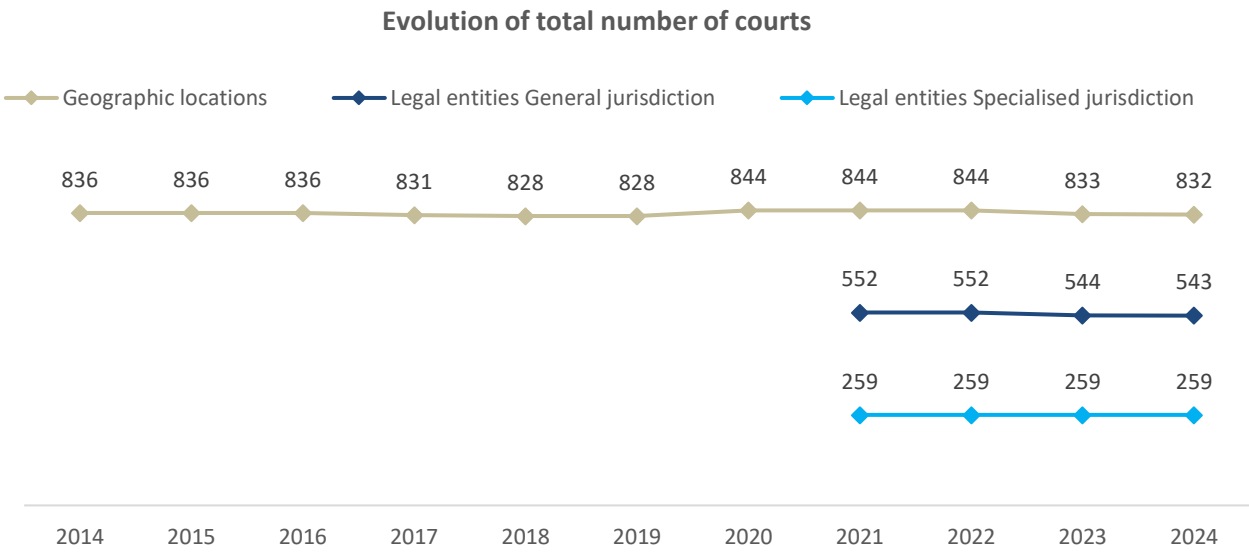
1. Judicial organisation in Italy (2024 data)

In 2024, the Italian judicial system comprised 543 first-instance courts of general jurisdiction, 26 second-instance courts of general jurisdiction (Courts of Appeal) and one Supreme Court (Corte di Cassazione), which acts as the highest judicial authority for matters of general jurisdiction. In addition, there were 259 specialised courts, of which 236 operate at first instance and 23 at higher instance level, for a total of 833 geographic locations.

Specialised courts, by contrast, cover specific subject matters and present a more heterogeneous organisational structure. In several areas (such as labour, family, insolvency or organised crime), specialisation is ensured through dedicated divisions within general jurisdiction courts, rather than through separate legal entities. Administrative justice is organised as a specialised jurisdiction, composed of regional administrative courts (first instance) and a single Supreme Administrative Court. Unlike the courts of general jurisdiction, the administrative judiciary does not include a distinct intermediate appellate tier comparable to the Courts of Appeal. As a result, administrative cases follow a two-instance model, with a direct appeal from the first-instance administrative courts to the supreme administrative jurisdiction. It should also be noted that some specialised courts (such as military courts or certain tax-related bodies) are not administered or financed by the Ministry of Justice, which has implications for the scope of data reported on budgets, staff and cases. These institutional specificities are explained in detail in the notes to the specialised courts table.

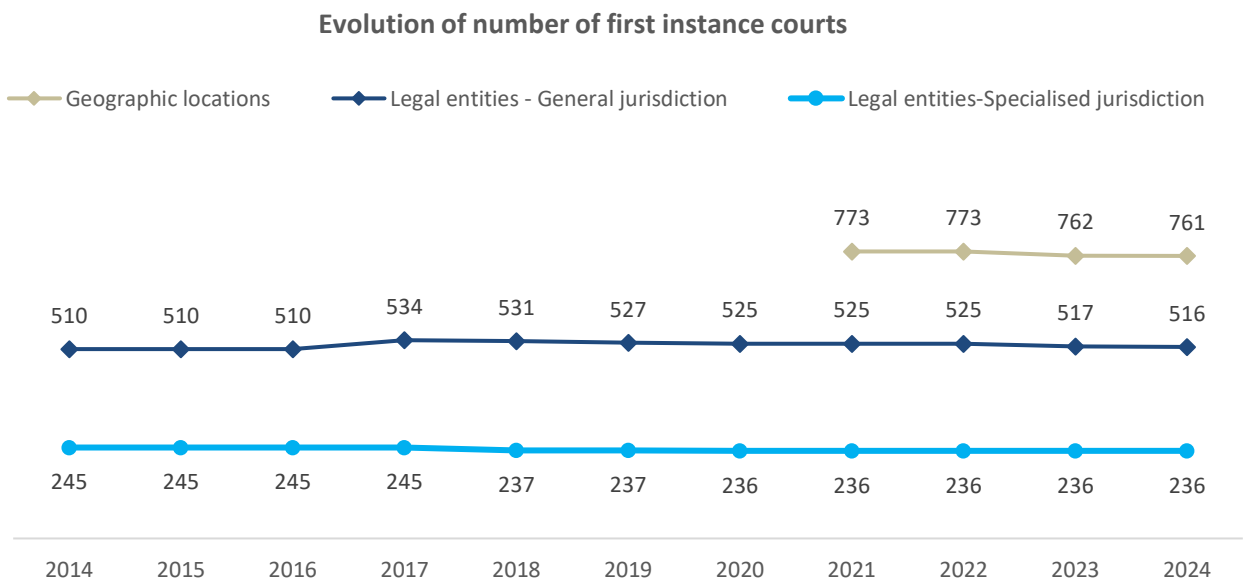

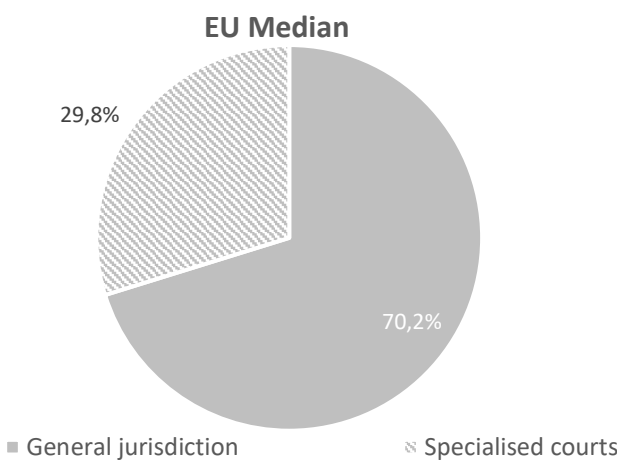
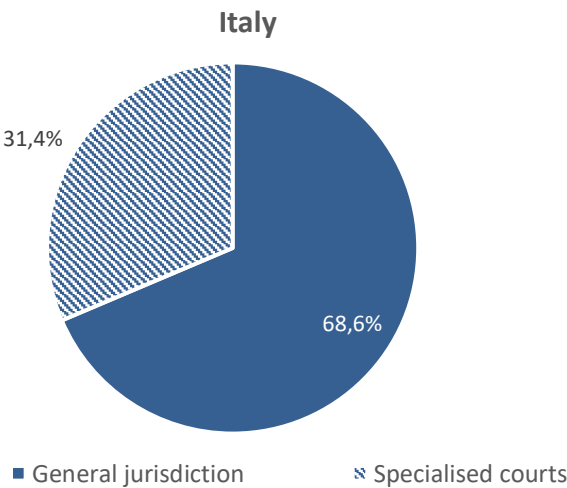

Since 2014, Italy has had 22 Brand Commercial Courts (Tribunali delle Imprese), which are distinct legal entities rather than internal court divisions established for organisational purposes, such as labour or family matters.

