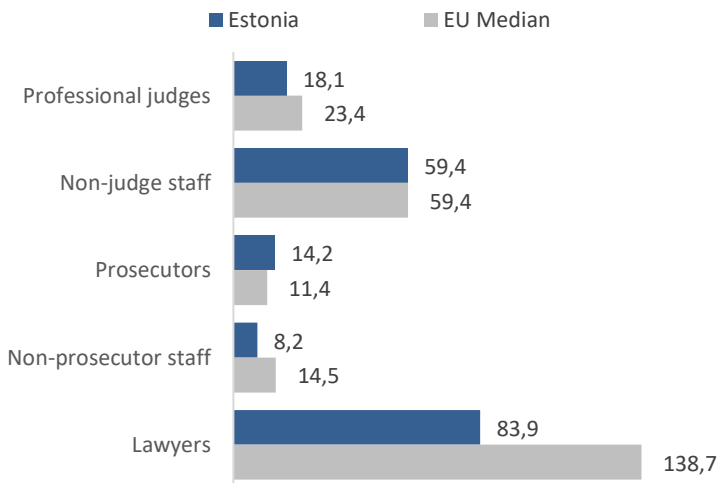

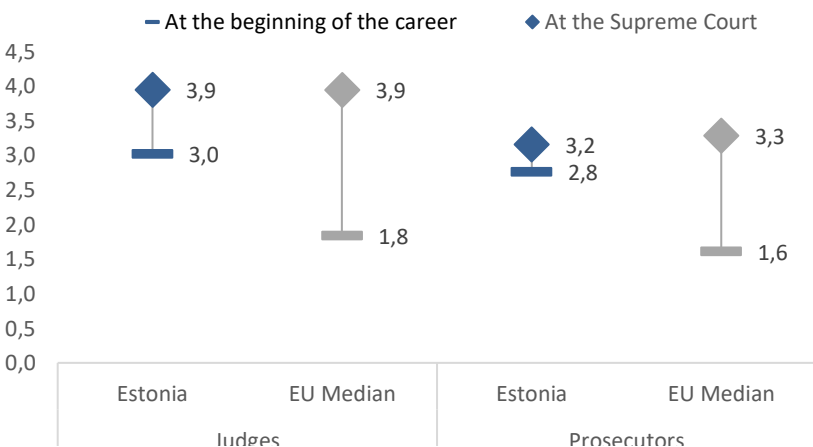

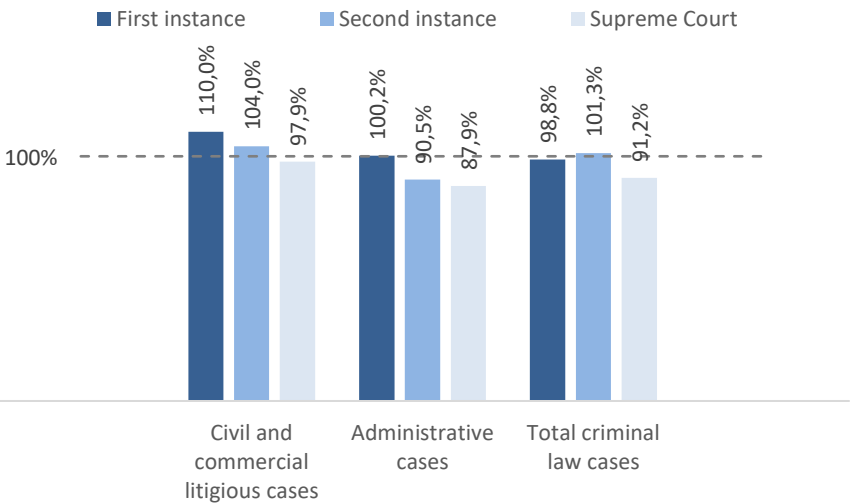


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2024

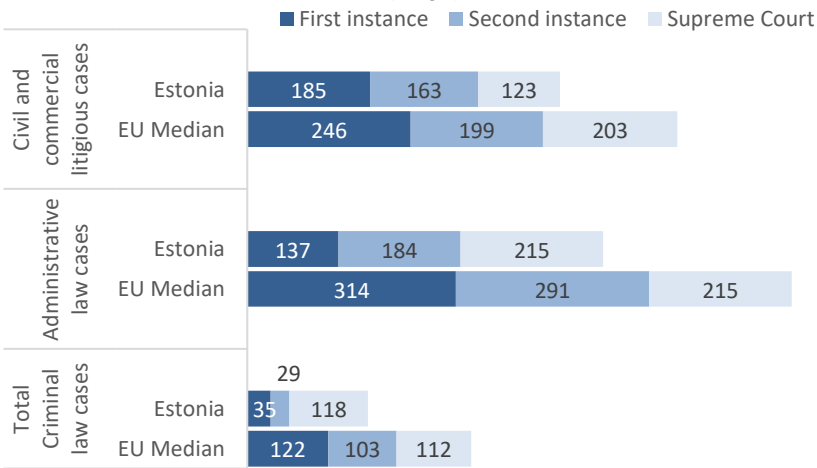

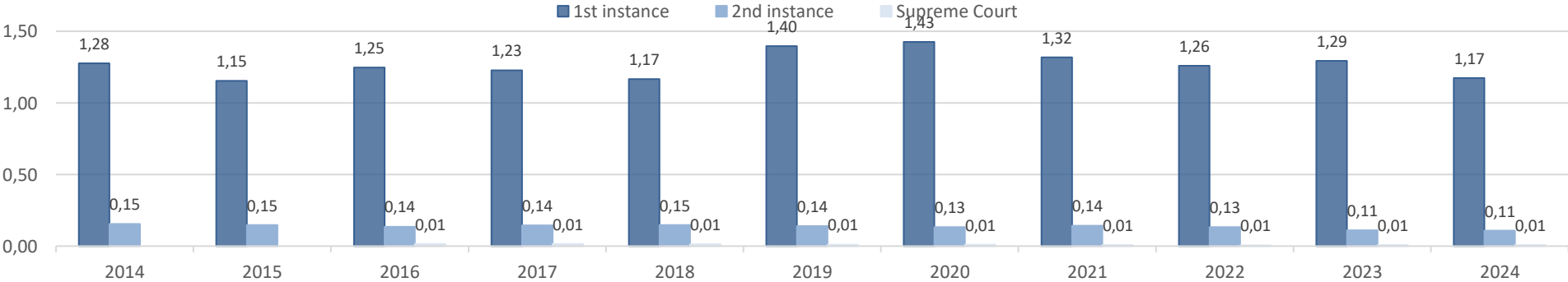

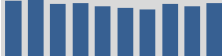
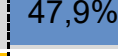
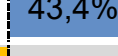


