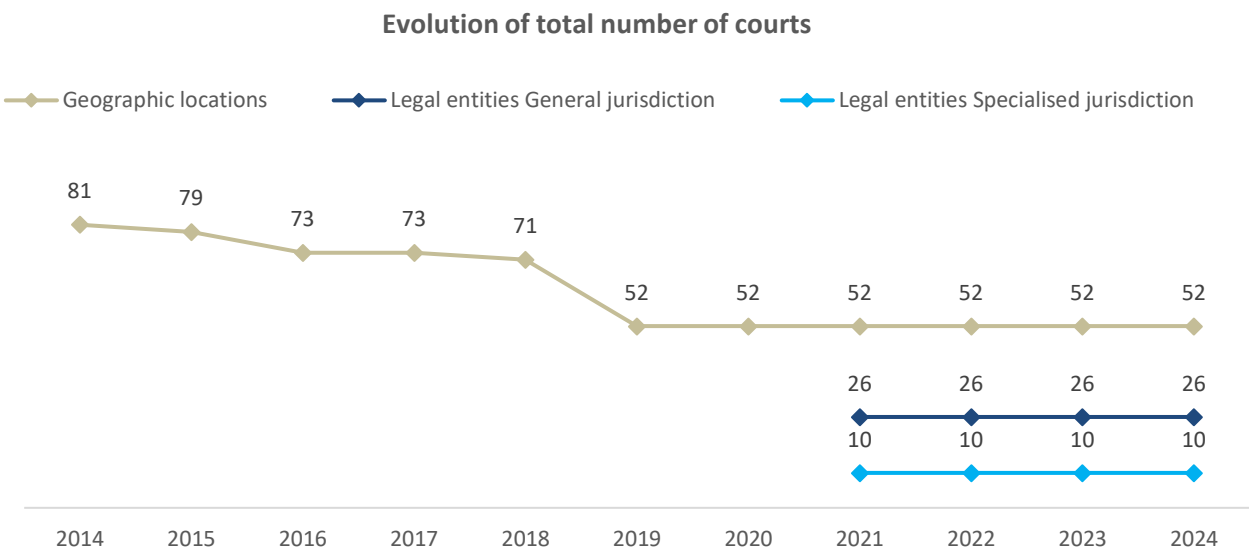
1. Judicial organisation in Finland (2024 data)

In Finland, there are 20 district courts with 36 offices, five courts of appeal, the Supreme Court, six administrative courts, the Supreme Administrative Court, the Market Court, the Labour Court and the Insurance Court. One of the administrative courts, the Labour Court and the Market Court are located in the same location.

In total there are 36 courts in 52 geographic locations.

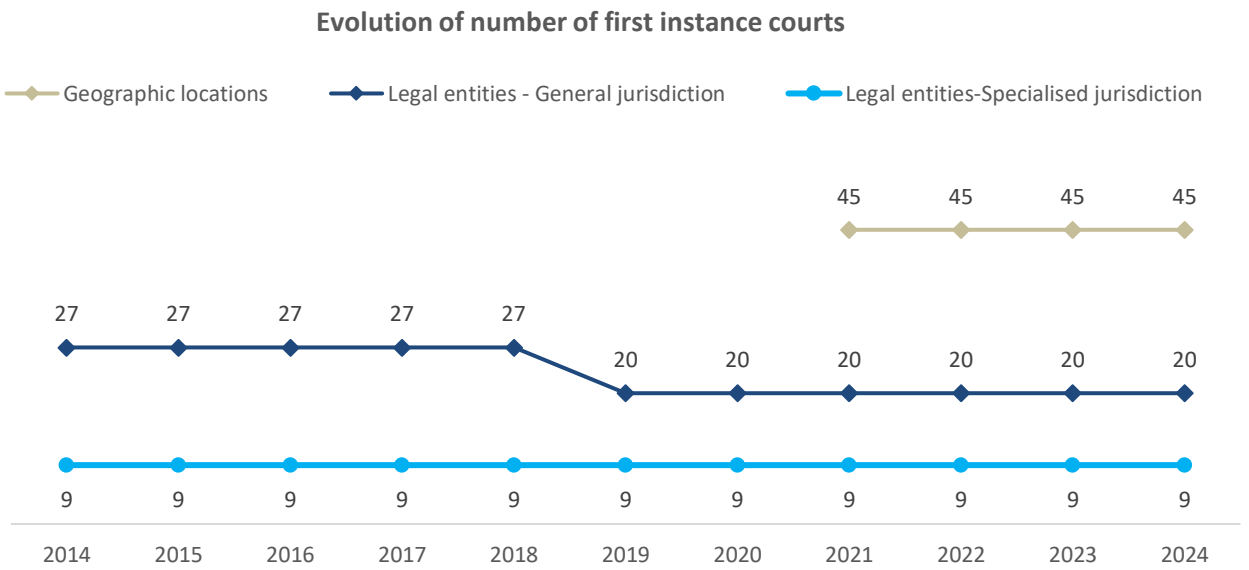

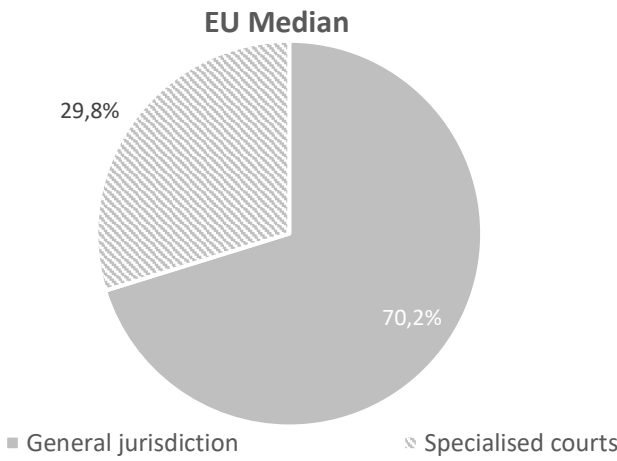
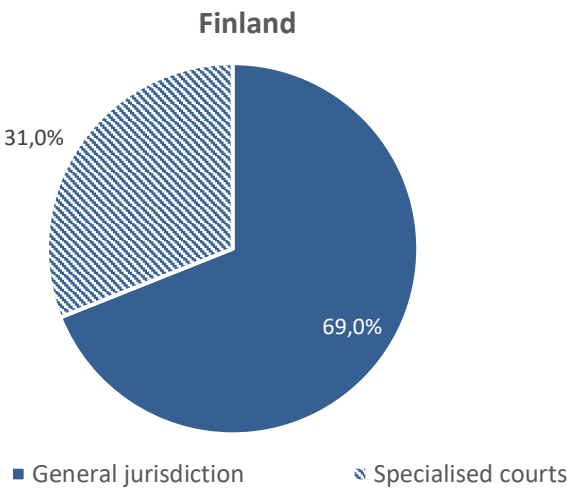

The number of general jurisdiction courts (legal entities) was reduced from 27 to 20 courts on 1 January 2019. A court can have more than one office. The number of the district court offices was also reduced from 57 to 36 offices.

The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Finland is 69,0% - 31,0%, which is very similar to the distribution tendency in EU (70,2% - 29,8%).

In Finland, there are six regional administrative courts, the Market Court, the Labour Court and the Insurance Court.

