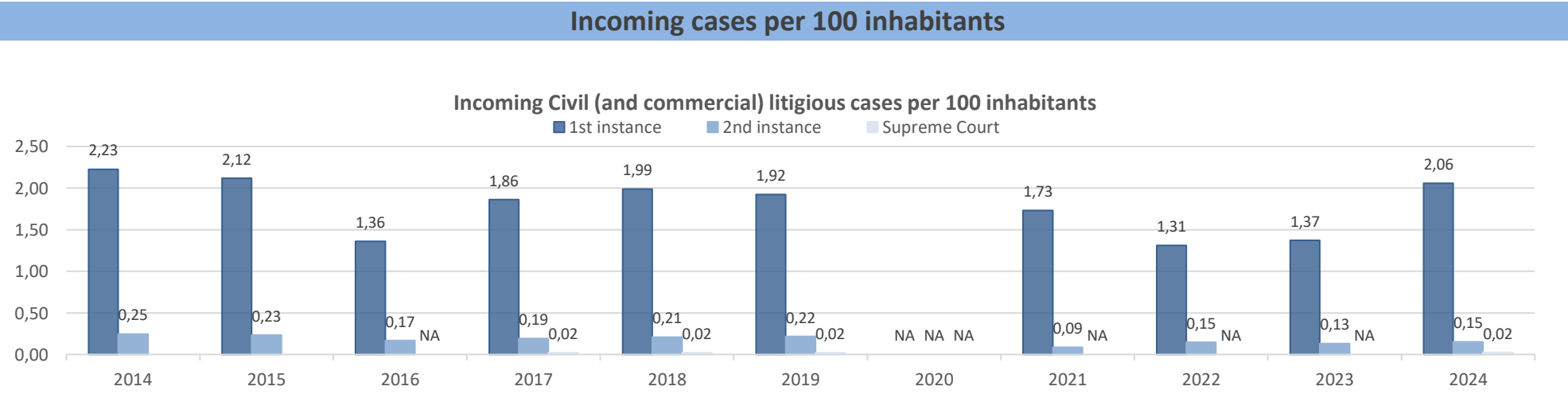
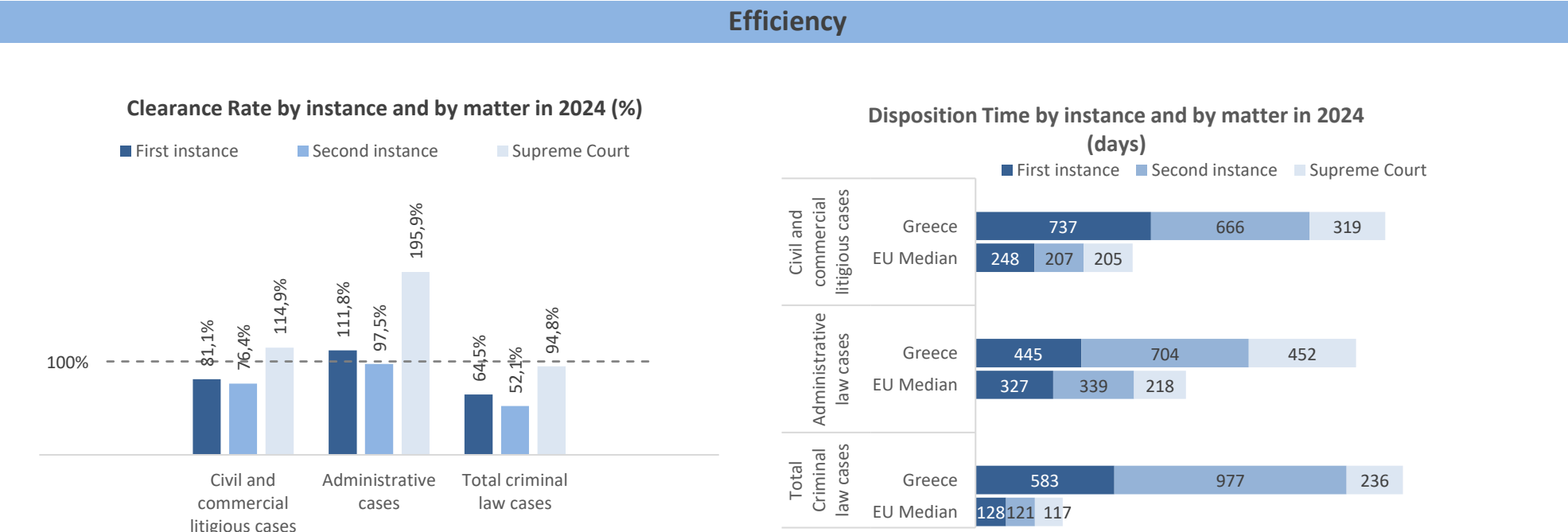
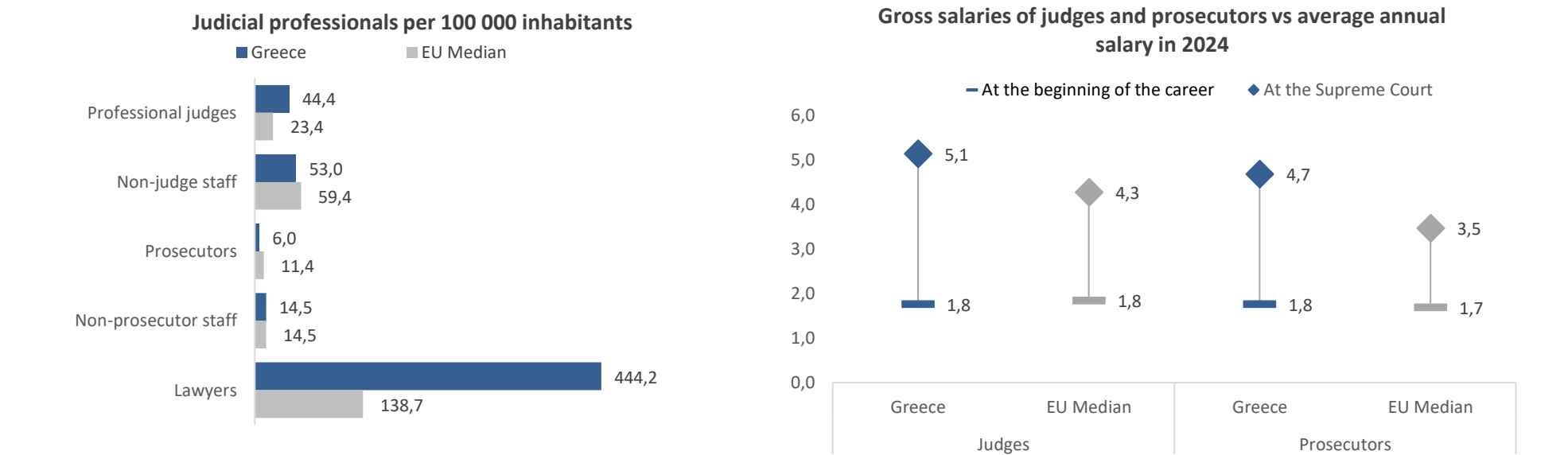

1. Judicial organisation in Greece (2024 data)

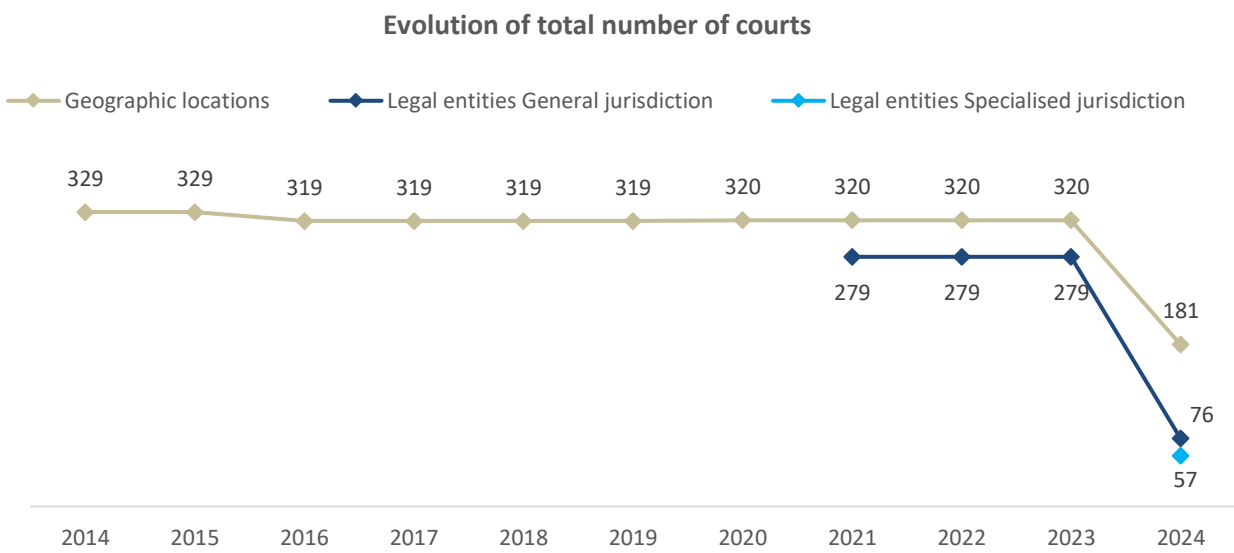
In Greece, in 2024, the total number of courts considered as legal entities is 133, among which 76 are of general jurisdiction and 57 are specialised courts. Following the 2024 reform of the judicial map resulting in the abolition of all Magistrates' courts and the rationalisation of first instance courts, there are 56 courts of general jurisdiction acting at first instance. The number of second instance courts of general jurisdiction remained 19. The Supreme Court is the highest court of general jurisdiction (Areios Pagos).

Among the 57 specialised courts, 45 are sitting at first instance, while 12 are courts of a higher instance.

In terms of geographic locations, in 2024, there are 181 courts, out of which 150 are sitting at first instance.

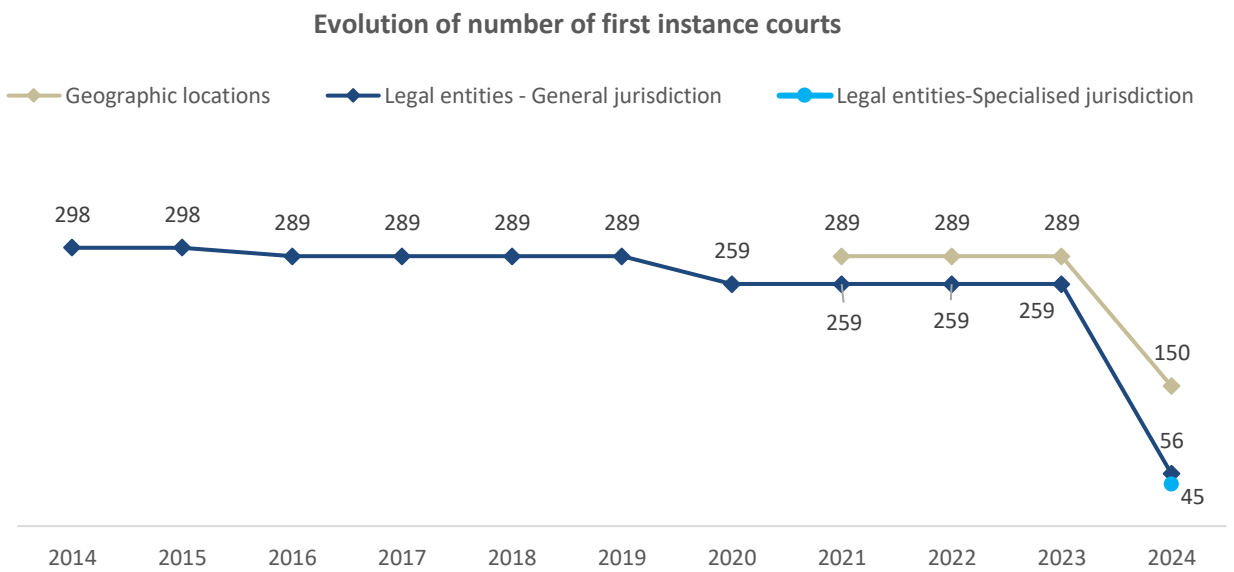


The 2024 judicial map reform (Law 5108/2024) was aimed at streamlining first instance courts. As a result, all Magistrates' courts were abolished, while the number of first instance courts was reduced from 63 to 56. Indeed, the 7 other first instance courts are currently considered as "parallel" court seats to the (central) courts, since there were previously some Prefectures where two or more first instance courts were co-existing. In compliance with the Constitution and as an exception, the rule of one first instance court per administrative prefecture does not apply to border and island regions.