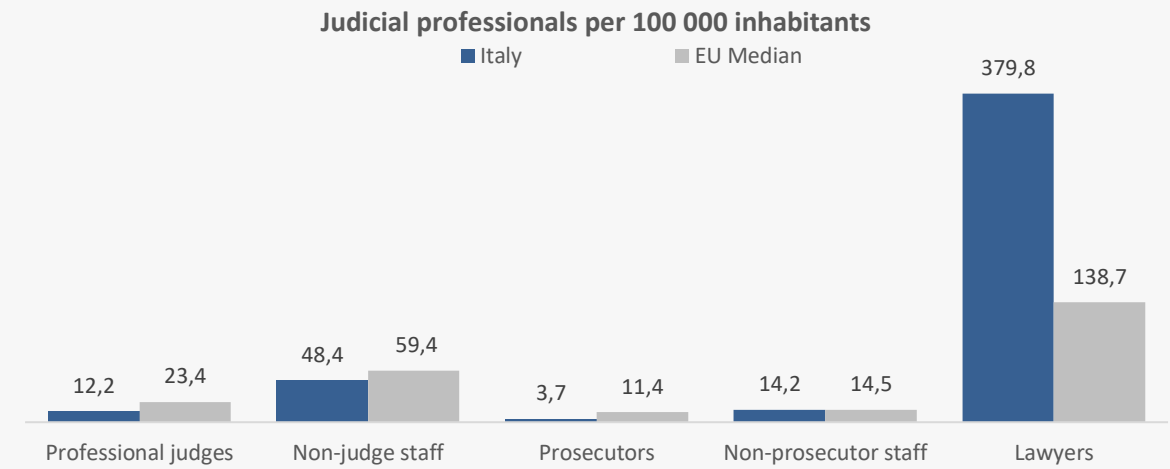
As mentioned above, in Italy, some specialised first-instance courts are not administered or financed by the Ministry of Justice. These include regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts. As a result, these courts are not considered in responses regarding court budgets, cases, judges, or non-judge staff. Regional audit commissions are not even counted in the number of courts. Conversely, regional administrative courts (first-instance administrative courts) and the supreme administrative court, although they are also not administered or financed by the Ministry of Justice, are included in the counts. Since 2014, they have been considered in the totals for the number of courts and cases. Additionally, starting from 2018, they have been included in the counts for the number of judges, non-judge staff and in the courts budget. Furthermore, specific matters, such as labour, family, and other specialised areas, are handled by dedicated divisions within the same court. In addition, there are 26 divisions, known as Direzioni Distrettuali Antimafia (DDA), that specifically address mafia and organised crime cases.

Appeals from some specialised courts, such as commercial and juvenile courts, are heard by general jurisdiction appeal courts. Specific subject matters, such as labour, insolvency, family, counter-terrorism, and the fight against organised crime, are addressed by dedicated divisions within general jurisdiction courts. The option "Other specialised courts" refers to tax courts.