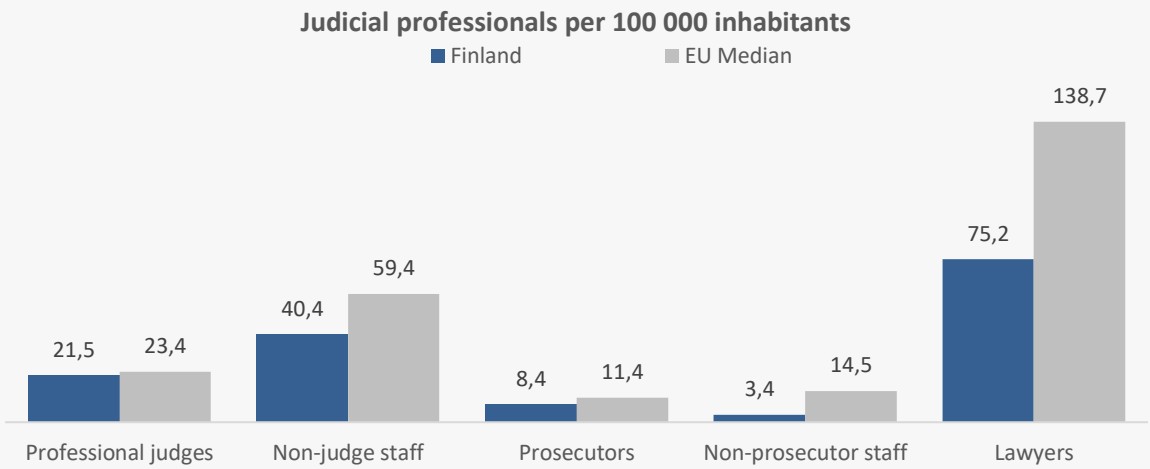
Another specialised court is the High Court of Impeachment that hears charges against ministers (i.e. members of the Government), the Chancellor of Justice, the Parliamentary Ombudsman and members of the Supreme Court or the Supreme Administrative Court for unlawful conduct in office. In addition, the High Court of Impeachment deals with charges concerning the criminal liability of the President of the Republic. However, it is convened only when necessary.

