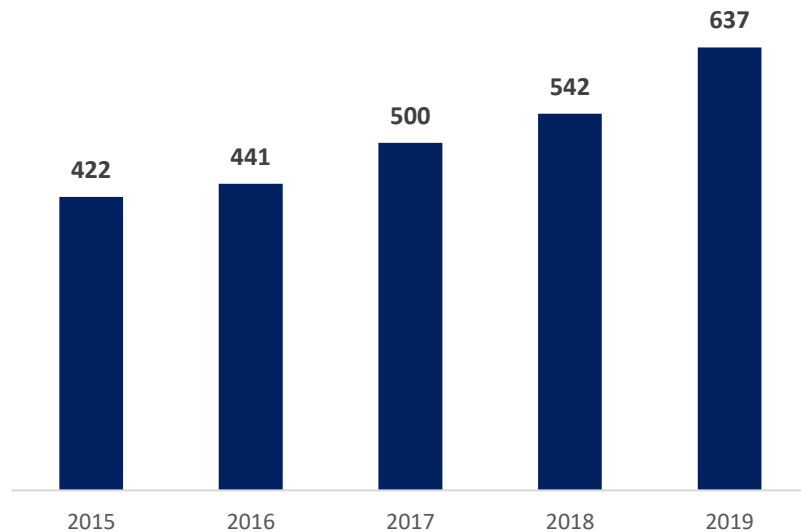
The production of series has steadily increased in Europe

