CALL FOR SPONSORSHIP PROPOSALS IN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE EURIMAGES GENDER EQUALITY STRATEGY

1. Background of the Call for Proposals

In 2018, Eurimages commissioned an external evaluation of its activities and operations over a five-year cycle (2013-2017) so that its future operation would be based on good management and governance practices. In October 2019, the Eurimages Board of Management decided to implement a series of concrete measures based both on the evaluators' recommendations and the proposals of a Study Group composed of representatives of the member States. Several of these measures concern the Gender Equality strategy and its various activities.

The Board of Management has adopted measures to ensure that only initiatives that are relevant and likely to meet the Fund's quality standards and values are supported. In order to structure the activities, it was decided to proceed with a call for sponsorship proposals.

These specifications set out the terms and conditions of the call for sponsorship proposals in the framework of the Eurimages gender equality strategy 2021-2023.

2. Description of the Fund

Eurimages is the Council of Europe's Fund for co-operation in the field of filmmaking.

a) *The Council of Europe*

The Council of Europe has played a pioneering role in the process of European integration. It was founded in 1949, in the aftermath of the Second World War, to ensure the political reconstruction of Europe based on a number of fundamental values. The Council of Europe works with its 46 member States to **strengthen human rights, democracy and the rule of law** throughout the continent of Europe and beyond. It has devised an effective system for the protection of rights, of which one the best-known bodies is the European Court of Human Rights. The Court was established by the European Convention on Human Rights, which has been ratified by all member states of the Council of Europe.

The Council of Europe advocates freedom of expression and of the media, freedom of assembly, equality, and the protection of minorities. It has launched campaigns on issues such as child protection, online hate speech, and the rights of the Roma, Europe's largest minority. The Council of Europe helps member States fight corruption and terrorism and undertake necessary judicial reforms. Its group of constitutional experts, known as the Venice Commission, offers legal advice to countries throughout the world.

The Council of Europe promotes human rights through international conventions, such as the Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence against Women and Domestic Violence and the Convention on Cybercrime. It monitors member States' progress in these areas and makes recommendations through independent expert monitoring bodies. The work of the Council of Europe may therefore take a variety of forms such as the drafting and signature of international conventions, recommendations or guidelines, monitoring and evaluation mechanisms or partial agreements on specific subjects (for example the Eurimages Fund).

b) *The Eurimages Fund*

Eurimages is an enlarged partial agreement of the Council of Europe founded in 1988. An enlarged partial agreement is a particular form of co-operation within the Organisation. It authorises certain member States of the Council of Europe, and non-member States, to participate in activities without requiring that the other member States do so too. From a statutory point of view, a partial agreement remains an activity of the Organisation in the same way as other activities, but it has its own budget and working methods. The “associate member State” status is attributed for at least 4 years to non-member States of the Council of Europe upon their accession to Eurimages.

Eurimages currently numbers 39 member States: Albania, Armenia, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Montenegro, Netherlands, Norway, North Macedonia, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Türkiye and Ukraine.

The Board of Management, made up of representatives of each member State, sets out the Fund's policy and the conditions on which it awards financial support. It supervises the management of the Fund.

Eurimages currently numbers 39 full member States¹: Albania, Armenia, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Montenegro, Netherlands, Norway, North Macedonia, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Türkiye and Ukraine.

Eurimages has a total provisional annual budget of about €26 million coming essentially from contributions from member States. The Fund has its own revenues, primarily repayments of the support granted (in the form of advances against revenues) and bank interest, but these revenues remain relatively low.

80% of the Fund's resources are devoted to co-production support.

c) *Values and missions of the Eurimages Fund*

As an entity of the Council of Europe, the Eurimages Fund organises its activities based on the following fundamental values:

- freedom of artistic expression
- cultural diversity and co-operation
- equality, diversity, inclusion, and pluralism
- fostering creativity and nurturing talent
- sustainability
- transparency and neutrality
- adaptability.

A cultural Fund of the Council of Europe, Eurimages aims to enhance co-operation for the purpose of stimulating high quality film and audiovisual production as an important means of promoting independent cinematography and cultural exchanges within Europe and beyond, thus contributing to more inclusive and peaceful societies.

