justice

Delivered by trainers Dr Bart Claes and Roberto Moreno this course offers a profound exploration of how restorative justice approaches can be used when one of the parties is in prison. It is designed to prepare professionals to work restoratively with the victim, the prisoner, his/her social network (like family, partner, children), and local community. The course is informed by the most-up-to-date research and practice in the experience of people participating in restorative justice.

Basic Restorative Training Skills

This course, developed by the EFRJ's Training Committee, equips participants with essential training skills for various settings. The coruse will be faciliated by Tom Mellor and Gael Cochran and it is aligned with the principles stipulated in the forthcoming EFRJ Standards for Training Courses document. The EFRJ encourages everyone interested in delivering training to complete this course.