Moreover, the reform affected the number of geographic locations given that the courthouses of the magistrates' courts located at the same place as the first instance courts have been closed down. Their facilities are now serving as additional installations for the relevant first instance courts. As regards the other magistrates' courts, 50 have been transformed into regional seats for the first instance courts, while the remaining have been closed.

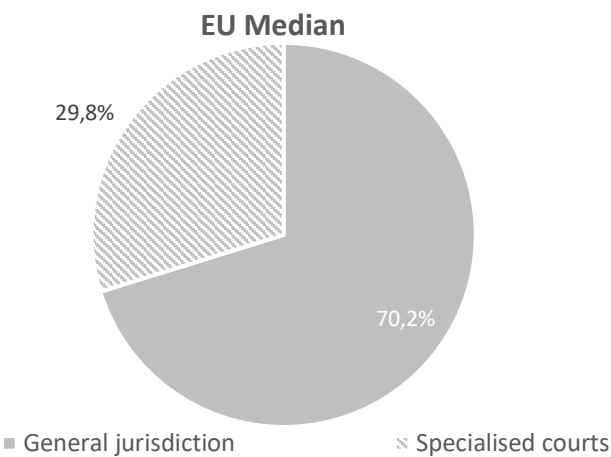
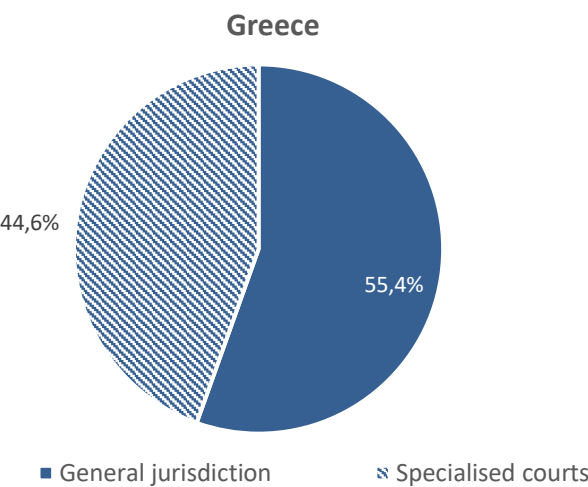

The above-described judicial map reform resulted in the decrease in the number of first instance courts of general jurisdiction considered as legal entities, as well as in the decrease in the number of geographic locations (*supra*).

Distribution of first instance general jurisdiction and specialised courts



The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Greece is 55,4% - 44,6% which does not follow the distribution tendency in EU (70,2% - 29,8%).

Among the 57 specialised courts existing in Greece, 45 are acting at first instance, namely the 30 administrative courts and the 15 military courts. At the appeal level, there are 9 administrative courts of appeal and one military court of appeal. The Council of State is the highest instance court in administrative matters.

In Greece, the Court of Audit has also the statute of a Supreme court. Indeed, the Hellenic Court of Audit is a special administrative court. According to the Greek Constitution, administrative disputes are divided between the Council of State, the regular administrative courts, and the Court of Audit. The latter is staffed by graduates of the National School of Judicial Officers.

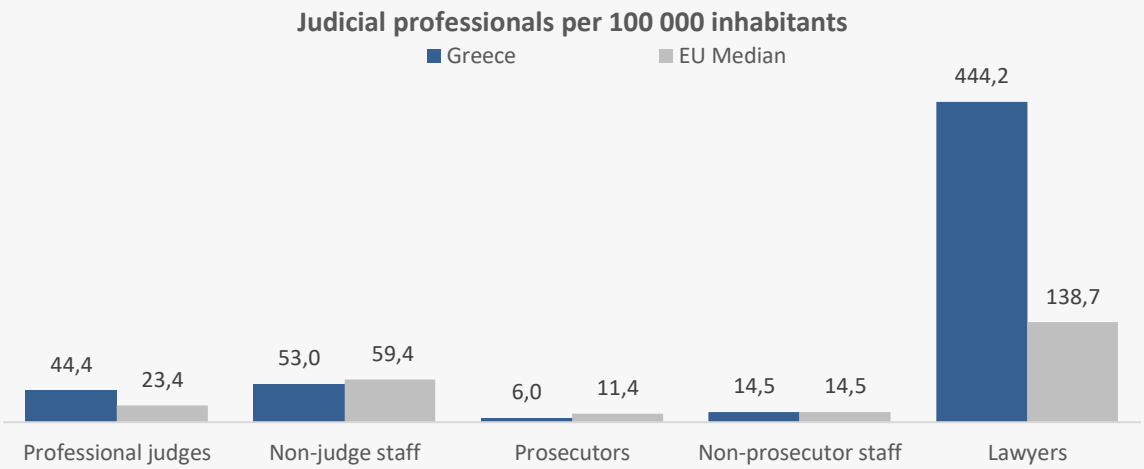
There are no other specialised courts existing in Greece as autonomous legal entities, but the first instance and appeal courts of large cities have specialised chambers adjudicating in specific legal fields (e.g., family law, commercial law, etc.). Judges entrusted with such duties have usually the correspondent specific studies. Special provisions regulate the operation of "courts for juveniles" which are specialised divisions within courts of general criminal jurisdiction, military, navy and air force courts.

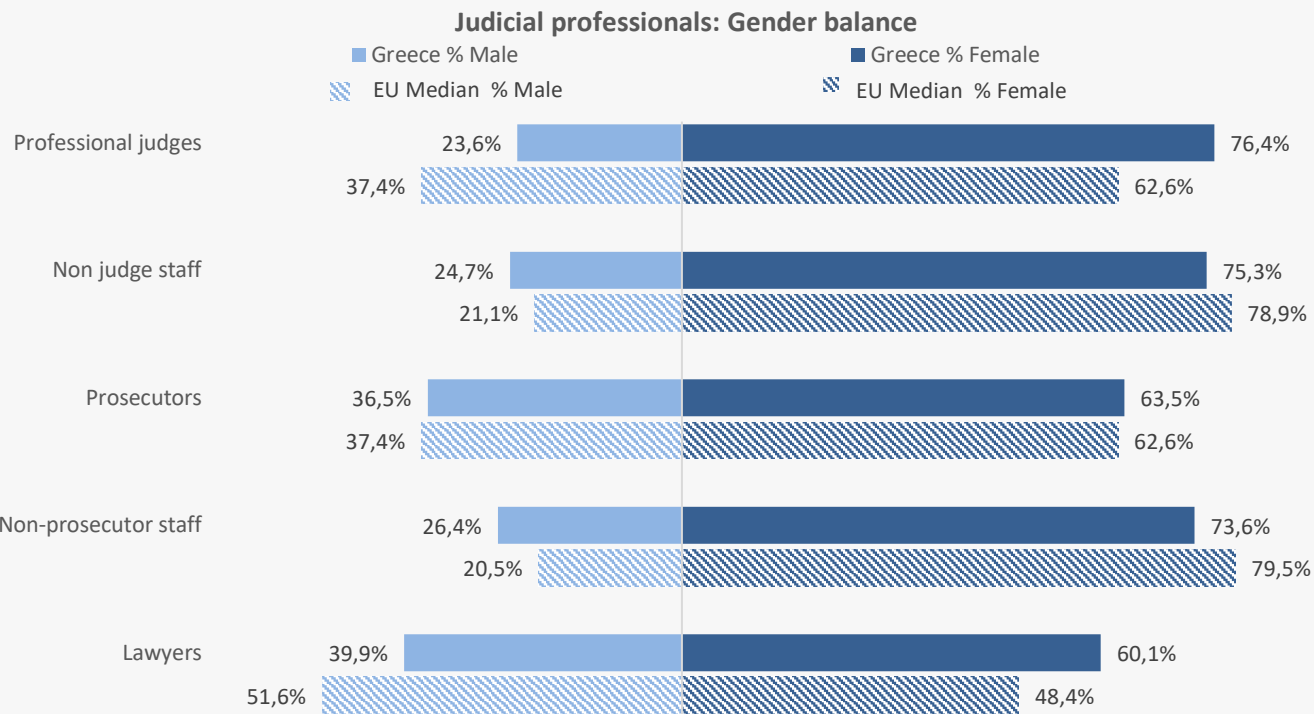

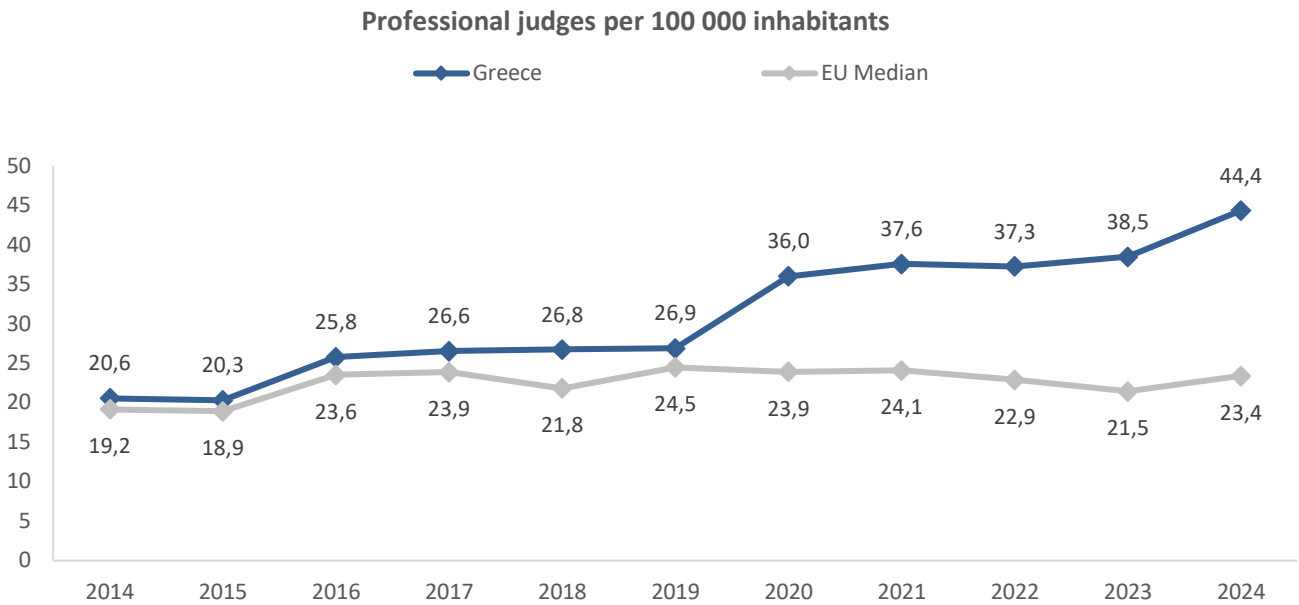

According to 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Greece is 4 615, which is 15,0% more than in the previous cycle.

More precisely, in Greece, there are 44,4 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is considerably above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and highest in EU.

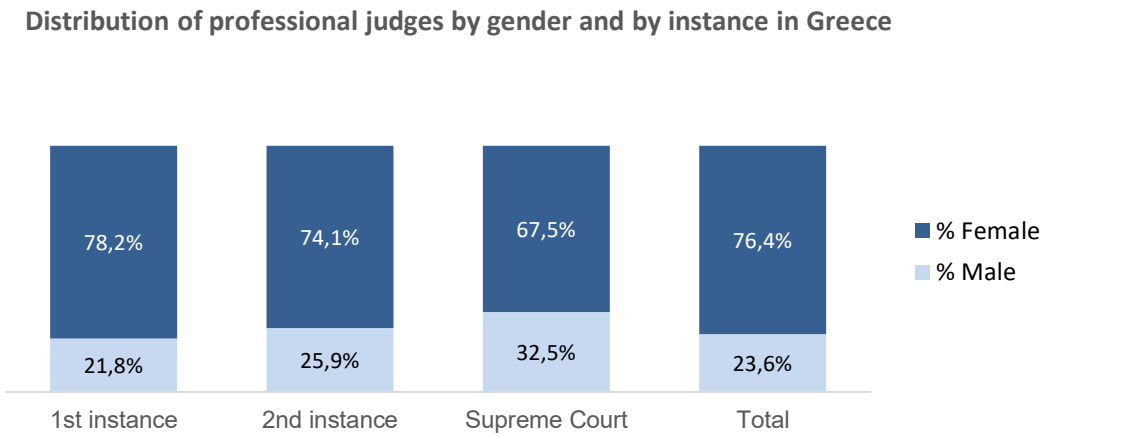
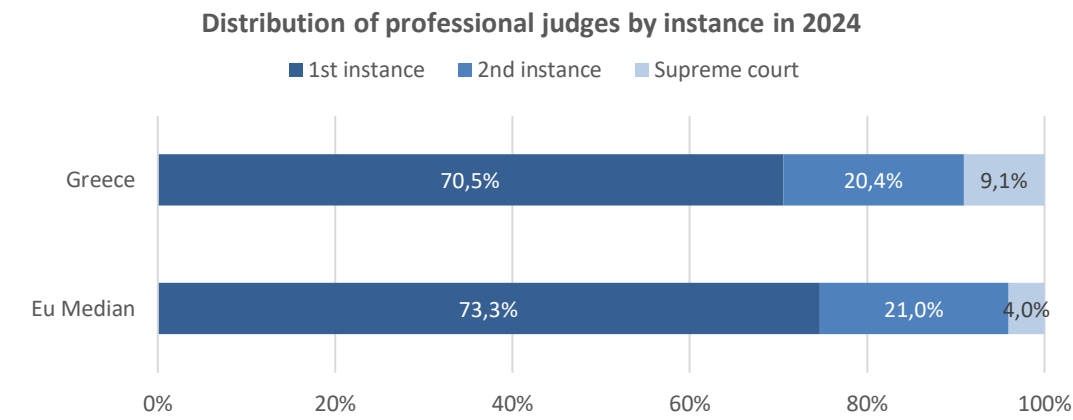
The 2024 judicial map reform (Law 5108/2024) aimed at streamlining the first instance court structure resulted in an increase in the number of first instance judges as the former Justices of the peace were transferred to the first instance courts as special term judges. The latter are professional judges.