Its mission is fostering co-production and circulation of independent, diverse and original filmmaking of quality and encouraging co-operation contributing to a common film heritage, whilst taking into account gender equality, diversity, inclusion and environmental protection.

¹ Countries non-members of the Council of Europe may, under certain conditions, become associate members of Eurimages and subsequently full members. As of March 2023, Eurimages has no associate members as all current member States are full members.

d) *Eurimages activities*

i. Co-production support programme

This is the main activity of the Fund. The programme is open to independent producers from the member States applying for co-production support. This support takes the form either of a loan repayable from the revenue generated by the film or a subsidy.

Eurimages funds fiction, documentary and animation features, which are of no less than 70 minutes duration and are destined for cinema release. The amount awarded can be up to €500,000 but is in all cases capped at 17% of the total production budget of fiction or animation films or 25% in the case of documentary features and films directed by women. Projects submitted for selection must involve producers from at least two Eurimages member States and have confirmed finance at a level of at least 50% in each of the co-producing countries on the date of the application. Finally, Eurimages is involved in the end stages of the financing process, as films must be ready for shooting within one year of the support decision.

ii. Promotion programme

Eurimages Lab Projects Awards

In 2016, Eurimages partnered with four European festivals (Karlovy Vary International Film Festival, Norwegian International Haugesund Film Festival, Thessaloniki International Film Festival and the European Film Festival of Les Arcs) to set up the Eurimages "Lab Projects" Awards for innovative projects exploring new forms of expression. The prizes of €50,000 each were awarded as part of the festivals' "Works in Progress" initiatives to assist films produced outside the traditional framework, both from the point of view of dramaturgy and methods of production. This was a concrete demonstration of the Fund's willingness to invest in new forms of cinematographic expression (often at the crossroads of different artistic forms) and to play an active role in the renewal of film in the member States.

This programme was suspended in on 1st January 2021 and the Fund launched an independent study on the relevance and modalities of support for non-conventional cinematographic projects.

A call for proposals will be launched at the same time as this one in order to select the Initiatives (festivals/markets/labs) that will host the Eurimages New Lab Awards for the period 2024-2026.

Eurimages Co-production Development Awards

These awards were created to promote the Fund's role in encouraging cinematographic co-production from the initial stages of a project. Until the end of 2020, the Fund presented the Eurimages Co-production Development Awards - €20,000 each for fiction films and €15,000 for documentaries - in the framework of ten co-production markets: Cinemart (International Film Festival Rotterdam), Cinelink (Sarajevo Film Festival), MIA: Cinema Co-Production Market (MIA Market), Berlinale Co-production Market (Berlin International Film Festival), CPH:Forum (CPH:DOX Copenhagen International Documentary Film Festival), Baltic Event (Tallinn Black Nights Film Festival), Cinekid (Amsterdam), Cartoon Movie, Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum (San Sebastian International Film Festival) and Transilvania Pitch Stop (Transilvania International Film Festival). In order to improve the impact of these awards, a decision was taken in 2019 to issue a call for proposals to select co-production markets capable of hosting such awards and of ensuring their conformity with the Fund's overall strategy as decided by the Board of Management.

Following the call for proposals launched in May 2020, it was decided that the Eurimages Co-production Development Awards would be presented in the co-production markets of CineMart in Rotterdam (NL), Berlinale (DE), Cartoon Movie (FR), CPH:DOX (DK), Cinekid for Professionals (NL) and TorinoFilmLab (IT) in 2021-2023.

A call for proposals will be launched at the same time as this one in order to select the co-production markets that will host the Eurimages Co-production Development Awards for the period 2024-2026.

Other initiatives

As part of the European Film Awards ceremony, and with the aim of promoting the Eurimages "brand", the Eurimages Co-production Award is awarded each year to a producer from a member State for his/her outstanding contribution to cinema through co-production. Eurimages also offers sponsorship and patronage to selected film-related events taking place in the Fund's member States. This activity aims to promote the Fund through partnerships with initiatives likely to share its objectives and willing to highlight them. Furthermore, among the activities aimed at promoting the Eurimages Fund, a distinction is made between sponsorship of receptions and events taking place within the framework of film events and patronage of film events without any financial participation from the Fund. Following a call for proposals launched in 2020, the Eurimages Fund has signed a sponsorship agreement with 9 initiatives for the period 2021-2023. These are listed on the [Eurimages website](#).

