1. Presentation of the functioning of the judicial system in Greece

In Greece there are 289 first instance courts of general jurisdiction. The accurate number of first instance specialized courts encompassing administrative courts, military courts and other courts is not available.

According to the Greek Constitution there are three categories of courts: civil, criminal and administrative. The Supreme Court of the civil and penal justice is the Court of Cassation, while the Supreme Court of the administrative justice is the Council of State.

Civil cases are judged at first instance by the District courts or the courts of first instance, according to the estimated value of the matter disputed at law. At second instance, cases are dealt with by the courts of first instance or the courts of appeal, again according to the estimated value of the matter disputed at law. At third instance, cases are judged by the Court of Cassation. Cases concerning employment dismissal follow a special procedure and are dealt with at first instance by the Department of Labour Disputes of the single-member first instance court and on appeal by the competent court of appeal.

The merit of an administrative act can be contested before the administrative courts (of first instance and of appeal) through legal remedies of the recourse or of the suit. In the other cases they must be appealed against with the legal remedy of the writ of annulment and are under the jurisdiction either of the Council of State or of the Administrative Court of appeal. There are in total 319 courts as geographic locations.

As first instance specialised courts, in Greece, there are 30 administartive courts, as well as military courts and some other specialised courts. The Greek Constitution is reluctant to provide in the Greek legal system special courts. Instead, within the first instance courts and courts of appeal of large cities, there are special Chambers, where the task of adjudicating in special categories of law (e.g. family law, commercial law, etc.) is assigned. Judges entrusted with such duties have usually the correspondent specific studies. As far as other special courts are concerned, special provisions regulate the operation of courts for juveniles, military, navy and air force courts.



According to 2019 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Greece is 2 884 which is 0,3% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Greece, in 2019 there are 26,9 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 24,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 1,5 non-judge staff per judge (in previous cycle this ratio was at 1,5 non-judge staff per judge).


In Greece, in this cycle there are 4 284 non-judge staff (among which 3 283 females). Comparisson with previous cycle reveals an increase of 2,5%.

In the light of the data relevant for the judges, it is possible to notice that in 2019 the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 38,9 in 2018 to 39,9 in 2019).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolves from 26,8 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2018 to 26,9 in 2019.




In 2019, there are 42 500 lawyers, which is 1,0% less than in 2018.

This data of 396,3 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants in 2019 is above the EU median of 121,3 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

3. Access to justice

∘ Legal aid

The total annual approved public budget to legal aid is 21 296 725 \in (2,0 \in per capita).

The total annual implemented public budget to legal aid is 7 561 650 € (0,7 € per capita).

The distribution of the total annual approved public budget allocated to legal aid cannot be carried out in respect of criminal and other than criminal cases, as well as cases brought to court and cases not brought to court.

The difference in the approved and implemented budget is because the approved budget concerns economic obligations not only of 2019 but also of previous years.

In Greece, legal aid is avaiable for :



Exoneration from paying court fees in civil and commercial cases covers court bailiffs' fees.

Article 9 par. 2 and 3 of law 3226/2004: Exemption of court fees in civil and commercial cases, of payment of a bailiff as well as the costs of the enforcement procedure.

Regarding "criminal cases", the ex officio appointment of a lawyer is provided. Furthermore, if an expert's opinion is considered by the court to be necessary then the relevant costs are covered by the State.

With regard to administrative courts, there is not any such legislative provision, while in civil and commercial cases legal aid is granted for expert fees.

Other costs might be provided for payment of a lawyer, notary, bailiff, witness.

In criminal cases:

Accused individuals are not free to chose their lawyers in the frame of legal aid system

Victims are not free to chose their lawyers in the frame of legal aid system

Court fees

Litigants have to pay taxes to start a proceeding in other than criminal matters.

Free access to all courts applies only for those who have been provided with legal aid.

3. Efficiency and quality of the judicial system

Court performance

· Clearance Rate (CR) and Disposition Time (DT)

The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.


The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.



