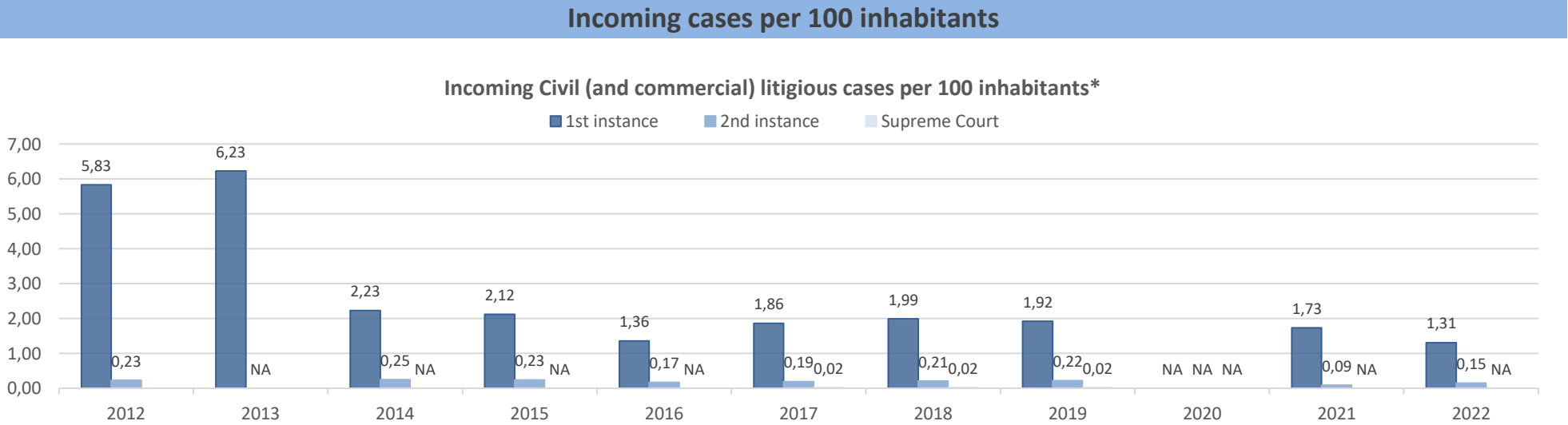
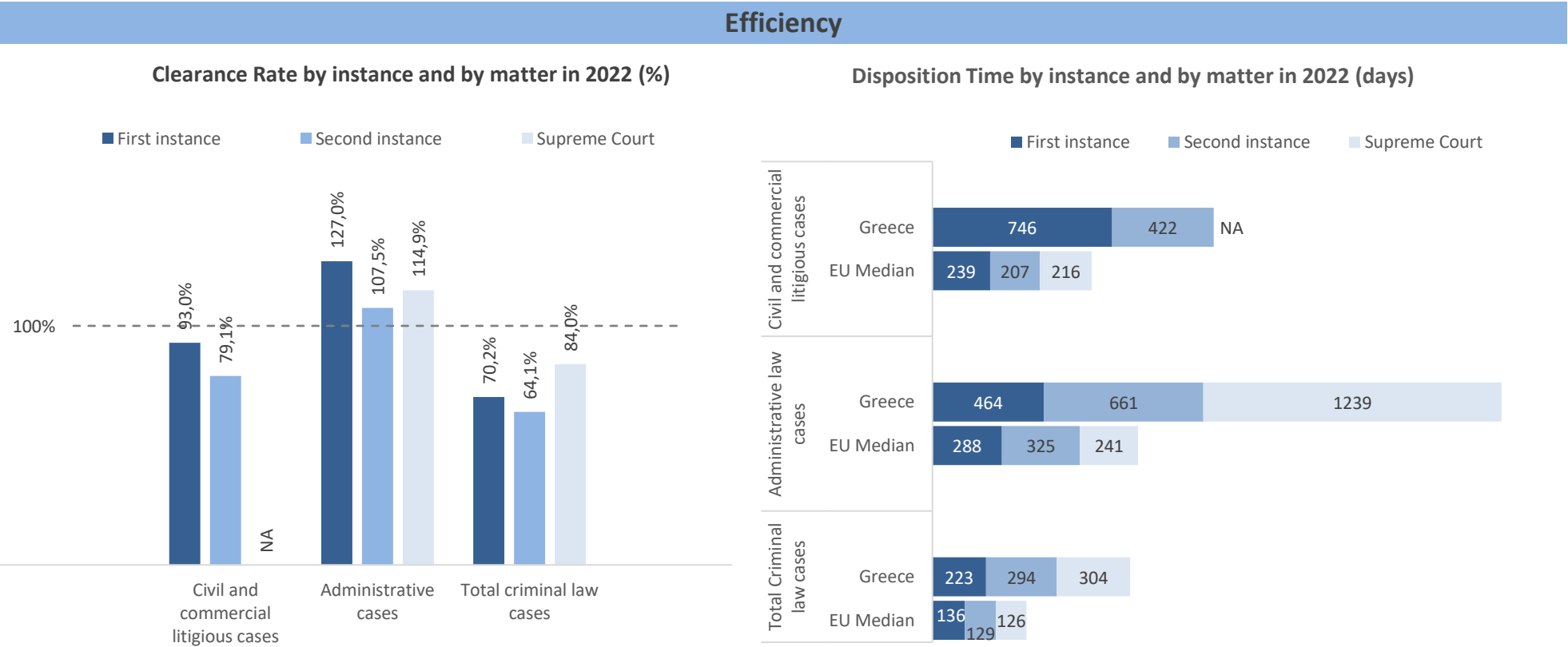
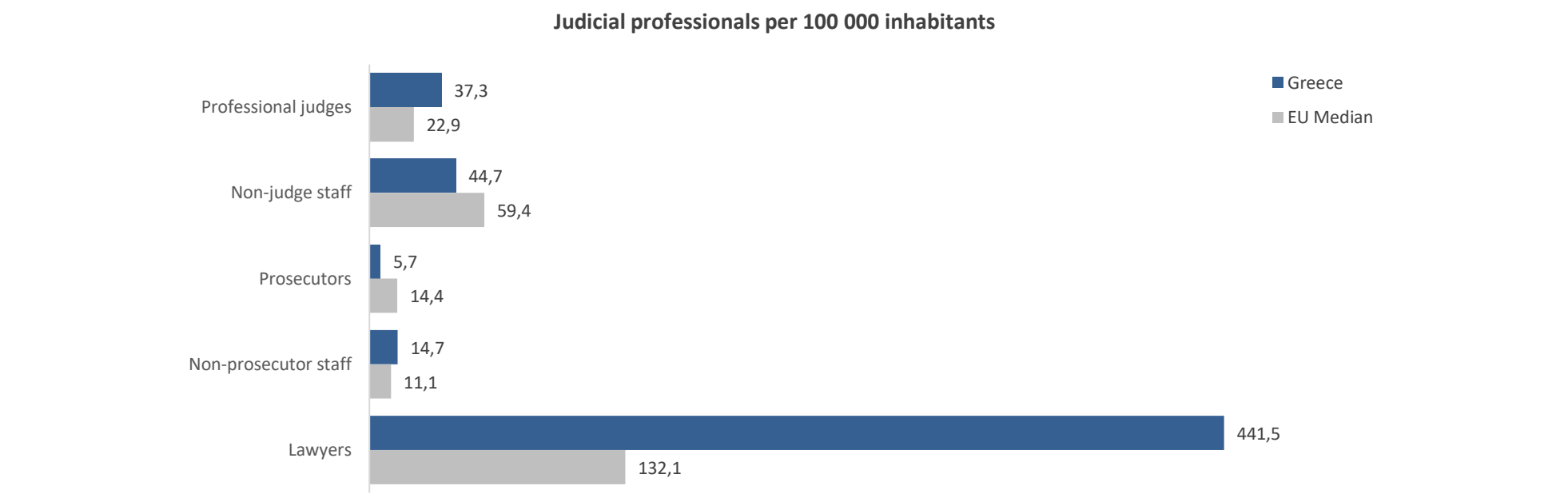