Incoming cases per 100 inhabitants

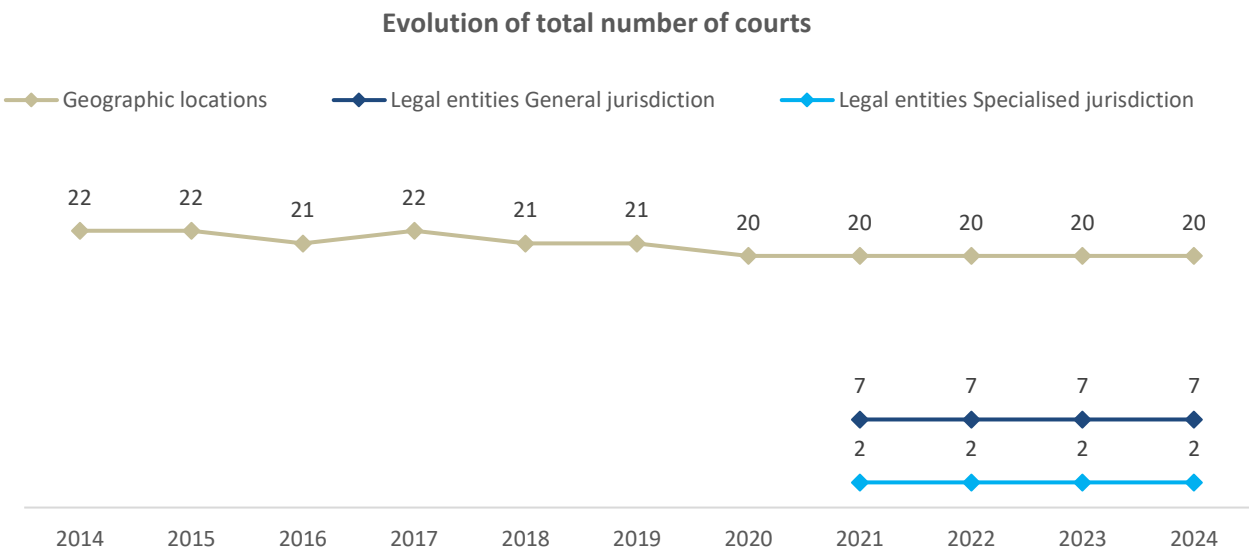
1. Judicial organisation in Estonia (2024 data)

In 2024, there are 9 courts considered as legal entities in Estonia. Among them, 7 are of general jurisdiction and 2 have specialised competence. More precisely, there are 4 first instance courts of general jurisdiction – the county courts - which decisions can be appealed before 2 Appellate courts. The Supreme Court is the highest instance court of general jurisdiction. It hears only cases that have been given leave to appeal (i.e., that have been declared admissible for proceedings in the Supreme Court). The Supreme Court is not required to give reasons in its rulings on the admissibility of the appeals. There are only two specialised courts which are first instance administrative courts.

In terms of geographic locations, Estonia has 17 courthouses of county courts (first instance courts), 4 courthouses of administrative courts (first instance courts), 2 courthouses of appellate courts (second instance courts) and 1 courthouse of the Supreme Court (highest instance court), all together 24 courthouses. However, as some of the courts are situated in the same house (e.g Tallinn Administrative Court and Tallinn Circuit Court) and taking into account the fact that Pärnu County Court has a courthouse that is divided between two locations, there are 20 actual geographical locations of Estonian courts.

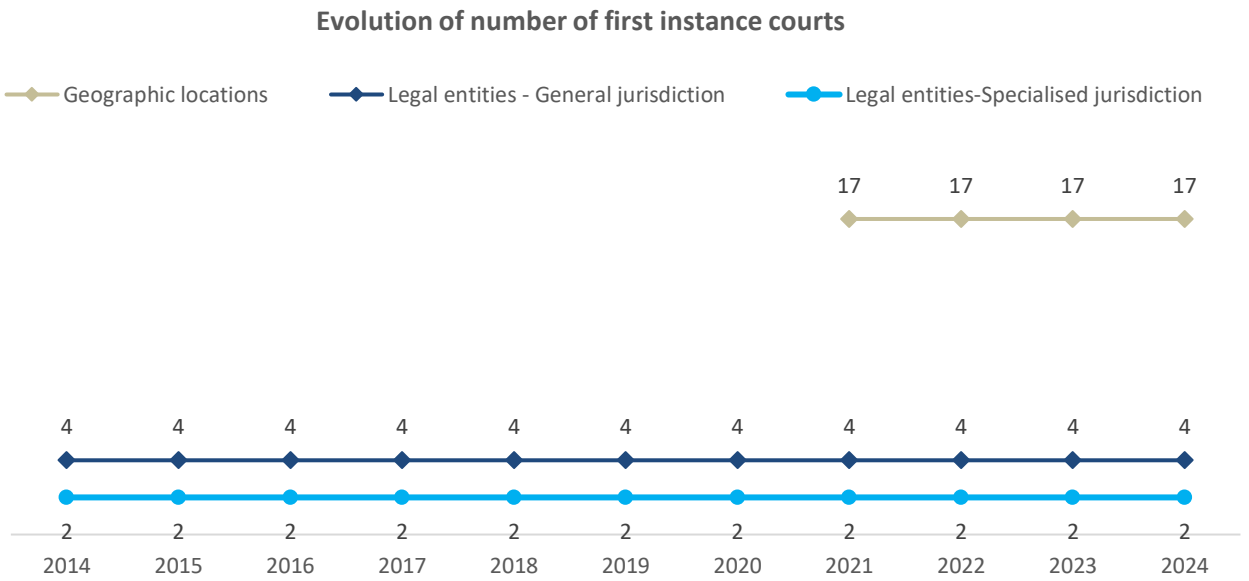

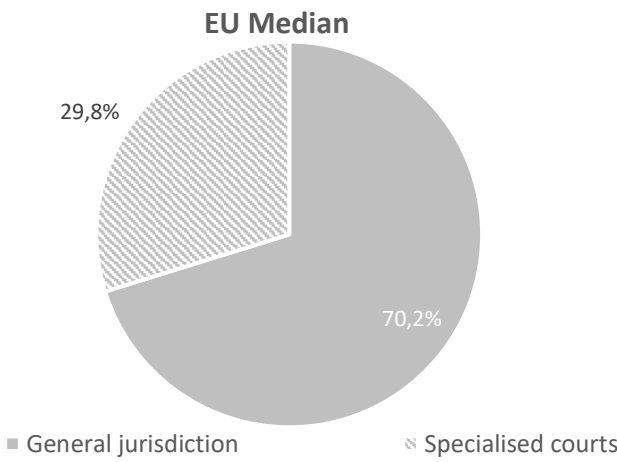
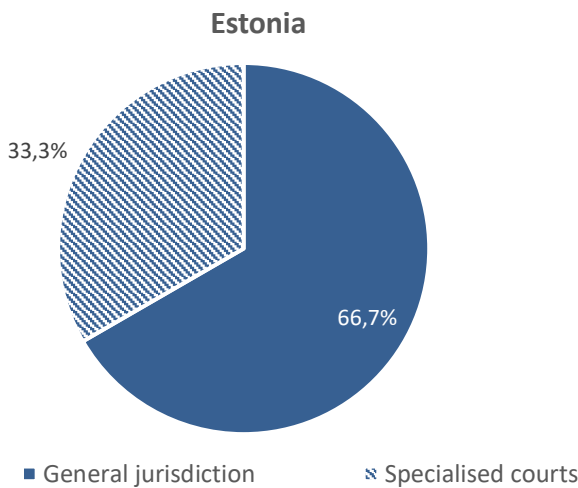