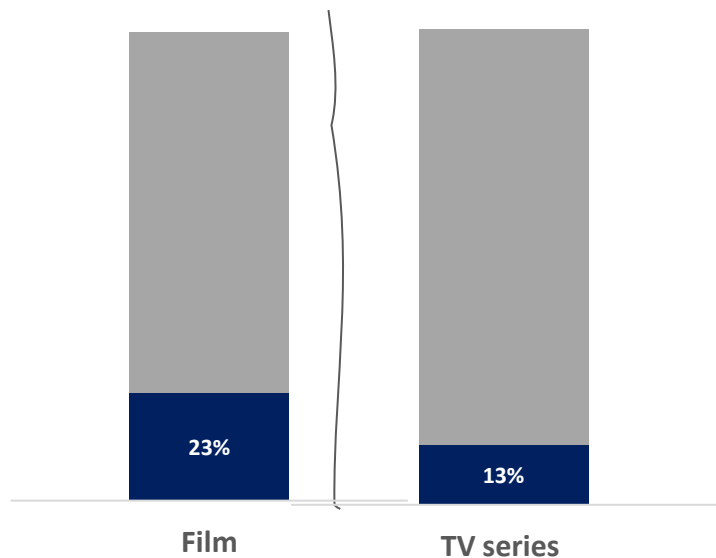


Few international coproductions

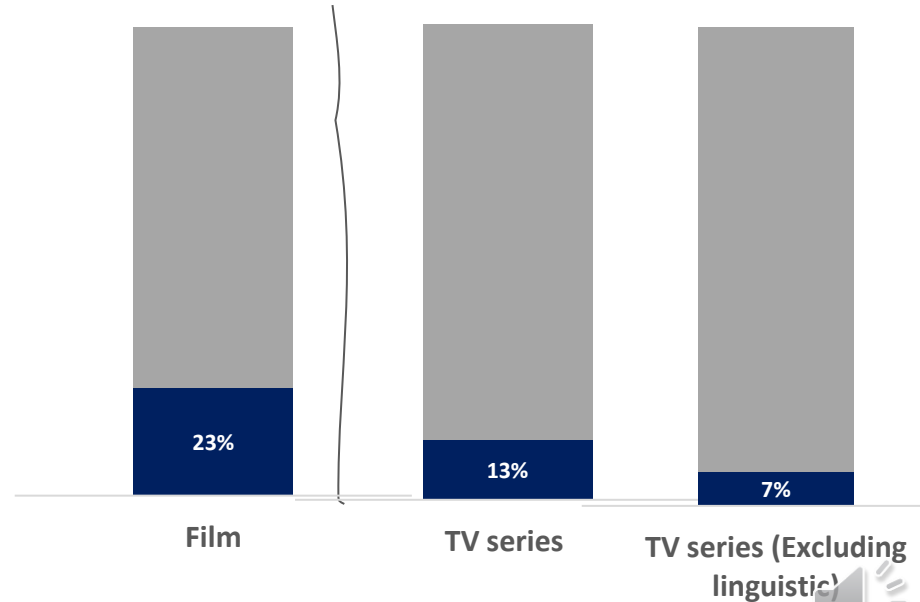


Even fewer “non-linguistic coproductions”

In %.

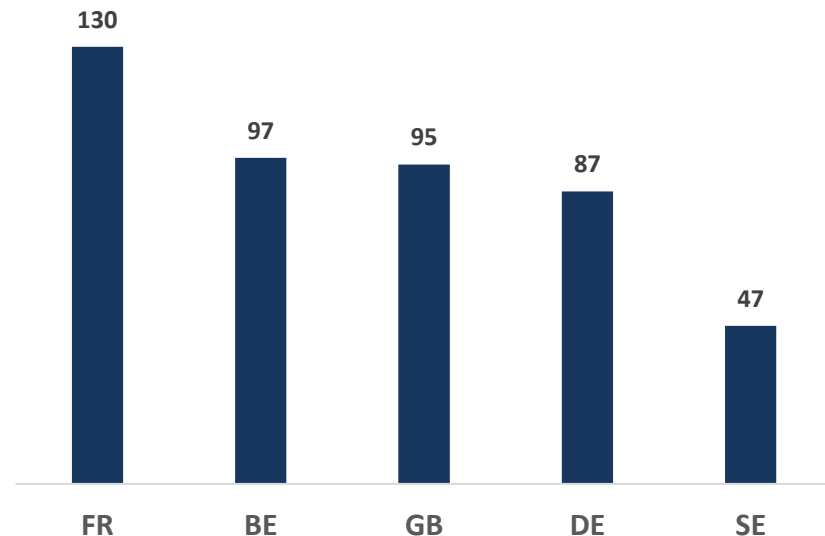

The Top 5 coproducing countries...apparently

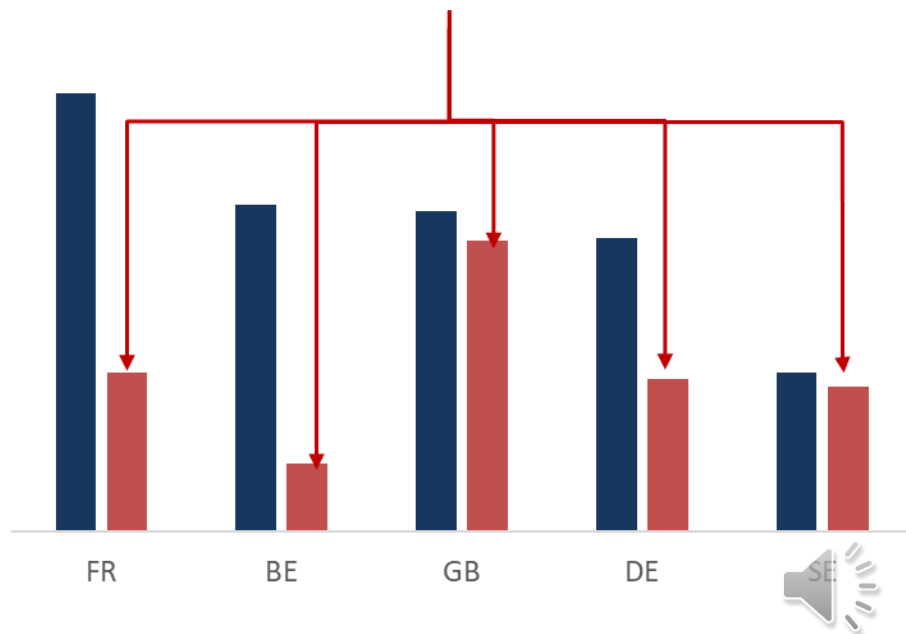
Top coproducing countries (maj. and min.)