1. Judicial organisation in Greece (2022 data)

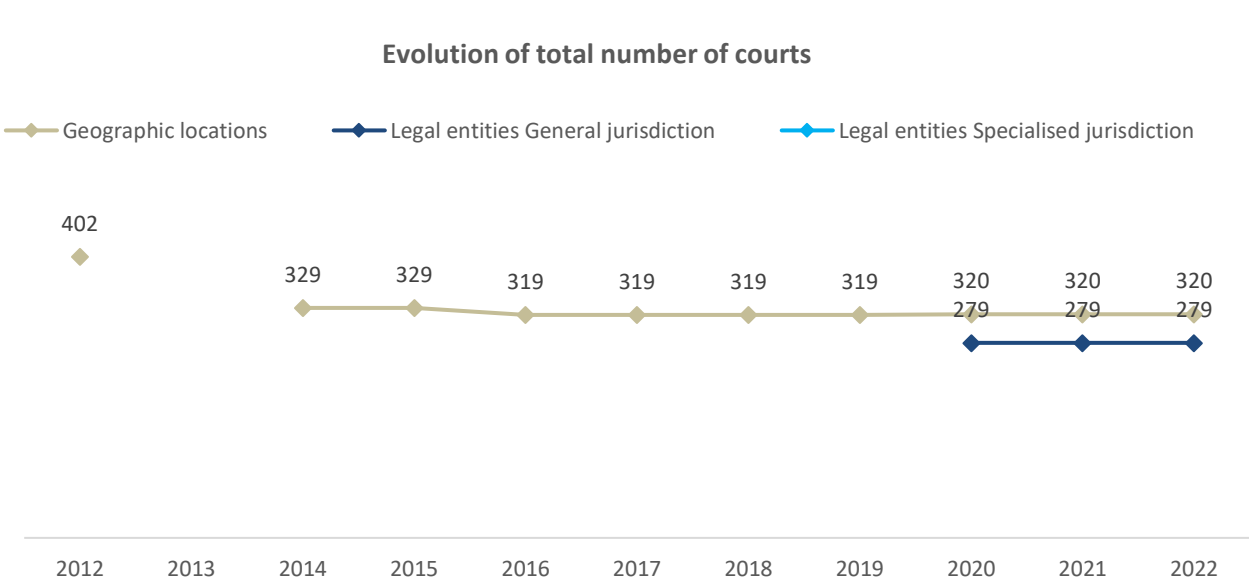
In Greece, the total number of courts of general jurisdiction (legal entities) is 279. There are 259 first instance courts of general jurisdiction (196 Local and District Criminal Courts and 63 Courts of First Degree). There are 19 second instance courts of general jurisdiction and the Supreme Court as the highest court of general jurisdiction (Areios Pagos).

The accurate number of first instance specialized courts encompassing administrative courts, military courts and other courts is not available. However, it is reported that administrative courts include 30 first instance courts, 9 second instance courts and 1 Supreme Court (the Council of State) that is considered as one of the three supreme courts in Greece. The higher instance other specialized court is the Court of Auditors that is also considered as one of the three supreme courts in Greece.

There are in total 320 courts as geographic locations.

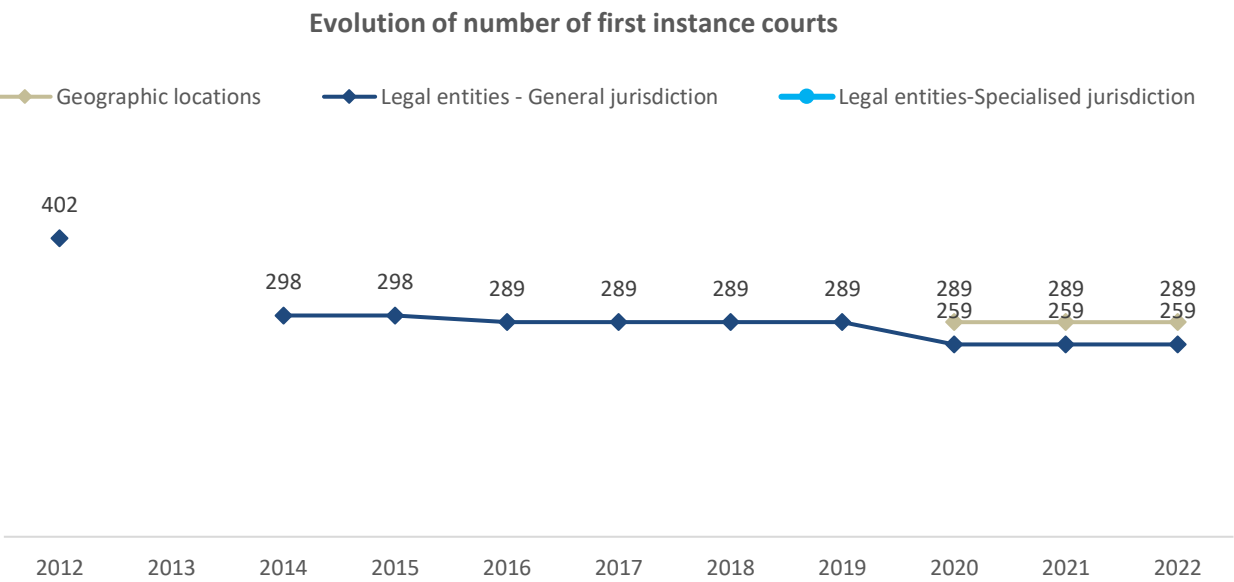

In Greece, there are no special courts for the fields of law described above, besides those already mentioned. The Greek Constitution is reluctant to provide specialised courts in the Greek legal system. Instead, within the Courts of First Instance and Courts of appeal of large cities there are special chambers, where the task of adjudicating in special categories of law (e.g. family law, commercial law, etc.) is assigned. Judges entrusted with such duties have usually the correspondent specific studies.

As far as other special courts are concerned, special provisions regulate the operation of courts for military, navy and air force courts. It should be noted that these courts are under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of National Defence, therefore there is no further information.

Administrative courts include: in the first instance 30, in the second instance 9 and 1 Supreme Court (the Council of State).

