CONTEXT

he Council of Europe views corruption as a serious threat to the preservation and promotion of its core values: pluralist democracy, human rights and the rule of law in Europe. It takes a multidisciplinary approach to the fight against corruption and has adopted multifaceted legal instruments to address it. These instruments are designed to strengthen member States' democratic, legal and institutional capacity to prevent corruption, as well as to detect and sanction it effectively when it occurs.

Since 1999, the Group of States against Corruption (GRECO) has monitored the implementation of these standards and promoted effective measures to prevent corruption and promote integrity in member States. Over the years, GRECO has become the main multilateral anti-corruption review and monitoring mechanism in Europe. Its membership has grown in parallel with its prestige: today GRECO brings together 49 member states (48 European states and the United States of America) and its membership is still growing.

GRECO has completed four thematic evaluation rounds and is currently implementing its fifth round. In all these areas, it has acted as a catalyst for major policy, legislative or constitutional changes. This progress in the fight against corruption is relevant for all our member states and all sectors (public and private).

The 20th anniversary of GRECO provides a privileged moment to take stock of GRECO's achievements, to assess member States' additional needs, to anticipate emerging corruption challenges and risks and to propose a forward-looking anti-corruption agenda of the Council of Europe and of GRECO to consolidate and strengthen the progress made.

CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

he high level conference organised under the auspices of the French Presidency of the Committee of Ministers, will be an exercise of stock-taking, strategy planning and consultation with governments, anticorruption authorities, key international organisations and civil society representatives. It will pursue the following objectives:

- 1. to share progress achieved since the launching of GRECO in 1999 -
- to support the implementation of GRECO's current Fifth Evaluation Round and to conduct an evaluation of its key findings and trends -
- 3. to consult governments on their needs and, in partnership with the international community, identify challenging modern-day corruption risks -
- 4. to propose a vision for future GRECO and Council of Europe anti-corruption efforts.
