



European Route of Jewish Heritage

Network Overcoming Antisemitism Seminars

Summary

NOA (Networks Overcoming Antisemitism) explored multiple ways of dealing with antisemitism, counting among its main objectives the dissemination of positive narratives through socio-cultural educational activities towards diversity and Jewish culture, as well as with training and teaching tools that effectively counter antisemitic prejudice, aside others. The seminars were focused on ways to connect the non-Jewish society to the Jewish life and culture. The approaches explored along the seminars were based on several cultural expressions as gastronomy, music, architecture, and literature, especially regarding the influence by the context to the Jewish communities' culture, and the opposite way, from the communities towards their context; the historical and geopolitical deals in the antisemitism in the western Balkans, and how the role of young people may contribute in the future to fight against it; the value of medieval Hispano-Hebrew literature and the reality of Spanish society in the 16th and 17th c. because of the Jewish convert phenomenon; how educational programs led by cultural institutions can provide teachers, students and citizens of a more open minded approach to the Jewish culture, history and society; and, finally, about the artistic influence of every cultural context depicted on the synagogues architecture, which is a huge example of the cultural exchange of Jewish communities along centuries with their local society, in the Cordoba's, Florence's and Bohemia-Moravia's synagogues.

Main objectives

Developing seminars for local people, opened to Jewish and non-Jewish, on how to deal with antisemitism in several different ways.