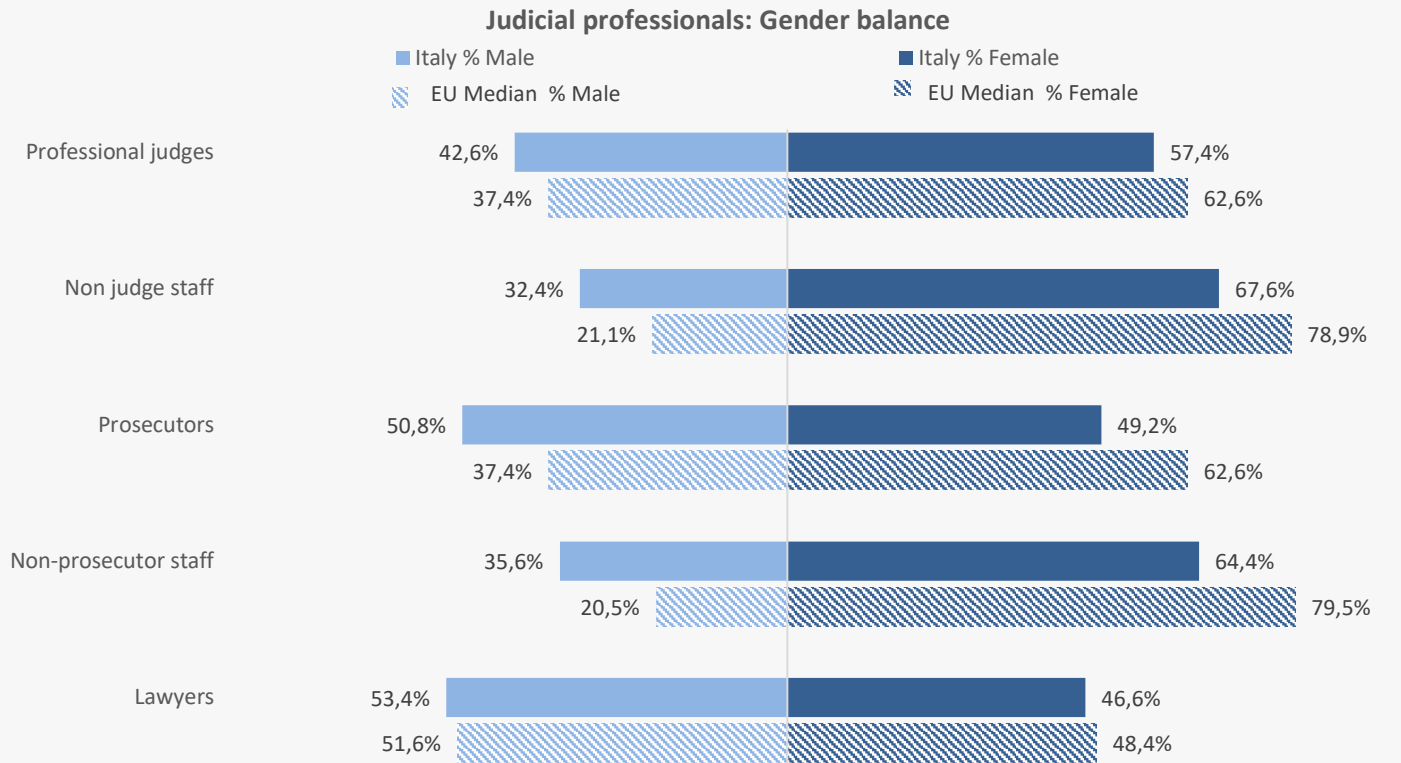

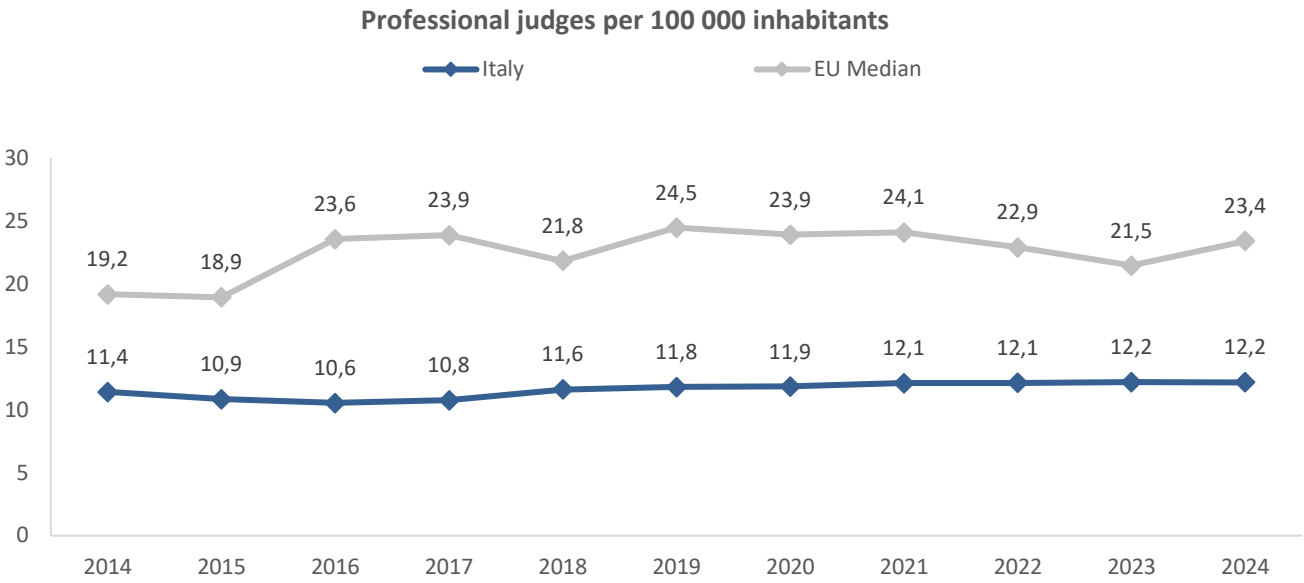

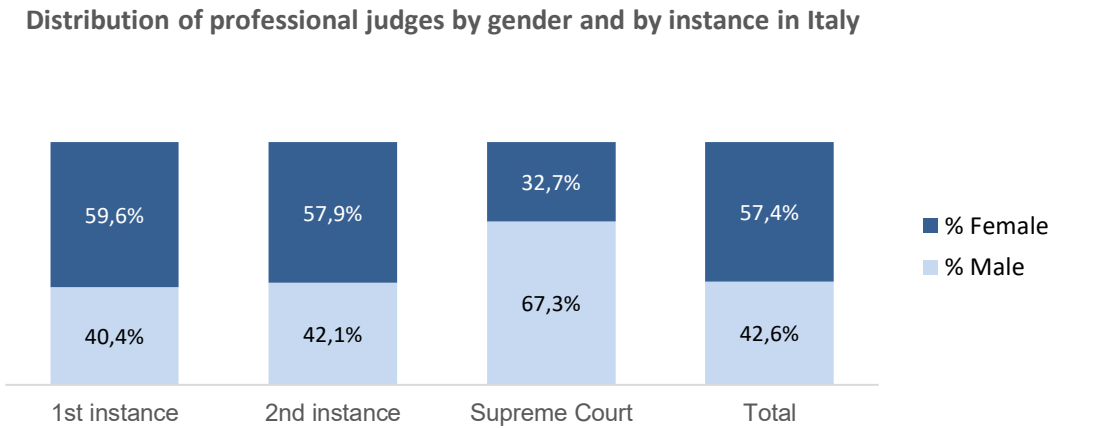
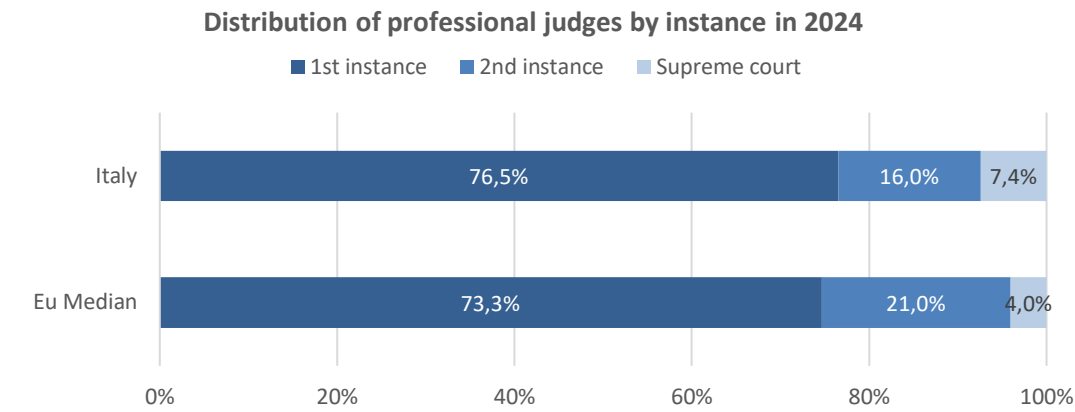
According to 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Italy is 7 188, which is -0,1% less than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Italy, there are 12,2 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

Judges serving in specialised first-instance courts, such as regional audit commissions, local tax commissions, and military courts, which operate independently and are financially autonomous from the Ministry of Justice, are not included in this count.

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 4 123, which represents 57,4% of the total number of judges. The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 5 502 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 3 281 are female); 1 151 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 667 are female) and 535 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 175 are female). Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Italy has relatively less judges in the second instance. This is probably due to the fact that there are no administrative courts and judges of second instance.

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, it should be noticed that the judges belonging to the specialised first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not counted under this question.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, as already mentioned, in Italy there is not a second instance for administrative cases, therefore, there are no second instance administrative judges.

As regards the distribution male/female, the percentage of females is higher in the first two instances and lower at the supreme court.