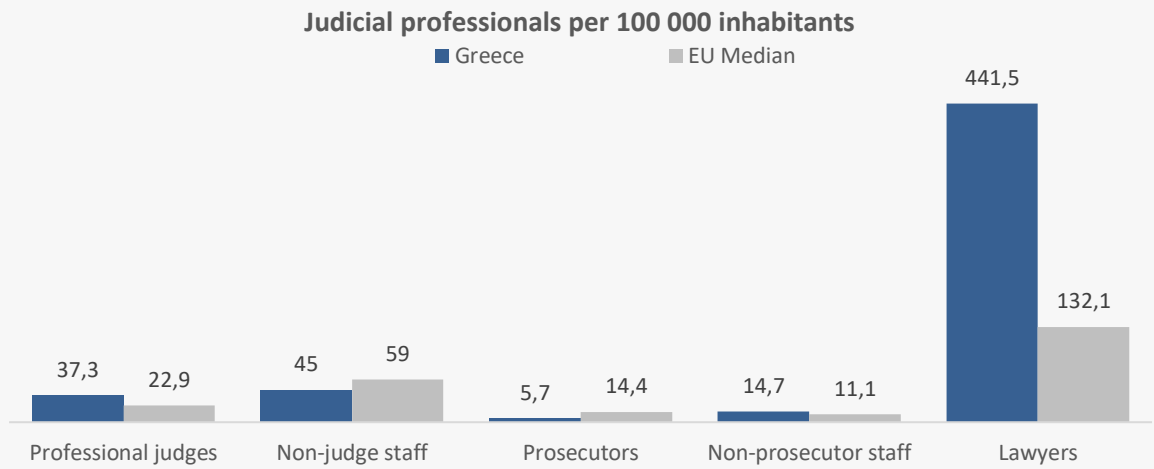
The "Other specialised courts" include the Court of Auditors which is one of the three supreme courts in Greece.