Besides, it is worth recalling that starting from 2021, the judges of the Court of Audit are included in the data alongside with judges of the Supreme court (Areios Pagos) and the Council of State.

Finally, in 2020 the methodology of presentation of data changed, explaining the observed variation on the graph.

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 3 526, which represents 76,4% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 3 255 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 2 546 are female); 941 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 697 are female) and 419 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 283 are female).

The distribution of professional judges per instance in Greece is very similar to the trend in the EU. At first and second instances the respective EU medians are slightly above the values of Greece, while at third instance the number of professional judges in Greece is higher than the EU median.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, the following methodology has been applied: judges of the 56 first instance courts of general jurisdiction and the 30 administrative courts are taken into account as first instance judges; judges of the 19 courts of appeal and the 9 administrative courts of appeal are considered as second instance judges; as for the last instance, starting from 2021, the judges of the Court of Audit are included in the data alongside with judges of the Supreme court (Areios Pagos) and the Council of State.

As regards the distribution male/female, it is worth highlighting that female judges constitute the majority in Greece, exceeding the 65% at all three instances.

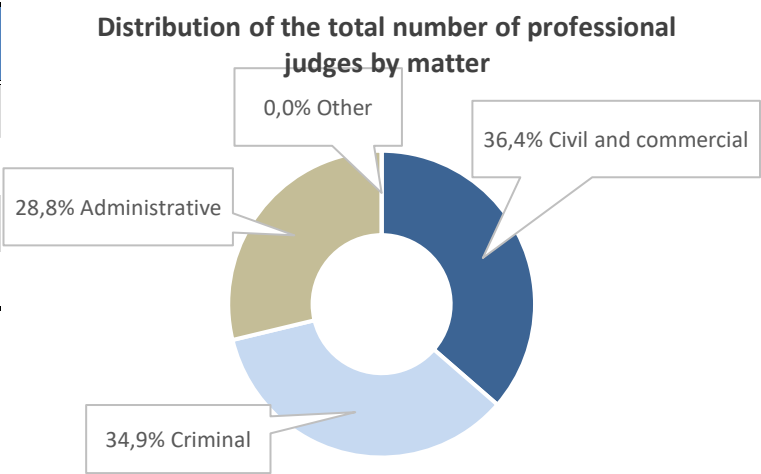

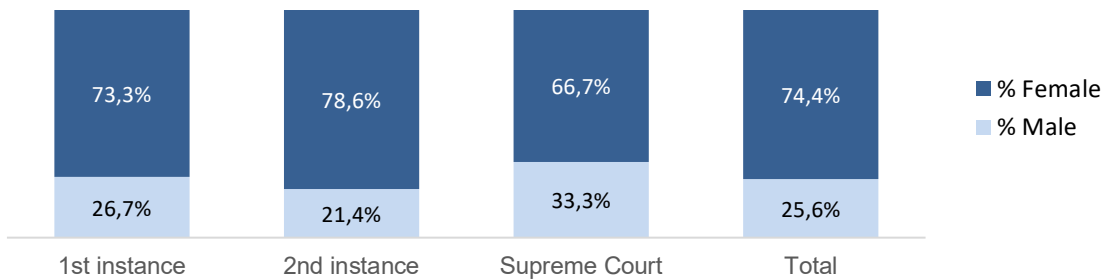
Starting from 2024, judges of the Court of Audit, a specialised administrative court having the statute of a Supreme court, are categorised as third instance administrative judges.

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Greece



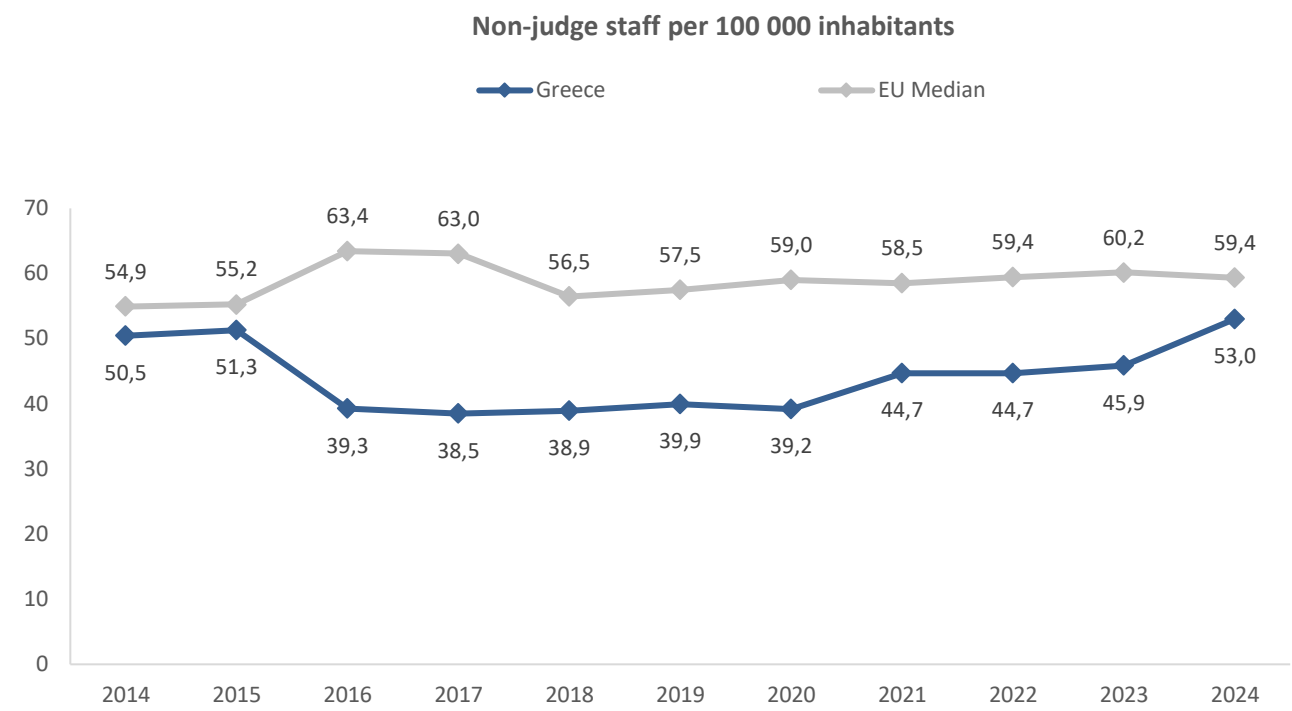
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 87, which represents 74,4% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 86 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 63 are female); 28 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom 22 are female) and 3 are sitting in Supreme Court (of whom 2 are female).

The presidents of the courts are responsible for the operation of the courts and the work of the judges. Starting from 2016, information is given on court presidents who have the respective duties. The presidents of the 56 first instance courts of general jurisdiction and the 30 administrative courts are considered as first instance court presidents. Those of the 19 courts of appeal and the 9 administrative courts of appeal are counted as second instance court presidents. The 3 third instance court presidents are those of the Areios Pagos (Supreme Court), the Council of State, and the Court of Auditors.

In 2024, Greece has 5 514 non-judge staff (of whom 4 152 are female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 15,5%.

In 2024, a breakdown by gender could not be carried out in respect of non-judge staff.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 45,9 in 2023 to 53,0 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 38,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 44,4 in 2024.

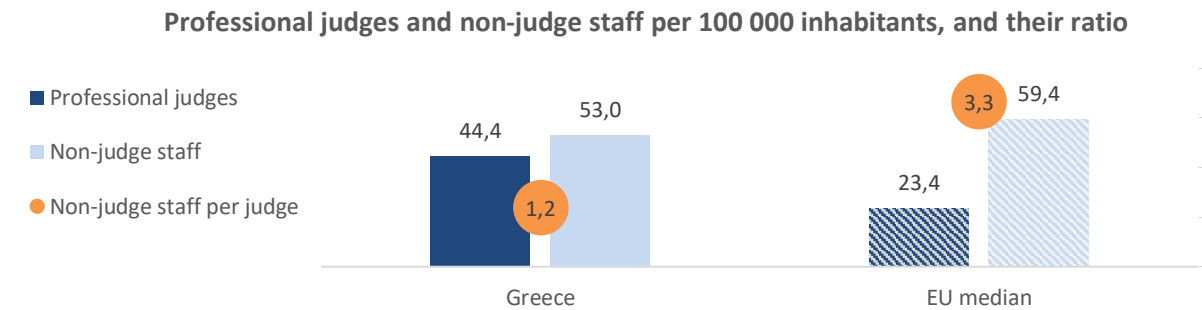

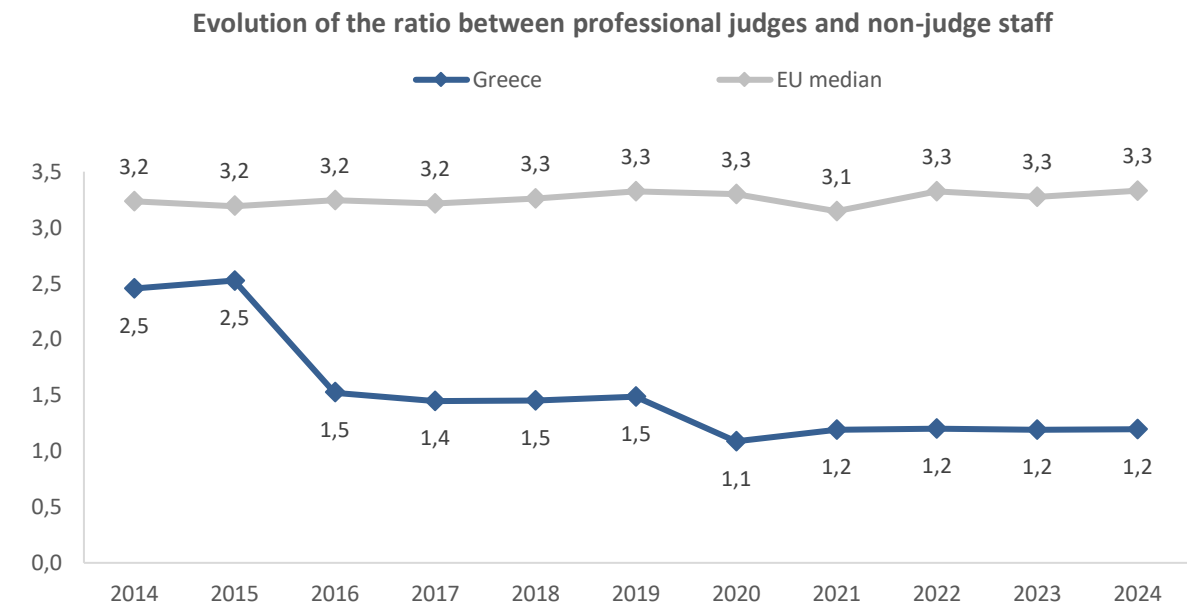


In Greece, there are 44,4 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is significantly above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) but only about 1,2 non-judge staff per judge. In Greece there is situation that the number of judges is highest in EU while the number of non-judge staff and the ratio of non-judge staff per judge is lowest.