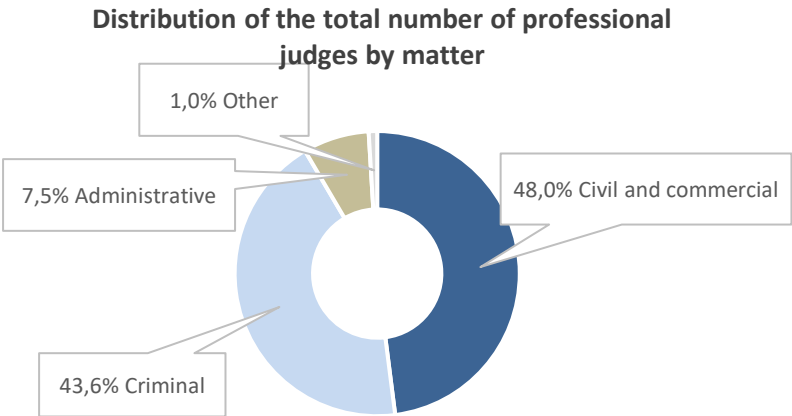

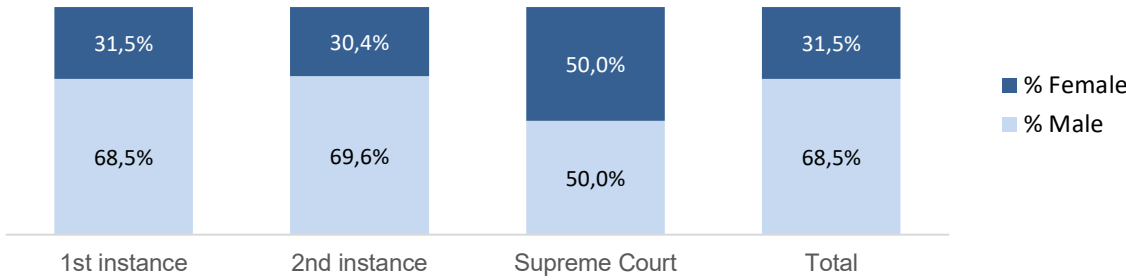

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Italy

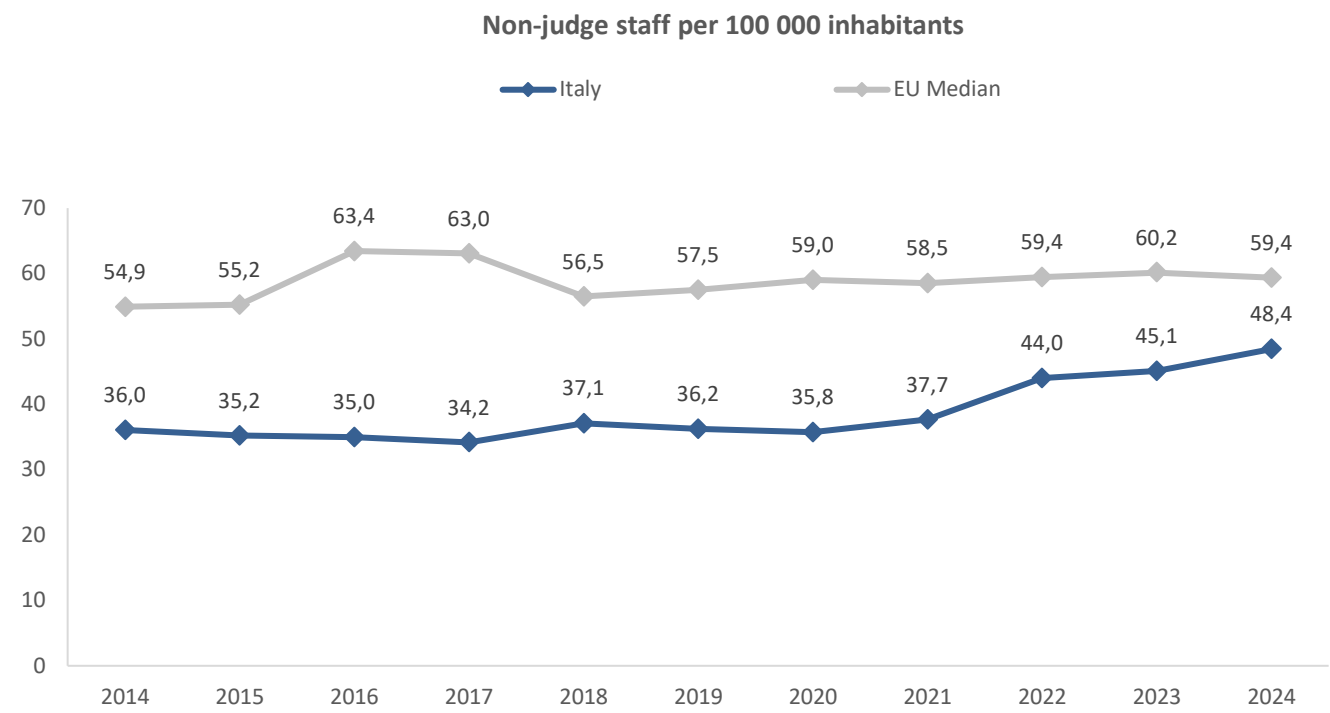


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 64, which represents 31,5% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 178 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 56 are female); 23 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom 7 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of whom 1 are female).

In 2024, Italy has 28 546 non-judge staff (of whom 19 284 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 7,4%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 45,1 in 2023 to 48,4 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 12,2 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 12,2 in 2024.

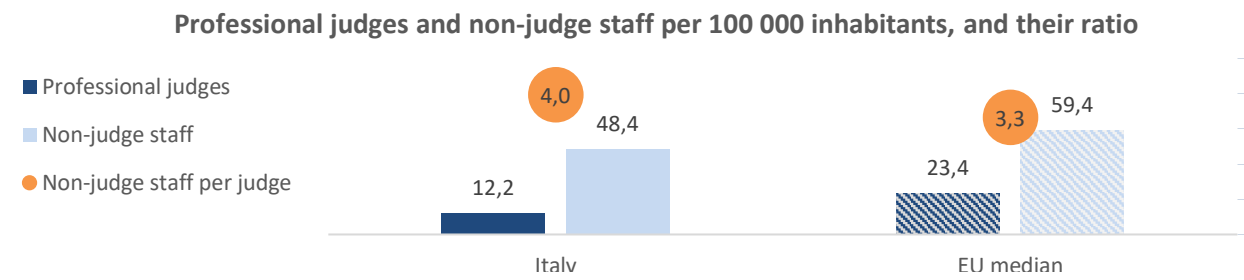

- 7 011 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of whom 4 304 are Female);
- 1 922 technical staff (of whom 852 are Female);
- 0 other.

The specialised first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not taken into consideration in this question.

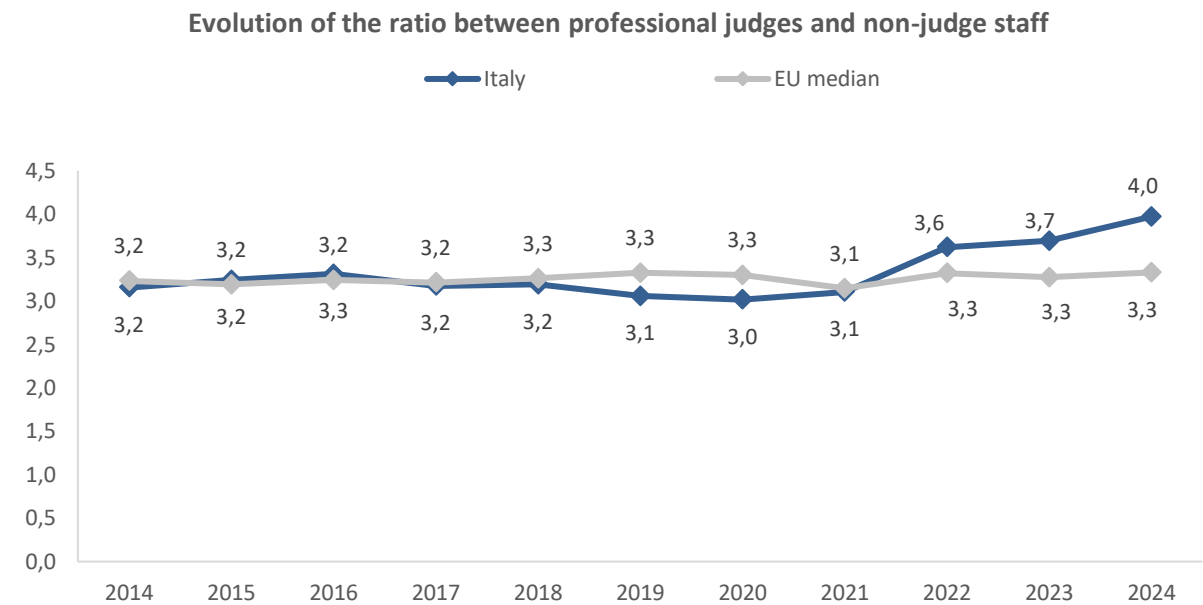

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

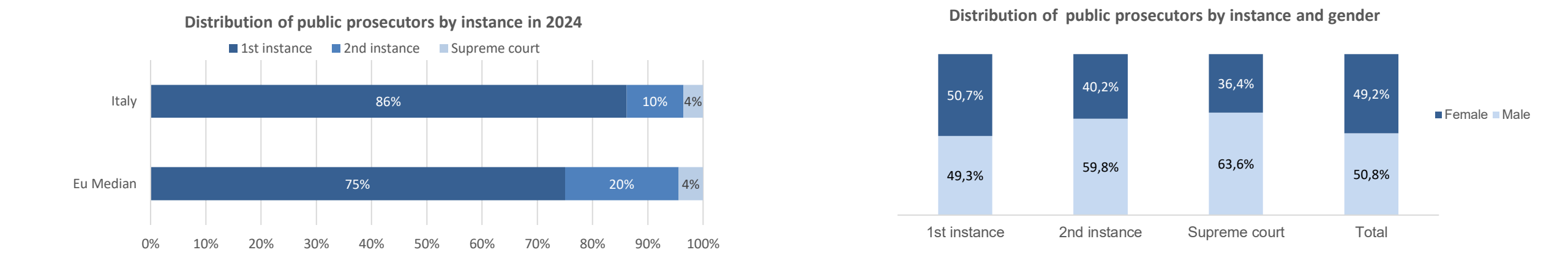

In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 1 070, which represents 49,2% of the total number of prosecutors.