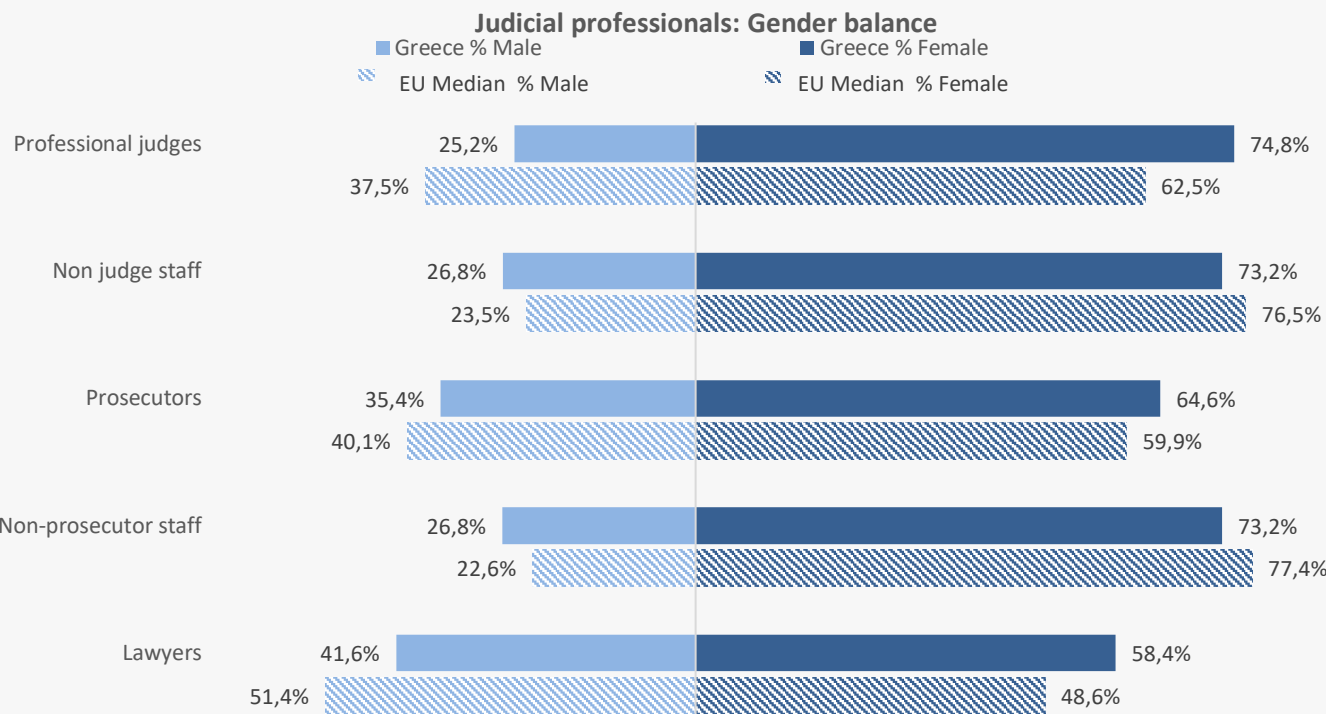

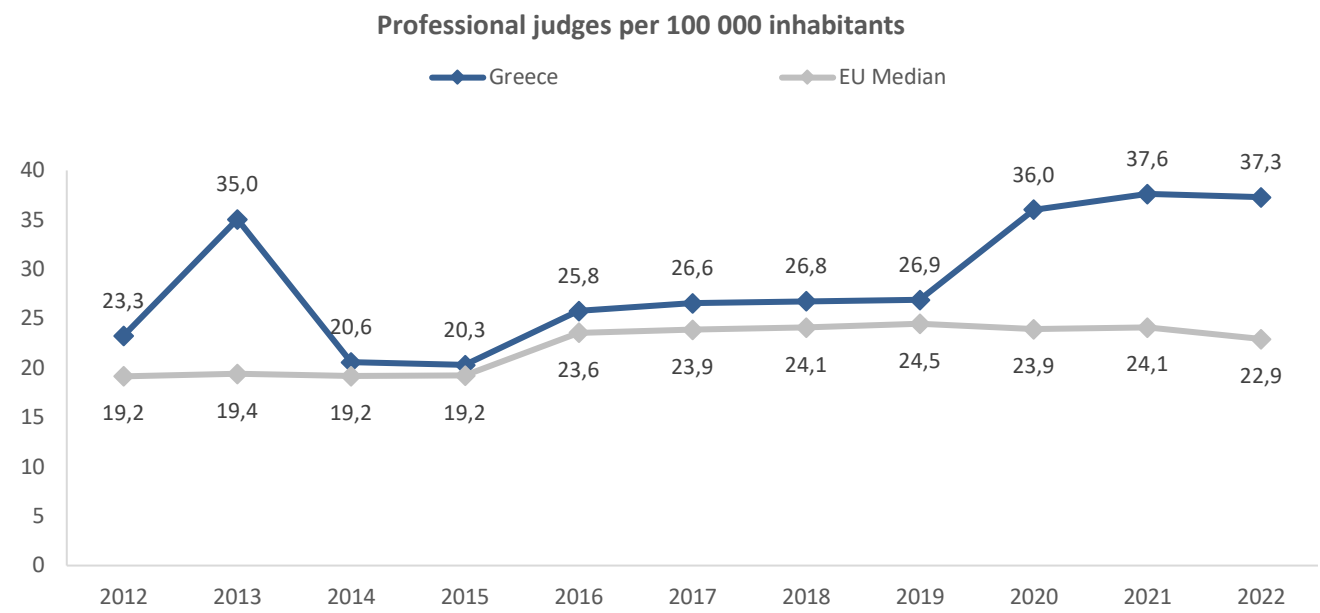

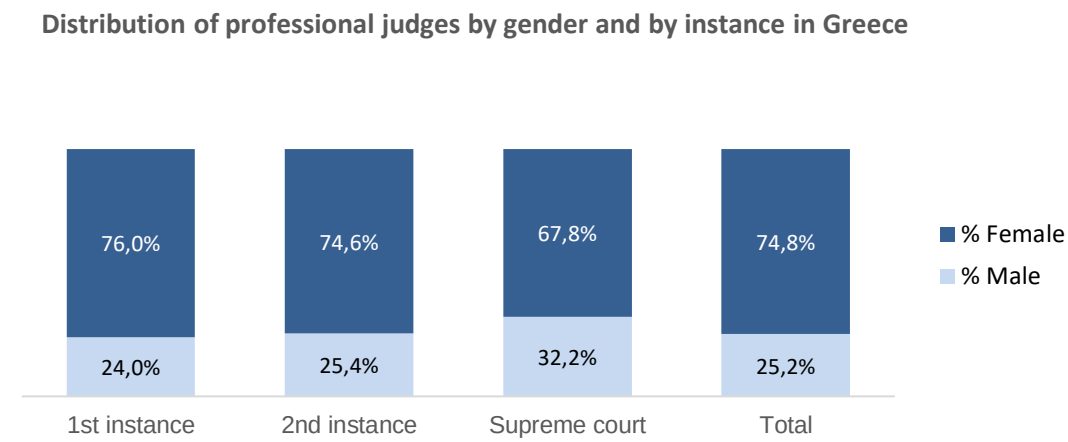
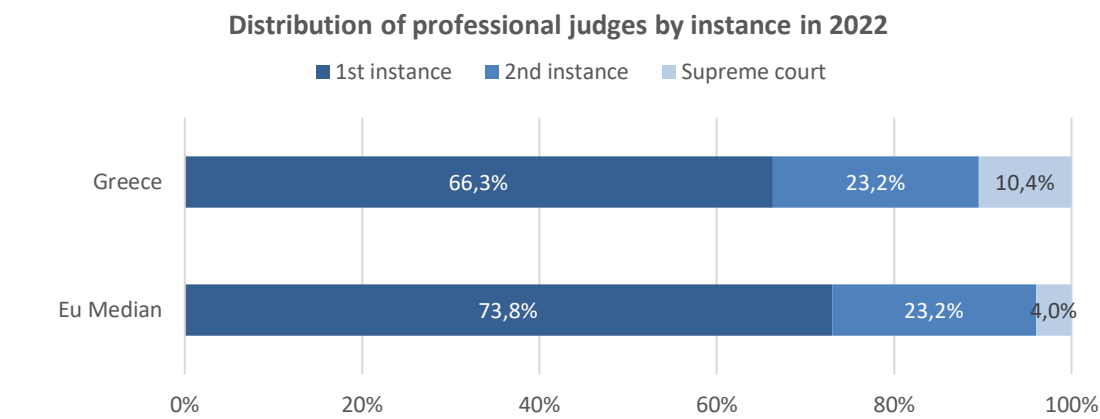


According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Greece is 3 981, which is -0,9% less than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Greece, there are 37,3 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is well above the EU median of 22,9 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 2 979, which represents 74,8% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 2 640 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 2 007 are female); 925 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 690 are female) and 416 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 282 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Greece follows similar trends, but with less judges in the first instance courts and more judges in the Supreme court's level.

As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that in Greece, there is a high percentage of female judges in all instances (76 % in first instance courts, 74,6% in second instance courts and 67,8% in Supreme courts).

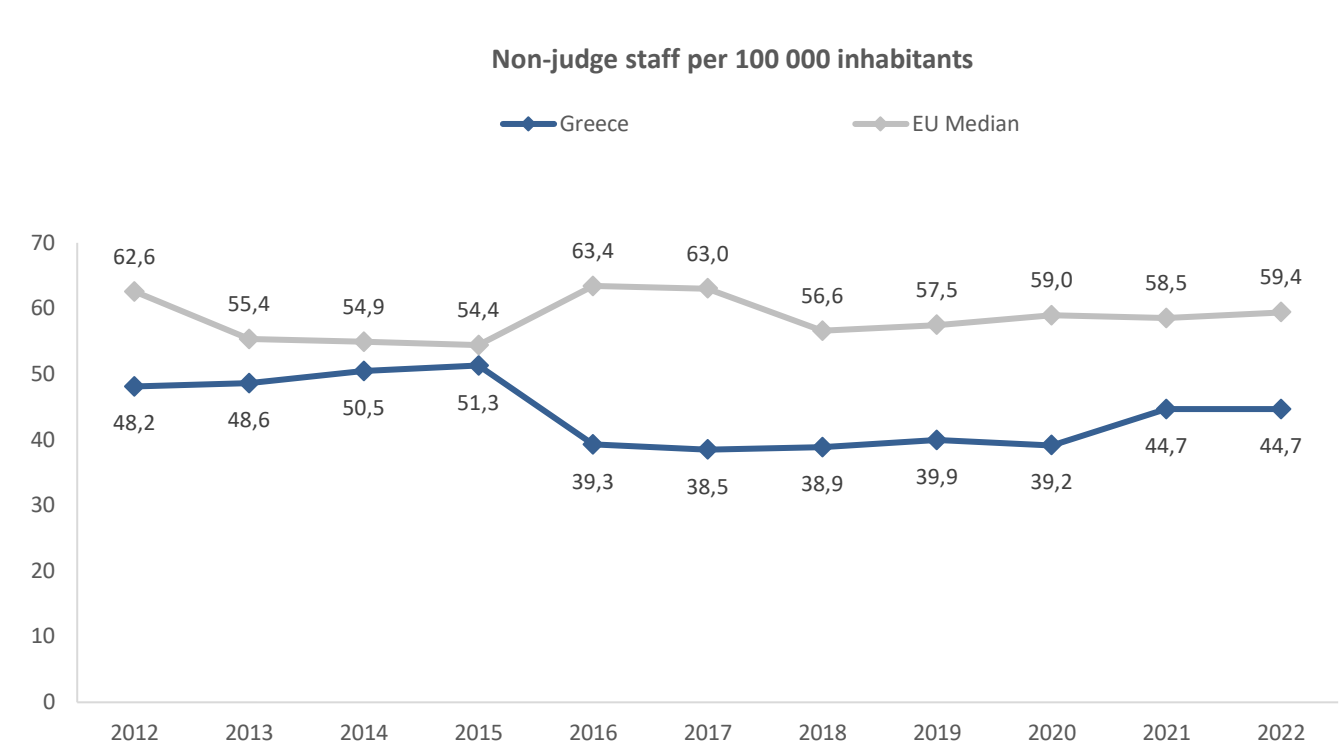

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has remained on the same level as in 2021 (44,7).