No variation has been observed compared with the previous cycle when this ratio was also at 1,2 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

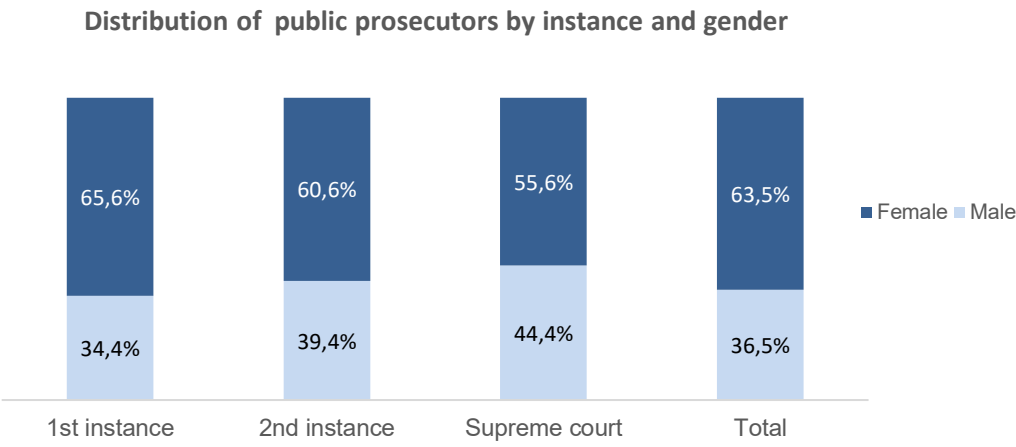
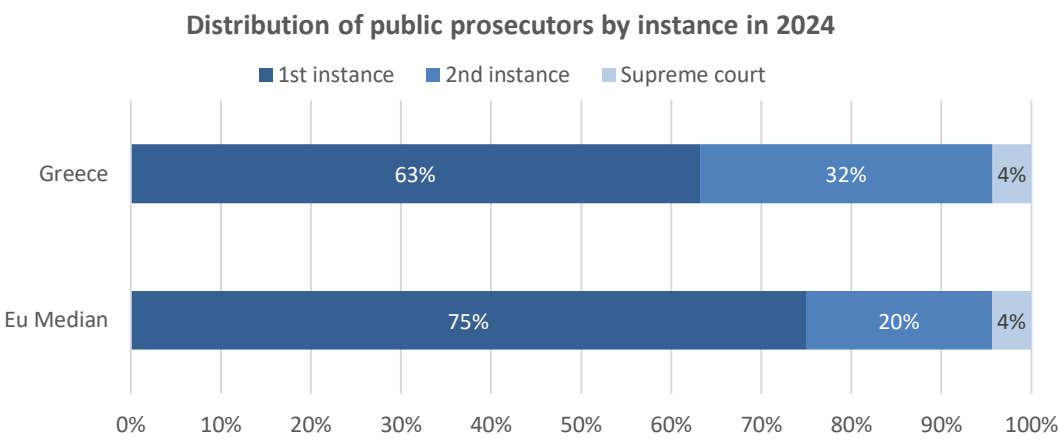

In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 397, which represents 63,5% of the total number of prosecutors.

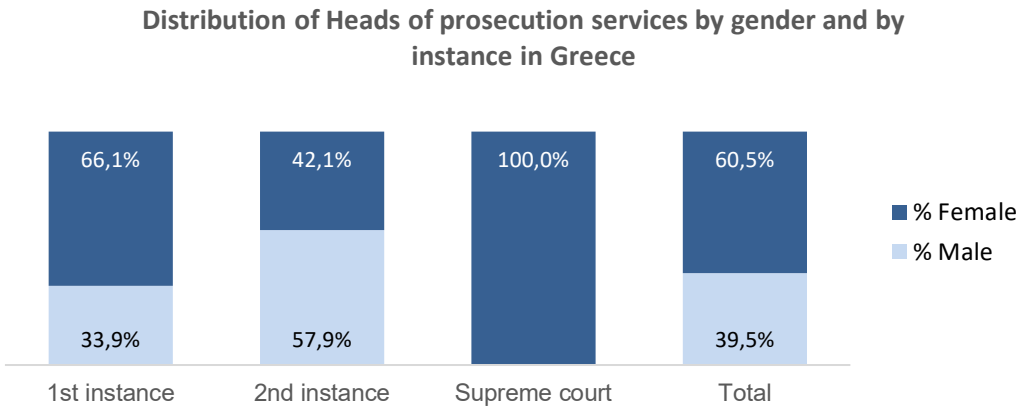
The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 395 in first instance (of whom 259 are female); 203 are in second instance (of whom 123 are female) and 27 in final instance (of whom 15 are female).

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female prosecutors constitute the majority at all three instances.

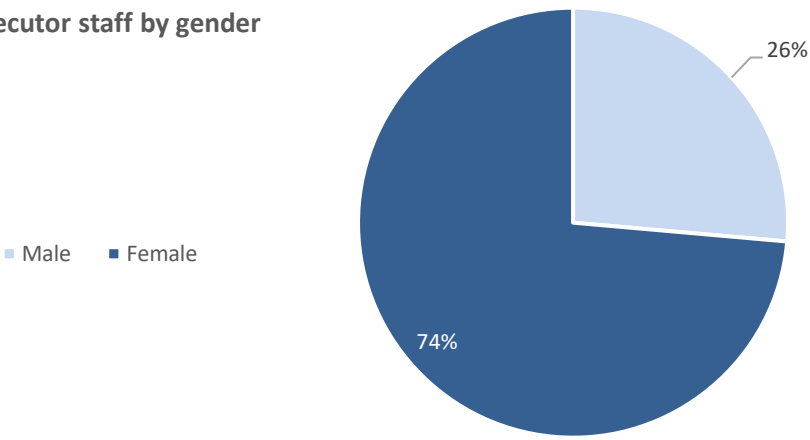
In this cycle, the total number of female heads of prosecution services (all instances) is 46, which represents 60,5% of the total number of heads of prosecution services.

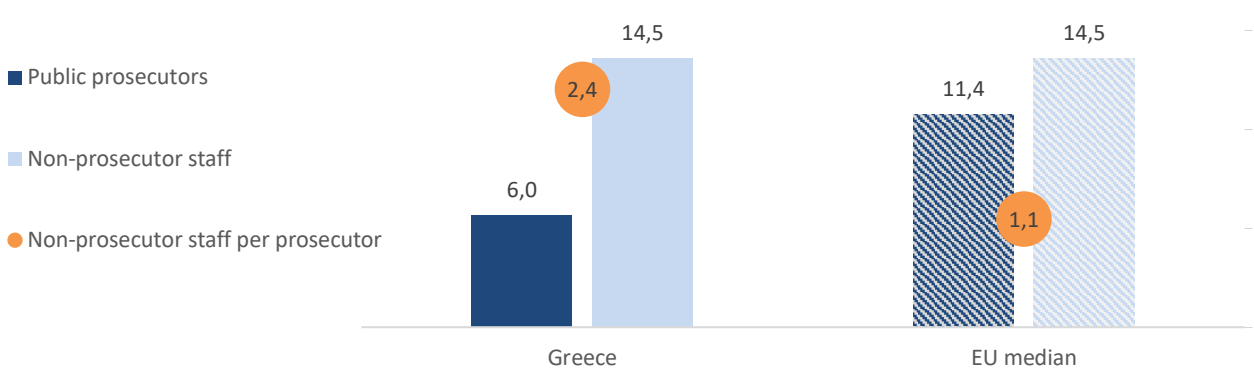
Non-prosecutor staff by gender

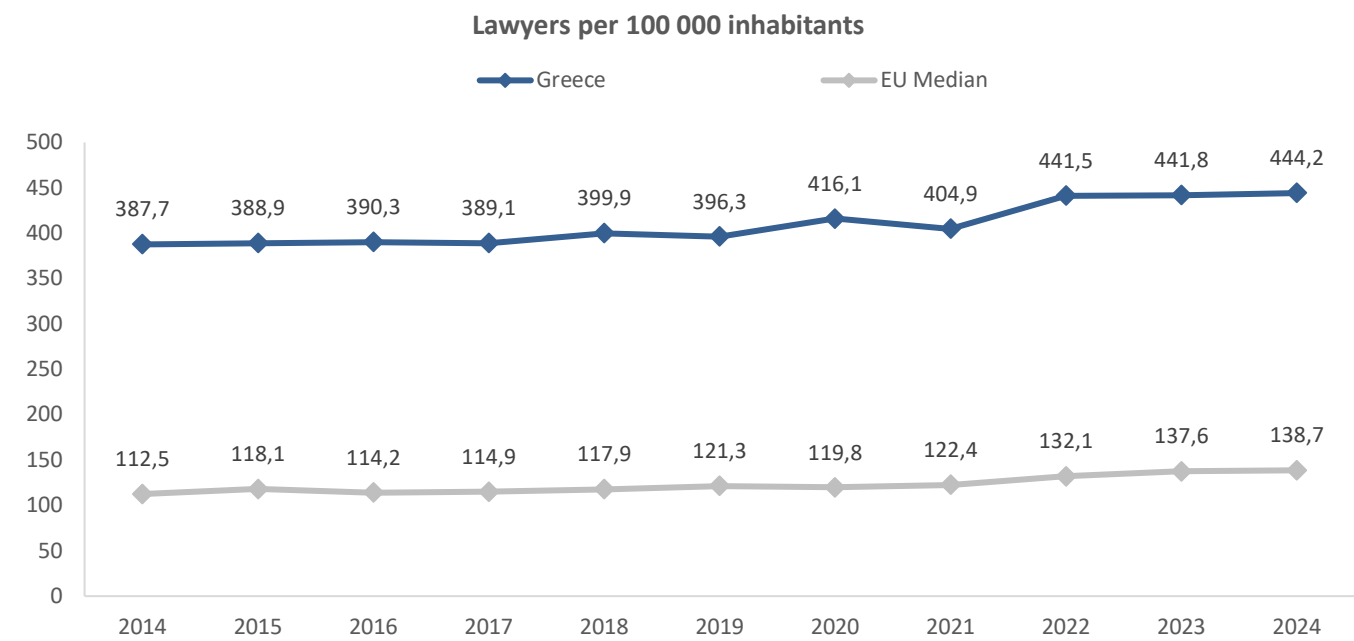
Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

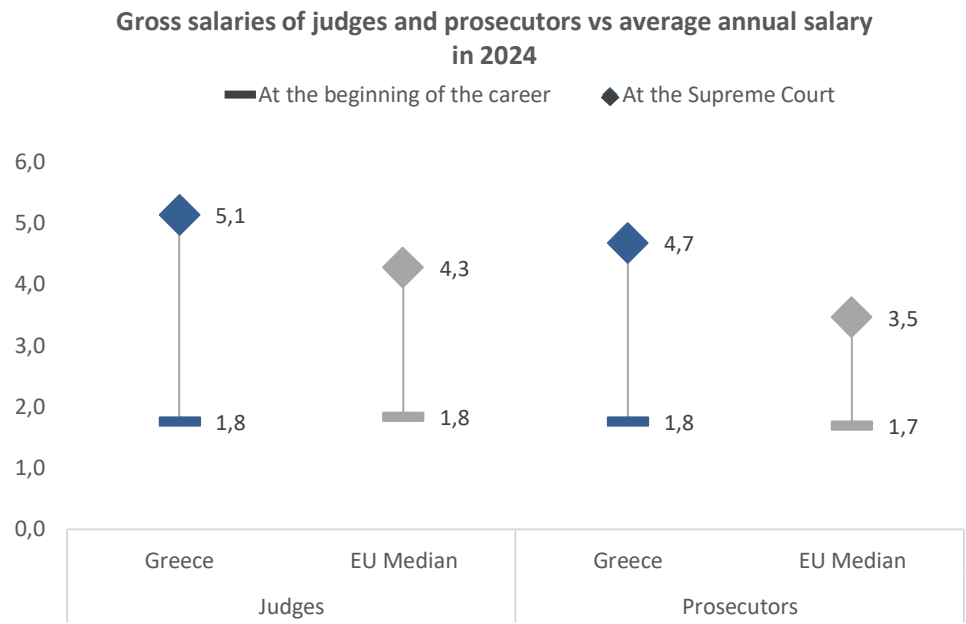
In 2024, there are 46 204 lawyers, which is 0,4% more than in 2023.

There are 27 784 female lawyers which is 60% of the total.

Greece has 444,2 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is significantly above the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Greece is 34 560€, which is rather below the EU median of 61 347€ (-44% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,8 times higher which corresponds to the EU median is 1,8.

