




Restoring hope and justice: A lawyer's fight for women's rights after the earthquakes in Türkiye

When the devastating earthquakes struck Türkiye in 2023, the destruction went far beyond collapsed buildings. It shattered lives, leaving many women in vulnerable situations displaced, and trapped in difficult circumstances. For Fatma Serap Balakan, who is a lawyer from Hatay, providing legal aid to these women became more than just a profession: it turned into a mission. Through the grant scheme implemented by the Council of Europe and the Union of Turkish Bar Associations (UTBA) under the action "Fostering Women's Access to Justice in Türkiye," she helped women navigate the legal challenges that emerged in the aftermath of the disaster.

A rare internship opportunity: Sofija Lekic's journey into human rights law

For many young law students, the path to understanding the complexities of human rights law is often a theoretical one.

But for Sofija Lekic, a 22-year-old law student from Belgrade, the opportunity to dive into real-world cases at the European Court of Human Rights has provided a rare and invaluable experience. As one of 22 students who went through the internship at the Government Agent's Office which represents Serbia before the European Court of Human Rights, organised with the Council of Europe's support, Sofija gained firsthand knowledge of how human rights cases are handled, sharpening her skills and deepening her passion for the field.

Trauma-informed therapy for women offenders to be introduced soon in Albania



The Council of Europe is assisting the Albanian prison service in the process of introducing for the first time the trauma-informed therapy for women offenders. It promotes emotional recovery by being aware of patient's triggers as well as recognises the signs of trauma and builds on a strength-based approach to resist re-traumatisation. In this view, an on-site visit of Council of Europe experts was conducted to the newly built "Pojëska" prison near Pogradec, aiming to assess the situation and modalities of piloting the treatment programme.

Monitoring officers better equipped to communicate with minors in enclosed institutions



Monitoring officers have strengthened their ability to engage with minors in closed institutions following a specialised capacity building activity on effective communication techniques. Monitoring officers from the Montenegrin Ministry of Justice, National Prevention Mechanism (NPM) and the Treatment Department of the Administration for Execution of Criminal Sanctions improved their skills to conduct more in-depth monitoring visits.



Representatives of the Albanian government, local institutions and civil society organisations involved in primary education gathered in Korça to address the ongoing challenge of segregation of Roma and Egyptian pupils at the "Naim Frashëri" school. This roundtable, organised in partnership with the Commissioner for Protection from Discrimination and the State Advocate's Office, identified concrete actions and determined related responsibilities in the implementation of the European Court of Human Rights' judgments.

Strengthening oversight of high-risk businesses to tackle financial crime in Türkiye

Supervisors in Türkiye are better equipped to monitor and regulate businesses vulnerable to money laundering and terrorist financing, following a two-day capacity building on risk-based supervision of Designated Non-Financial Businesses and Professions (DNFBPs). Organised by the Council of Europe, in collaboration with the Financial Crime Investigation Board (MASAK) on 25-26 February 2025 in Ankara, the training focused on practical tools and strategies for supervising high-risk sectors such as real estate businesses and dealers in precious metals and stones.


Enhancing financial investigations and asset recovery in Bosnia and Herzegovina
