Background & Legal Framework

- Based on European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR), CPT, Biomedicine Convention.
- Builds upon previous recommendations (2004, 2006, 2010, 2017, 2008).
- Focus: dignity, human rights, and equivalence of care in penal systems.

Scope & Definitions

- Applies to adult prisoners and probationers.
- Children under 18: special provisions apply.
- Definitions:
- Prisoners = incarcerated individuals (European Prison Rules)
- Probationers = under supervision (Probation Rules)
- Mental disorder = clinically significant disturbances

General Principles

- Timely mental health care with respect for dignity.
- Gender and cultural sensitivity in services.
- Care equivalent to general population.
- Clear information on access to services.
- No solitary confinement for mental health reasons.

Promoting & Protecting Mental Health

- Supportive, informed environment.
- Mental health education and early access to services.
- Social determinants addressed.
- Physical activity, arts, prosocial support encouraged.
- Protective measures: substance use, crisis services, systemic reforms.

Managing Mental Disorders

- Mandatory screening at entry/transition points.
- Comprehensive mental health assessments.
- Multidisciplinary, consent-based treatment.
- Inclusion of substance abuse treatment and harm reduction.
- Therapeutic response to mental health crises.

Staff, Training, and Data

- Support staff dealing with mental health duties.
- Training on mental health care and crisis response.
- Collect anonymized data on prevalence, suicide, self-harm.
- Encourage research and evidence-based policy development.