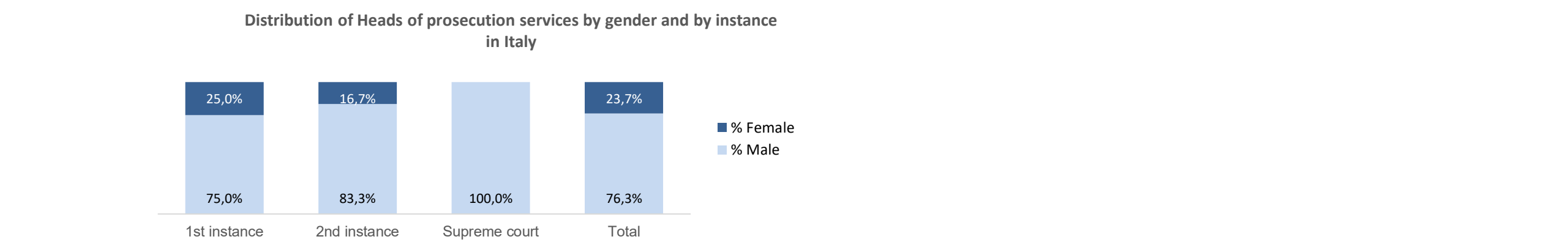
The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 876 in first instance (of whom 952 are female); 224 are in second instance (of whom 90 are female) and 77 in final instance (of whom 28 are female).

As regards the distribution male/female, male prosecutors are more than 50% in all instances. Additionally, their representation tends to increase as the instance level progresses.

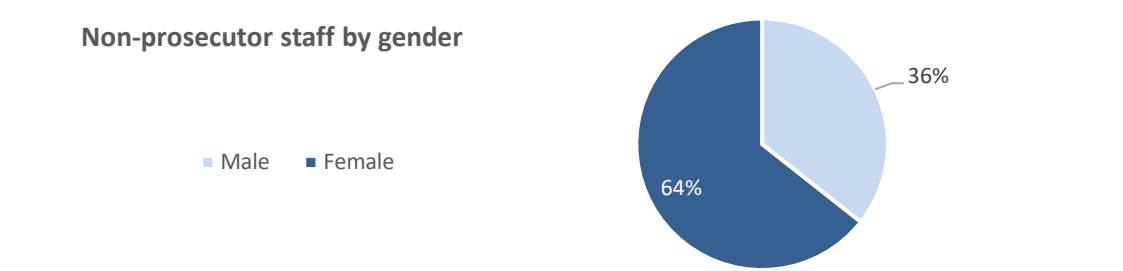

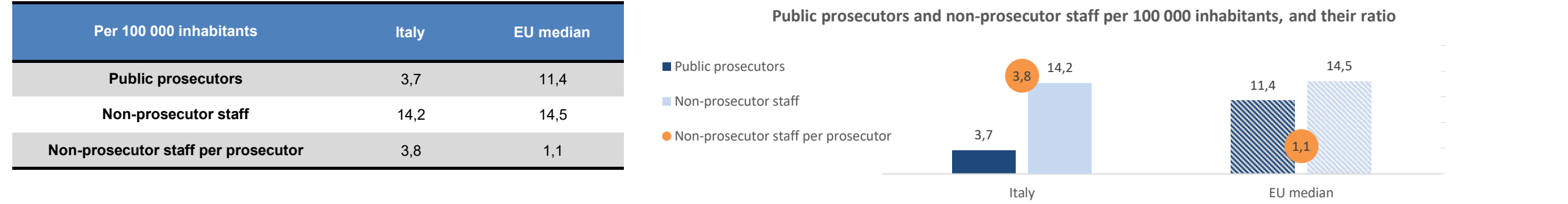

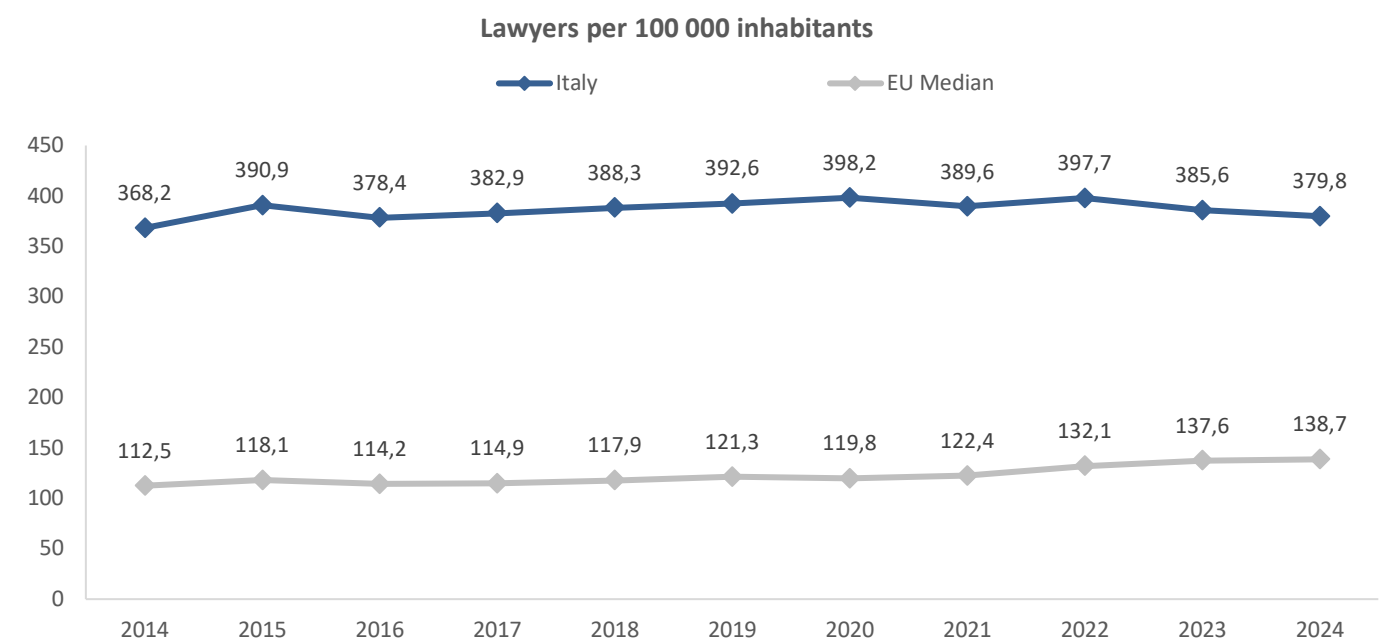
Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