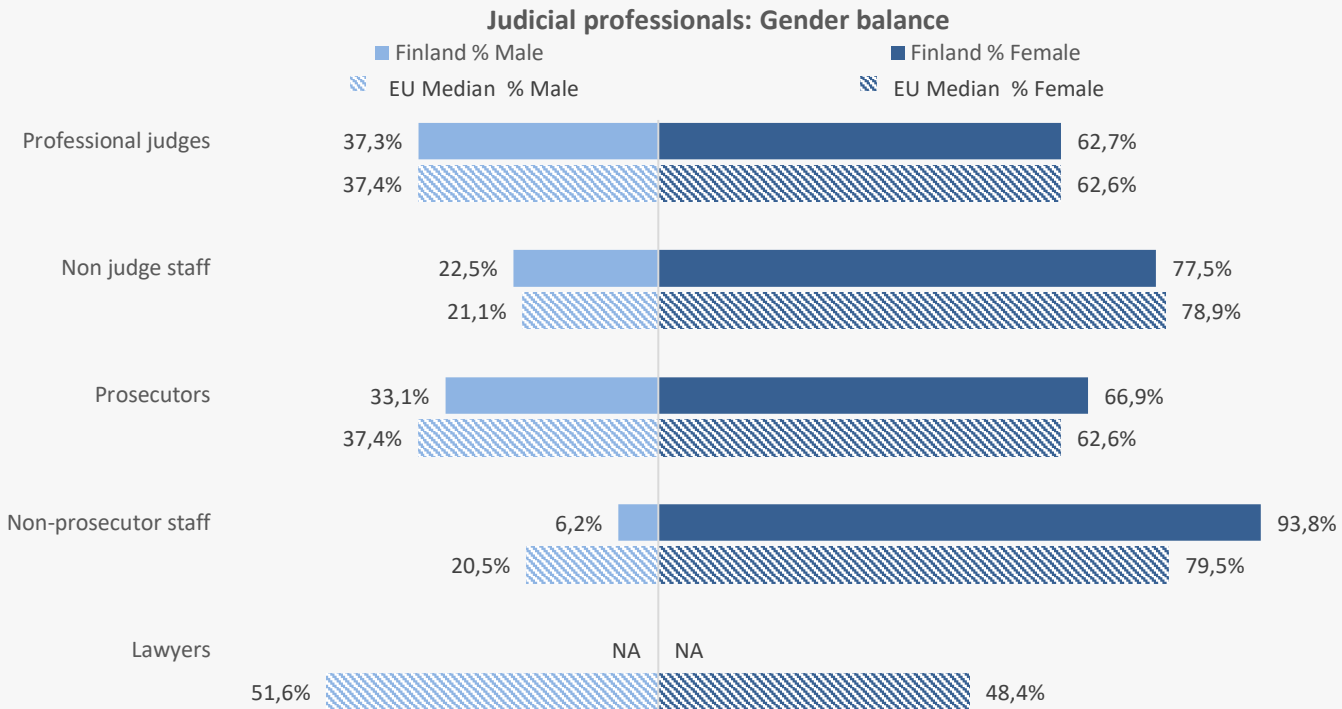

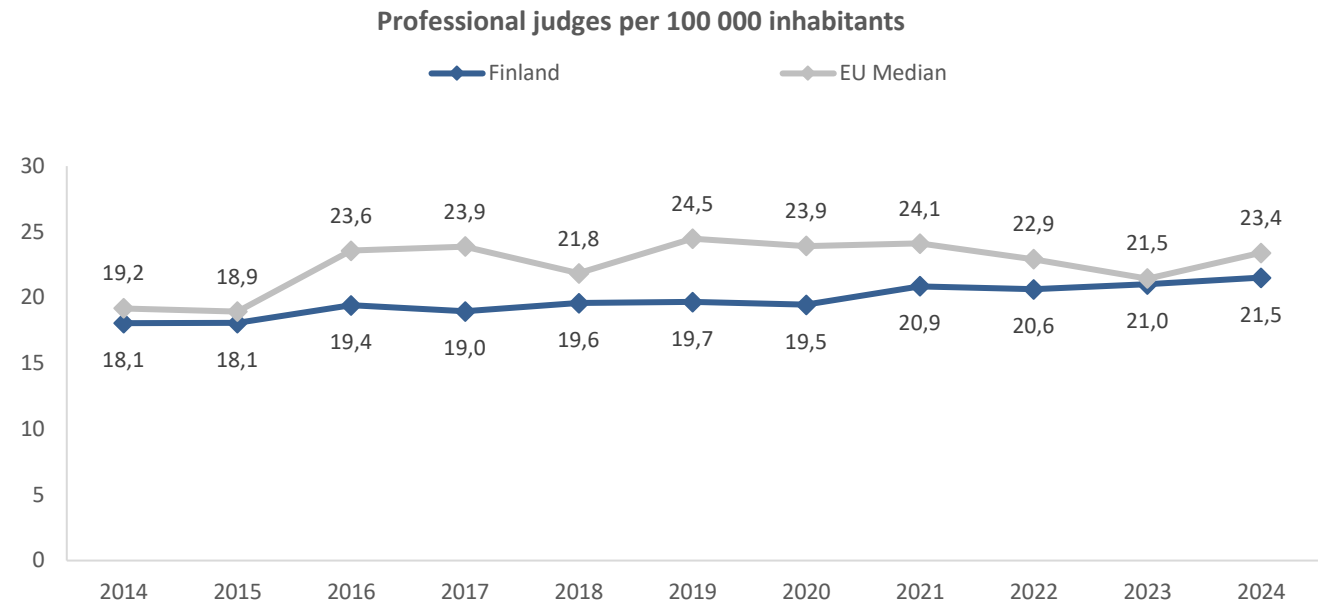

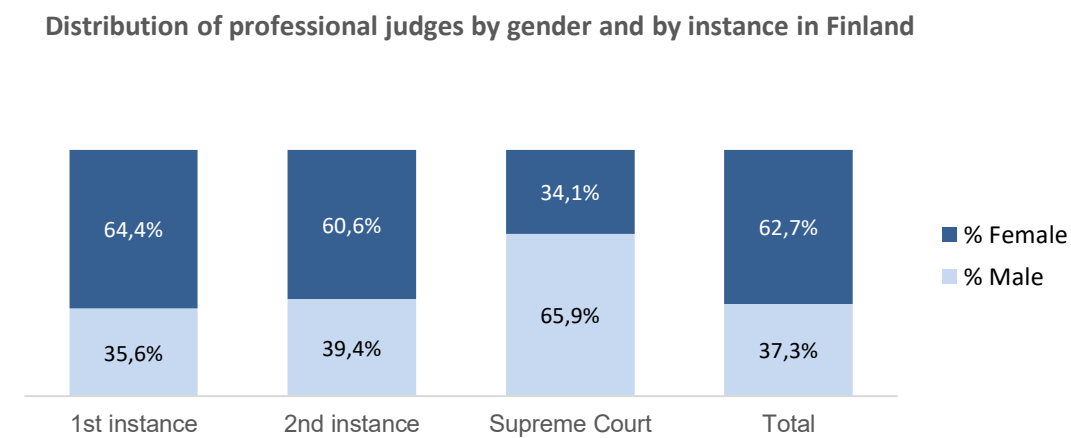
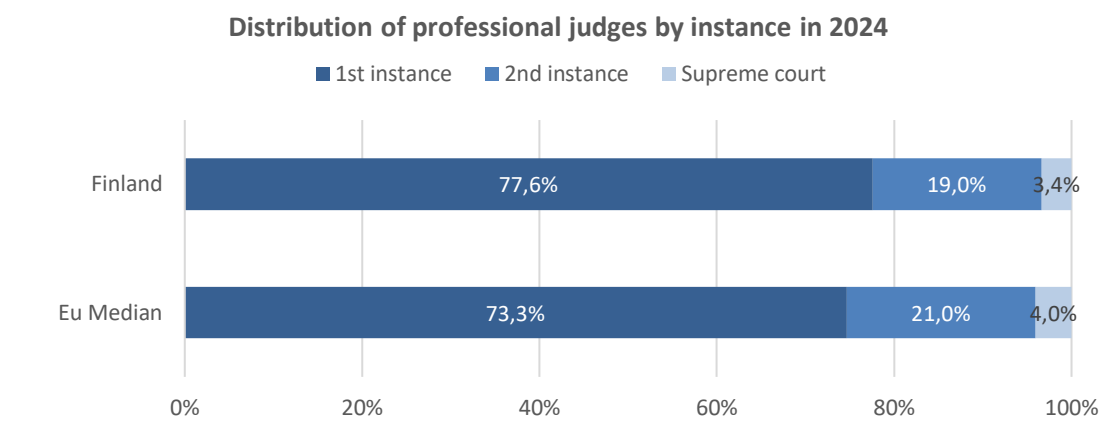


According to the 2024 data, in Finland, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) is 1 213, which is 2,8% more than in previous cycle.

Indeed, there are 21,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is slightly below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 760, which represents 62,7% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 941 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 606 are female); 231 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 140 are female) and 41 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 14 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Finland presents a siminla trend. While the percentage of first instance judges is slightly higher than the EU Median, the percentages of second and third instance judges fall a little below the EU Median.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that in the first and second instances there is a predominance of female judges (over 60%).Yet, at the Supreme Court, the percentage of female judges is far from reaching the 50% benchmark.

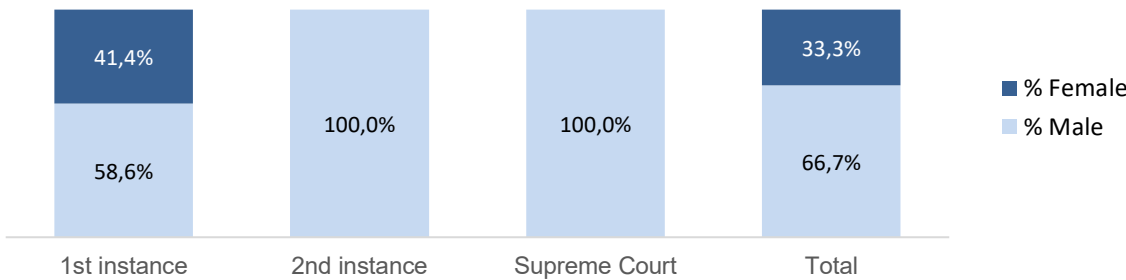

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Finland

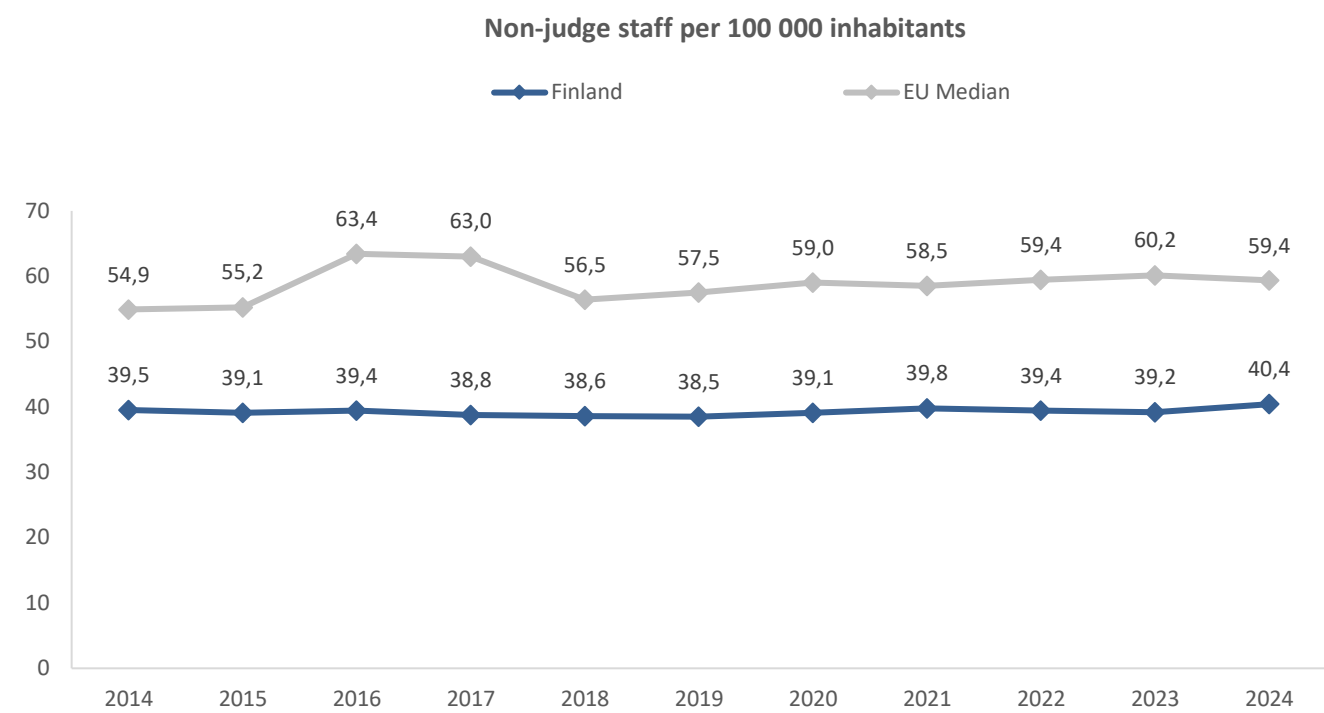


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 12, which represents 33,3% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 29 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 12 are female); 5 are sitting in second instance courts (none of which is female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (none of which is female).

In 2024, Finland has 2 278 non-judge staff (of whom 1 765 are female). The total number of non-judge staff has increased by 3,6% in comparison with the previous cycle.

The number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has also increased (from 39,2 in 2023 to 40,4 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants slightly increased from 21,0 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 21,5 in 2024.

The total non-judge staff includes office staff 1595, summoners 284, trainee district judges 145 and referendaries 254.

The Finnish court staff organisation does not correspond to the CEPEJ subcategories. Therefore, only the total of non-judge staff can be provided. The office staff has tasks mentioned in the categories above. Summoners' tasks are for example to serve summons, subpoenas and other documents. Trainee judges have the same responsibility as judges but they do not have competence to deal with difficult cases. They are always appointed for a fixed term period (one year). In the courts of appeal, the administrative courts, the Supreme Court, the Supreme Administrative Court, the Labour Court and the Market Court, a referendary prepares and presents a case to the judges but the final judgment is decided by the judges. The tasks of trainee judges and referendaries correspond to the categories 1 and 2. The senior judge of a district court may appoint in writing a member of the office personnel at the district court who has given an affirmation corresponding to the judge's affirmation, who has received sufficient training and who has sufficient skills to attend to the duties:

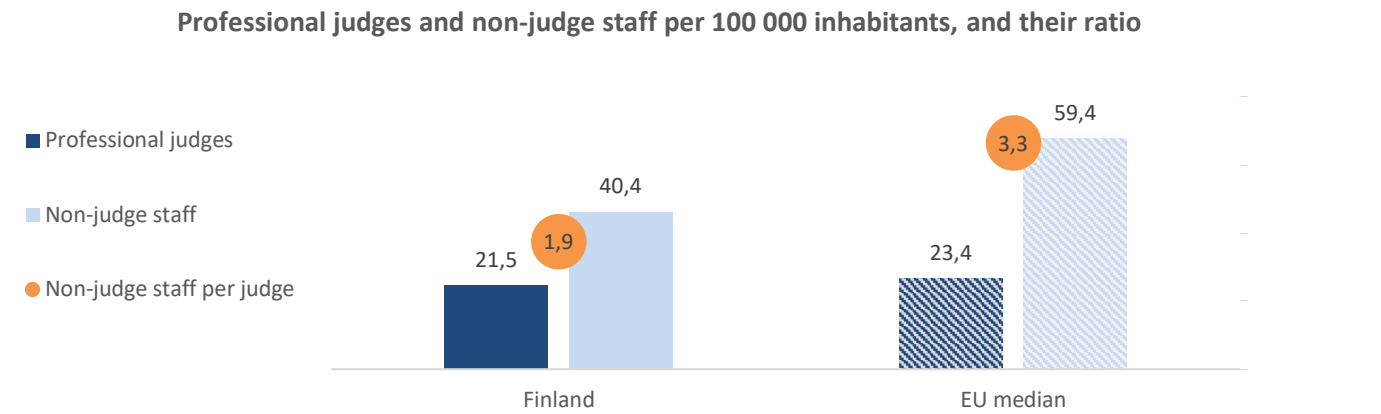
(1) in cases referred to in Chapter 5, section 3 of the Code of Judicial Procedure: (a) to give judgments by default; (b) to give, on the basis of Chapter 21, section 8(c) of the Code of Judicial Procedure, decisions and judgments on court costs, if the respondent has conceded the claim; (c) to decide on the staying of an action if the plaintiff has withdrawn the action and the respondent does not call for a decision in the case;

(2) to decide on applications for divorce on the basis of section 25, subsection 1 of the Marriage Act (234/1929) if both spouses are domiciled in Finland. If the case to be decided by office personnel, as referred to in subsection 1, proves to be extensive, subject to interpretation or otherwise difficult to decide, the case shall be transferred for a decision of a notary or a legally trained judge at the district court.

The chief judge of a district court may appoint in writing a member of the office personnel at the district court who has sufficient skills, to issue summons and certificates, to effect service of documents and to attend to other duties connected to the preparation, consideration or enforcement of administration of justice matters. Before taking such tasks the staff member must give an oath. (Courts Act, Chapter 19, Section 6).

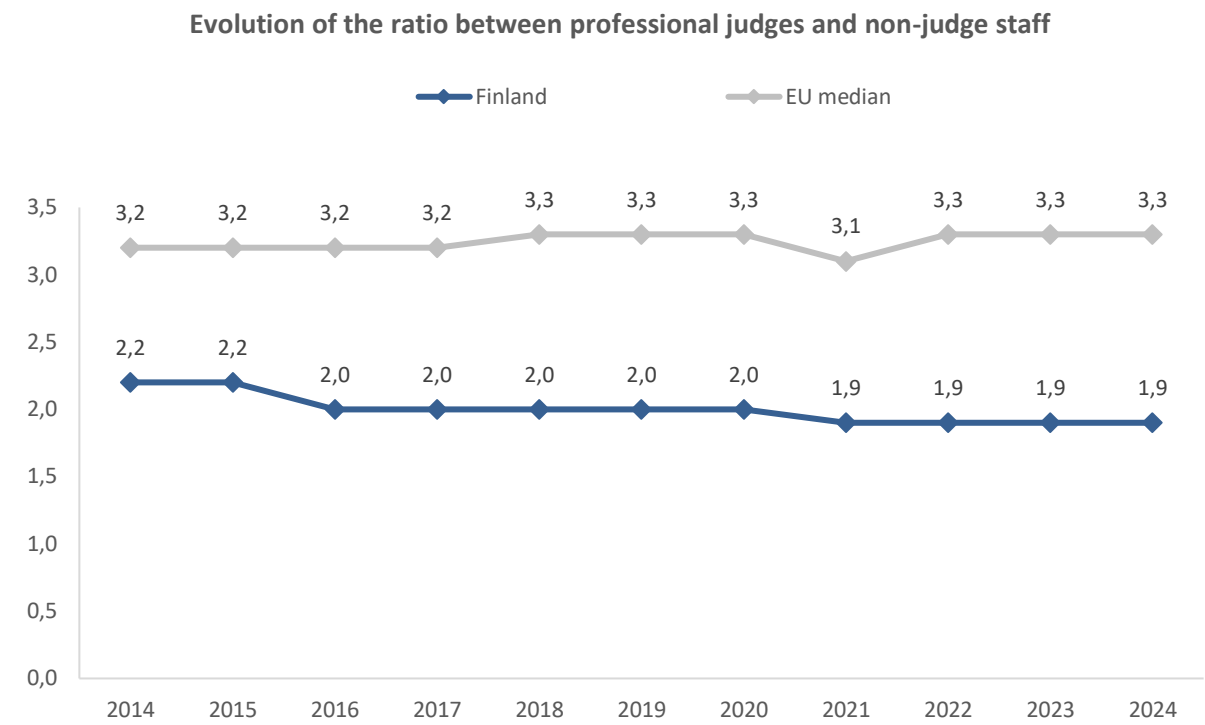

In Finland, there are 21,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants). In 2024, there were 1,9 non-judge staff per judge which is well below the EU Median of 3,3.

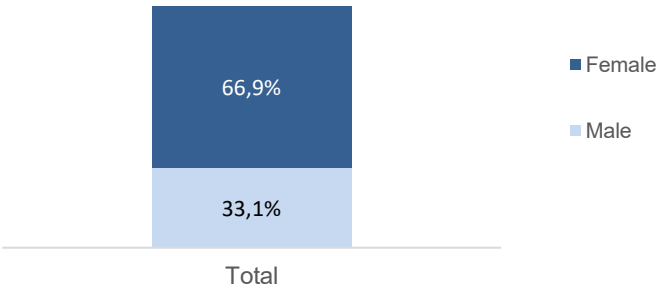

In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 315, which represents 66,9% of the total number of prosecutors. Prosecutors in Finland are not bound on Court instances, and every prosecutor is expected to, in a normal situation, to handle and prosecute the criminal case all the way to the Supreme Court, if needed.

The National Prosecution Authority comprises the Office of the Prosecutor General that acts as the general administrative unit, and five prosecution districts: Southern Finland, Western Finland, Northern Finland, Eastern Finland and Åland. The National Prosecution Authority has 34 offices around Finland.

The Prosecutor General is the supreme prosecutor and the head of the prosecution service. The Prosecutor General directs and develops prosecutorial activity by issuing general instructions and guidelines to the prosecutors. She/he also appoints district prosecutors. The Prosecutor General may take over a case from a prosecutor, but cannot order a prosecutor to decide the case in any given manner. She/he can also self-decide on the bringing of charges and designate a prosecutor to pursue the case in the courts.

The Deputy Prosecutor General decides the matters in his/her competence on the same authority as the Prosecutor General. He/she also acts as a deputy for the Prosecutor General when necessary.

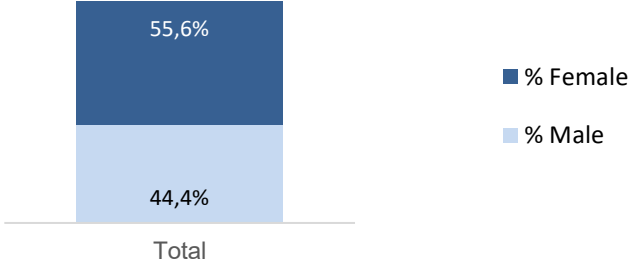
For regular prosecutorial tasks, the Office of the Prosecutor General has state prosecutors whose jurisdiction covers the entire country. Most criminal matters (about 91 300 cases annually) are dealt with by the prosecution. The Office of the Prosecutor General deals mainly with criminal cases with wider significance to society as a whole, a few dozen every year.