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary of a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Greece's absolute gross salary of a judge at the highest level is -17% below the EU median of 121 591€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Greece of 34 560€ is rather below the EU median of 52 969€ (-35% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career is 1,8 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary of a prosecutor in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. Greece's absolute gross salary of a prosecutor at the highest level is -3% below the EU median of 94 385€.

According to the provisions of §§ 1 and 2 of article 20 of law 5045/2023, the basic salaries of the judiciary, as they were structured on December 31, 2023, were increased from January 1, 2024 by the amount corresponding to the product of the starting salary of the category of Mandatory Education (Y.E.) of unified salary employees, multiplied by a coefficient of 0.0897, rounded to the nearest euro, specifically by the amount of 70 euros per month.

By the provisions of Article 39 of Law 5079/2023, the allowances, benefits, and compensations under paragraphs 3, 5, and 6 of § A of Article 30 of Law 3205/2003 (A' 297) for the judiciary, as they were established on December 31, 2023, were increased from January 1, 2024, as follows: a) by 30% the allowance for faster processing under §3 of §A, and b) by 10% the fixed compensation and the representation expenses compensation of §§ 5 and 6 of § A, respectively, rounded to the nearest euro unit.

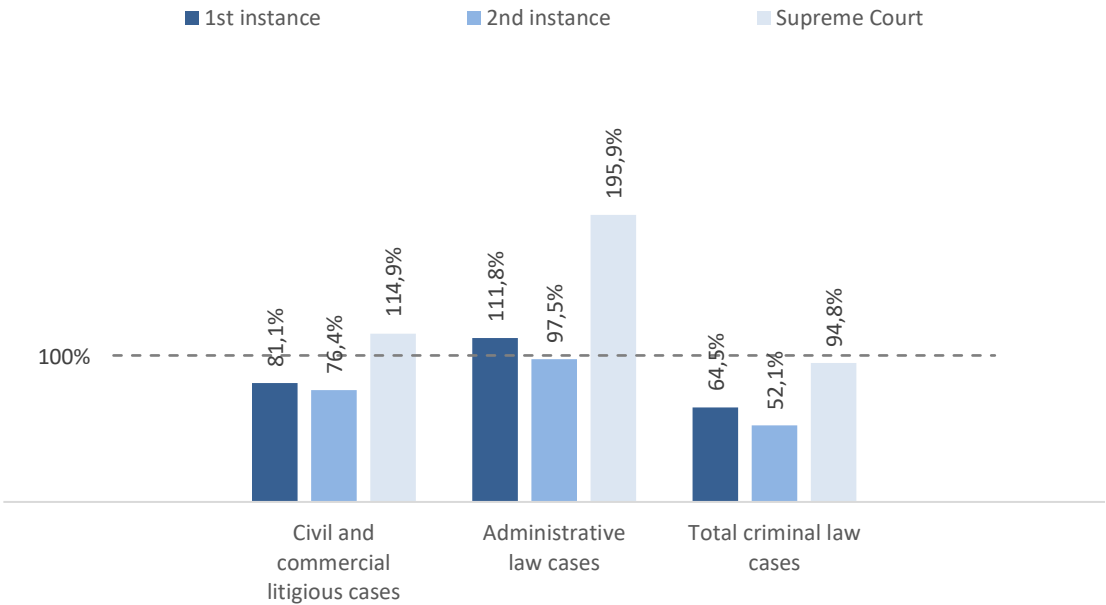
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

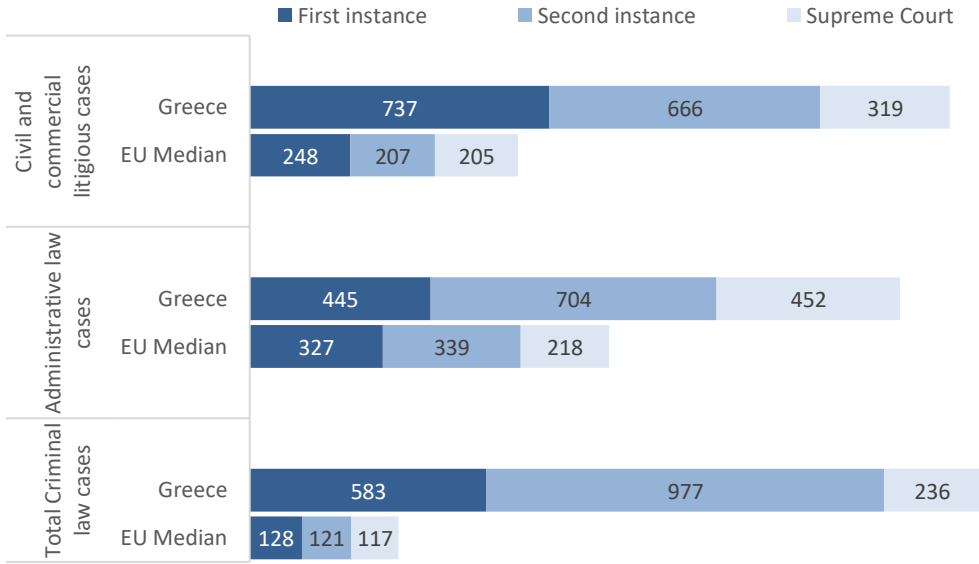

At the outset, it is worth pointing out that the efficiency analyses for 2024 should be carried out against the background of several parameters: the judicial map reform resulting in the abolishment of the Magistrates' courts, the legislative amendments to the Criminal Code and the Criminal Procedural Code, the extension of the category of third instance administrative law cases to the case-flow of the Court of Audit, the availability of data on civil cases dealt with by the Supreme court.

In contrast with the EU trend, in 2024, in Greece, the length of judicial proceedings is the longest in the criminal law field and the shortest in administrative matters. One can notice that in all matters and at all instances, the Disposition time indicator for Greece is above the respective EU medians. As to the Clearance rate, the values are above the 100% threshold only for third instance civil cases, and first and last instance administrative cases.

More precisely, in civil matters, the 2024 judicial map reform resulted in significant variations in the number of incoming and pending cases at first and second instance. On the one hand, before 2024 Magistrates' courts cases were not included in the data communicated to the CEPEJ. The abolition of these courts resulted in the transfer of their cases to first instance courts which Clearance rate decreased compared to 2023 by 10,8 points. On the other hand, the reform introduced structural changes that affected the appeal courts, namely the transfer of certain case types to lower courts. Accordingly, the Clearance rate for second instance civil cases has increased between 2023 and 2024, while the Disposition time indicator slightly improved. As to the Supreme Court, for the first time its efficiency indicators could be measured, with a positive Clearance rate of 115% and a Disposition time of 319 days, quite above the EU median of 205 days.

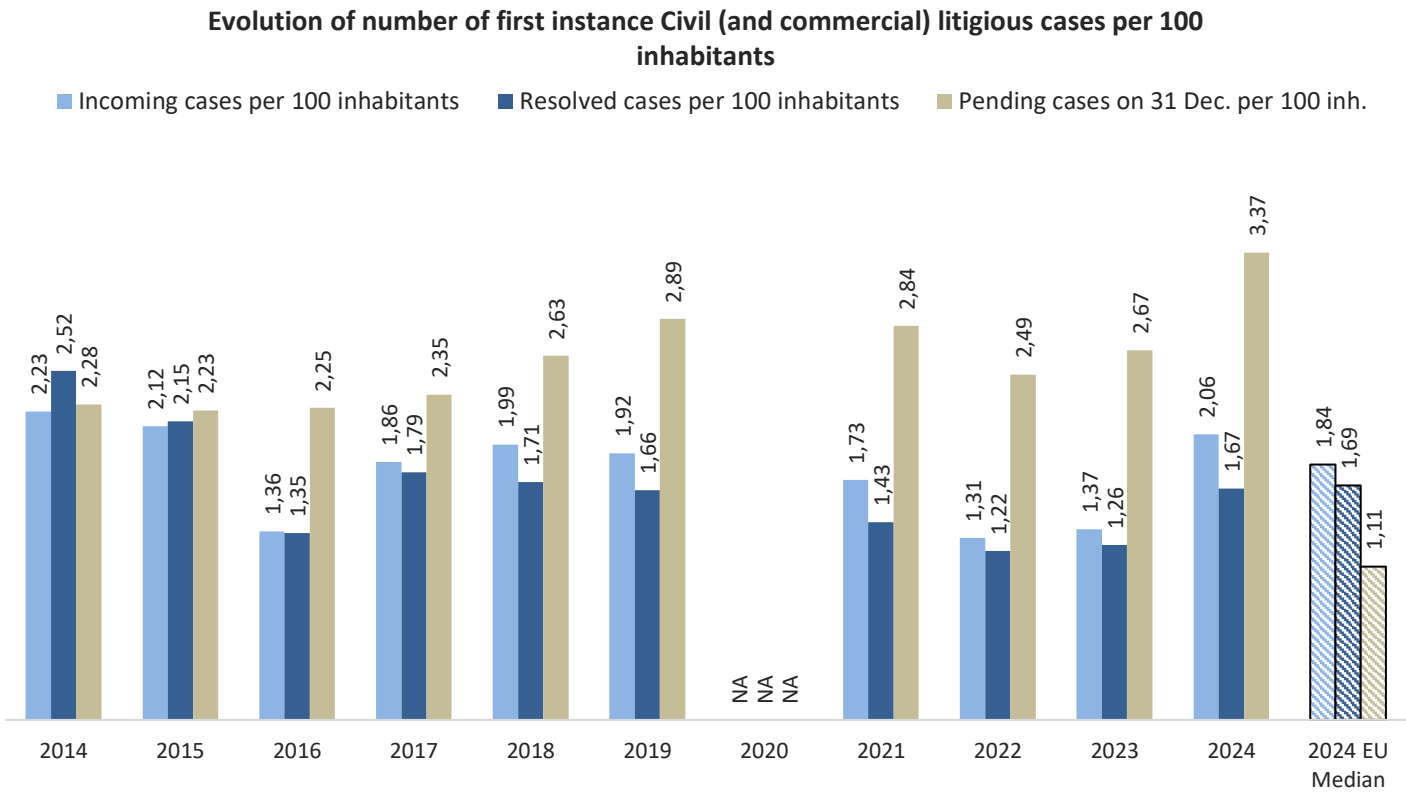
In administrative matters, at first and second instance the efficiency indicators remained stable compared to 2023, with a Clearance rate very close to the 100% at second instance and going beyond this threshold at first instance. The Disposition time kept similar values to those of 2023, remaining significantly above the respective EU medians at both instances. As to the highest instance, for the first time the case-flow of the Court of Audit has been taken into consideration, which hinders comparison with previous evaluation cycles.

As already mentioned, in 2024 in Greece courts proved to be the least efficient in criminal matters. At all three instances the Clearance rate dropped compared to 2023, while the Disposition time increased considerably, especially at second instance. It was explained that the Law 5090/2024 amending the Criminal Code and the Criminal Procedure Code led to the reinstatement of public prosecution for selected misdemeanors, as well as to the strengthening of the prosecution of domestic violence and organised crime. Besides, the classification of some acts as misdemeanors or felonies was changes, some competences have been revised, while other were transferred from prosecutors to judicial councils.