A call for proposals will be launched at the same time as this one in order to select sponsorship proposals made by international festivals or organisations and likely to contribute to the promotion of the Eurimages Fund for the period 2024-2026.

iii. Exhibition support programme

The objective of this programme is to increase the programming of European or member State films in cinemas established in Eurimages member countries not covered by the Creative Europe – MEDIA programme of the European Union. In 2022, the countries involved were Armenia, Canada, Georgia, Switzerland and Türkiye.

This programme encourages diversity in the screening of these films and has made it possible to develop a network of cinemas in collaboration with Europa Cinemas.

iv. Sustainability Strategy

Eurimages acknowledges its accountability towards future generations regarding sustainable development, bearing in mind the undeniable environmental impact of international co-productions. Eurimages also believes that international cooperation is a key element in answering the challenges of climate change, hence engaging its responsibility as a platform to encourage the greening of the film industry in its member States. At its meeting in November 2022, the Eurimages Board of Management decided to implement three measures in favour of sustainable co-productions among which an additional selection criterion concerning the existence of measures implemented to reduce the environmental impact of the co-production project and the creation of three Eurimages Green Co-production Awards.

A call for proposals will be launched at the same time as this one in order to select the festivals, markets and events which will host these awards in 2024.

v. Gender equality and Diversity & Inclusion strategies

Through its Gender equality strategy, Eurimages affirms its willingness to participate actively in the reduction of gender inequalities in the film industry and to promote the role of women in front of and behind the camera. This involves actions within the Fund but also externally, such as encouraging other film funds at national or regional level to take this dimension into account. This work programme is based on three strategic objectives:

- Propose an approach to gender equality at the heart of all policies or measures, take this dimension into account in all processes, including financial processes and in the allocation of support;
- Combat gender stereotypes and sexism in the representation of women on screen by raising awareness in cinema professionals of this problem;
- Prevent and combat violence against women by drawing attention to the fact that showing degrading images of women can encourage violence and by developing respect for their dignity.

On 1st July 2022, the Eurimages Board of Management reinforced its commitment to diversity and inclusion by adopting its [first strategy for diversity and inclusion in the European film industry covering the period 2022-2024](#).

The purpose of this call is to select, for the year 2024 and with the possibility of renewal, sponsorship proposals to receive a financial contribution from the Eurimages Fund as part of its gender equality strategy.

vi. Convention on cinematographic co-production

On 30 January 2017, the Council of Europe Convention on Cinematographic Co-production (revised), which updates the provisions of the 1992 European Convention on Cinematographic Co-production to reflect the profound changes in the film industry, was opened for signature. The Convention specifies that the Board of Management of the Eurimages Fund is responsible for monitoring the Convention, notably to promote its effective implementation. When the Board of Management performs this task, it meets in a composition enlarged to include representatives of Parties to the Convention not members of Eurimages.

3. Description of current sponsorship and patronage activities of the Eurimages Fund in the framework of the gender equality strategy

Eurimages receives regular requests, which take various forms, for the financial support of projects, initiatives and events aimed at promoting gender equality and international co-operation within the film industry in exchange for high visibility for the Fund in the activity. Sponsored activities have included events, promotional activities and training programmes with a focus on female filmmakers. As part of its Gender Equality Action Plan 2021-2023, Eurimages has funded six projects: Pop Up Film Residency, Europe! Voices of Women in Film at Sidney Film Festival (EFP), The Purple Meridians, Berlin Nipkow Residency for Female Empowerment in the Film Industry, Sisterhood of Young Animation Auteurs, and Step In at Locarno Film Festival. The aim of this action was to encourage female filmmakers in their ongoing careers. Eurimages Audentia Award

This award has been created to promote the ongoing career of a female director and is awarded at a different festival every year since 2016. The Audentia Award includes a cash prize of €30,000 to be invested in the director's upcoming film as well as a statue designed by Ewa Rossano. So far, the prize has been presented at the Istanbul Film Festival (2016), Locarno Film Festival (2017), Toronto Film Festival (2018), Göteborg Film festival (2019), Sarajevo Film festival (2020), Montreal's Festival du Nouveau Cinéma (2021), Trieste Film Festival (2022) and Beldocs International Documentary Film Festival (2023).