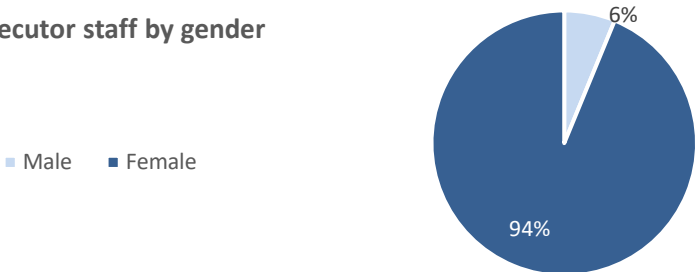

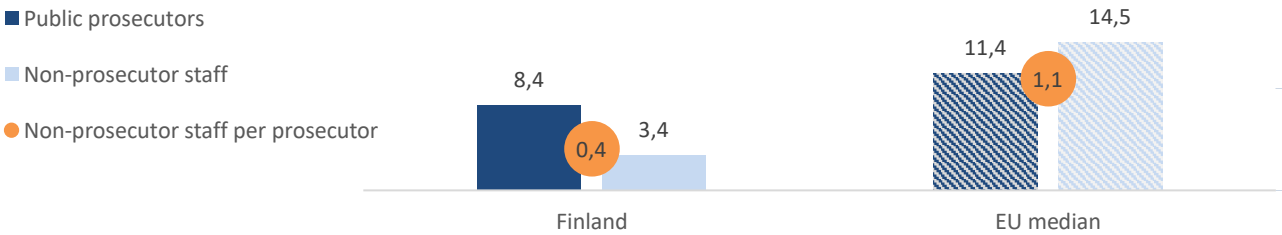
Non-prosecutor staff by gender

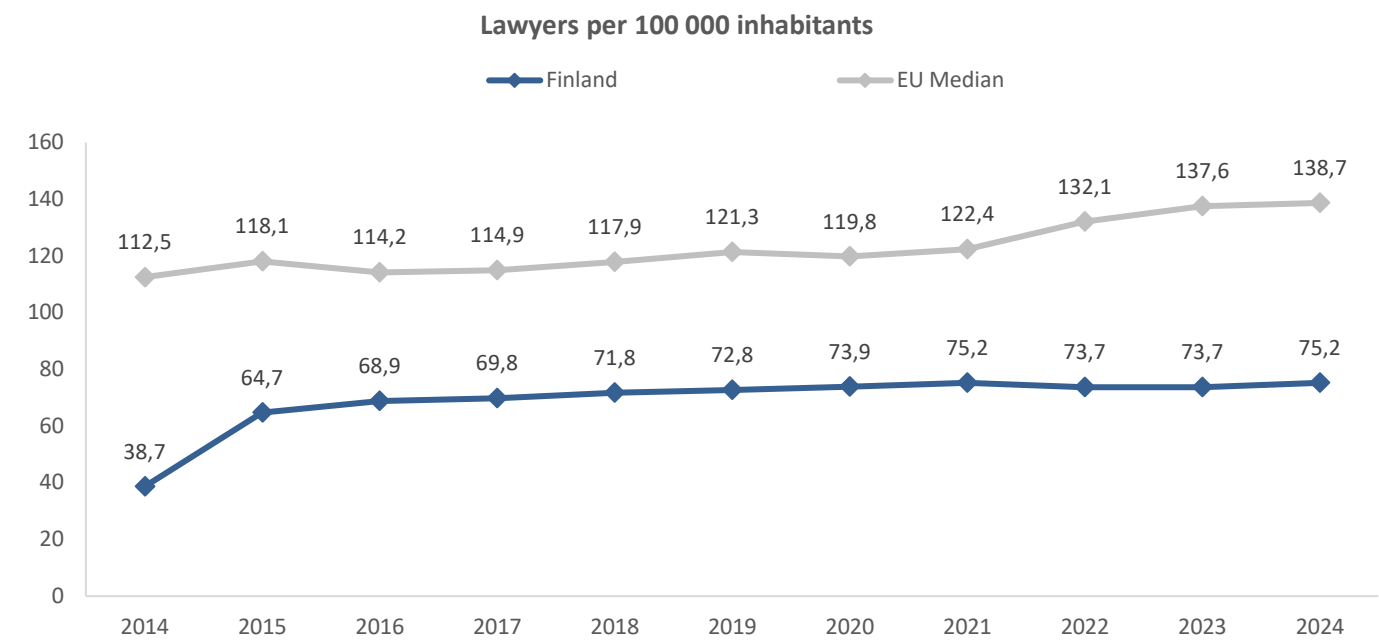
Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

In 2024, there are 4 240 lawyers, which is 2,5% more than in 2023. The number includes 2 359 attorneys (i.e. members of the Finnish Bar Association), 1 775 licensed trial counsels and 200 public legal aid attorneys. From the public legal aid attorneys 94 were simultaneously members of the Finnish Bar Association.

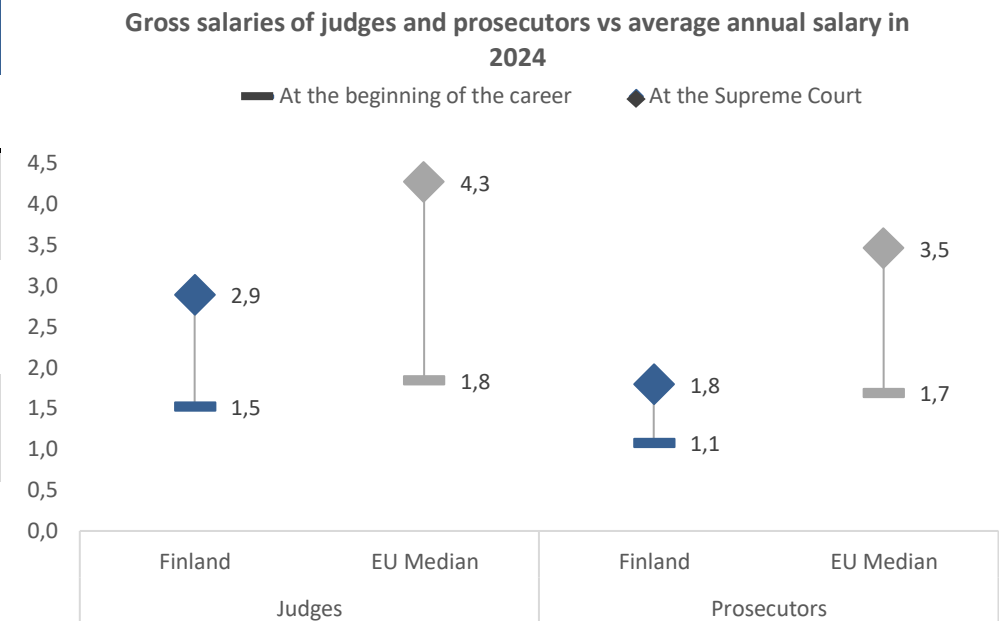
Finland has 75,2 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

Since 2014, only attorneys-at-law, public legal aid lawyers and licenced legal counsels are allowed to represent a client in court. In addition, in-house lawyers can represent their company in court. Lawyers working for trade unions can represent a client in a district court and in the Labour Court in disputes regarding employment relationship. Lawyers working for public authorities can represent the public authority in court.

In order to qualify as an attorney-at-law, a lawyer needs to have at least four years of work experience and must pass the demanding three-part professional qualification test known as the bar examination. The titles of attorney-at-law and attorney's office are protected by law and can only be used by lawyers accepted into the Finnish Bar Association. Attorney's offices employ also associate lawyers, that is lawyers who are not yet members of the bar.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 80 761€ in Finland, which is quite above the EU median of 61 347€ (32% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,5 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. The Finland's absolute gross salaries for judges of the Supreme Court is 152 787€, 26% above the EU median of 121 591€.

For the public prosecutors, the EU range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career is 56 900€ in Finland, which is slightly above the EU median of 52 969€ (7% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,1 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. The Finland's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 95 000€, 1% above the EU median of 94 385€.

In Finland, there are several salary categories for judges. The salary depends also on the years of work experience.

At the end of 2024 first instance judge is in a salary category T11 in which the gross salary is from 5 415,2 €/month to 7 039,76€/month depending on his/her experience. A permanent first instance judge T13 has usually at least nine years of work experience which means the salary is 6 036,11 €/month(minimum 5 487,37 maximum 7 133,58).

In Finland, the taxation is progressive so the information on net salary varies from person to person and is not available.

There are several salary categories for prosecutors. Prosecutors salaries are based on three components: task-specific , personal component and component based on the years of employment. At the start of the career prosecutors usually start at the lower levels of task-specific paylevels, as well as the component based on years of employment is lower. The personal componet is increased by the improvement of the personal capability. Experienced professionals usually have higher levels in all three components.

