EDUCATION

Drs Harry Rogge MA owns a Master Degree in Human Geography from the University of Amsterdam. Next to that he owns a Bachelor Degree in English Language and Literature.

CAREER

With retirement in 2018 Harry concluded a vivid career of forty years in secondary education in The Netherlands. The first period of 25 years he was a motivated high school teacher of geography as part of the social sciences. Developing many extra-curricular activities in the field of the arts and internationalization. During the second part of his career Harry was a dedicated high school head. These 15 years, because of his expertise in educational innovation and internationalization, were not confined to one school only. With a dedicated team he "built" two innovative high schools and "from within" he inspired his team of teachers as well as his students to results of which "the sky is the limit". Next to school management with focus on innovation in the learning process he combined this with other positions. He was Director of the Centre for the Promotion of Languages and Director of North American Programs (a Dutch exchange program for educators and students with the USA and Canada). More than twenty years ago Harry joined the European Association of Geographers where he now functions as Vice President. Since 2009 part of his work is dedicated to the INGO Conference of the Council of Europe. Within its Standing Committee he was Vice Chair of the Education and Culture Committee from 2011-2014.

ACTIVITIES

In The Netherlands Harry is still involved in education through film as part of "Netwerk Filmeducatie".

Within the INGO Conference Harry is currently involved, together with Dutch delegates, to make the connection with the national parliamentarians delegated to the Parliamentary Assembly and Dutch delegates to the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities. Activities currently inhibited by covid regulations. Furthermore, Harry is ambassador for Education for All Morocco where young girls in the High Atlas get full chances for secondary and higher education. As projectgroup member Harry is currently involved in the European programs "Digi-Path" and "Smart Villages". Both stimulating vulnerable groups within civil society that need strong support. As project coordinator Harry is involved in "Focus on Future Skills" an international educational media project that focusses on young adult refugees in Europe. The latter initiative he developed after visiting the Moria refugees settlement on Lesbos, Greece in February 2020.