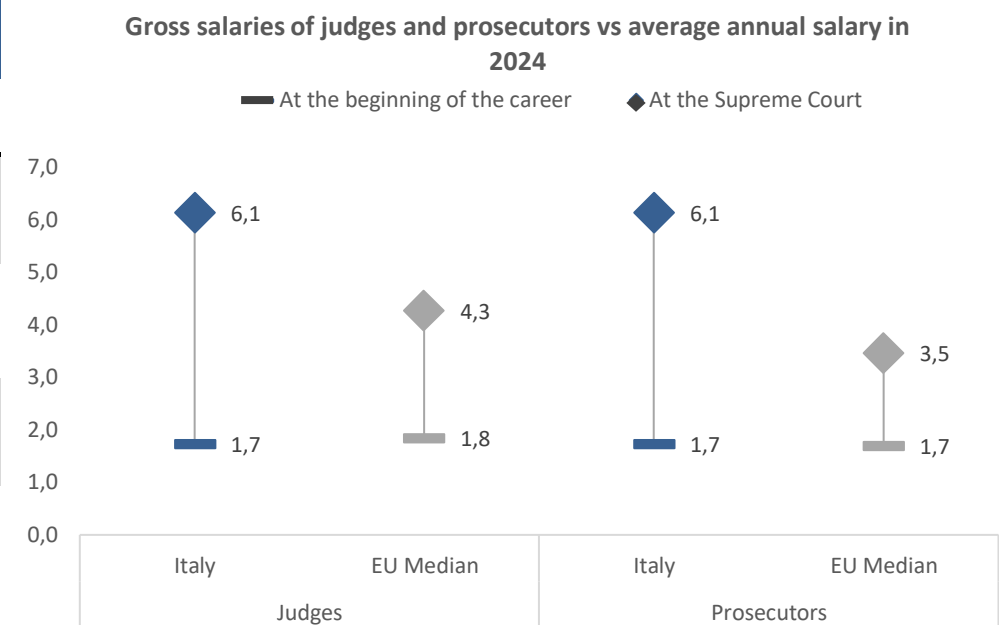

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Italy is 61 347€, which is the EU median.

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Italy's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 79% above the EU median of 121 591€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Italy of 61 347€ is rather above the EU median of 52 969€ (16% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. Italy's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 130% above the EU median of 94 385€.

It is noteworthy that the salaries of judges and public prosecutors do not depend on the position held but rather on the experience (i.e. years of service). This means that the salary of a judge working in the lowest courts can be the same as the salary of a judge working in the Supreme Court of Cassation.The salaries of administrative judges are not included in the data provided.

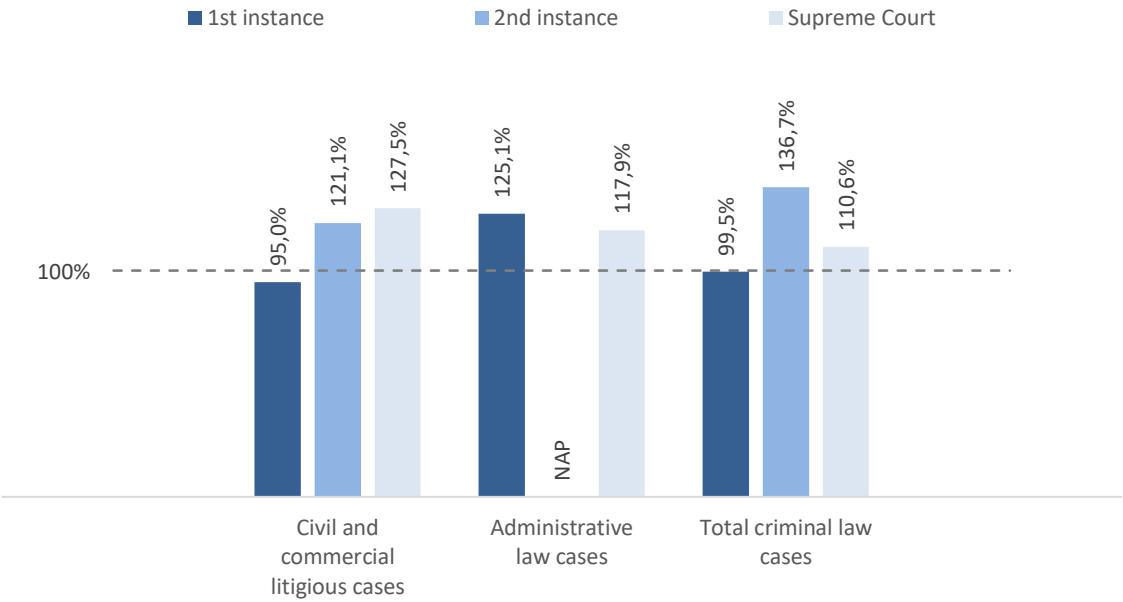
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

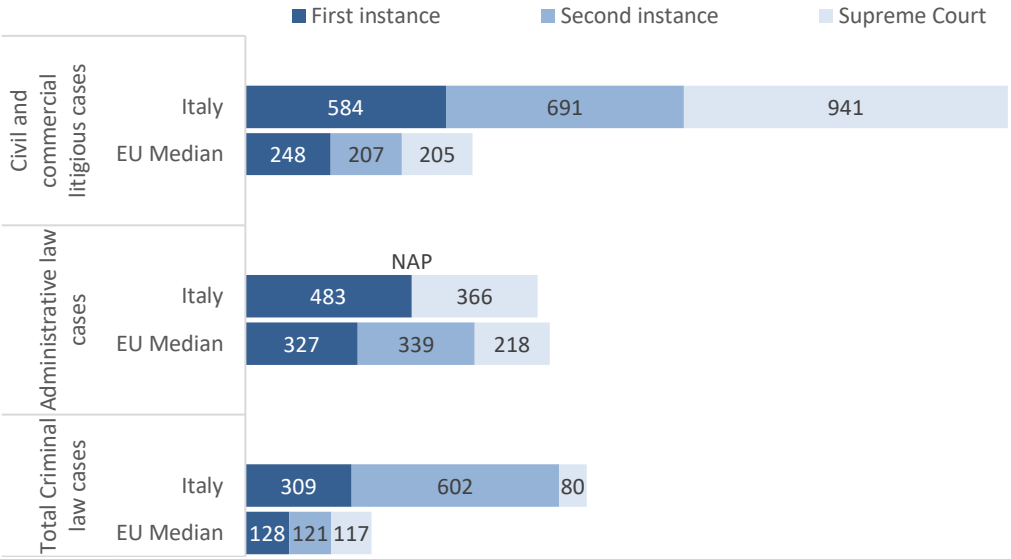

In the framework of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), Italy has undertaken a series of actions aimed at reducing disposition time and backlogs across the justice system. The revised targets to be achieved by June 2026 include an overall reduction of 40% in the civil sector and 25% in the criminal sector, calculated across all three instances. For civil and commercial litigious cases, the objectives focus in particular on the reduction of pending cases at first and second instance courts, with intermediate and final disposal targets defined for the period 2024–2026.

In 2025, Italy continues to display high levels of productivity, as reflected by clearance rates that are at or above 100% in many categories of cases and instances. In civil and commercial litigious cases, the clearance rate is 95,0% at first instance, slightly below the EU median (97,8%), while it exceeds 100% at second instance (121,1%) and at Supreme Court level (127,5%). Disposition times remain high at all instances, amounting to 584 days at first instance, 691 days at second instance and 941 days at Supreme Court level, compared to EU median values of 248, 207 and 205 days respectively. When all three instances are considered together, civil and commercial litigious cases record the longest overall duration among the three categories of cases.

Administrative law cases show clearance rates well above the EU median, reaching 125,1% at first instance and 117,9% at Supreme Court level. As in previous years, data for second instance are not applicable, as appeals are dealt with by the Council of State (Consiglio di Stato) and reported as third instance cases. Disposition times amount to 483 days at first instance and 366 days at Supreme Court level, compared to EU median values of 327 and 218 days respectively. Administrative cases are processed more quickly than civil and commercial litigious cases, but remain above the EU median at all available instances.