Applications from festivals to hold the annual Audentia Award (2024 onwards) are not concerned by this call.

Applications for sponsorship that do not involve a financial contribution from the Fund are not concerned by this call. They must be submitted in accordance with the guidelines on patronage published on the Eurimages website: <https://www.coe.int/en/web/eurimages/home>

4. Objectives and modalities of the call for proposals

Eurimages intends to select projects, activities, residencies or events which, by sharing the same objectives and values as the Fund, are likely to give visibility to its activities and to promote gender equality, in accordance with the eligibility and selection criteria defined below. The maximum amount of Eurimages (co)financing of the activity will be € 10 000.

Depending on the amount of the financial contribution, a letter of agreement (up to € 2 000) or an agreement (more than € 2 000 and up to € 10 000) will be signed between the Eurimages Fund and the organiser of the selected activity.

The letter of agreement or the agreement signed with the organisers of the activity will cover the first year of the activity in 2024-2025. The Fund reserves the right to renew the agreement twice for a one-year period each time.

a) Eligibility criteria

These are the mandatory minimum requirements for the organisation of the proposed projects, activities, residencies or events. Proposals that do not meet these minimum requirements will be dismissed as ineligible.

i. Nature

The activity to be sponsored aims to promote gender equality in the film industry.

The organiser of the activity is a legal entity that is authorised to enter into a partnership agreement with the Council of Europe.

ii. Content of the proposal

The proposal should be compatible with the Fund's objectives and values and relevant to the strategy of the Eurimages Fund and its [Gender Equality Strategy](#) in particular.

The organisers will demonstrate the added value of their activity, its international dimension, its benefits for Eurimages, as well as their capacity to manage it.

iii. Funding of the activity

In the case of applications for a financial contribution of more than € 2.000, the proposal must clearly demonstrate the activity's financial viability by means of a detailed provisional budget and a financing plan.

iv. Communication and advertising

The organisers of the activity will ensure the best possible visibility for Eurimages by mentioning the sponsorship of the Fund in their communication, by use of the Fund's logo, or a visual.

b) *Selection criteria*

A. References/Track record, experience and quality	50
Proven track record of the activity or of its organisers in promoting gender equality with reference to achieved results.	20
Quality and innovative character of the activity.	10
International dimension of the activity and its connections and multiplying effects with other activities in the film industry.	20
B. Eurimages visibility	50
Compatibility of the objectives of the activity with those of the Eurimages Fund and its Gender Equality Strategy.	25
Ability of the activity to be sponsored to promote the Eurimages Fund and its added value in promoting gender equality.	25
C. Final score = A+B	100

Proposals will be selected on the basis of the above criteria by the Eurimages Board of Management, based on the recommendations of external experts and its Gender Equality and Diversity Working Group.

Eurimages will endeavour to select the proposals for sponsorship according to a fair geographical and calendar distribution.

Eurimages will take into consideration the number of activities which are already benefitting from sponsorship in that particular year. The amounts granted will be determined according to the available budget.

All meeting reports and deliberations relating to the selection are confidential.

c) *Exclusion criteria*

Proposals shall be excluded from the call if they, or, where applicable, their owners or persons having powers of representation or decision-making:

- have been convicted by final judgment for any of the following offences: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have been convicted by final judgment for serious professional misconduct or any other offence relating to professional integrity;
- do not comply with their obligations relating to the payment of social security contributions, taxes and duties under the legislation of their country of incorporation;
- are in a situation of a conflict of interests or a potential conflict of interests.

