Working methods of the Drafting Committee on Migrant Women (GEC-MIG) 20th GEC meeting, 23-25.11.2021



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GEC-MIG: Mandate

✓ Gender Equality Strategy 2018-2023:

Objective 5: 'Protect the rights of migrant, refugee and asylum-seeking women and girls'

Terms of Reference of GEC-MIG (adopted by the CM on 19-21 November 2019) - "Specific task": ' Draft a recommendation on migrant and refugee women on the basis of Recommendation R(79)10 concerning women migrants and of an analysis of needs and gaps that need to be addressed'.



GEC-MIG Working Methods (1)

✓ 5 Meetings of GEC-MIG in 2020-2021

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- ✓ All 47 member states invited to participate
- ✓ 8 member states with participation costs covered: Austria, France, Greece, Italy, Malta, Portugal, Serbia, Slovak Republic.
- ✓All participants and observers in the GEC are observers in GEC-MIG
- ✓ Support from an expert (Louise Hooper) to give advice and help with the drafting.



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GEC-MIG Working Methods (2)

- ✓ GEC survey May-July 2020: 20 contributions
- ✓ Guidance given at the July 2020 GEC meeting
- ✓ Reporting to the GEC and continuous guidance from **GEC** after each GEC-MIG meeting
- Internal consultation meeting with different sectors of the CoE (September 2020)
- ✓ Input by relevant CoE sectors to ensure consistency with existing standards and policies: GREVIO, GRETA, CPT, ECtHR, SGSR
- Exchanges with/input by different stakeholders during GEC-MIG meetings: civil society organisations, UN bodies



GEC-MIG Working Methods (3)

Amendments/comments by MS and other stakeholders:

- ✓ After GEC-MIG1 (October 2020)
- After GEC-MIG2 (December 2020 looked at during GEC-MIG 3 and 4)
- After GEC-MIG4, last internal and external consultation, (4th June - 16th July 2021)

In total 35 member states participated in GEC-MIG meetings and/or submitted amendments

Drafting of a compromise document discussed & agreed during last GEC-MIG meeting (Sept. 2021)
Finalisation of draft Recommendation in view of GEC meeting by Chair and Secretariat



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Next steps for the adoption of the draft **Recommendation (1)**

- After the GEC: Finalisation of document by the Gender Equality Division
- Revision by the legal service of the Council of Europe (usual procedure for CM texts)
- February 2022: Transmission to the Group of Rapporteurs on Human Rights (GR-H) of the Committee of Ministers for discussion



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Next steps for the adoption of the draft **Recommendation (2)**

- Depending on how the discussions proceed at the GR-H meeting, the document could be transmitted to the Committee of Ministers in March 2022 for adoption at the earliest
- ✓ If the text is not agreed at the first discussion of the GR-H, as these meetings only take place once a month, it will be transmitted later (April?) to the **Committee of Ministers**

Final step: adoption by the Committee of Ministers