The number of incoming cases in 2019 in Greece (1,92 per 100 inhabitants) is the same as the EU median (1,92 per 100 inhabitants). Moreover, the number of resolved cases in 2019 (1,66 per 100 inhabitants) is slightly below the EU median (1,73 per 100 inhabitants). Finally, the number of pending cases at the end of 2019(2,89 per 100 inhabitants) is well above the EU median (1,10 per 100 inhabitants).



With a Clearance Rate calculated at 86,2% in 2019, Greece seems to face some difficulties in dealing with its civil and commercial litigious cases.

Between 2018 and 2019, the Clearance Rate has decreased by 0,1 points.

In 2019, the civil and commercial litigious cases are solved in approximately 637 days, which is well above the EU median of 213 days.

Analysis of the 2018 - 2019 period reveals a 13,9% increase of the Disposition Time.

The number of civil and commercial litigious cases older than 2 years is not available.


· Administrative cases

The Council of State did not provide data regarding the first and second instance Administrative law cases to the Ministry of Justice. Therefore, CR and DT for this type of cases cannot be calculated.

· Insolvency

Competent Authorities and Courts did not provide the relevant data for insolvency cases. Therefore, CR and DT for this type of cases cannot be calcualted.

Overall efficiency by instance and by case matter



As regards overall efficiency in Greece, it should be noted that all DT levels are well above EU median values. In respect of civil and commercial litigious cases, the first and second instance courts seem to face significant challenges as both instances recorded very high DT levels (637 and 638 days respectively) which are 3 to 4 times larger than EU median (213 and 175 days respectively). In the highest instance court, the situation appears more favorable as DT shows lower value compared with first two instances (352 days) but is still considerably higher than EU median (217 days).

For administrative law cases DT cannot be compared between three instances, considering that only data for the highest instance were provided in 2019. However, it could be concluded that third instance court encounters considerable difficulties with efficiency as DT is significantly higher than EU median (1 283 days compared with 219 days). This implies large backlogs of administrative cases.


•Alternative dispute resolutions

The judicial system in Greece provides court related mediation.

For Civil cases judicial mediation is optional and it is possible to resort to it before filling any action or during pendency before the Court of first instance or the Court of Appeal.

In 2019, there are 2 553 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represent 23,8 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation between 2018 and 2019 is about 53,3%.

The interest of people to acquire the status of mediator increased in 2019 without any special or official reason identified.

• Systems for measuring and evaluating the court performance

In 2019, individual courts are required to prepare an annual activity report.

Although individual courts are asked to prepare an annual activity report, this is not required by law.

According to Law 1756/1988 (art. 85), supreme judges appointed as inspectors for one year's term, redact every year general reports on the operation of each court and prosecutor's office in their district and recommend the necessary measures for the proper functioning of the service. Regarding administrative courts, this task is fulfilled by the General Commission of the State for ordinary administrative courts.

Furthermore, the Greek government has introduced a new system for organizing and evaluating the planning and implementation of public sector actions and projects, which introduces among others, monitoring court activities. (L. 4622/2019 art. 49 foll.)

In Greece, there is a system to evaluate regularly the activity of each court.

A system to evaluate regurlarly the activity of each court (in terms of performance and output) exists and performance and quality indicators are defined at the court level.




The calculation of this index for each field is an average of the values of the sub-fields included. The calculation of the sub-field depends on each question and the combination of different modalities of the answers.

Note; Index is modified each cycle depending on the new modalities included in the questionnaire that show more precise details on the ICT situation that can make the index drop even if there is no real change.





In the context of the Informational System OSDDY PP there are provided templates for certificates, case files and other documents that are used in the judicial proceedings.

Statistical data

In Greece, there is a centralised institution that is responsible for collecting statistical data regarding the functioning of the courts and judiciary.

Although courts collect data, each one in its respective jurisdiction, the centralized institution responsible for collecting statistical data regarding the functioning of the courts and judiciary is the Ministry of Justice, Transparency and Human Rights.

The Special Service for the Collection of Statistical Data of the Hellenic Ministry of Justice (JustStat) has been established by law, but has not yet been organized and is currently not operating.

This institution publishes statistics of each court on internet.

Individual courts are required to prepare an activity report.