Evolution of number of first instance courts

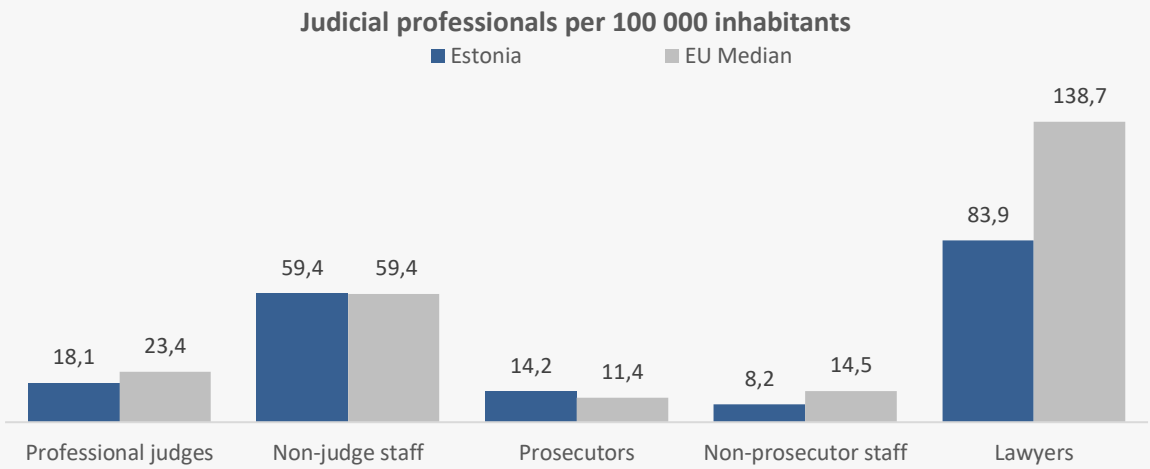
In Estonia, there are no specialised first instance courts, other than administrative courts. All the cases are dealt with by ordinary courts of first instance. The two administrative courts of first instance are situated in Tallinn and Tartu. Nevertheless, for guaranteeing wider access to justice, these two courts have several court buildings in other cities, namely in Pärnu and Jõhvi, where judges and their supporting legal staff work.