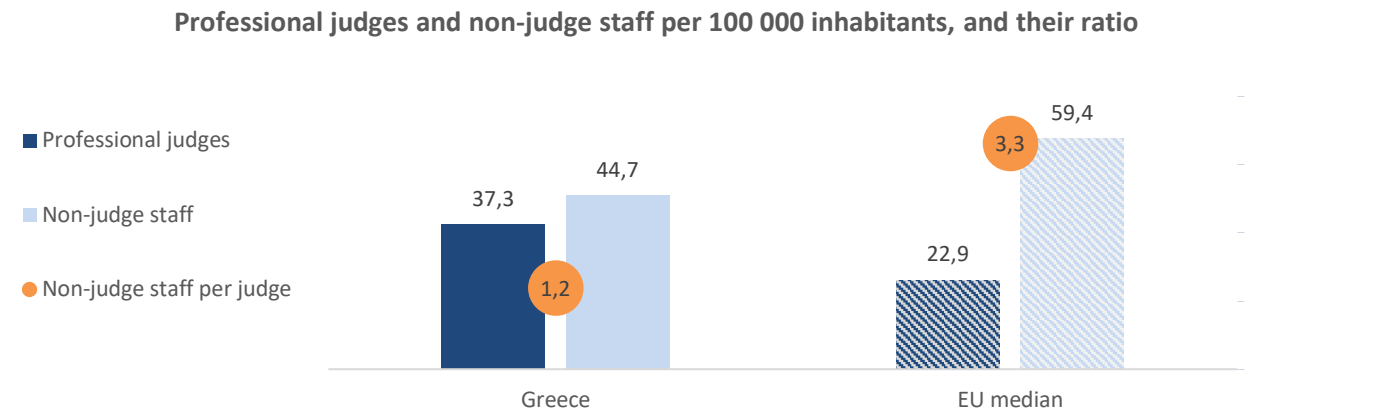

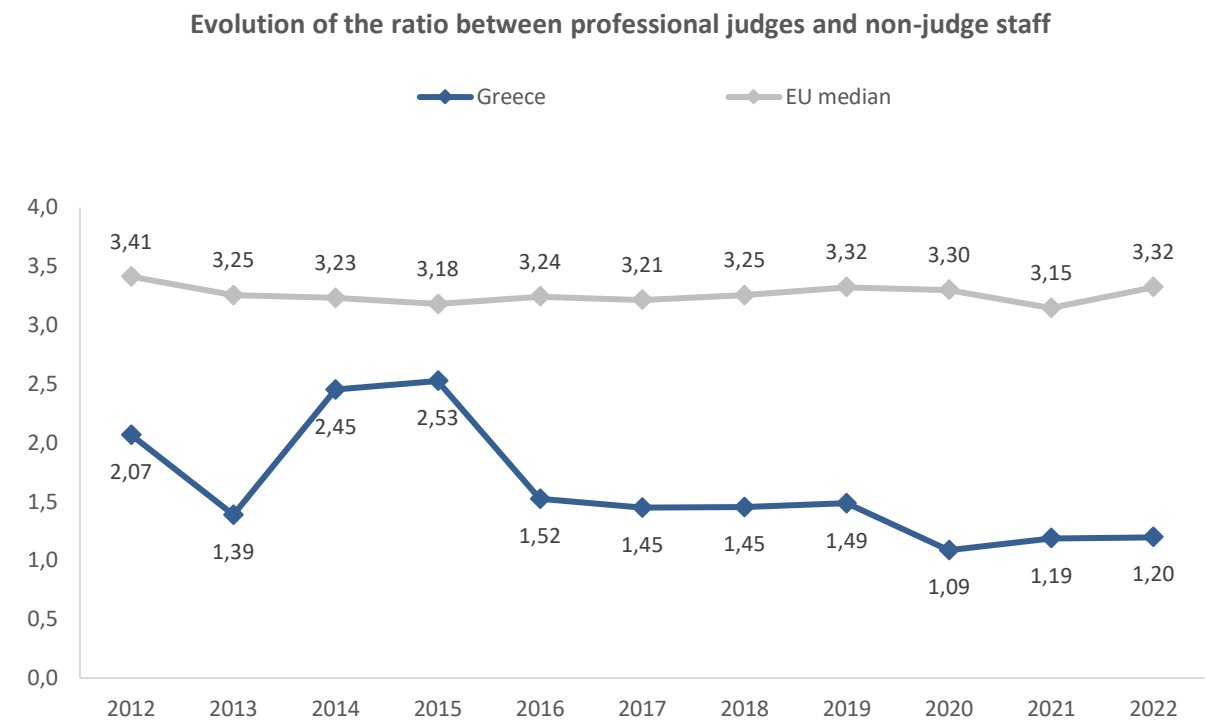

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

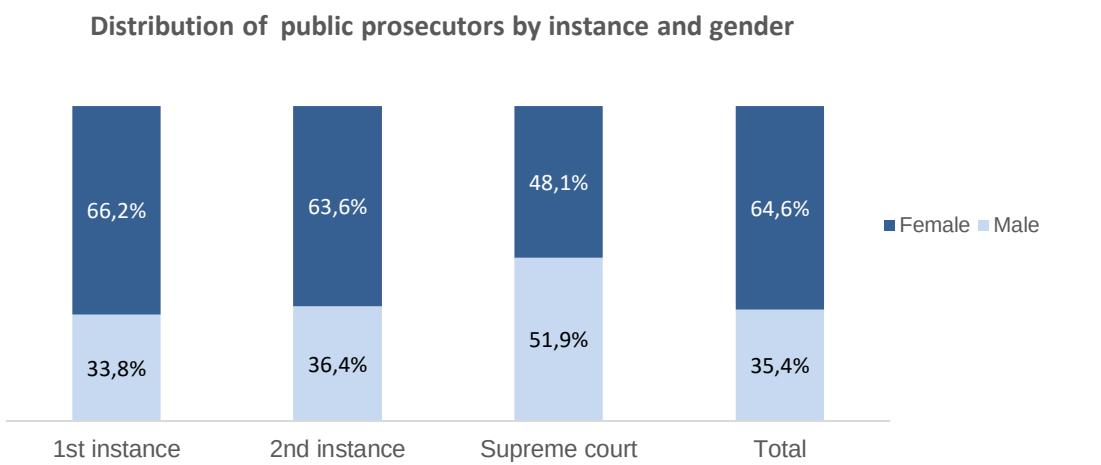
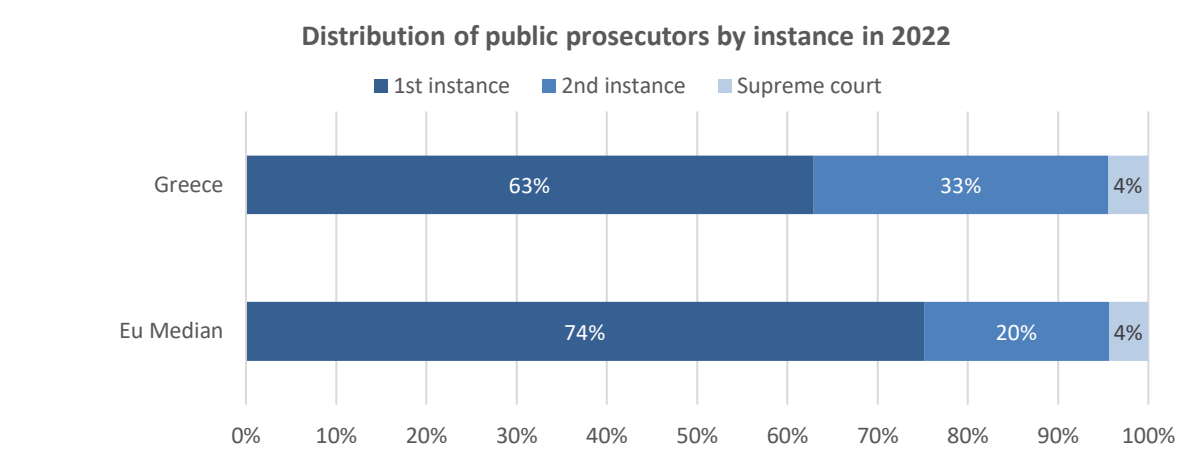

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 392, which represents 64,6% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 382 in first instance (of which 253 are female); 198 are in second instance (of which 126 are female) and 27 in final instance (of which 13 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of public prosecutors per instance, Greece has less public prosecutors in the first instance and more public prosecutors on the second instance level.

As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that in Greece, there is an important percentage of female prosecutors in first instance (66,2 %), second instance (63,6%) and per total (64,6%). There is however no majority of female prosecutors at Supreme court level (48,1%).

