Objectives:

- to provide participants with detailed information on the implications of signing, ratifying and implementing the Faro Convention;
- to offer examples of good practices and the added value of signing, ratifying and implementing the Convention;
- to discuss the adjustment of the role of national authorities in the process of increasing civil society's participation in cultural heritage governance.

Approach:

Through presentations and discussions on specific topics, participants at the seminar will have a unique opportunity to exchange on the concerns that authorities may have in supporting the Faro Convention approach to cultural heritage. In particular, visiting two local initiatives that are already applying some of the Faro Convention principles will serve to illustrate how authorities can be involved in the implementation phase.

Background:

The Faro Convention highlights three main aspects:

- the shared rights and responsibilities towards cultural heritage within an integrated strategy approach;
- the role of cultural heritage as a resource for building more democratic societies and improving the living environment and quality of life;
- the links between heritage rights and human rights: every person has a right to engage with the cultural heritage of their choice, while respecting the rights and freedoms of others.

Such concepts may challenge the usual approach to cultural heritage governance, where identification, protection, conservation and diffusion are mainly developed through public authorities. The decision by States to endorse the Faro Convention and participate in its implementation should ensure a balanced approach between the more traditional role of authorities and civil society's increased involvement today. In particular, this will allow the preservation of the existing heritage while promoting its use in addressing societal issues.
