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Background

Every year, large numbers of **migrant and refugee children** arrive in Europe via various migratory routes, often without their parents or adult caregivers. Upon arrival in various European countries, migrant and refugee children fall under child protection schemes and are thus protected by the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. Once they **turn 18 years old**, they lose the additional rights and protection they had as children, often from one day to another.

To enjoy human rights effectively, and without disruptions, they must be prepared for their **transition to adulthood** and continue to be supported after turning 18 years old. The right to be supported during the transition to adulthood is not a new human right. It is grounded in existing children's rights and human rights standards.

This module aims to clarify the corresponding **human rights standards** and understand how they can be applied to ensure that young refugees and migrants enjoy both in law, and in practice, the fundamental rights they are entitled to. In addition, **examples of promising practices** are included throughout the different sessions with a view to promoting knowledge sharing and inspiring relevant professionals in the field.

This free online course on the **Transition of Migrant and Refugee Children to Adulthood** was developed under the multilateral Project "[Building Futures, Sharing Good Practices: Migrant Children's Transition to Adulthood – UACFutures](#)", funded by the European Union's Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (AMIF) and the Council of Europe.

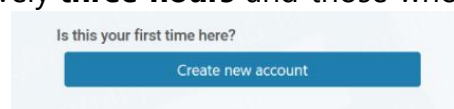
Target audience