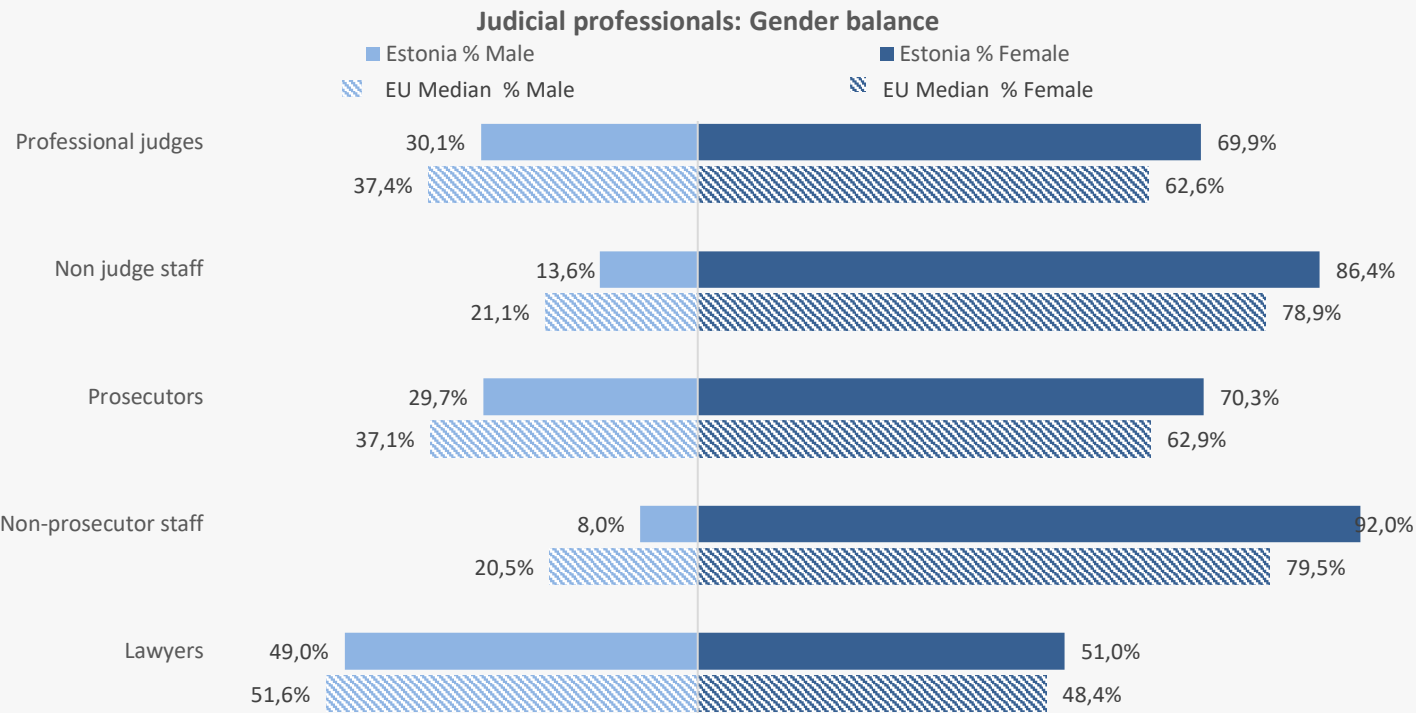

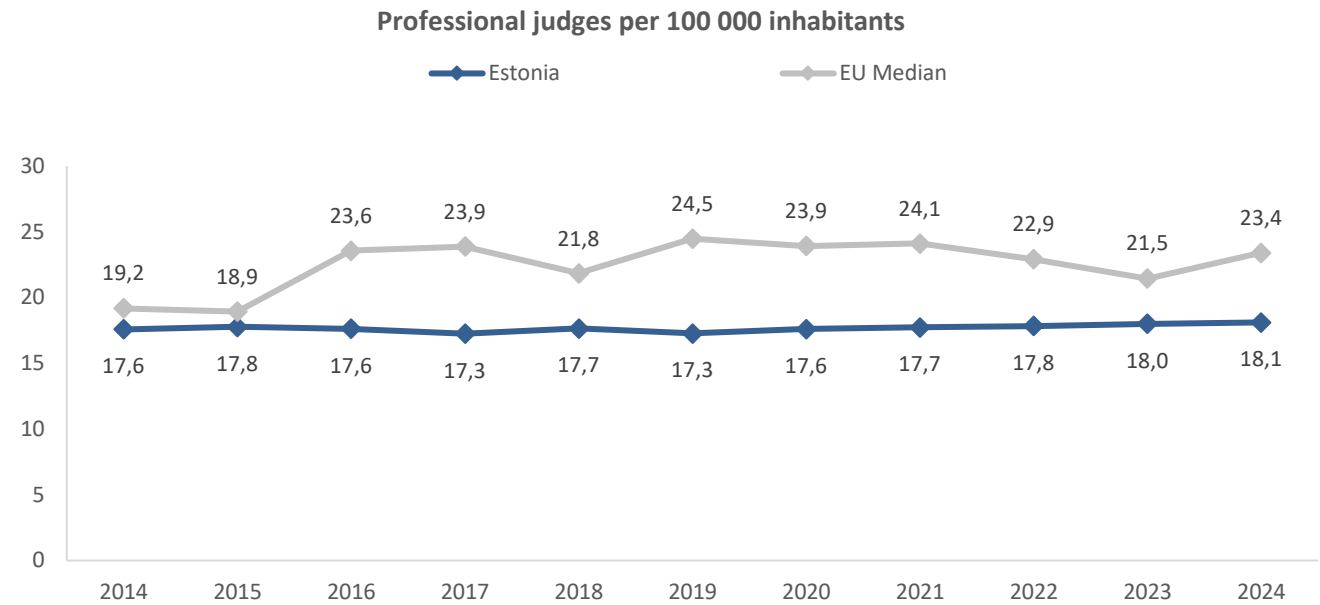

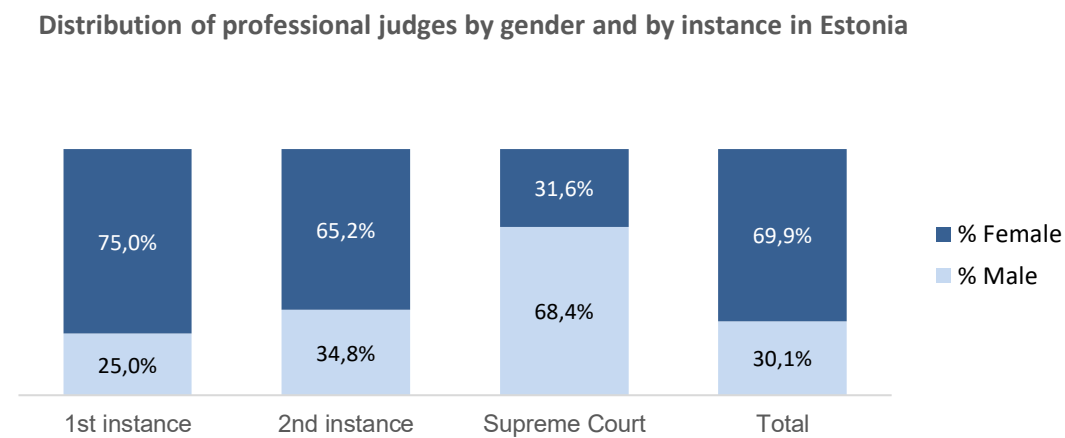
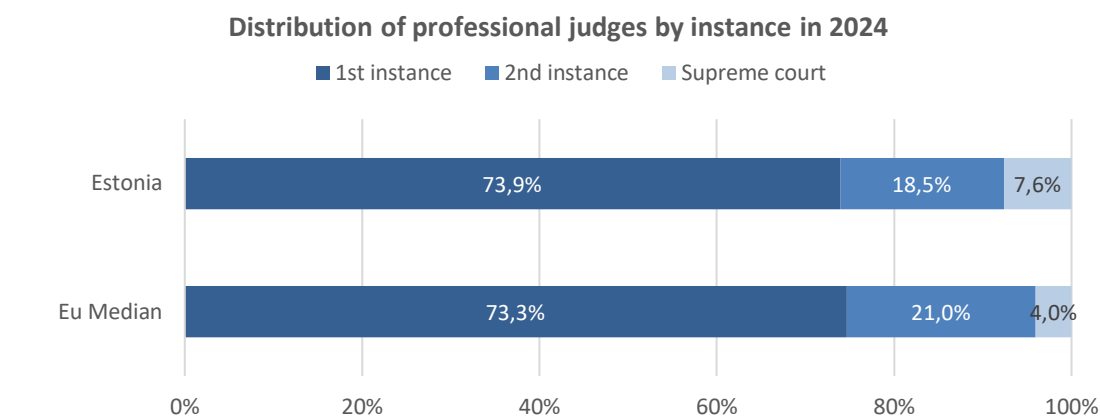


According to the 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Estonia is 249, which is 1,2% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Estonia, there are 18,1 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 174, which represents 69,9% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 184 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 138 are female); 46 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 30 are female) and 19 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 6 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Estonia is characterised by a similar trend. The percentage of first instance judges is close to the EU median. Second instance judges are less numerous than in the EU, while third instance judges are more numerous.

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female judges constitute the majority at first and second instance but not at the level of the Supreme court.

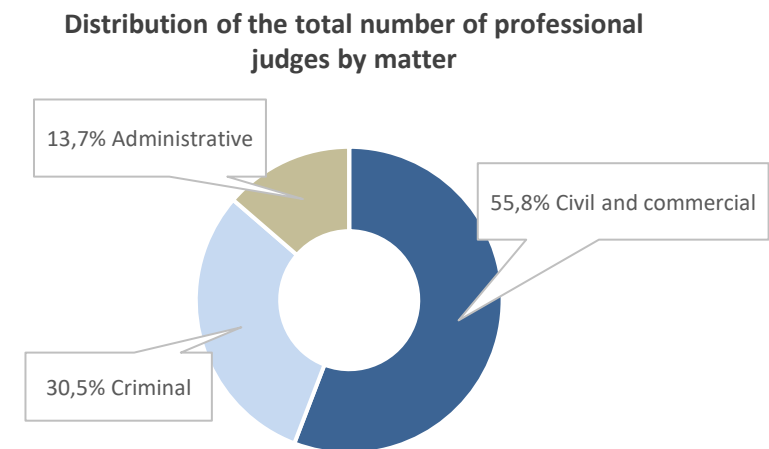

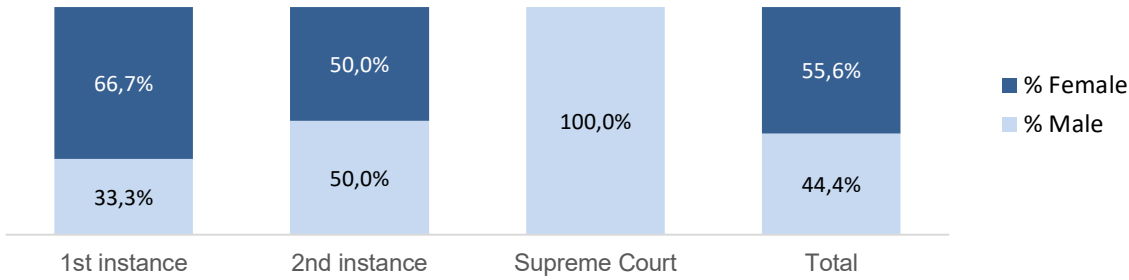

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Estonia

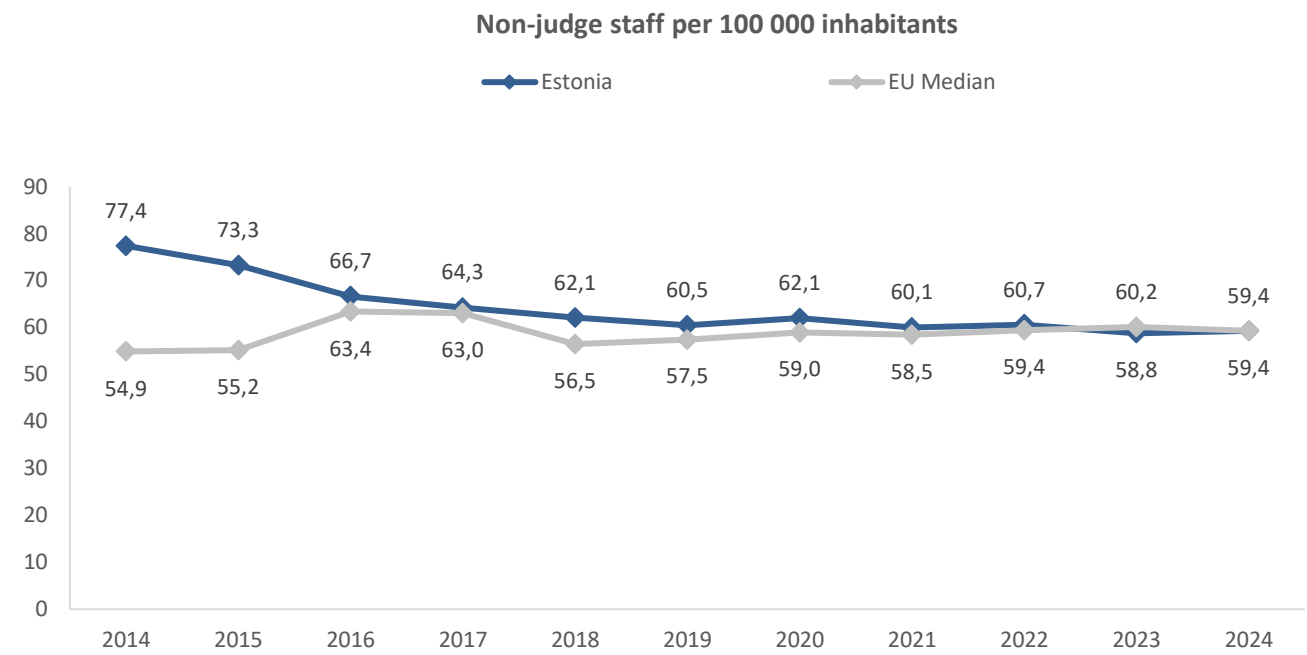


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 5, which represents 55,6% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 6 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 4 are female); 2 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom 1 is female) and 1 male court president in the Supreme Court.

