Enhancing student citizenship through extracurricular activities

DESCRIPTION

As the Civic Democratic Culture advocates serving both as topic (educating students about the concept and importance of democracy) and as an approach (enhancing student participation in democratic processes), it is essential to provide VET students with tangible opportunities to practice democracy while studying.

One way to foster students' engagement in building a democratic society is through their involvement in **extracurricular activities**. Implementation of CDC is significantly encouraged through non-formal education, particularly through implementation of extracurricular activities and projects developed in the framework of partnership with both governmental and non-governmental organisations. These activities aim to encourage students to participate in projects that promote **social well-being**, **equity**, and **democracy**.

To enhance democratic culture at VET institutions, the **Skills Agency is annually announcing a special competition for extracurricular projects**. The competition aims to activate students as responsible citizens, including by fostering the formation of student clubs, which implement **different community-oriented projects**. These initiatives include students' involvement in projects focused on environmental protection, as well as furnishing the college yard to serve as a community recreational space.
