# Overall management response to the evaluation:

The most essential recommendations were already anticipated towards the end of Phase I (last quarter of 2020). Furthermore, appropriate action has been already taken in the field of women's participation, activities related to Roma identity and culture, as well as the balancing approach in the selection of partner municipalities. Although these actions were carried out in various Beneficiaries prior to publishing the evaluation report, they are included in the Action Plan and will be further developed throughout the duration of the Programme.

Some of the recommendations are under consideration due to their complexity, such as exploring a more linear structure of the Programme or applying the ROMACTED methodology and tools to a wider population in corresponding processes.

Recommendations to the EU will be duly transmitted to our counterparts in DG NEAR.