In 2024, Estonia has 816 non-judge staff (of whom 705 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 1,6%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 58,8 in 2023 to 59,4 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 18,0 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 18,1 in 2024.

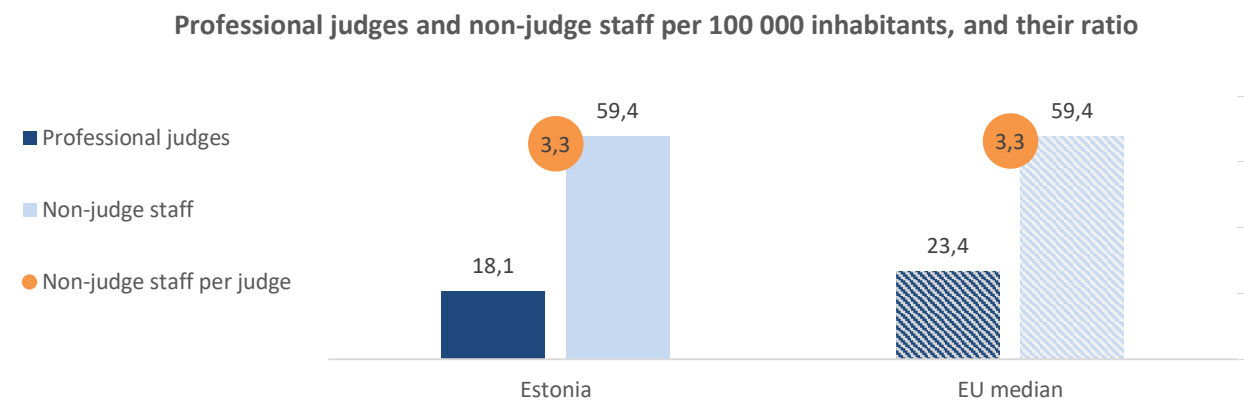

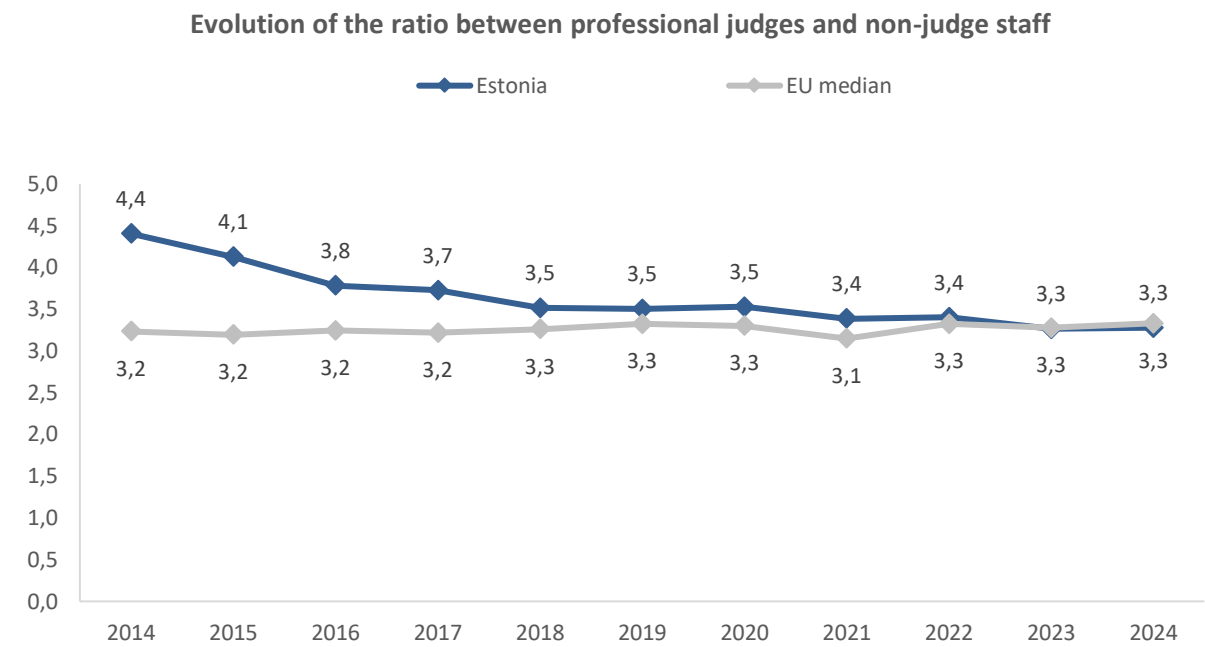


In Estonia, there are 18,1 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,3 non-judge staff per judge.

There is no significant difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,3 non-judge staff per judge.