In criminal cases, the primary means to compensate excessive length of proceedings for a convicted person is to reduce the sentence. Therefore the number of compensation paid does not reflect the whole picture of the cases where the proceeding has taken too long. For excessive length the compensation is 1500 euro/unduly delayed year, maximum 10.000 euro, which may be exceeded if there are special circumstances. The information on wrongful arrest and wrongful conviction are compiled together.

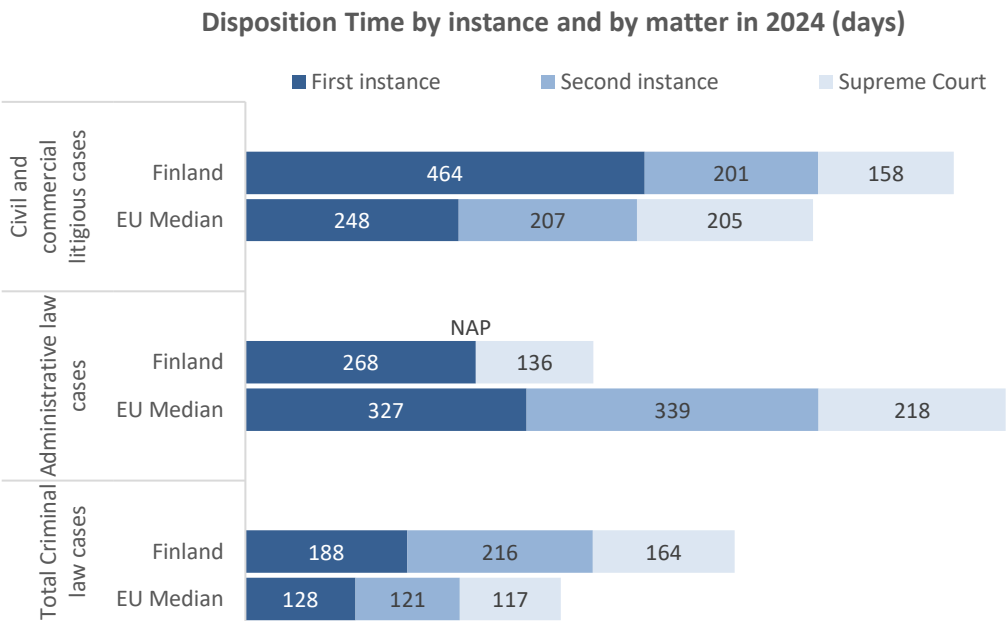
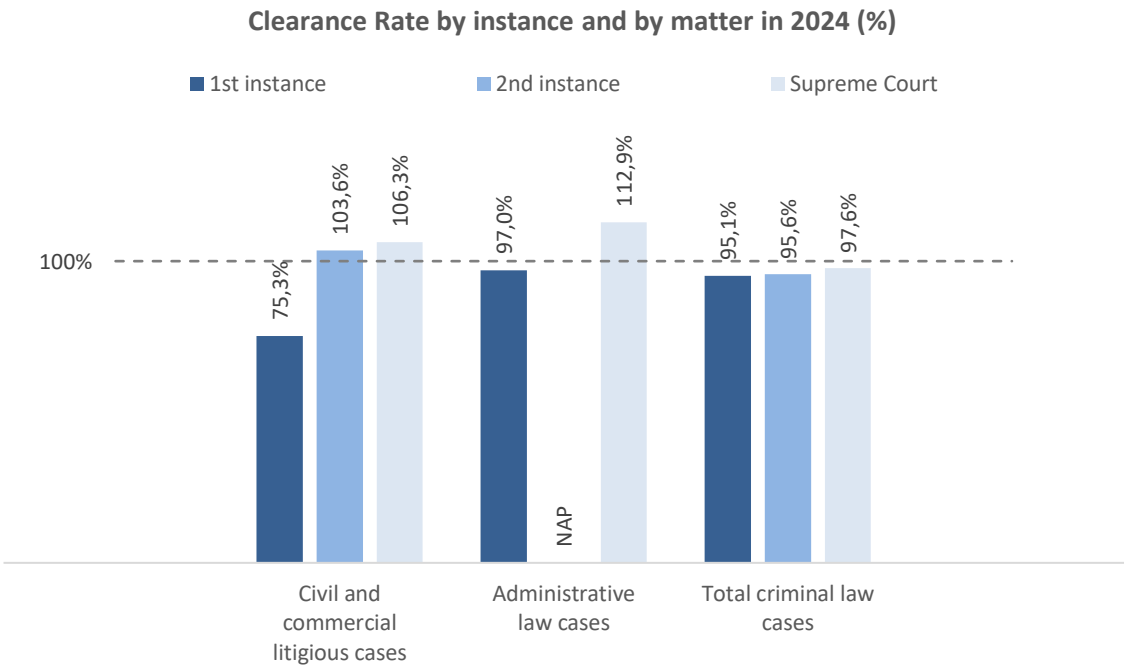

In 2024, the Disposition Time (DT) for both civil and commercial litigious cases and total criminal law cases is above the EU median, while the administrative cases are resolved faster than the EU median. The Clearance Rate (CR) surpasses the 100% benchmark only for 3 instances: first and second instance civil and commercial litigious cases and third instance administrative cases).

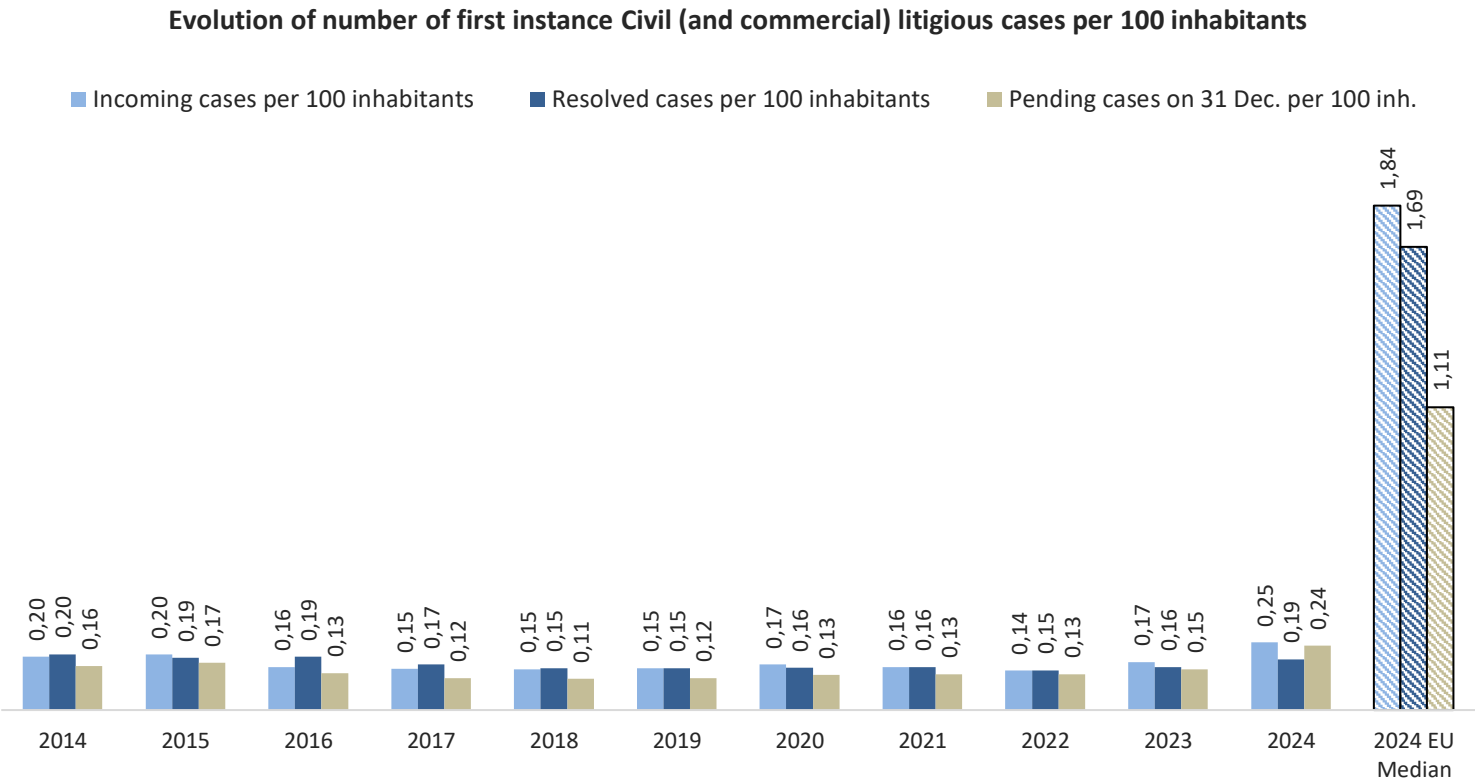
In particular, the first instance civil and commercial litigious cases take the longest to conclude, with a DT of 464 days (compared to the EU Median of 248 days). The Finish courts have indeed seen a dramatic increase of the DT for this type of cases over the recent years, accompanied by the decline of the CR from over 100% in 2022 to 75,3% in 2024. The growth of summary civil cases appears to have negatively impacted the courts' efficiency for this type of cases.

