Integrated Approach

The National Heritage Institute (NHI) is the major organisation of the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic receiving contributions from the State Budget. It was established in 2003 by merging independent regional offices. Under the current legislation, and in particular under the State Heritage Preservation Act, the Institute is entrusted with several expert tasks. It provides expert opinions supporting the decisions of executive bodies, it has a methodological impact on the unification of approaches in the area of preservation and the development of heritage values on the territory of the Czech Republic, and also maintains a heritage inventory. It actively intervenes in the process of designating individual objects, structures and sites as cultural property of the Czech Republic, also providing for their documentation within its limits. In addition, the Institute benefits from its professional capabilities and knowledge within the preservation of more than 100 cultural monuments, the conservation of which is entrusted to the Institute by the State and which are open to the public, seven of which being inscribed in the UNESCO World Heritage List. Within the property open to the public, the NHI cares for approximately three-quarters of a million items in collection. It also administers historic gardens and parks.

As a scientific centre it is currently working on 29 projects co-funded from European grants and on 36 scientific projects co-funded by institutions within the Czech Republic. The NHI is also involved in the Europeana internet portal and participates in providing digital data for the CARARE project.

The NHI as an expert methodological, documentation and information institution of State heritage conservation prepares and publishes, based on its own scientific research, approximately 50 publications and periodicals a year, specializing in particular in the certified methodologies from various areas of its activity. The awarding of internationally recognised certifications to the NHI methodologies enables their more intensive application in practice, for instance, as sources of argumentation for expert opinions in the area of State heritage conservation. Since 1986, roughly 50 methodologies have been published by the National Heritage Institute.

A number of conceptual and strategic documents, which exists at all levels (national, regional, local), contributes to the identification, conservation and protection of the cultural and natural heritage. For example, in the system of territorial planning documentation, plans of conservation principles based on the State Heritage Preservation Act are used and the regeneration of heritage conservation areas should be based on up-to-date territorial planning documentation.

Currently, the national priorities in heritage conservation include the drafting of a new act regulating State heritage conservation and the protection of archaeological heritage (the intended substance of the law has already been accepted), the digitization of the Central List of Cultural Property, establishing cooperation with the Ministry of the Interior in performing periodical preventive checks of security systems at heritage sites, active participation in implementing the European Landscape Convention, the stimulation and implementation of cultural heritage science

in the primary and secondary school system, and streamlining of the current system of tax relief for heritage property owners.

Until 2003, the administration of heritage property was carried out within independent regional offices and was characterised by distinctive differences in the level of its presentation to the public. The National Heritage Institute realizes innovation in this area: it has issued a methodology for interior installations as well as a methodology for guided tours, and enhances "live culture" activities at historic sites (Castle Night, Living Monuments). Furthermore, growing visitor needs and increasing competition from heritage sites not administered by the NHI also determine the basic requirements for the uniform level of services provided to the visitor (guiding services, booking and ticket sales, souvenir sales, services related to organizing cultural and social events, catering services, landscaping). Towards the begin of 2016 the unification of the websites of all heritage sites and their interconnection with the central NHI website was completed.