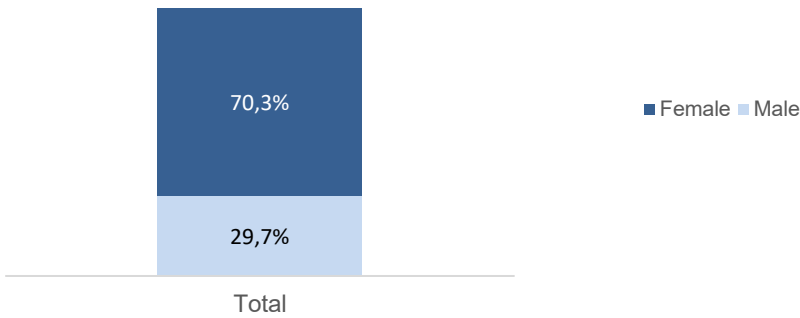

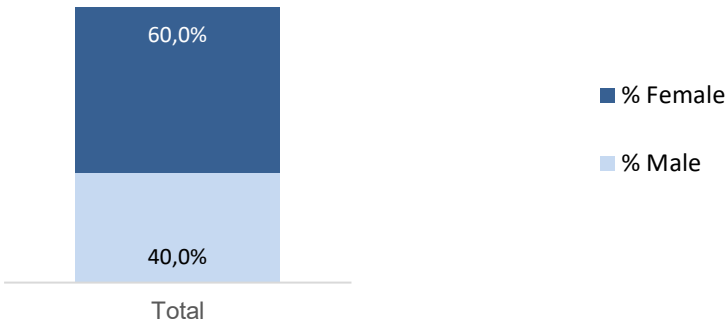

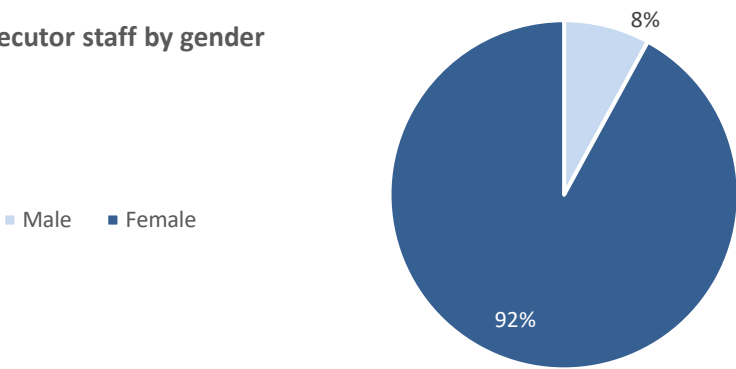

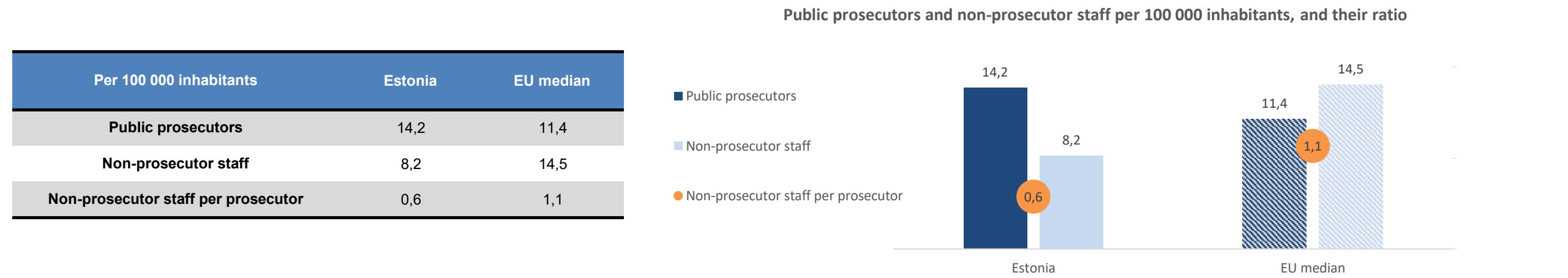

Non-prosecutor staff by gender



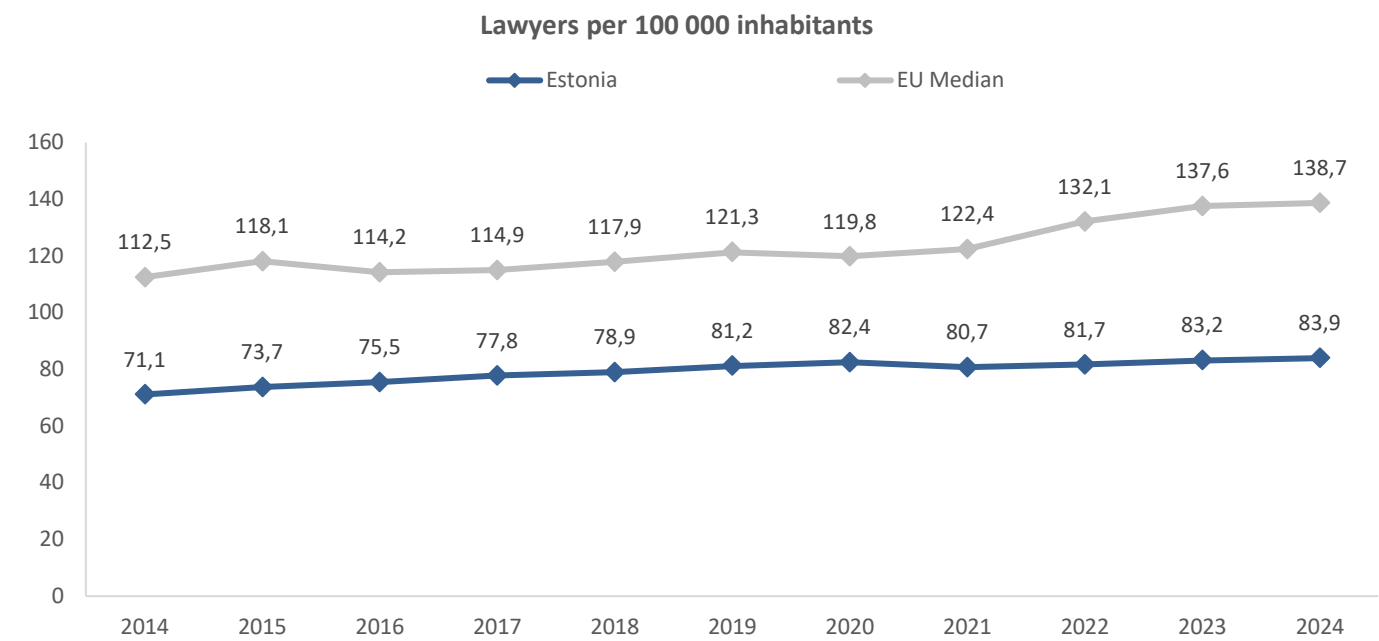
Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

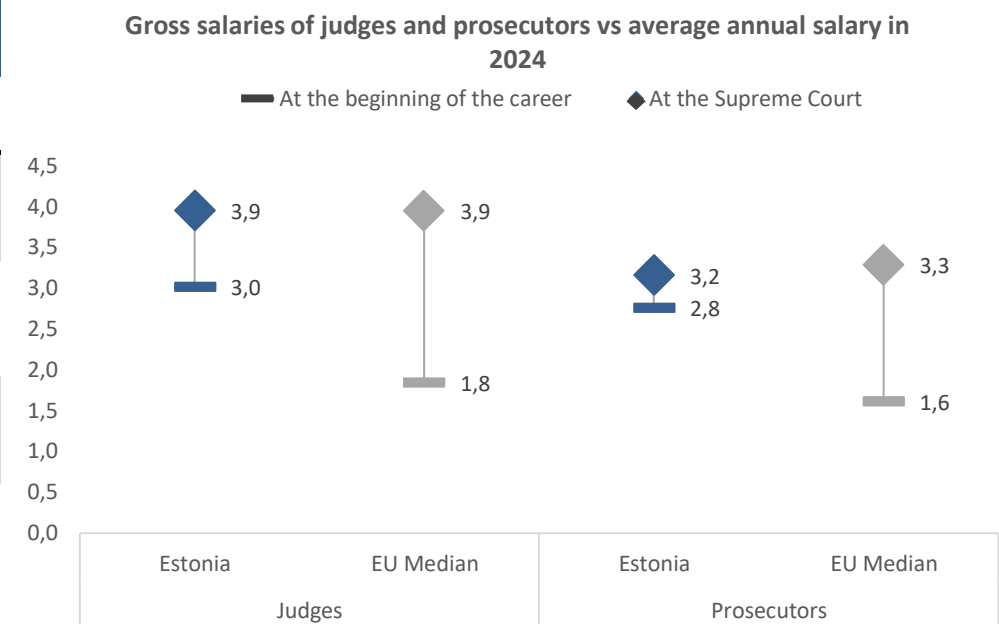


In 2024, there are 1 154 lawyers, which is 1,6% more than in 2023.

Estonia has 83,9 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to the 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Estonia is 71 760€, which is rather above the EU median of 59 141€ (21% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,0 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Estonia's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -23% below the EU median of 121 338€.

For public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Estonia of 65 688€ is rather above the EU median of 52 922€ (24% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 2,8 times higher (the EU median is 1,6).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. Estonia's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is -20% below the EU median of 94 385€.