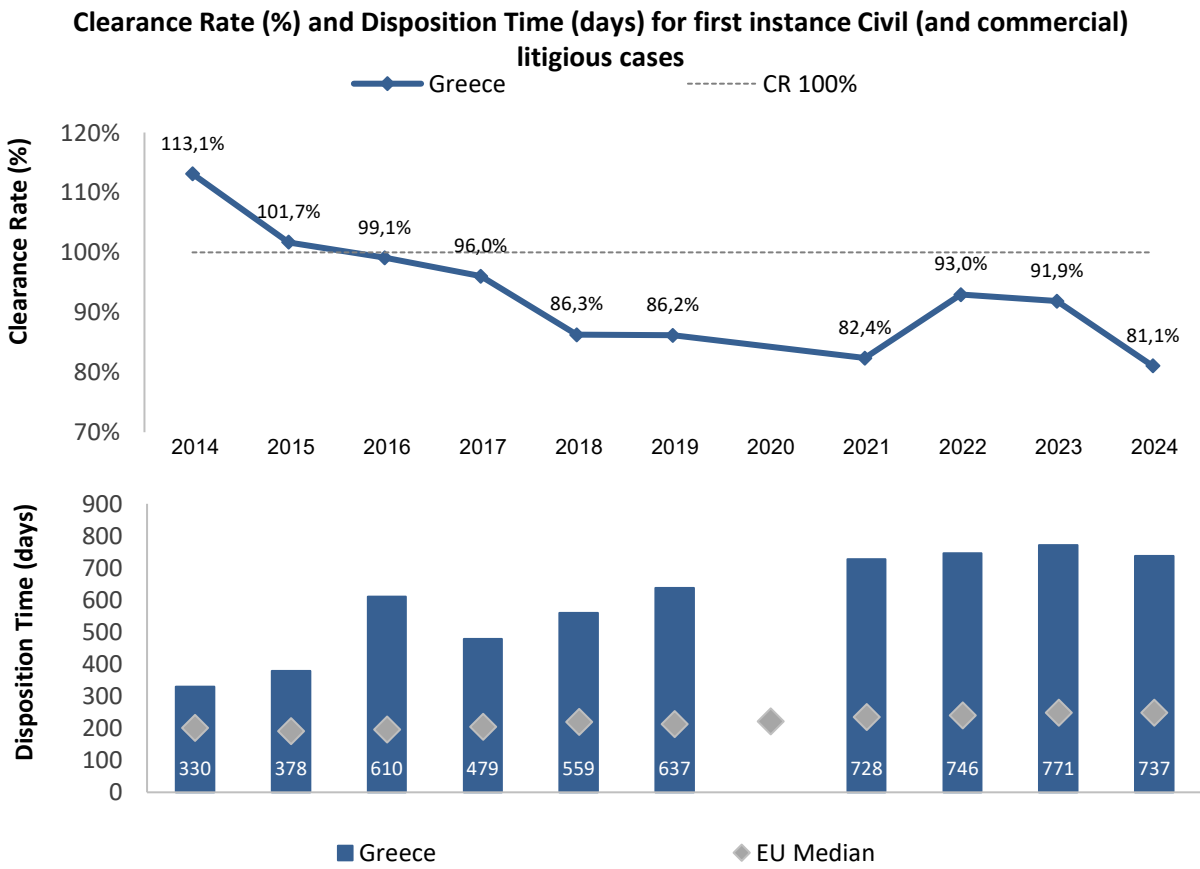

In 2024, Greece recorded 2.06 incoming cases per 100 inhabitants, which is slightly above the EU median of 1.84. However, Greece resolved 1.67 cases per 100 inhabitants, just below the EU median of 1.69. As a result, the number of pending cases at the end of 2024 in Greece stood at 3.37 per 100 inhabitants, which is significantly higher than the EU median of 1.11.

With a Clearance Rate calculated at 81,1% in 2024 Greece seems to encounter difficulties in dealing with its first instance civil (and commercial) litigious cases.

Between 2023 and 2024, the Clearance Rate has decreased by -10,8 points.

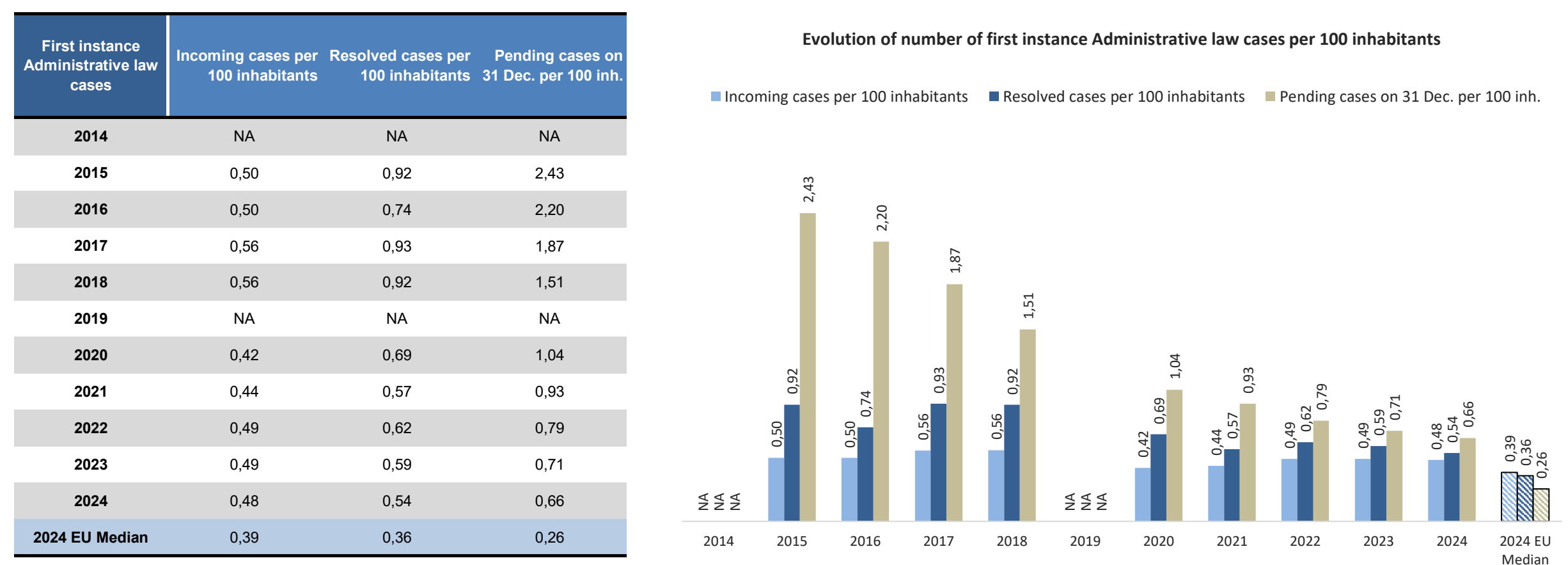
In 2024, first instance civil (and commercial) litigious cases are solved in approximately 737 days, which is well above the EU median of 248 days.

The analysis of the 2023 - 2024 period reveals a -4,3% decrease of the Disposition Time.

As already explained, following the 2024 reform introduced by the Law 5108/2024, the Magistrates' Courts were abolished while their caseload was transferred to the respective first instance courts. The efficiency analyses concerning first instance civil litigious cases should be carried out against this background.

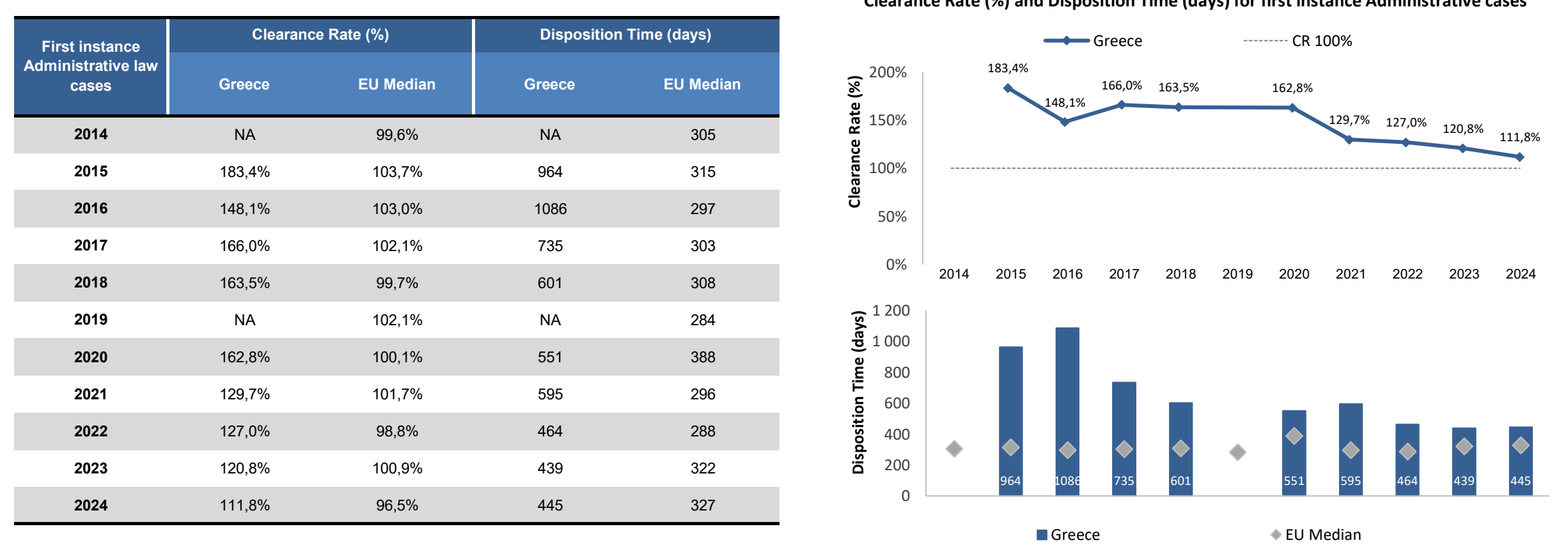

Between 2023 and 2024, the Clearance Rate has decreased by -9,0 points.