Moreover, the courts dealing with criminal law cases have experienced a surge of incoming cases, primarily due to a significant so-called Vastaamo criminal case, which involves an unusually large number of plaintiffs. As a result, the CR is below 100% benchmark, and the DT exceeds the EU Median in all instances.

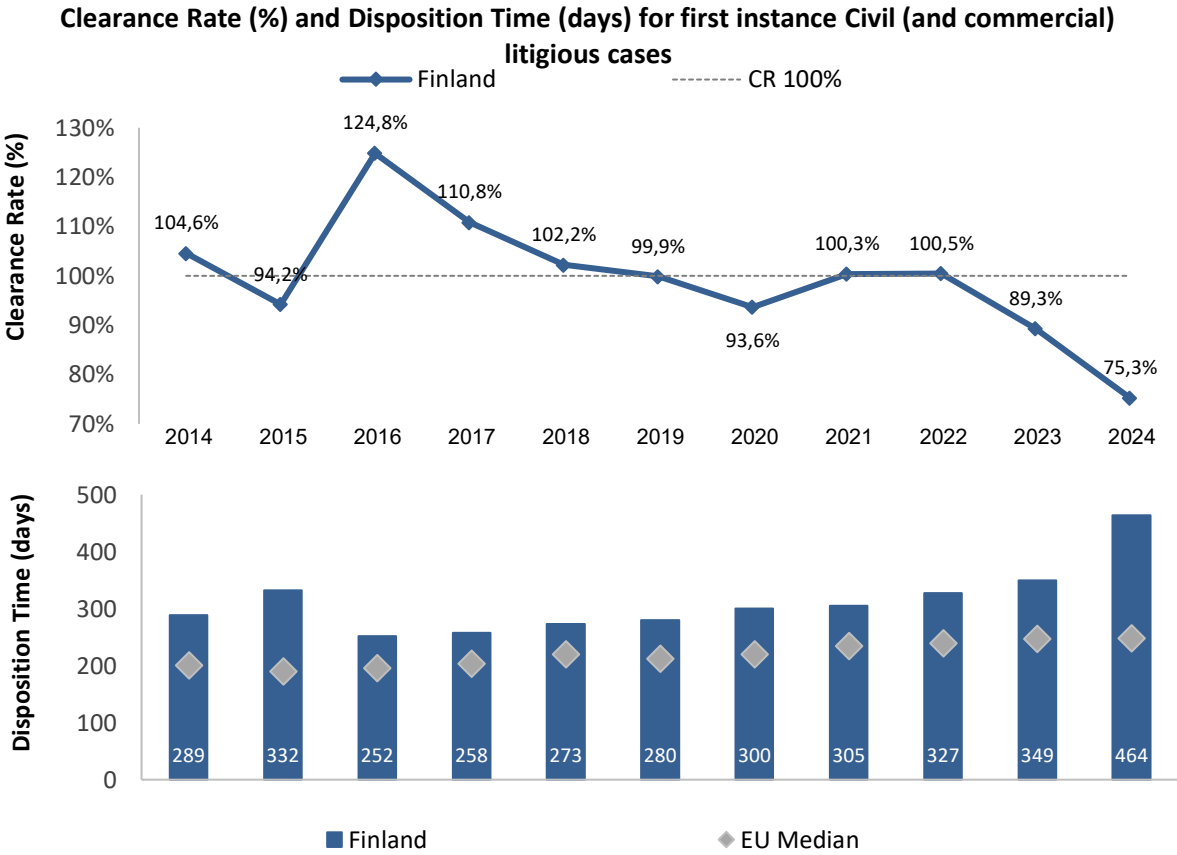

The number of pending cases at the end of 2024 are also remarkably below the EU median (0,24 vs 1,11 per 100 inhabitants).

As mentioned above, the rise in summary civil cases seems to have diminished the efficiency of courts in handling this category of cases. Summary civil cases are undisputed civil cases that are decided by a district court in summary procedure, in other words in the written procedure. Such cases include undisputed debt collection cases, such as cases concerning unpaid rents, consumer credits and phone and electricity bills, as well as undisputed cases concerning evictions, restoration of possession or a disrupted circumstance. Summary proceedings can be initiated at a district court with an application for a summons that contains less information than what is required for other civil proceedings. The prerequisite for using the less detailed application for a summons is that the plaintiff, i.e. the creditor, has stated that to his or her knowledge the matter is not under dispute.