5. Content of a sponsorship proposal for an activity promoting gender equality

The proposal must include the following elements:

- A declaration relating to the exclusion criteria duly completed and signed (see Appendix I);
- Legal registration documents for the organising body if it is established under civil law or a declaration that it has the authority to enter into the partnership if it is a public authority;
- A description of the activity (maximum 5 pages) indicating:
 - i. a description and aims of the proposed activity with specific reference to the promotion of gender equality including the location and date of the activity;
 - ii. track record of the activity or its organisers in promoting gender equality: submit company profile and/or professional CV of the applicant;
 - iii. the professionals and public targeted by the activity;
 - iv. international aspects, geographical scope, number of countries involved in the activity;
 - v. the connections of the activity with other activities (e.g. workshops, meetings, training or other professional initiatives and networks) in the film industry;
- A description of the proposal for sponsorship by Eurimages (maximum 3 pages) indicating:
 - i. the compatibility of the objectives of the activity to be sponsored with those of the Eurimages Fund and its Gender Equality Strategy;
 - ii. the mutual benefits of the sponsorship for each party, notably the visibility (form and extent) that will be given to the Eurimages Fund;
 - iii. the added value of the activity to be sponsored with reference to the promotion of gender equality;
 - iv. a provisional budget and financing plan for the activity including the precise amount of support applied from Eurimages;
 - v. the working language(s) of the activity.

Proposals must be submitted in English. A French version may be provided in addition.

Multiple submissions to this call are not permitted.

6. Provisional timetable

The provisional timetable for the implementation of the call for proposals is as follows:

The Council of Europe reserves the right to cancel this procedure if none of the proposals obtain at least 50 points out of 100.

c) neither the company/organisation I represent nor its owners or any of the persons having powers of representation or decision-making have ever been convicted by a final judgment for serious professional misconduct or any other offence relating to professional conduct;

d) the company/organisation I represent or its owners or any of the persons having powers of representation have fulfilled all obligations relating to the payment of social security contributions, taxes and duties under the legislation of the country in which it is established;

e) neither the company/organisation I represent nor its owners or any of the persons having powers of representation or decision-making are in a situation of a conflict of interests or a potential conflict of interests in relation to this call for proposals or, to the best of my knowledge, to any sub-contractors to be used for the realisation of the proposal; the company/organisation I represent or its owners or any of the persons having powers of representation have been notified and understand that a conflict of interests may arise, in particular, from economic interests, political or national affinities, emotional or family ties or any other type of shared relationship or interest;

f) neither the company/organisation I represent nor its owners or any of the persons having powers of representation or decision-making have ever engaged in misconduct in connection with an earlier application for support or partnership that led Eurimages to justifiably terminate a support or partnership agreement or to exclude the company/organisation concerned from the support or partnership agreement;

g) neither the company/organisation I represent nor its owners or any of the persons having powers of representation or decision-making are included in the lists of persons or entities subject to restrictive measures applied by the European Union (available at www.sanctionsmap.eu).

h) the information provided to Eurimages under this procedure is complete, correct and truthful;

i) if my company's/organisation's proposal is retained, I will provide Eurimages with the following documents upon request:

- In relation to the matters referred to in sub-paragraphs a), b) and c) above, a recent extract from the criminal record or an equivalent recent document issued by a judicial or administrative authority in the country of origin or provenance, showing that the requirements referred to have been met. If the national law of the country in which the company or organisation is established does not provide for such documents to be supplied to legal persons, these documents shall be requested for natural persons concerned, such as the administrators or any person vested with powers of representation, decision or supervision on the company's/organisation's behalf;
- In the case referred to in sub-paragraph d) above, recent certificates or letters from the relevant authorities of the state concerned are required. These documents must provide proof of payment of all the taxes,

duties and social security contributions owed by the applicant including VAT, corporation tax and social insurance contributions.

If necessary, where one of the documents referred to above is not issued in the country concerned, it may be replaced by a sworn or, failing that, a solemn statement made by the interested party before a judicial or administrative authority, a notary or a qualified professional body in the applicant's country of origin or provenance.

In signing this form, I acknowledge that I have been notified that if any of the statements made or information provided prove to be false, Eurimages reserves the right to exclude the proposal concerned from this call for proposals or to terminate any existing contractual relations related to the latter.