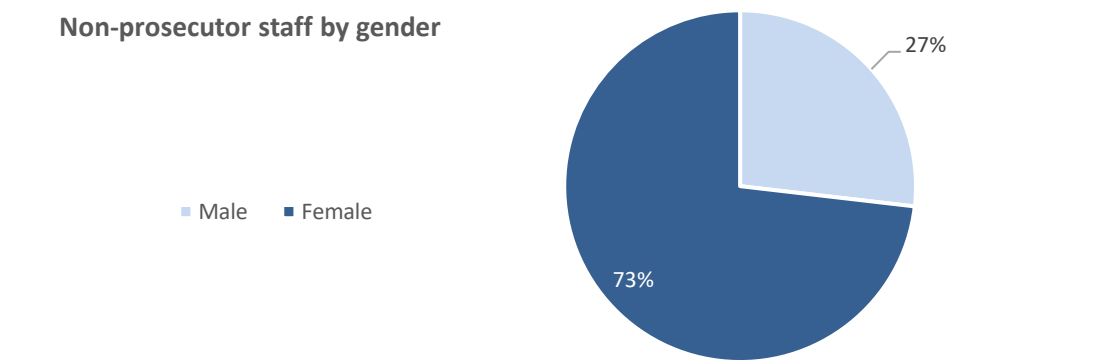

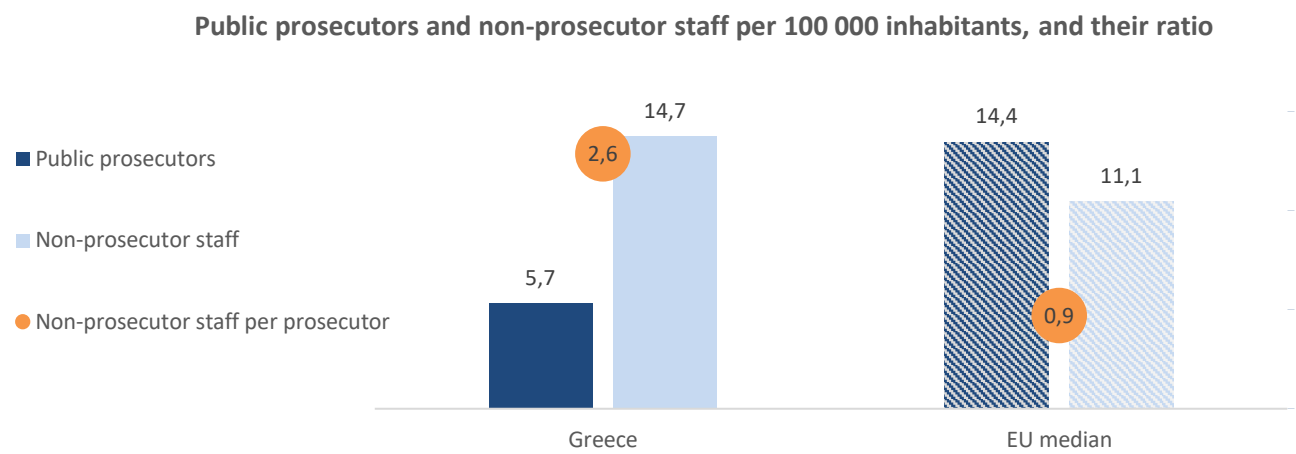

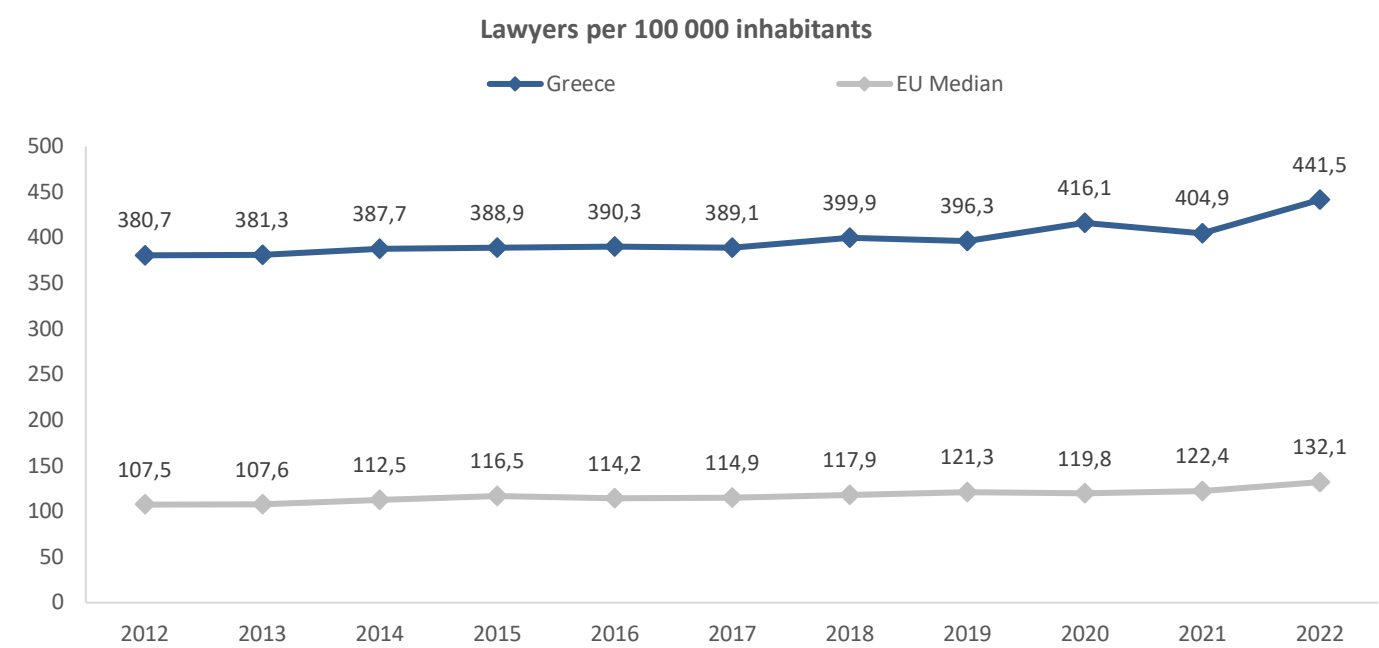

In 2022, there are 47 141 lawyers, which is 9,0% more than in 2021.

There are 27 528 female lawyers which is 58% of the total.

Greece has 441,5 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is significantly above the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Greece is 31 710€, which is rather below the EU median of 54 224€ (-42% below).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Greece's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -10% below the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Greece of 31 710€ is rather below the EU median of 48 728€ (-35% below).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Greece is the country that is at the median level of the absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level (87 247€).

