Aims of the project






- ✓ To empower teachers to use of the student-centered learning in developing CDC and digital skills;

- ✓ Student best practices applied by teachers are presented on the published **online platform**.



Challenges faced and Key lessons learned

in integration of EDC/HRE practice as cross - curricular approach and student-centered learning

At policy level

✓ Synergies and coordination between BDE and various projects are essential for development of policies to support implementation of CDC through EDC/EDC.

At the school level

- ✓ Common understanding and acceptance of international EDC/HRE principles and concepts is a key for implementation of CDC model.
- ✓ Extensive efforts is required to support teachers in the transition from a traditional methodology to a modern competence-based approach.
- ✓ School leadership need adequate support for practicing whole school approach to promote CDC model.

- ✓ Continue to raise awareness of the responsibility of school leaders and teachers to promote CDC model.

- ✓ Put the experienced teachers in CDC practice to act as trainers/mentors in their and other schools.
- ✓ Focus on **formative assessment and evaluation** to stimulate reflection and meta-cognition.
- ✓ Make available online platform as source of ideas and practices for teacher professional development.
