1. Presentation of the functioning of the judicial system in Italy

In Italy there are 527 first instance courts of general jurisdiction and 237 first instance courts of specialised jurisdiction. Geographic locations are 828. In 2012-2013 Italy went through a major reform of the judicial map. In particular, a great number of justice of peace offices (initially 846) were shut down. However, each Italian municipality had (and still has) the opportunity to preserve the office at their own expenses. For this reason, each year a series of Justice of Peace offices administered by the municipality might be re-opened or closed. 3 justice of peace offices closed between 2017 and 2018.





Specialised courts

In 2019, Italy had 237 specialised courts. 22 of them are commercial courts, 58 are enforcement of criminal sanctions courts, 21 are administrative courts, 4 are military courts and 132 are other specialised 1st instance courts.

Since 2014, in Italy there have been 22 Brand Commercial courts (Tribunali delle imprese) that are legal entities of their own and not just internal court divisions for organizational purpose (such as labour, family etc.).

It is noteworthy that in Italy, some of the specialized first instance courts are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice. This is the case for the regional audit commissions, the local tax commissions and military courts. These courts are not taken into consideration for the replies to questions 6, 46 and 52 for none of the exercises.

The category "other" subsumes 29 Minor (or Juvenile) Courts and 103 Tax Courts.

Due to the structure of the Italian judicial system, the Ministry of Justice has one single budget which does not distinguish between the budget allocated to courts, the budget allocated to public prosecution services and the one allocated to the administration. The figures provided in this chapter are the result of a re-classification of the budget statements which takes into consideration several criteria.]

According to 2019 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Italy is 7 127 which is 1,6% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Italy, in 2019 there are 11,8 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 24,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,1 non-judge staff per judge (in previous cycle this ratio was at 3,2 non-judge staff per judge).

The specialized first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not taken into consideration at question

The total number of female professional judges (all instances), in this cycle is 3 942 which represents 55,3% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 5 407 are sitting in first instance courts (among which 3 110 are female); 1 208 are sitting in second instance courts (among which 671 are female) and 512 are sitting in Supreme Court (among which 161 are female).

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, it should be noticed that in 2018 and 2019 judges belonging to administrative justice have been included.

As regards the distribution male/female, it should be noticed that female judges are the majority in the first two instances. However, in the higher instance only one third of judges are female.

In accordance with the constitutional principles of judicial independence, freedom of research and teaching, and good administration of justice, the School for the Judiciary, established by the Legislative Decree n. 26, of 30 January 2006, ensures the implementation of the right to, and duty of, professional training of members of the judiciary; the School also performs other tasks in the areas of training and research, as provided for by the law and the School's own charter. The School is an independent entity with legal personality under public and private law, as well as full capacity vis-à-vis organizational, functioning, management, contractual and accounting aspects of its activity. Its charter was adopted on February 6, 2012. The School is the sole agency competent with regard to professional training of the judiciary. In adopting or amending its annual training programme the School takes account of the guidelines it receives from the High Council for the Judiciary and the Minister of Justice, as well as the proposals it receives from the National Bar Council and the National University Council. The School may conclude agreements or memoranda of understanding with other public or private entities. The organs of the School are: the Board of Directors, the President and the Secretary General. The Board of Directors is composed of 12 members: 7 are chosen from among judges and prosecutors, both in service and retired; 3 from among university professors, both in service and retired, and 2 among lawyers who have practiced for at least ten years. The High Council for the Judiciary appoints 6 judges and prosecutors and 1 university professor, the Minister of Justice appoints 1 judge or prosecutor, 2 lawyers and 2 university professors. The members of the Board shall hold office for four years and may not be immediately renewed. The Secretary General is either a judge or prosecutor or a chief executive within State Ministries. Moreover, the National School of Administration (Scuola Nazionale dell'Amministrazione) is a national body which is in charge of the training of all civil servants (including non-judge staff belonging to the Justice Administration).

In Italy, in this cycle there are 21 808 non-judge staff (among which 14 634 females). Comparisson with previous cycle reveals a decrease of -2,6%.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- 14 032 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (among which 10 129 are women);
- 4 471 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (among which 3 233 are women);
- 376 technical staff (among which 149 are women);
- 2 929 other (among which 1 123 are women);

In the light of the data relevant for the judges, it is possible to notice that in 2019 the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 37,1 in 2018 to 36,2 in 2019).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolves from 11,6 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2018 to 11,8 in 2019.

The category "other non-judge staff" encompasses assistants, receptionists, porters and other judicial staff. As a general remark, it should be stressed that the high percentage of "other non-judge staff" in Italy is due to a very strict interpretation of the definition of the main categories. The specialized first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not taken into consideration at question 52.

