UN Legal Instruments

UN Security Council has dealt UN Security Council (UNSC) has dealt with terrorism since the first terrorist attacks have taken place. However, it wasn't until the 1980s that the UNSC began to consider **terrorism as a threat to international peace and security**, meaning it is one of the gravest dangers to the international community. It also means that the UNSC can use its enlarged powers under **Chapter VII**:

"Countering violent extremism, which can be conducive to terrorism, including preventing radicalisation, recruitment, and mobilization of individuals into terrorist groups and becoming foreign terrorist fighters is an essential element of addressing the threat to international peace and security posed by foreign terrorist fighters, and calls upon Member States to enhance efforts to counter this kind of violent extremism"

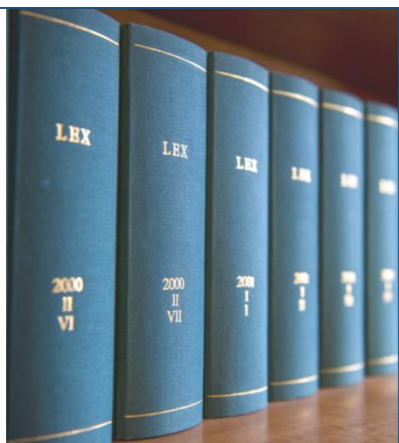

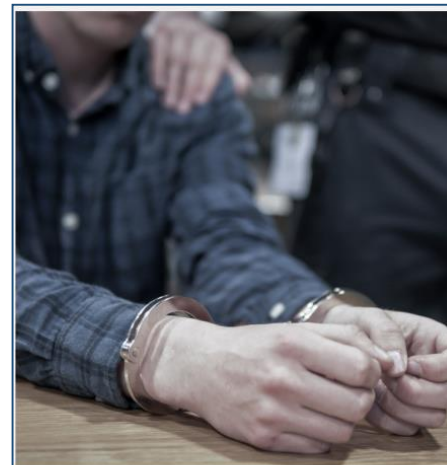

Special Investigation Techniques

Drawing on various international and regional instruments, SITs comprise a number of investigative techniques, such as:

- **surveillance**, including interception of communication
- **covert investigations** (i.e. undercover agents)
- **controlled delivery**
- **informants**
- **Joint Investigation Teams (JITs)**
- **witness protection**

The adjudication of some SITs (notably surveillance (viewed broadly) and covert investigations, have resulted in landmark jurisprudence, notably by the European Court of Human Rights.