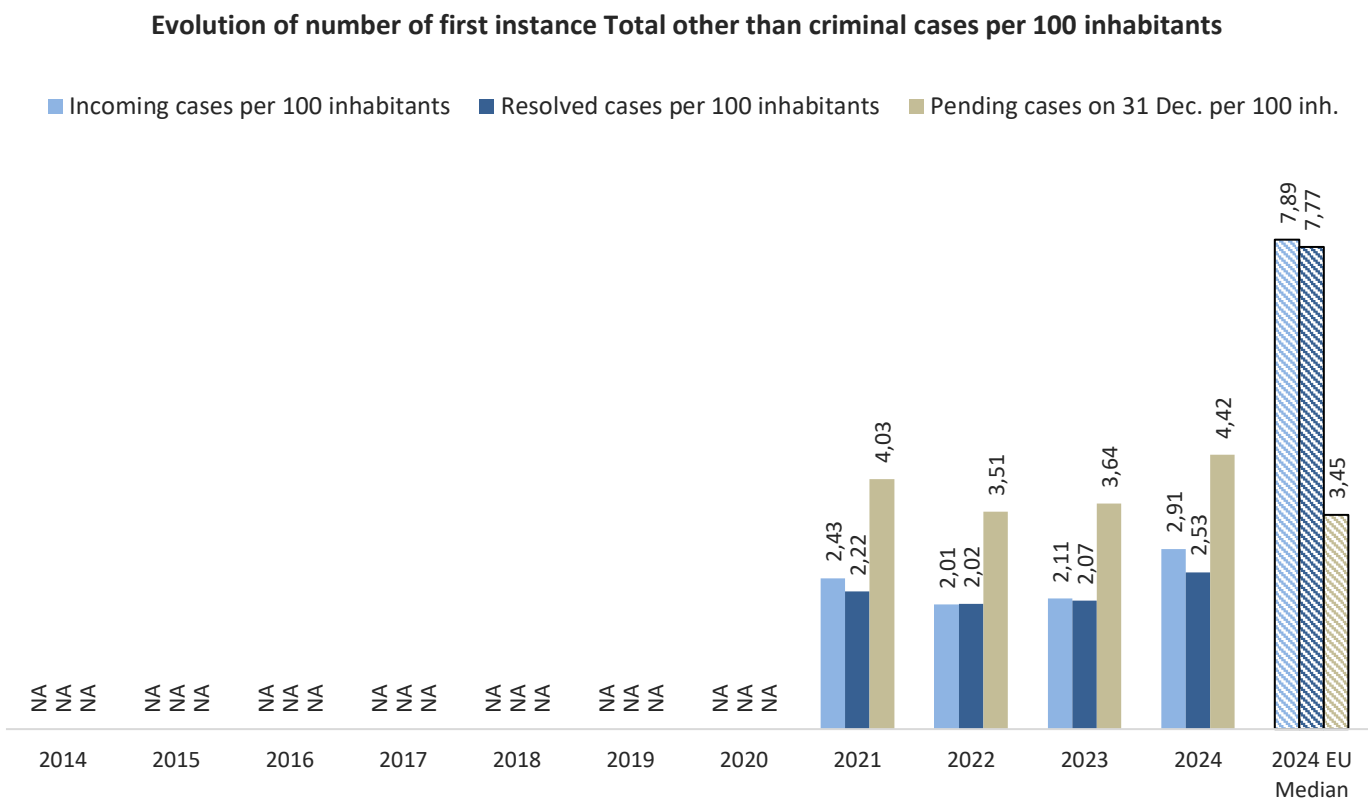

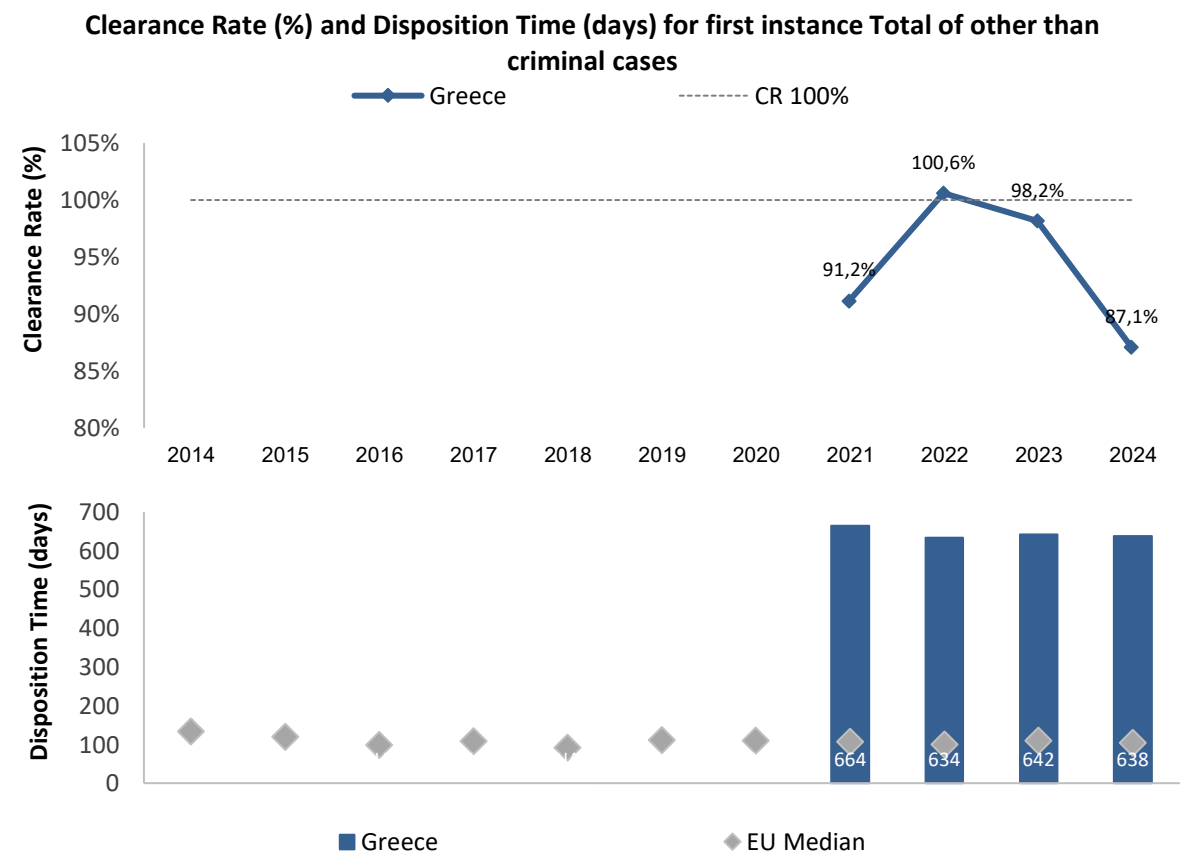

With a Clearance Rate calculated at 87,1% in 2024 Greece seems to encounter difficulties in dealing with its other than criminal cases.

Between 2023 and 2024, the Clearance Rate has decreased by -11,1 points.

In 2024, other than criminal cases are solved in approximately 638 days, which is well above EU median of 104 days.

The analysis of the 2023 - 2024 period reveals a -0,7% decrease of the Disposition Time.

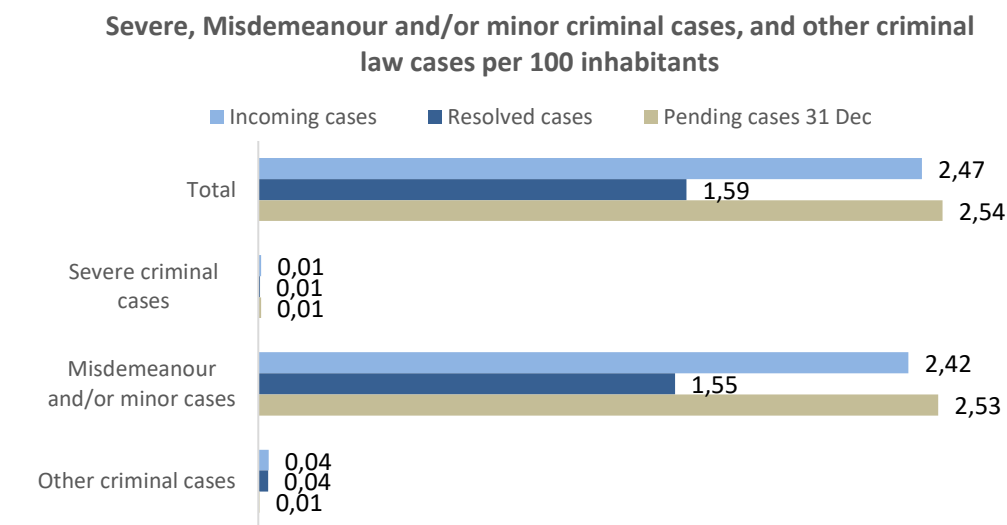
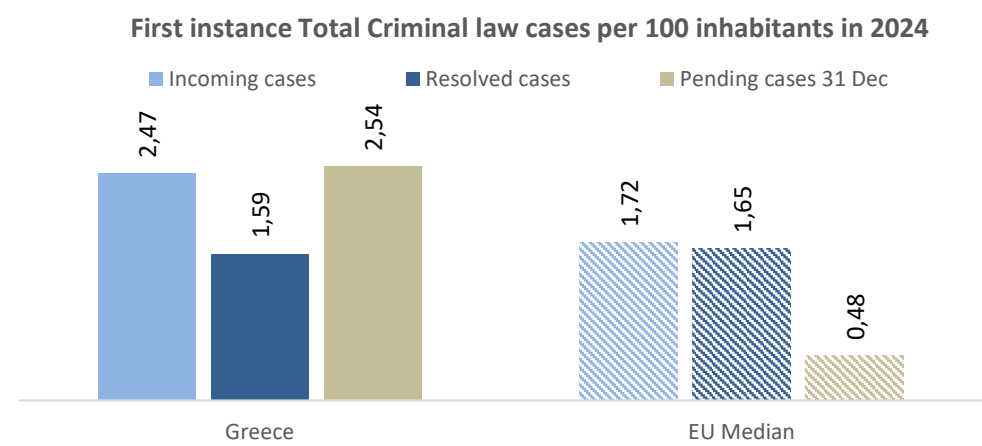

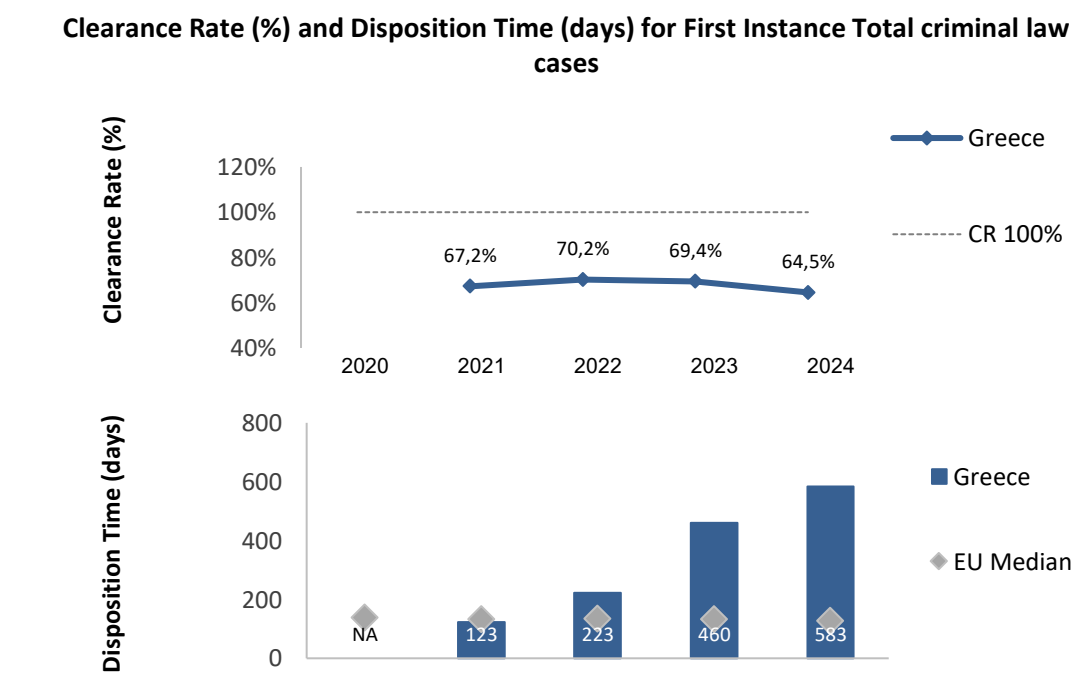

With a Clearance Rate calculated at 64,5% in 2024 Greece seems to face difficulties in dealing with its first instance total criminal law cases.

Between 2023 and 2024, the Clearance Rate has decreased by -4,9 points.

In 2024, first instance total criminal law cases are solved in approximately 583 days, which is well above the EU median of 128 days.

The analysis of the 2023 - 2024 period reveals a 26,6% increase of the Disposition Time.

The observed fluctuations in criminal cases can be partly explained by the legislative amendments to the Criminal Code and the Criminal Procedure Code introduced by Law 5090/2024. The latter resulted in the reinstatement of public prosecution for selected misdemeanors and the strengthening of the prosecution of domestic violence and organized crime, affecting the classification, volume, and length of processing of criminal cases. Additional factors affecting statistics are: transitional provisions implying the gradual implementation of some changes until July 1, 2024; reclassification of some acts as misdemeanors or felonies; transfer of competences from prosecutors to judicial councils for certain acts.

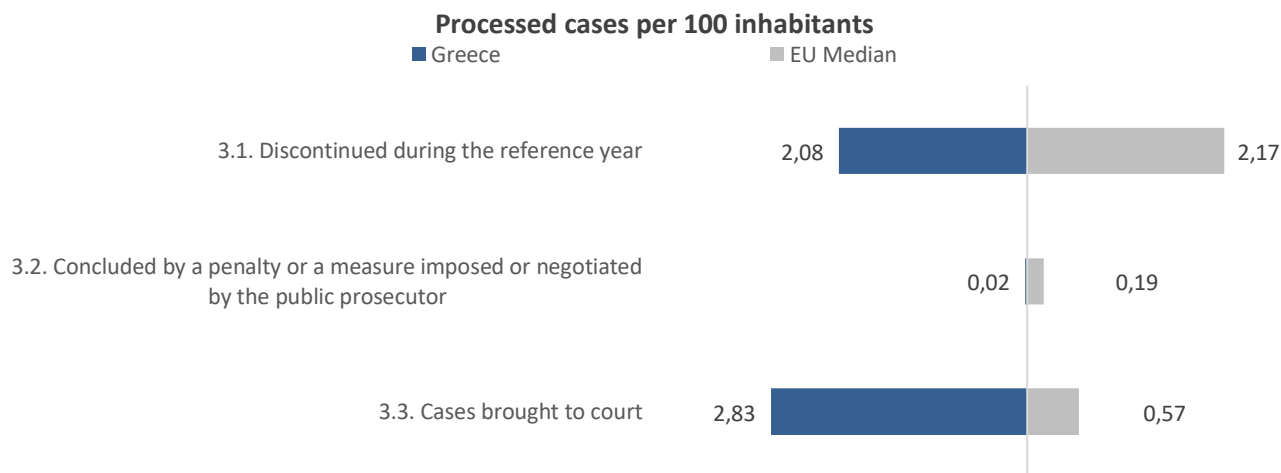
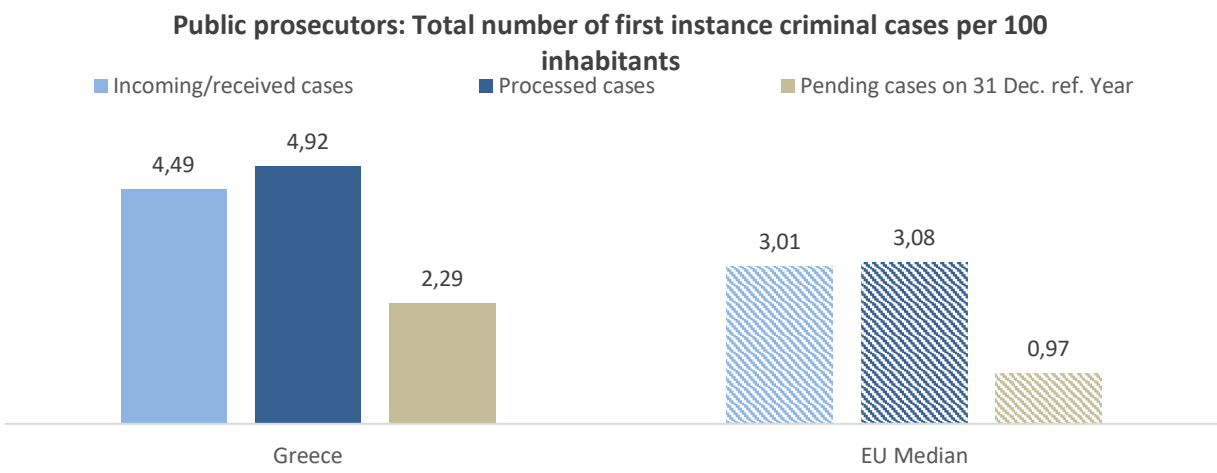