It is noteworthy that the salaries of judges and public prosecutors do not depend on the position held but rather on the experience (i.e. years of service). That means that the salary of a judge working in the lowest courts can be the same as the salary of a judge working in the Highest Appellate Court.

In Italy there is not a specific budget allocated to legal aid. Legal aid is part of the general budget allocated to justice expenses.

More generally, due to the structure of the Italian judicial system, the Ministry of Justice has one single budget which does not distinguish between the budget allocated to courts, the budget allocated to public prosecution services and the one allocated to the administration. The figures provided in this chapter are the result of a re-classification of the budget statements which takes into consideration several criteria.

In Italy, legal aid can be granted for all categories of civil cases: litigious, non-litigious and also ADR. Nevertheless, in respect of the latter, so far the Ministry of Justice has not experienced any payment yet.

Legal advice does not exist as such in Italy, but lawyers play a role in ADR procedures

Legal aid also covers expenses related to the enforcement of judicial decisions.

Legal aid can also be granted for costs related to private detectives, interpreters and expert witnesses.

In criminal cases:

Accused individuals are free to chose their lawyers in the frame of legal aid system.

Victims are free to chose their lawyers in the frame of legal aid system.

Court fees

Litigants have to pay taxes to start a proceeding in other than criminal matters.

Generally, litigants are required to pay court fees in respect of other than criminal law cases, except for cases concerning employment, agriculture, family matters and other specific cases explicitly enumerated by law (DPR 115/2002).

Methodology of calculation of court fees

Courts fees depend on the value of the dispute and they are provided by law.

Amount of court fees to commence an action for 3000€ debt recovery is 98€

To commence a case whose value is 3.000€ the court fee is 98€. The appeal fee for the same case is 147,00€ whilst the cassation fee is 196,00€.

3. Efficiency and quality of the judicial system

Court performance

• Clearance Rate (CR) and Disposition Time (DT)

The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

The number of incoming cases in 2019 in Italy (5,72 per 100 inhabitants) is below the EU median (7,22 per 100 inhabitants). Moreover, the number of resolved cases in 2019 (5,90 per 100 inhabitants) is also below EU median (7,27 per 100 inhabitants). However, the number of pending cases at the end of 2019 (5,94 per 100 inhabitants) is well above the EU median (2,84 per 100 inhabitants).



With a Clearance Rate calculated at 103,3% in 2019 Italy seems to be able to deal with its other than criminal cases.

Between 2018 and 2019, the Clearance Rate has increased for 0,4 points.

In 2019, other than criminal cases are solved in approximately 367 days, which is well above the EU median of 111 days.

Analysis of the 2018 - 2019 period reveals a -1,5% decrease of the Disposition Time.

· Civil (and commercial) litigious cases



The number of incoming cases in 2019 in Italy (2,44 per 100 inhabitants) is above the EU median (1,92 per 100 inhabitants); as for the number of resolved cases, which is 2,55 per 100 inhabitants compared to the EU median of 1,73 per 100 inhabitants.

Finally, the number of pending cases at the end of 2019 (3,72 per 100 inhabitants) is well above the EU median (1,10 per 100 inhabitants).

With a Clearance Rate calculated at 104,5% in 2019, Italy seems to be able to deal with its civil and commercial litigious cases.

Between 2018 and 2019, the Clearance Rate has increased for 1,6 points.

In 2019, the civil and commercial litigious cases are solved in approximately 532 days, which is well above the EU median of 213 days.

Analysis of the 2018 - 2019 period reveals a 1,0% increase of the Disposition Time. The number of civil and commercial litigious cases older than 2 years is not available. Administrative cases



The number of incoming cases in 2019 in Italy (0,08 per 100 inhabitants) is significantly below the EU median (0,25 per 100 inhabitants); as for the number of resolved cases, which is 0,11 per 100 inhabitants compared to the EU median of 0,31 per 100 inhabitants. Moreover, the number of pending cases at the end of 2019 (0,25 per 100 inhabitants) is above the EU median (0,19 per 100 inhabitants).



With a Clearance Rate calculated at 131,1% in 2019, Italy seems to be able to deal with its administrative cases.

Between 2018 and 2019, the Clearance Rate has decreased for -5,3 points.

In 2019, the administrative cases are solved in approximately 821 days, which is well above the EU median of 284 days.

Analysis of the 2018 - 2019 period reveals a -7,7% decrease of the Disposition Time.

In Italy, there are 72 949 administrative law cases older than 2 years. This is 48,6% of the total number of pending cases at the end of the year

A different methodology of classification of civil cases is used since 2012. The result is an improved classification and a better split between litigious and non-litigious cases. For 2010, 2012 and 2013, the category of civil and commercial non-litigious cases has an identical content, namely: separation and divorce by mutual consent, interdiction and incapacitation, protective measures for underage, guardianship and trusteeship etc. Since 2014, it subsumes uncontested payment orders, uncontested divorces, technical appraisals, judicial interdiction and incapacitation, hereditament, etc.