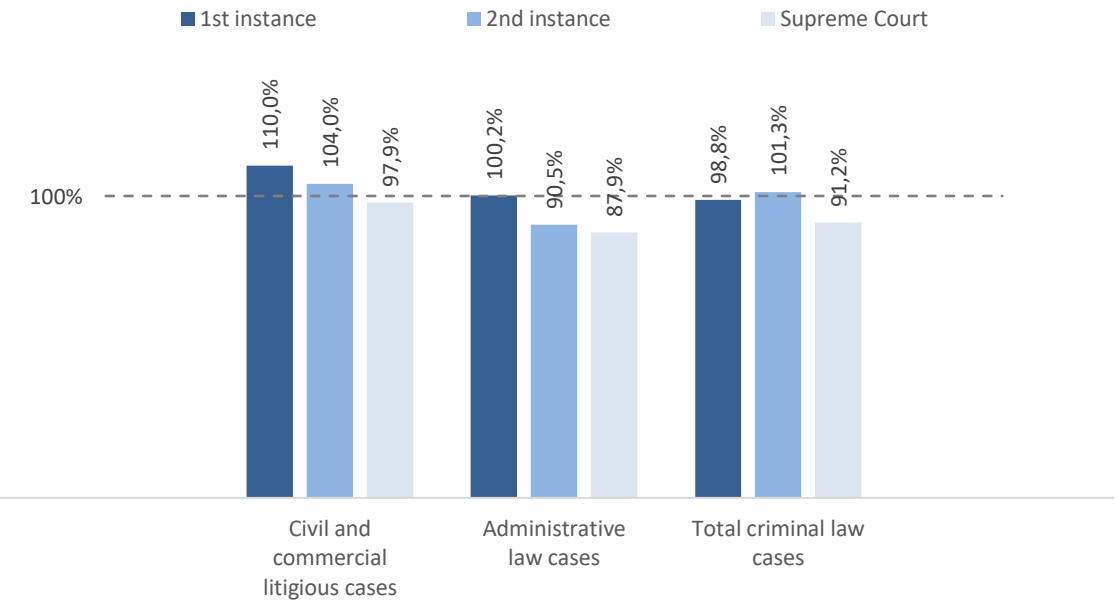
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

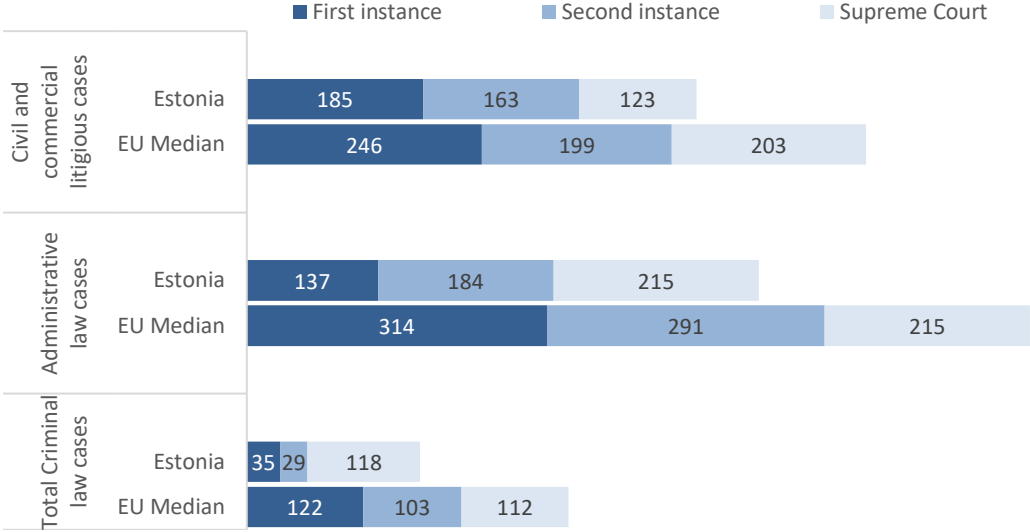

Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2024 (days)



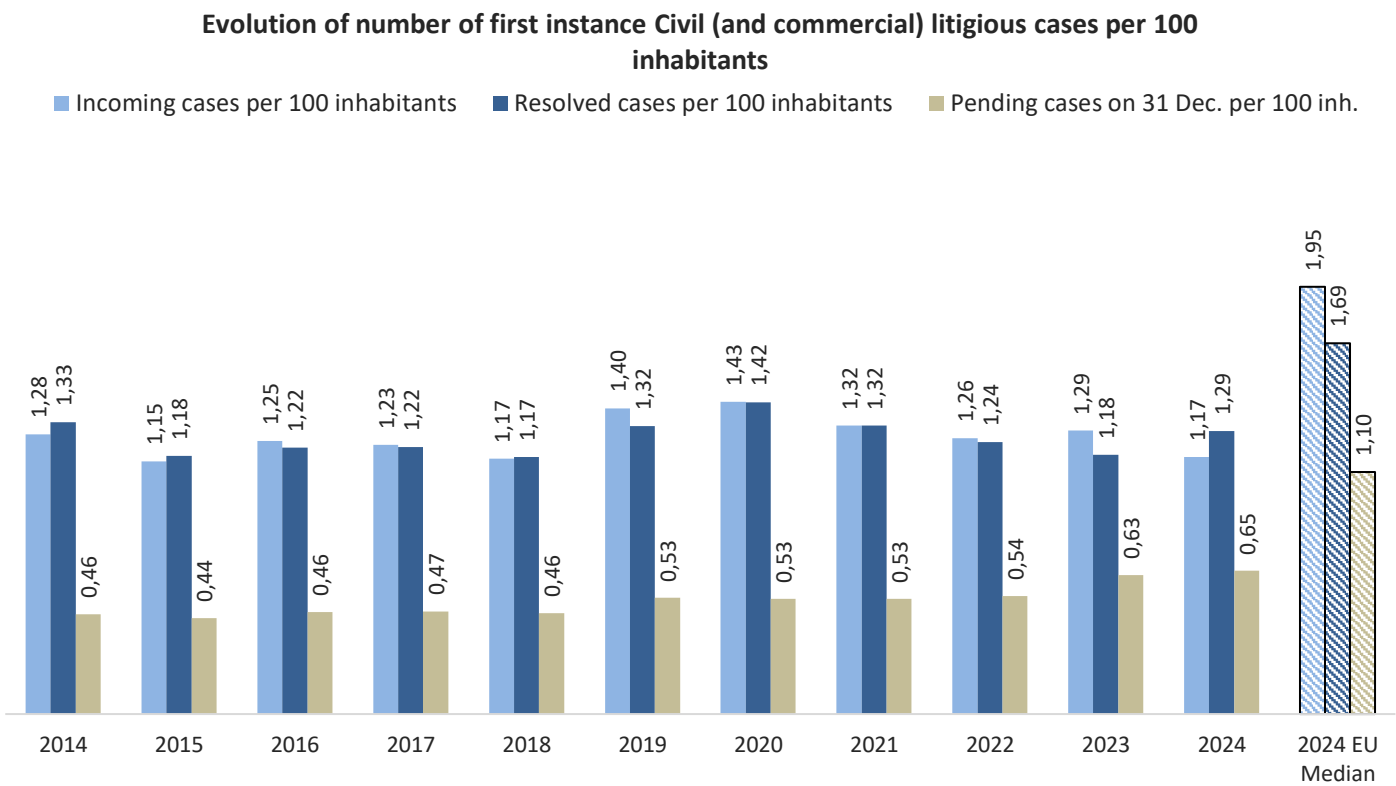
In 2024, Estonia’s Disposition Time for criminal cases remains exceptionally efficient. First-instance courts resolve such cases in 35 days and second-instance courts in 29 days, both far below the EU medians of 122 and 103 days. Civil and commercial litigious cases are also handled more quickly than the EU median across all three instances. In administrative law, Estonia outperforms the EU median at the first and second instances, while the third-instance Disposition Time matches the EU median of 215 days.