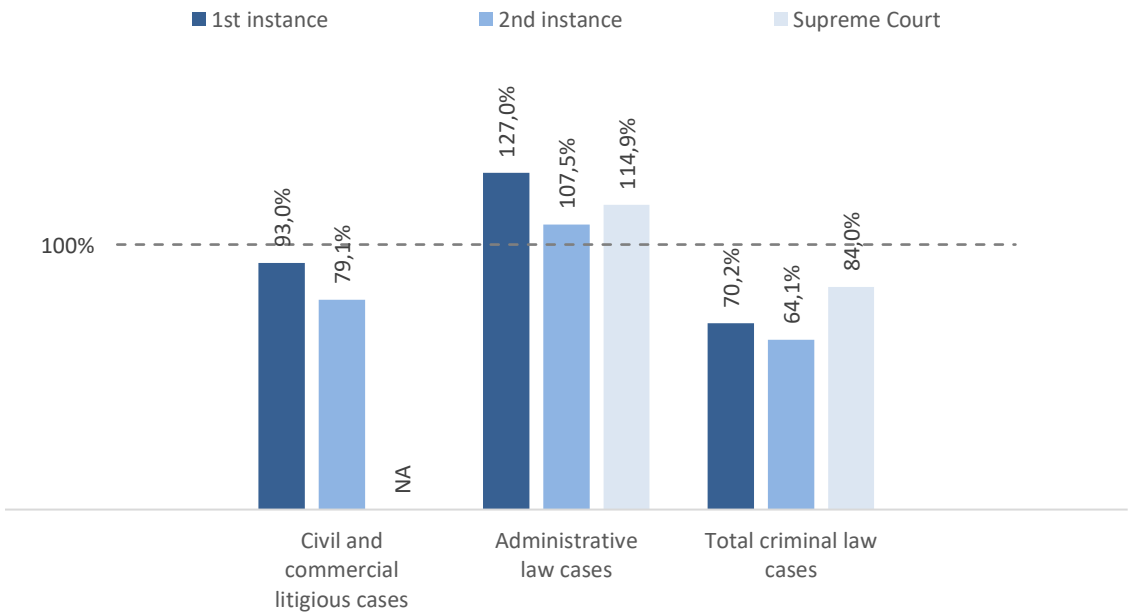
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

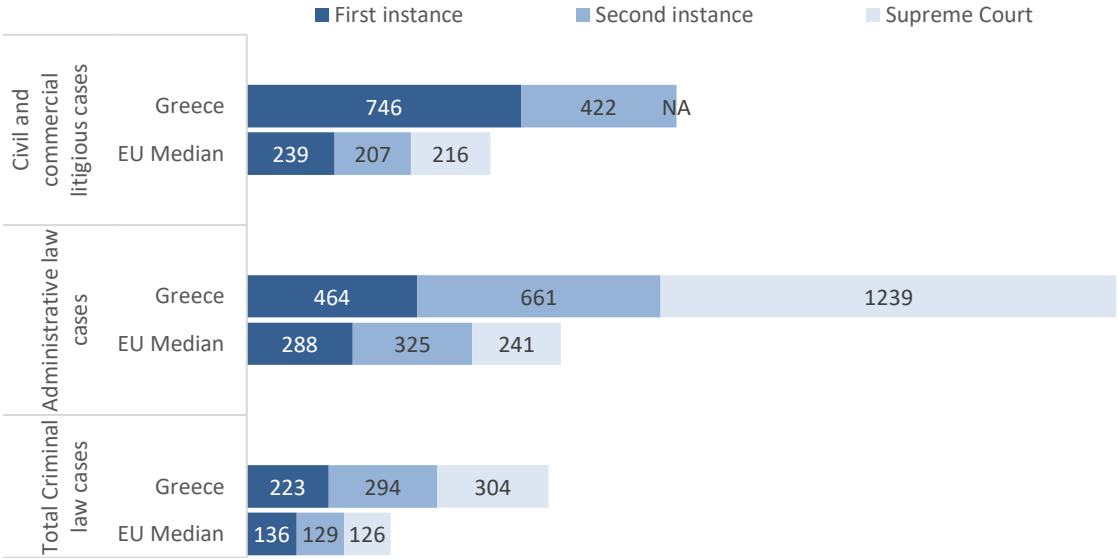

At the outset, it should be noticed that data on third instance civil litigious cases are not available for the reference year.

Looking at available data, the Clearance Rate indicator is satisfactory only for administrative law cases where it reached levels above the 100% threshold in all three instances. For civil litigious and criminal law cases, the Clearance Rate is well below the 100% threshold and EU medians in all instances, especially for criminal law cases where the recorded values are very low (70,2% in first, 64,1% in second and 84% in third instance).

The Disposition time is significantly higher than corresponding EU medians in each instance and for all case categories. The highest value was recorded for third instance administrative cases where it reached 1239 days (compared to EU median of 241 days) whereas criminal law cases appear to be overall the fastest in Greece, which is also the trend observed in the EU for the reference year.

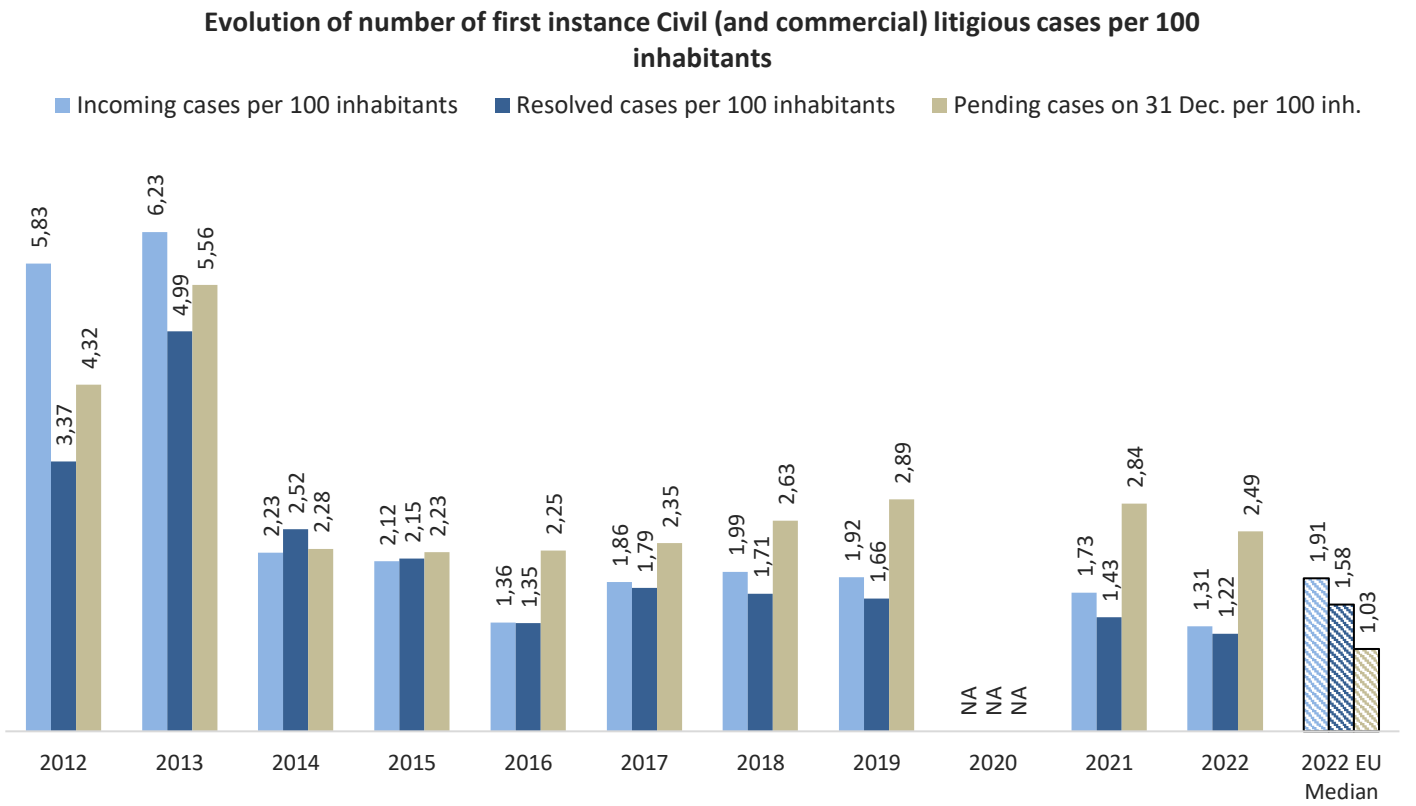
From the above analysis, it might be concluded that the situation in Greece raises some concerns regarding efficiency of courts. For civil and criminal cases, data show not only a high Disposition Time, but also a low Clearance rate, which implies that situation might be further deteriorated in the future, as further accumulation of pending cases caused by the low Clearance rate will lead to potential prolongation of already high Disposition times. On the other hand, the highest Disposition time is already faced in administrative law matters, indicating bigger challenges for Greek courts in this domain. However, high levels of Clearance rate imply that the situation might be gradually improved for these case types, if courts manage to maintain such high levels of this indicator.

