"Improvement and safeguards of health conditions of persons deprived of liberty with substances use disorders" (24-25 September 2024, Strasbourg, France)

1. Who is responsible for data processing?

Transversal Human Rights Responses Unit of the Council of Europe's Department for the Implementation of Human Rights, Justice and Legal Co-operation Standards, and the Pompidou Group are the "data controllers" which means they have the decision-making power concerning the data processing. Processing of your personal data is governed by the <u>Council of Europe Regulations on the Protection of Personal Data</u> adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 15 June 2022.

Each of the co-organisers is responsible of entering and managing the personal data of participants to whom they have addressed an invitation/call for participation.

2. What data do we process and for what purpose?

We process personal data that we receive either from you yourself or from another legitimate source (such as your employer or your assistant) insofar as they are necessary for us to provide your participation in the European NPM Forum Conference "Improvement and safeguards of health conditions of persons deprived of liberty with substances use disorders" organised under the auspices of the project "Support to Council of Europe for EU network of prison monitoring bodies", in cooperation with the Pompidou Group of the Council of Europe under its Criminal Justice and Health in Prison Programme.

We process the types of personal data listed below for the following purposes:

a) Participant administration

To prepare the European NPM Forum Conference "Improvement and safeguards of health conditions of persons deprived of liberty with substances use disorders", we need your name and surname, email address, mobile telephone number, country, professional information, reasons for your interest in and suggestions for the conference. We need these data in order to ensure that the agenda is tailored to your specific interests and needs as well as to issue the invitations for the conference.

If you participate in the event as a speaker, your name and professional titles will be included in the agenda.

b) Publication in participant and check-in lists

As part of the European NPM Forum Conference "Improvement and safeguards of health conditions of persons deprived of liberty with substances use disorders" documentation, we draw up lists of participants and provide these to participants within the framework of the event with a view to promote professional networking. Usually a participant list contains:

- Title, first name and surname
- Professional title
- Employer

You can object to the inclusion of your data in the list of participants or specify that particular data should not be included in the list. Should this be the case please contact us when registering your participation, at the latest one week before the event takes place.

c) Reimbursement of travel and subsistence expenses

If you are entitled to reimbursement of travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the applicable rules, in addition to the data listed above we may also process the following categories of data depending on the nature of the expenses incurred: your bank details, itinerary, copies of the

relevant tickets and accommodation bookings, evidence of the expenditure actually incurred such as invoices and credit card slips or statements, and information on meals or overnight accommodation provided free of charge.

d) Travel and accommodation assistance

If you are entitled to travel and accommodation assistance, in addition to the data listed above, we may also process details of your identity document.

e) Insurance

If you are covered by travel insurance taken out by the Council of Europe on your behalf, we may also process your home address to determine coverage territory. In the event that you make an insurance claim you will have to provide the following data so that your claim can be processed: your name and surname, phone number, fax number, email address, date of birth and your status in relation to the Council of Europe as well as the relevant information concerning the incident. You may also be required to submit supporting documents concerning the incident as well as the invitation letter from the Council of Europe.

3. What is the legal basis for our processing of your data?

We process your personal data on the basis of the Council of Europe's legal instruments and its internal rules in order to carry out activities necessary for the performance of the Council of Europe's tasks.

4. Who has access to your data?

Only persons within the Council of Europe who need your personal data to conduct the European NPM Forum Conference "Improvement and safeguards of health conditions of persons deprived of liberty with substances use disorders" have access to them.

If you are entitled to reimbursement of travel and subsistence expenses, your relevant personal data are processed by the services of the Council of Europe in charge of such reimbursements.

Where we provide you with travel or accommodation assistance, your personal data will be processed by the services of the Council of Europe in charge of organising travel and accommodation. We will share only the minimum personal data necessary for the provision of such services with the relevant service providers.

If you are covered by travel insurance taken out by the Council of Europe on your behalf and have made an insurance claim, your personal data will first be processed by the services of the Council of Europe in charge of organising travel and then shared with the insurance broker, CIGNA. In case of an accident or illness that requires your hospitalisation, you may contact the insurer, AIG, directly. In this case, the Council of Europe will be notified of the insurance claim made, but the insurer will not be required to provide any medical information to the Council of Europe. The insurer and the insurance broker will process your personal data in accordance with their own data protection policies.

5. How do we store your personal data?

Your personal data will be stored electronically on the Council of Europe's servers located in the European Union. We have put in place measures to protect the security of your personal information, including appropriate security measures to prevent your personal information from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. These measures include encrypted servers, limited access to any databases only for those people who need it and secure backup of all data.

6. How long will your data be stored?

We process and store your personal data until they are no longer necessary for the purposes relating to the organisation of the project "Support to Council of Europe for EU network of prison monitoring

bodies" (under which operates the European NPM Forum) and follow up activities, including sharing with you the information on forthcoming activities and events organised by the Transversal Human Right Responses Unit of the Council of Europe's Department for the Implementation of Human Rights, Justice and Legal Co-operation Standards.

The list of participants, along with other conference documents, will be stored for archiving purposes according to the Council of Europe's guidelines on archiving.

7. What are your data protection rights?

You have the right to:

- request access to your personal information held by us;
- request that we correct incomplete or inaccurate personal information that we hold about you;
- request that we delete or remove your personal information when there is no valid reason for us to keep it;
- object to the processing of your personal information on specific grounds relating to your situation.