Number of "pending cases older than 2 years" is not available because it refers to first instance causes which also include the activity of Justice of peace offices, for which this information is no available.

The Clearance Rate was calculated at 101,4% in 2019 for insolvency cases, Italy seems to be able to deal with its insolvency cases.

Between 2018 and 2019, the Clearance Rate has decreased for -2,5 points. In 2019, insolvency cases are solved in approximately 111 days, which is significantly below the EU median of 258 days. Analysis of the 2018 - 2019 period reveals a -2,3% decrease of the Disposition Time.

With regard to the insolvency cases, the peculiarity of the Italian system consists in distinguishing between "insolvency applications" and "insolvency cases". The former category concerns the litigious part of the proceeding where creditors and debtors have different goals (dispute). The latter category concerns the part of the proceeding where the judge has already established the insolvency / bankruptcy of the debtor and the case is all about the management of the assets and proceeds of the debtor. Figures at questions 101 and 102 refer to "insolvency applications" rather than "insolvency cases".

As regards other than criminal cases, Italy has a lower number of incoming and solved cases per inhabitant compared to the EU median, but a significantly higher number of pending cases per inhabitant. Therefore, Disposition Time results well above the EU median. The high number of pending cases is an issue that also regards civil and commercial cases and administrative cases, and it is accompanied by high Disposition Time. It is noteworthing that Clearance Rate has been above 100% every year in each category of cases, and since 2013, Disposition Time has diminished.

The Supreme Court, as regards civil and commercial cases, has a Clearance rate well below 100%, and really high disposition time.

Non-litigious enforcement cases are not in the competence of the Courts of Appeal.

With regard to the administrative cases (which number is provided only since 2014), the appeals are dealt with by the Council of State (Consiglio di Stato) which is a legal-administrative consultative body ensuring the legality of public administration in Italy. The Council has jurisdiction on acts of all administrative authorities, except when these authorities lack discretionary power, in which case the dispute is considered to be one of civil law. Figures referring to the activity of the Council of State are inserted in the frame of question 97 and not question 97. The Supreme Court does not deal with "non litigious cases". Most frequent subjects for "Litigious cases" are: Tributes, Immigration, Employment and Welfare.

•Alternative dispute resolutions

The judicial system in Italy provides court related mediation.

The court related mediation system in Italy provides mandatory court related mediation.

Before/instead of going to court

Mandatory mediation comes for the following fields: rights in rem, condominium disputes, division of assets, wills and inheritance, leasing, family covenants and agreements, loans, business rents, medical malpractice damages, libel, insurance, bank and financial contracts.

In Italy one party may initiate a mediation procedure and the other party may decide to take part to it or not. Please consider that in 2019 in Italy 256.311 mediation proceedings were initiated. Both parties showed up at the first mediation meeting in only 72.664 mediation proceedings. Please also note that these figures refer to private mediation. For some matter subjects the mediation is mandatory and it is managed by private mediation companies. Please note that the above figures refer to mediation procedures monitored by the Ministry of Justice. In Italy, there is a plethora of different forms of ADR procedures and some are not so widespread. Court-related mediations do exist for both family cases and labour cases but such mediation proceedings are not monitored by the Ministry of Justice.

• Systems for measuring and evaluating the court performance

In 2019, individual courts are required to prepare an annual activity report. The frequency of the reporting is annual.

A regular monitoring system of court activities is in place concerning:

number of incoming cases length of proceedings (timeframes) number of resolved cases number of pending cases backlogs productivity of judges and court staff number of appeals appeal ratio clearance rate disposition time

In Italy, there is a system to evaluate regularly the activity of each court. The reporting is quarterly.

A system to evaluate regurlarly the activity of each court (in terms of performance and output) exists and performance and quality indicators are defined at the court level. They are:

The evaluation of the court activity is used for the later allocation of means in this court.

Quality standards are not determined for the judicial system.

In Italy there is not a strict quality system as such. However, there is a regular monitoring system in place which tracks the performance of court activities.

The use of ICT in courts had been evaluated in 2 fields and 5 sub-fields within those fields in 2019 (graphics below):

The calculation of this index for each field is an average of the values of the sub-fields included. The calculation of the sub-field depends on each question and the combination of different modalities of the answers.

The details of the calculation are given in Annex 5 - IT calculations

The result by area may be summarized in these graphics, where each field has been evaluated from 0 to 4 points.



Note; Index is modified each cycle depending on the new modalities included in the questionnaire that show more precise details on the ICT situation that can make the index drop even if there is no real change.

Department of Statistics and Organizazional Analysis within the Ministry of Justice (for the ordinary justice). Bureau of the Administrative Justice Council (for the administrative justice).