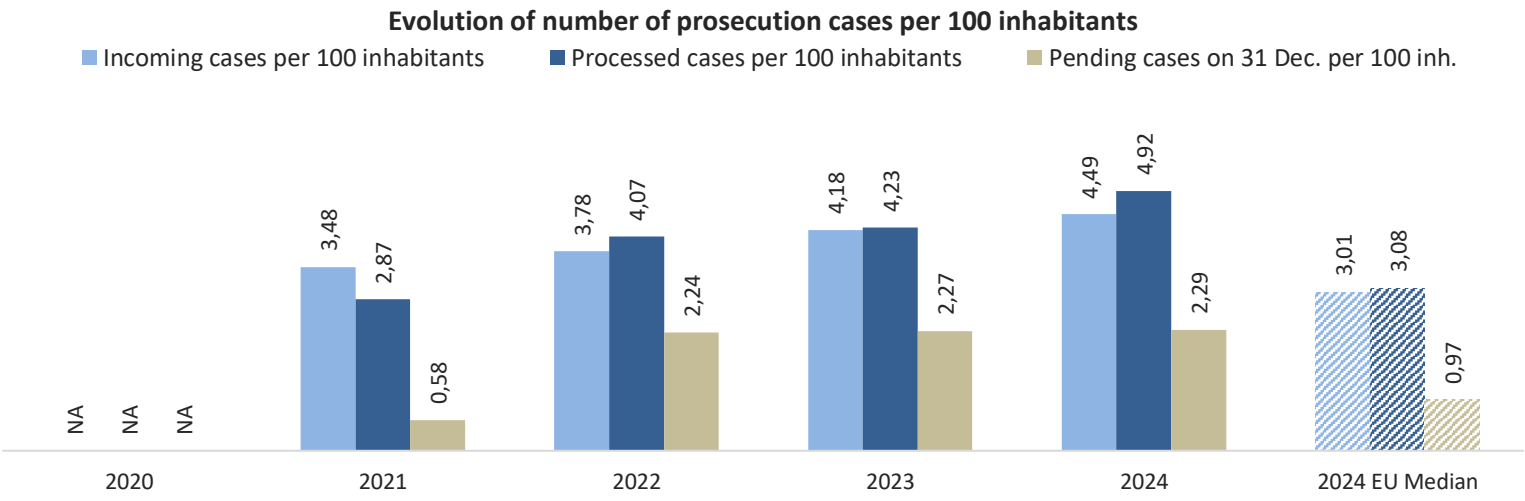
The data are presented by case file (and not per offender). Vertical consistency in the table is not ensured because the data are continuously updated/corrected and because of unknown offender cases that have not yet been completed and are referred either to the investigating magistrate (when they are felonies) or to a preliminary procedure (when they are misdemeanors). All cases that are referred to the investigator are returned to the public prosecutor, whether the perpetrator is identified or not. Cases where the perpetrator could not be identified are considered as resolved, while the rest (where the perpetrator is identified) follow further criminal proceedings and are either solved within the reporting period or are considered pending in the next time period. More precisely, cases where the offender could not be identified are placed in the "unknown perpetrator file". The latter are suspended with a decision of the prosecutor and such decisions are counted as " 3.1.1 Discontinued by the public prosecutor because the offender could not be identified".

The observed increase between 2023 and 2024 in the number of cases discontinued for reasons of opportunity (+42%) and the number of cases referred to court (+30%) can be attributed to the reforms of the public prosecutor's office introduced in 2024. More specifically, under Law 5090/2024 prosecutors were given greater discretion to close cases when it is not in the public interest or when the offense is of low severity. This was applied more actively to misdemeanors, especially in cases with limited evidence or with conciliatory intentions. At the same time, the prosecution of crimes of domestic violence, organised crime, and corruption was strengthened, resulting in an increase in the number of cases brought to court for trial.

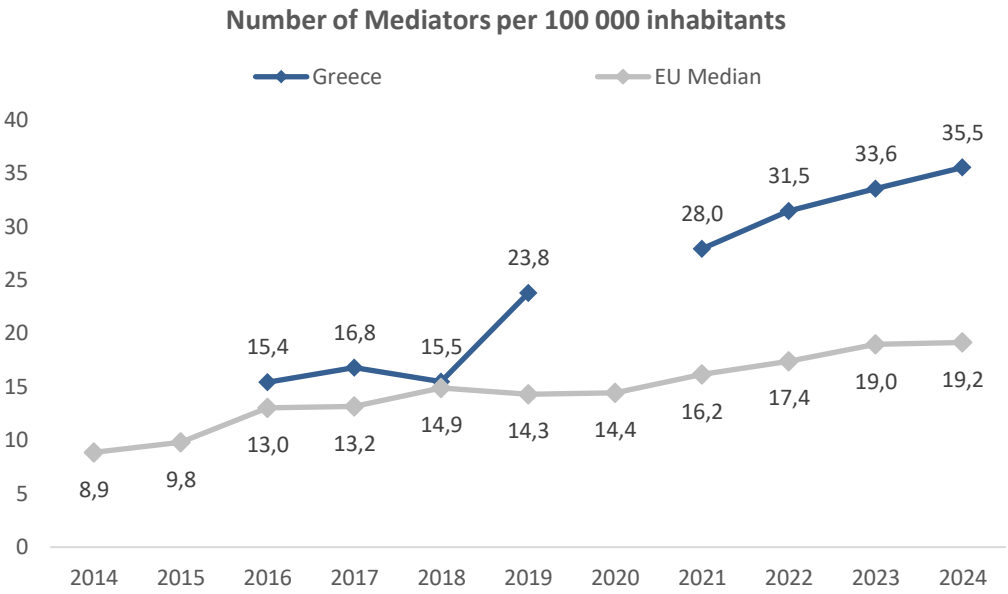

In 2024, there are 3 697 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 35,5 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2023 and 2024 is about 5,7%.

All the specific requirements and qualifications for attending mediation training seminars, as well as participating in national-level mediation accreditation examinations and any other procedural details concerning the mediator’s status, are described in Law 4640/2019. The relevant training programs are delivered by specially licensed and accredited training providers, with the aim of introducing the basic principles and theoretical framework of the mediation process, and equipping candidate mediators with all the necessary skills. Through a combination of theoretical and practical training modules, trainees acquire the necessary knowledge concerning negotiation and communication techniques, conflict analysis, understanding differences and conflicts, mediation law and the relevant legal framework, ethics, confidentiality, personality theory, and the principles of individual and group psychology. They also learn about the role of the mediator and practice techniques and skills through role-playing games, simulations, group exercises, and case studies.

It is worth mentioning that following the decision of the Prime Minister and the Minister of Justice (Decision 798, Government Gazette B 741/20-02-2025) and the subsequent Presidential Degree (P.D. 30, Government Gazette A 52/09-04-2025) concerning the statute of the Ministry of Justice, a Special Secretariat for Alternative Dispute Resolution was established. It consists of two units: the ADR Operational Unit and the International Orientation and Practices Unit. The ADR Operational Unit has the mandate, among other responsibilities, to support the Examination Committee in conducting national accreditation examinations for mediators, and to update the relevant Mediation Registries (meaning the Mediators General Registry and the Specialised Registries for Family and Cadastral mediators) maintained at the Ministry of Justice.

In 2024, there are 2 887 notaries which represents 27,8 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

Notaries are professionals appointed by the state and in particular, by the Minister of Justice after successful participation in a certain public competition. They are considered by the Constitution as public servants without receiving any salary from the State and they practice their profession as in a private sector.

It should be noted that in 2024, a large number of notaries ceased to perform their duties, either due to resignation or unilateral termination due to the age limit. In addition, it should be highlighted that the competent service is not computerized, which prevents the accurate reporting of statistical data(Notary Department of the Ministry of Justice).

There are no witness testimony in administrative cases.

In civil and criminal hearings, the recordings are systematic by default. However, the president of the court and/or the presiding judge has the discretionary power to decide not to record a hearing.

8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in Greece
(2024 data)

In Greece, quality standards are determined for the judicial system at national level (e.g. quality systems for the judiciary and/or judicial quality policies). Specialised personnel within the courts is entrusted with implementation of these national level quality standards.

Law 4938/2022, article 102 par.4 subsection, includes among other evaluation elements the quality of the judges' work with the additional consideration of any successful appeal or cassation against their decisions. The inspector examines, among other things, the quality of their work, i.e., the processing of the legal and factual part of each case and takes into account the cassation or appeal of the decisions drawn up by the inspectors upon admission of the respective legal remedy during the inspected period as well as the wording of the judicial decisions. Article 104 refers to the plenary of the Supreme Courts issuing directions in conjunction with Article 102 which refers to assessment criteria. From the combination of articles 104 and 102 and 100, 101, 102, 104 of Law 4938/22, the following innovations regarding the inspection system result: a) the drafting of an evaluation report on the operation of each court and prosecutor's office (not foreseen before) b) the drafting of an evaluation report of the directors, the courts and the prosecutor's offices (not foreseen before) c) the drafting of an evaluation report of the presidents and the presiding departments and judicial formations of each court and prosecutor's office d) for the inspection of the judges, they take into account the available statistical data.

The two-year term of the inspectors is expected to significantly upgrade the evaluation system, because it will provide the possibility of controlling the judicial work over a longer period of time, especially for the crowded judicial formations.

There is a system for inspecting the quantitative and qualitative performance of judicial officials (law 4938/2022) and decisions of the Administrative Plenary of the Council of State regarding the framework of instructions, practices and guidelines for the evaluation of the Council of State's Associate Councillors and Rapporteurs, as well as judges of the administrative courts. A Charter of Ethics for judges of the Council of State has also been approved.

With the 19/2023 decision of the Council of State in Plenary and the Council, a framework of guidelines, instructions and practices for the inspection of ordinary administrative courts, their directors and other judges was formulated on the basis of article 104 of the Code of the Organization of Courts (Law 4938/22).

The Plenary Session of the Council of State has issued guidelines to the judges serving in it for the better drafting of decisions. Specifically, for the rapporteurs, it has provided concrete recommendations on how to write their reports. Moreover, the Plenary Session has approved a document analyzing the elements taken into account when evaluating the judges.

Decision 7/23 of Areios Pagos in Plenary and the Council.

The option "Costs of the judicial procedures" has not been chosen by the majority of the courts. The option "Disposition time" refers only to Administrative Courts.

According to Law No 4938/2022 (OG A' 109/06.06.2022) "Code of Organization of Courts and Status of Judicial Officers and other provisions", Justices of the Supreme Court, appointed as inspectors for a period of two years, draw up an annual report on the work carried out by each court and prosecutor's office, recommending the necessary measures that should be performed for the proper functioning of judicial bodies.

Regarding the administrative courts, the General Commission of the State for ordinary administrative courts monitors and inspects the functioning of the administrative courts and assists their work (Articles 32-33 of Law 4938/2022). In the near future it is foreseen to use a business intelligence program through the upgraded Integrated Data Management System for the Administrative Justice, in order to extract composite statistical data without contacting any court.

The Head of each court is responsible for the assignment of the cases between judges under his/her responsibility. In this sense, he/she is aware of the quantitative performance of judges. The assigned cases have to be dealt with by the judges within the period of 8 months according to Law 4983/2022 (art. 99-104) and Law 2717/1999 art. 194 par.1. Besides the heads of courts, there is also the plenary of the Supreme Courts.

Each administrative court sets up an internal service regulation (Article 19 of Law 4938/2022) which specifies, among other things, the number of cases assigned to each judge per month or year, taking into consideration the special circumstances of each court, the number of serving judges and the seriousness of the cases.

The category "Other" refers to a disciplinary punishment pronounced by the competent disciplinary body, that can result in a permanent termination.
