Conference "The woman of the ancient Mediterranean"



Summary

With the conference "The woman of the ancient Mediterranean. From past to present, a key to understanding", organized by the Phoenicians' Route, thanks to a grant by the General Directorate for Education, Research and Cultural Institutes of the Italian Ministry of Culture, held on January 29th, 2022 at the MANN - National Archaeological Museum of Naples, a critical reflection has been launched on the role of women and on the female figure, starting from the ancient civilizations of the Mediterranean to arrive at contemporaneity. The Conference was broadcast online simultaneously on the Facebook pages of the Phoenicians' Route and the MANN, reaching more than 4,000 spectators. Furthermore, the publication of the Conference Proceedings was carried out, also available on the website www.fenici.net. To reinforce the reflection and the actualization of the theme today, The Phoenicians' Route will present a Gender Agenda, the first created by a Cultural Route of the Council of Europe, to which a space will be dedicated on the institutional website.

Main objectives

To promote a critical reflection on the role of women and the female figure, starting from ancient Mediterranean civilisations and arriving at contemporary times. The female figure was also analysed in its relationship with the other and other cultures, assuming and consolidating the communicative competence underlying the relational dimension. Finally, we started from the past to arrive at a reading of the present and the role of women in today's Mediterranean, with a view to intercultural dialogue, the theme underlying the Phoenicians' Route.
