### MORNING WORKSHOPS

- 1. Roma Identity Uccu (4<sup>th</sup> Floor, Room A1)

  Volunteers of two NGOs talk about their own experiences as members of the LGBTI community. They demonstrate the difficulties a young LGBTI person faces in everyday life situations through their own stories.
- 6. WHEN YOU DON'T EXIST... AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL HUNGARY (Ground Floor, Room E)
  Where are the refugees now? What happened to them? What do they go through?
  What does this mean from a human rights perspective and what is my role in all this?
- 7. FIRST-HAND EXPERIENCE OF HOMELESSNESS A VÁROS MINDENKIÉ/MENHELY ALAPÍTVÁNY (-1th Floor, Club Room)

  Have you met a homeless person before? Now you can talk to them. Moreover, you can even put yourself into their shoes during this simulation game.

#### AFTERNOON WORKSHOPS

- 1. "EASY LESSONS" VERZIÓ FILMCLUB (Club Room, -1. Floor)
  The documentary by, Hungarian filmmaker, Zurbó Dorottya dives straight into its ironic title. In the first scene, we see the protagonist, Kafia, a 17-year-old Somalian refugee, studying Hungarian. But as much as difficult this language may seem to anyone who is not Hungarian, it is actually one of the easier tasks Kafia has to face.
- 2. 'HEARTBEAT' TEENAGERS LEARNING ABOUT ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIPS NANE (4th Floor, Room B)

  During the workshop participants will learn about the dynamics of abusive relationships and the early signs of abuse. We'll talk about where one can seek

help in such a situation and how young people can help each other.

- 3. INTERACTIVELY ABOUT CHILDREN'S RIGHTS HINTALOVON FUNDATION (4th Floor, Room C)

  You'll be able to learn about children's rights through a game, you'll have the chance to try yourself out in a debate, share your opinion and ask questions about

  The play is a series of short scenes: the audience might find themselves in a hospital where they might end up being a part of the scene themselves and they can choose if they want the medicine prescribed or not. Pure luck decides what situations the viewer will be involved in.