But France and Belgium mainly coproduce together, and Germany mainly coproduces with Austria...

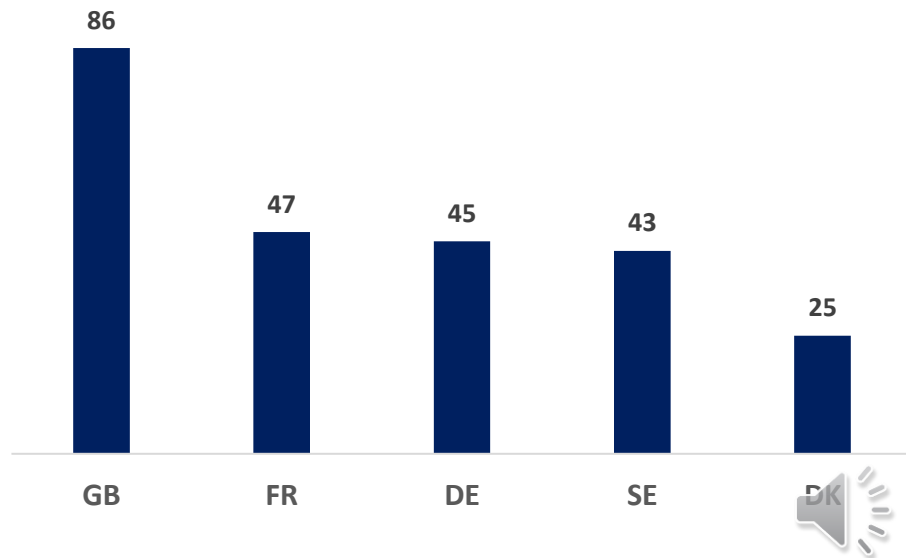

Excl. linguistic coproductions



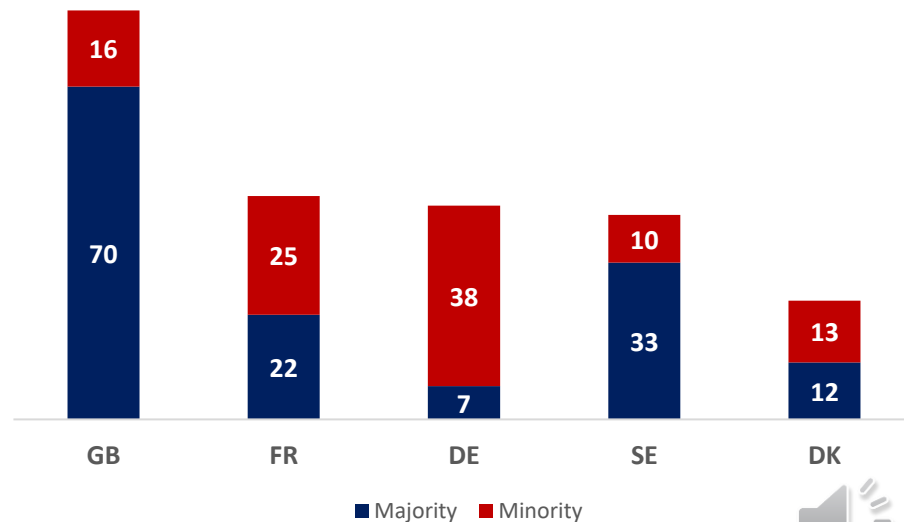

Who produces with whom? Some insights

- 1. UK the driving force for coproductions within Europe and with the US*
- 2. The Scandinavian « coproductions » have opened-up to more partners in Europe (notably Germany)*
- 3. Proportionally few coproductions in Italy and Spain*
- 4. Outside Scandinavia, « smaller » countries primarily coproduce with larger neighbouring countries sharing the same language.*