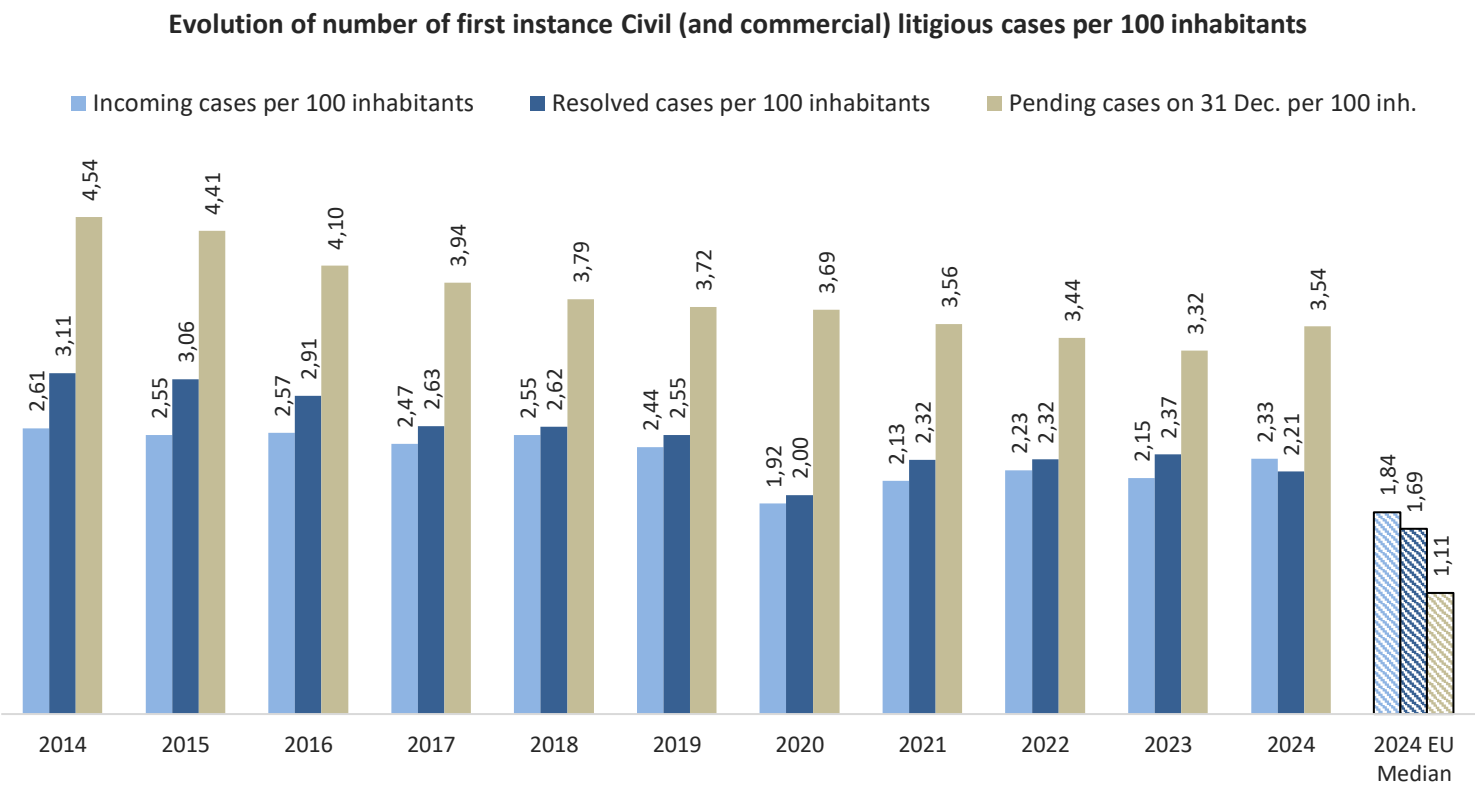
Criminal law cases record clearance rates close to or well above 100% at all instances, reaching 136,7% at second instance and 110,6% at Supreme Court level. Disposition times for criminal cases are 309 days at first instance and 602 days at second instance, compared to EU median values of 128 and 121 days respectively. At Supreme Court level, criminal cases are resolved in 80 days, below the EU median of 117 days.

Across case categories, criminal law cases show the shortest disposition times, followed by administrative law cases, while civil and commercial litigious cases have the longest durations. Across instances, the Supreme Court is the fastest instance for criminal cases, whereas it represents the longest stage for civil and commercial litigious cases.