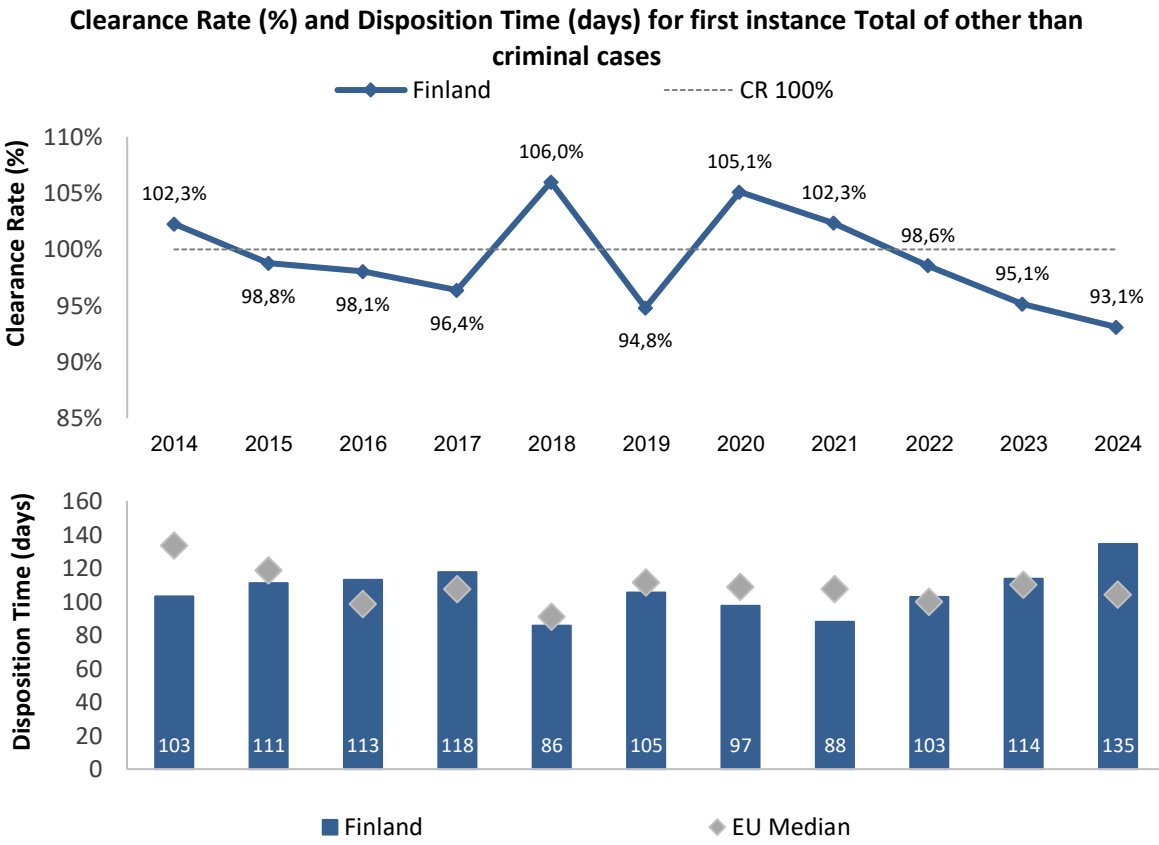

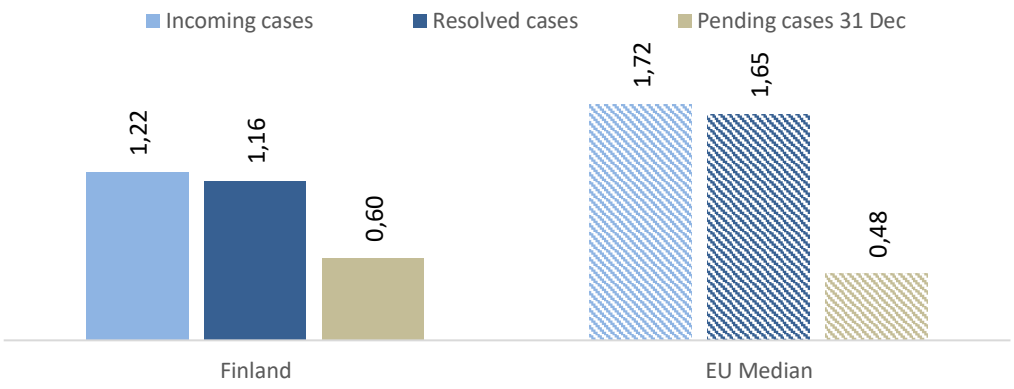

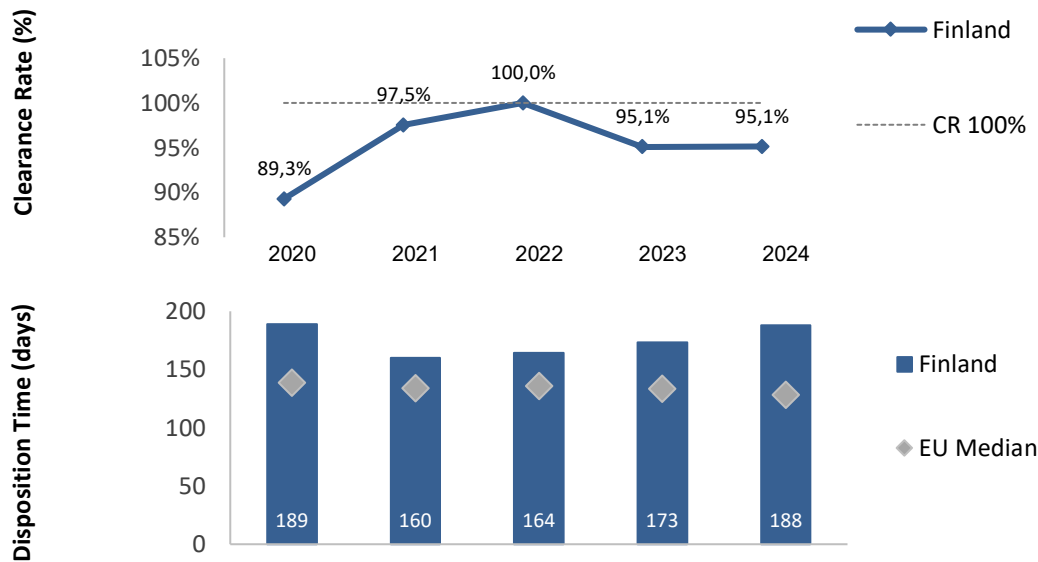

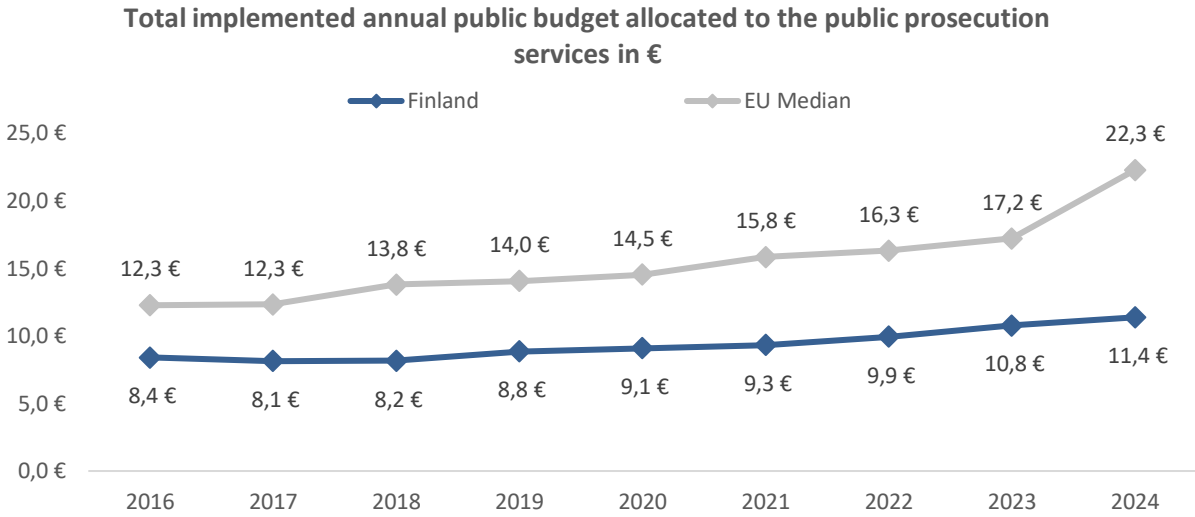

In Finland, there are not accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation.

A specific training is required for judges who want to become mediators. The training is not an actual legal requirement, but it is a general rule to get special training in order to mediate.

In Finland, there is no accredited or registered mediator for court-related mediations. Even the training is not actual legal requirement, but it's a general rule to get a training before carrying out a mediation.

There are two different kind of training paths, depending which kind of cases are mediated, civil cases or custody dispute. Criminal cases cannot be mediated.

In civil cases, the training is targeted to judges only and it consist of 3 parts, totally 6 days. First part is a 3-days training and is done before you start mediation, 2 others are done while you have mediated some time (year/ 2 years). First training includes basic theories about mediation, examples, structure of the process and practise. Two latter trainings are basically to deepen your skills.

Child dispute mediation training is meant for judges and auxiliaries. Training path consists from 5 different trainings, some targeted to judges, some to auxiliaries and some are joint trainings total 8 days. Training includes basic mediation theory, custody dispute theory/law, child law/ child rights, practise etc.

Comments on writing assistance tools
The Finnish case management systems HAIPA and AIPA use Word as the writing assistance tool.
Along with the introduction of the AIPA system in 2024, electronic signature has been possible also in criminal matters.

Comments on recording of court hearings
In criminal and civil matters only the witness testimonial is recorded.
In 2026, new legislation will enter into force, after which a video and audio recording will be made of evidence taken in district courts instead of the previous audio recording.

8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in Finland (2024 data)

In Finland, quality standards are not determined at national level but there is a person responsible for implementation of these quality standards.

There are no quality standards covering the whole judiciary in Finland. Instead, there are several quality projects going on, for example the Quality Project of the Administrative Courts, which started in 2020 and concerns all administrative courts in Finland. The Rovaniemi Court of Appeal Quality Projects have produced quality benchmarks, which evaluate the quality of the adjudication in courts of law. Last assessment was conducted in 2020.

The speed and consistency of prosecutors' work are monitored through statistics and by their supervisors. Additionally, special quality work is carried out, which defines quality matters.

Nationwide and departmental working groups formed for prosecutors evaluate and set quality standards.

A court can decide whether it sets quantitative performance targets for each judge. There are targets set for each judge in some courts.

The National Courts Administration negotiates annually with each court in order to set targets and objectives for the court for the next year. An allocation of permanent staff and possible additional temporary judges or other staff is decided upon these negotiations but within the state budget. Timeframe (length of proceedings) targets are also set. Possible issues and problems with developing the activities of the court are also discussed. Finally, the appropriation to cover the annual costs of the court operations is agreed. A minutes of the negotiation is written and it includes the targets, objectives and estimated workloads for the court for the next year. The chief justices of the courts can then apply this results-based management system in their respective courts as they see appropriate.