Clearance Rates show a more varied picture. In first-instance courts, the rate for criminal cases falls below 100%, whereas civil and commercial litigious cases and administrative law cases exceed the 100% threshold. At the second-instance level, Clearance Rates reach 104% for civil and commercial litigious matters and are slightly above, 101.3%, for criminal cases, while administrative law cases remain below 100%. In third-instance courts, Clearance Rates for all three case categories, administrative, civil and commercial litigious, and criminal, fall below 100%.

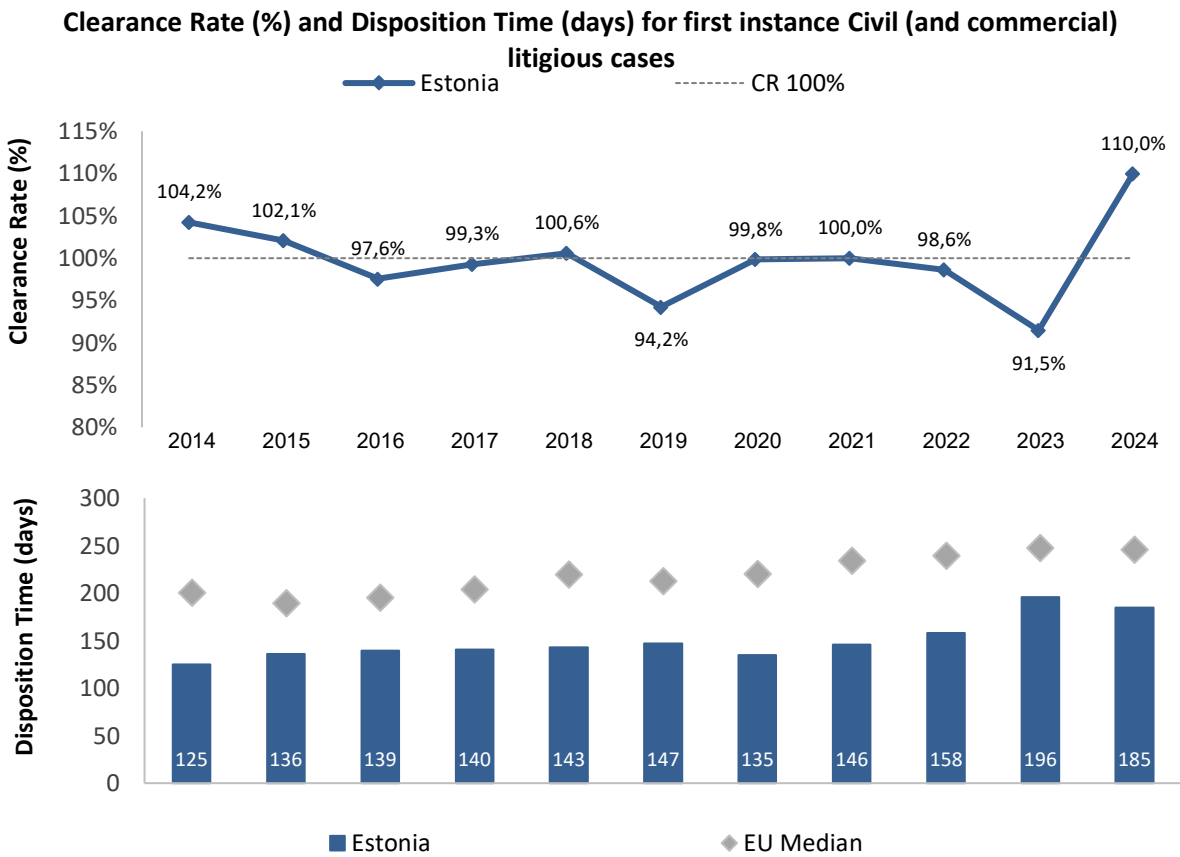
The number of incoming cases in 2024 in Estonia (1,17 per 100 inhabitants) is somewhat below the EU median (1,95 per 100 inhabitants).

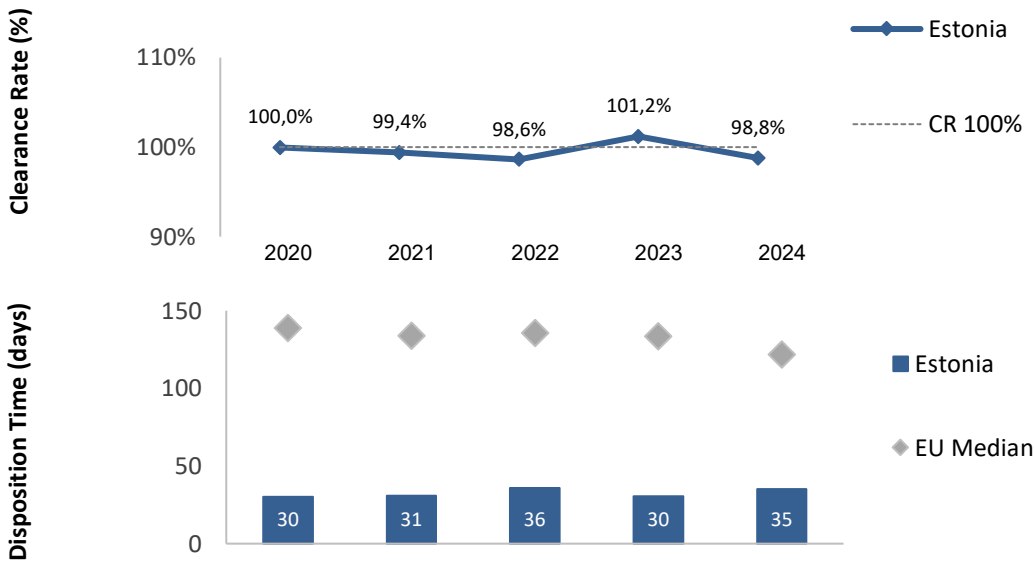

In 2024, there are 86 notaries which represents 6,3 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

A notary is an independent holder of office in public law, to whom the State has delegated the duty of ensuring the security of legal relationships and prevention of legal disputes. A notary executes his/her office as a liberal profession in his/her own name and at his/her own responsibility. Notaries are not proprietors but for accounting and taxation purposes, provisions applying to sole proprietors are applied. Notaries are appointed to office by the Minister of Justice according to the number of notaries and their corresponding territorial jurisdiction determined by the Regulation of the Minister of Justice. The Ministry of Justice supervises the professional activities of notaries.

8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in Estonia
(2024 data)

In Estonia, quality standards are determined for the judicial system at national level (e.g. quality systems for the judiciary and/or judicial quality policies). However, there is no specialised personnel within the courts or the public prosecution services entrusted with implementation of these national level quality standards.

Estonia has developed a quality system consisting of 3 parts. The first part contains the quality standards (good practice) for the management of the court that describe activities related to the chairman of the court. The second part contains the quality standards for the administration of courts and is focused on the different roles of the parties involved in the administration of courts: directors, Ministry of Justice, Council for the Administration of Courts. The third part contains quality standards for the court proceedings and is addressed to all the judges. All of the three parts of the quality standards have been discussed and approved by the Council for Administration of Courts, respectively in 2012, 2013 and 2015.

The scope of the monitoring system is extended to the results of proceedings; the categories of cases; the number of decisions appealed and revoked, fully or partially. The waiting time and the 'age' of pending (not solved) cases are also monitored. It is worthy mentionning that every year all the courts and the Ministry of Justice enter into an agreement according to which courts should aim to carry out structural changes and to make changes in case-flow management that will ultimately ensure efficient proceedings. The content of the agreement has changed since 2017. The goals are more general and the same for all the courts (except the Supreme Court).