When analysing case flow data, It is worth highlighting that comparisons with data from previous cycles are not relevant. Since last year, Greece undertook measures to improve the system for collecting statistical data, such as the training of staff and the creation of an instructional manual guide with definitions and instructions. These measures were intended to help collecting more reliable data from both small and large courts and prosecution services and eliminate the standard errors in judicial statistics. As this methodology is developing, discrepancies in data can be observed. This should be taken into account when analysing below figures as well.

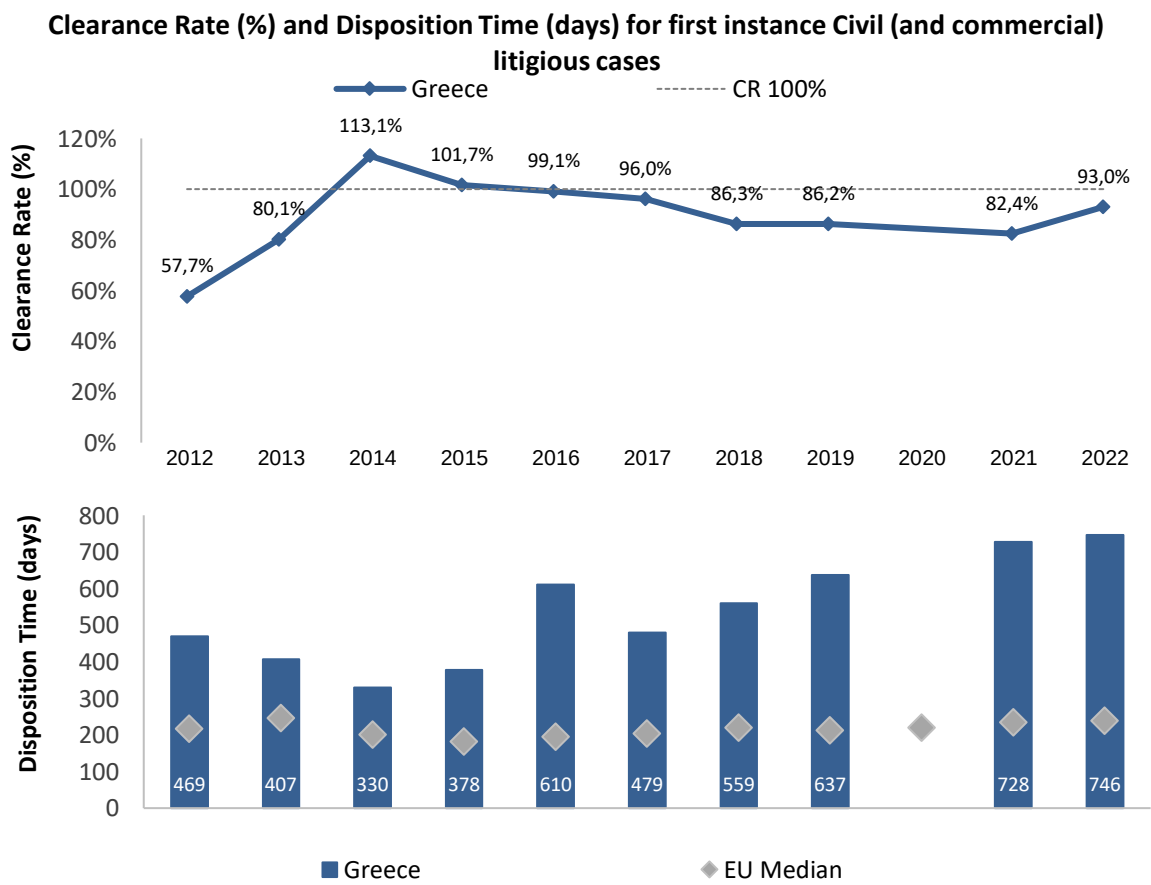
The number of incoming cases in 2022 in Greece (1,31 per 100 inhabitants) is somewhat below EU median (1,91 per 100 inhabitants).

The number of resolved cases in 2022 in Greece (1,22 per 100 inhabitants) is somewhat below EU median (1,58 per 100 inhabitants).

The number of pending cases at the end of 2022 in Greece (2,49 per 100 inhabitants) is well above EU median (1,03 per 100 inhabitants).

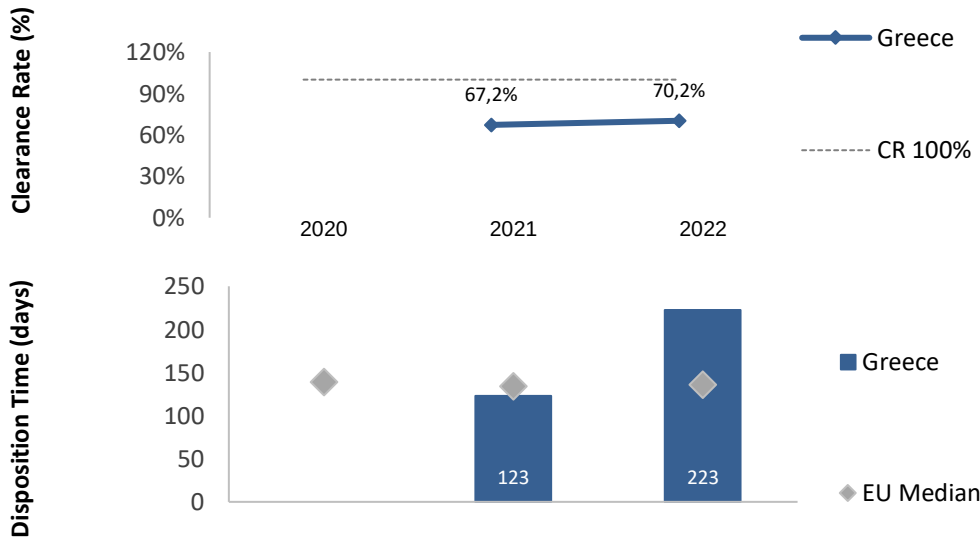

In 2022, there are 3 363 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 31,5 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2021 and 2022 is about 12,7%.

As regards the requirements and procedure to become an accredited or registered mediator the following should be noted.

Mediators must:

- (a) have a higher education graduates or holders of an equivalent degree abroad;
- (b) be trained by a mediator training body recognised by the Central mediation Commission or holders of an accreditation certificate from another member state of the European Union;
- and (c) be accredited by the Central mediation Commission and registered in the registers referred to in Article 29.

If a graduate of higher education or holder of an equivalent degree from abroad is also a holder of a master's or doctoral degree from universities or an equivalent degree from abroad on mediation, further training is not required in order to be accredited by a mediator. The Training Institution may participate directly in the examinations for its accreditation. Those who serve as public, municipal, and judicial officials or employees of a legal entity governed by Public Law, as well as active judicial or public officials, are excluded from the exercise of the profession of mediator.