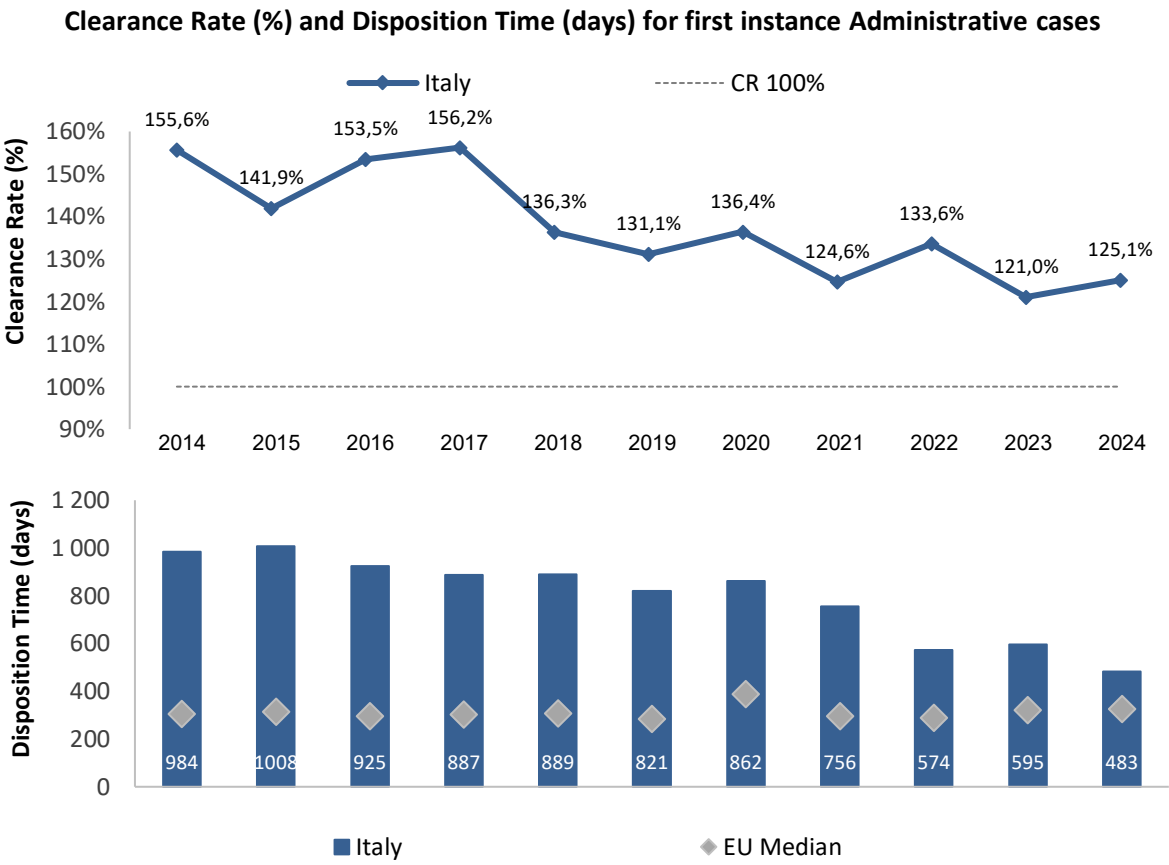

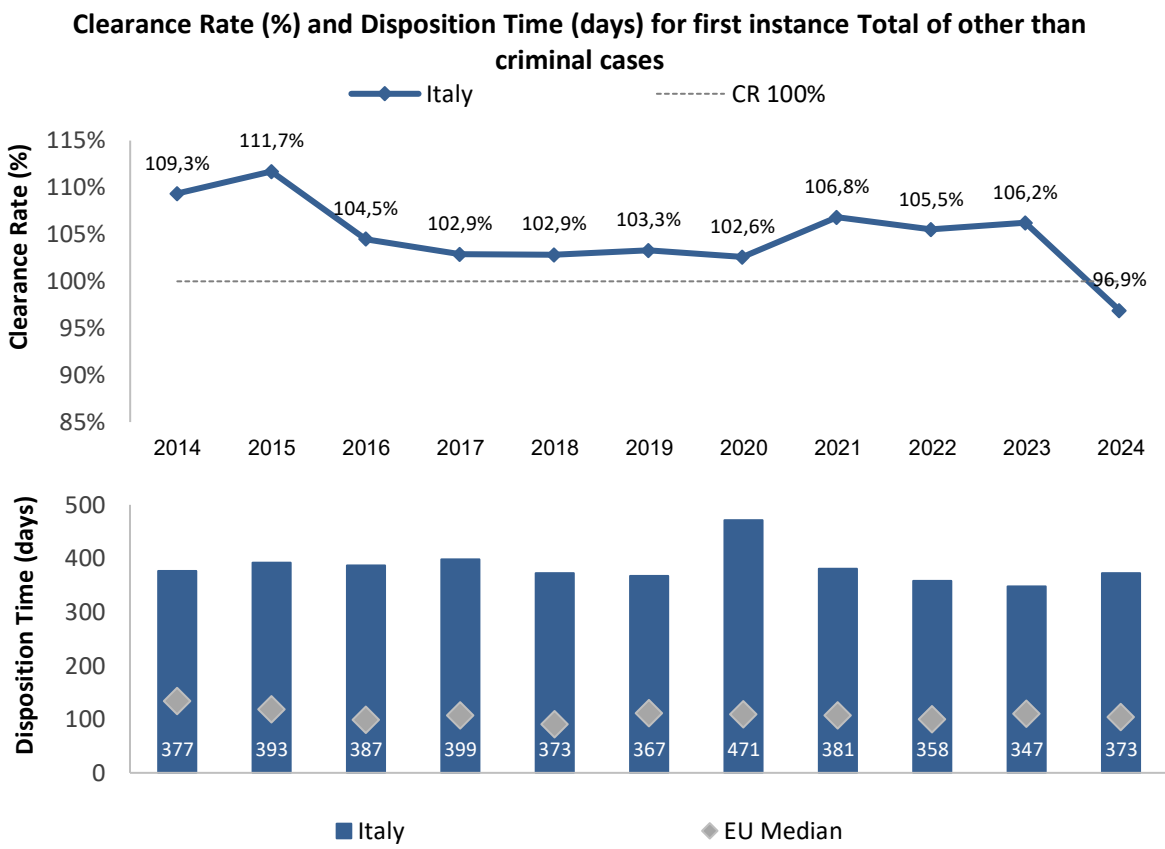

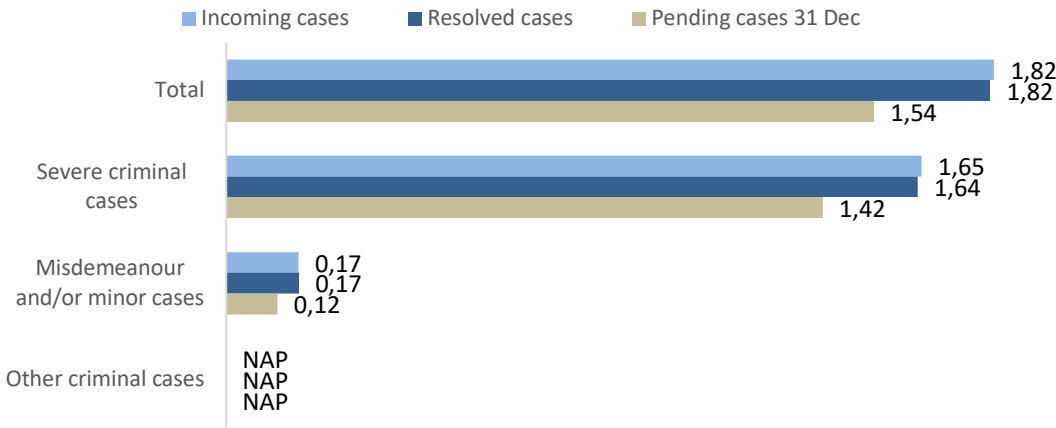

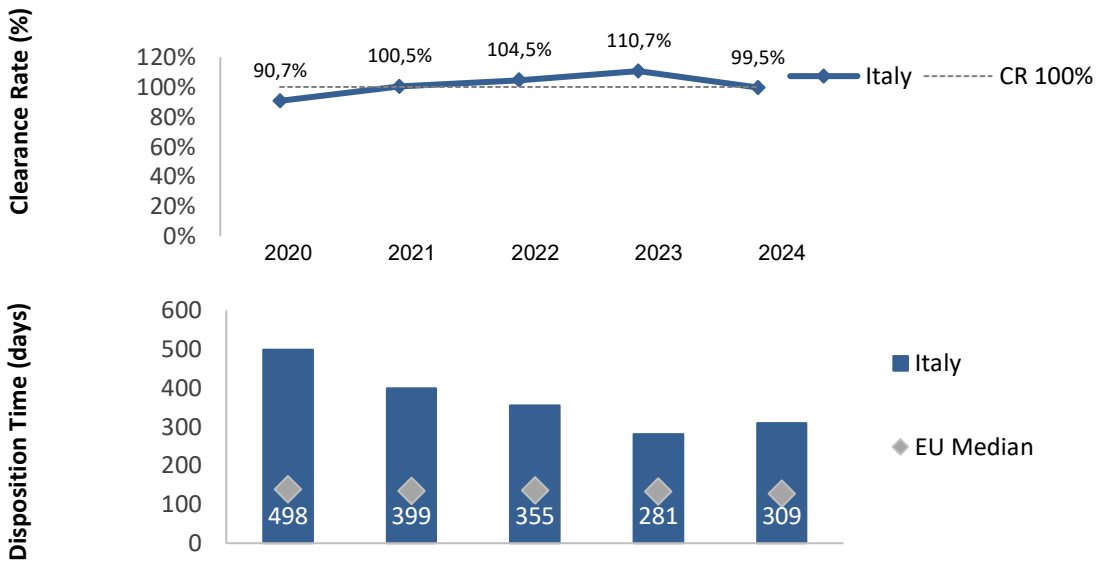

In 2024, there are 23 309 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 39,6 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2023 and 2024 is about -1,8%.

To become a mediator in Italy, candidates must meet a set of statutory requirements. They must hold a university degree of at least three years or be registered with a recognised professional association. They are required to complete a training course of at least 80 hours, including both theoretical and practical components, followed by a final assessment. In addition, an internship is mandatory and involves participation, under the supervision of a mediator, in at least ten mediation procedures, subject to the consent of the invited party.

Mediators must also attend biennial refresher training consisting of at least 18 hours of advanced courses, with an additional 10 hours required for mediators specialising in cross-border, international and consumer matters. Mediators already registered are further required to participate in training activities that include in-person workshops.

In 2024, there are 5 056 notaries which represents 8,6 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

The notary as existing in Italy belongs to the Latin (Roman) notarial system. A Latin notary is a public officer and a specialised counsellor whose expertise covers, inter alia, real estate contracts, loans and mortgages, company law, family law, wills and succession law, as well as the relevant areas of tax law.

The Latin notary also performs judicial functions as a judicial auxiliary or assistant. As a public officer, the notary performs public functions and is vested by the State with public authority and public faith, which allows him or her to draw up authentic deeds (public deeds). In this sense, a notary can be defined as a public officer to whom the State delegates a specific public power, namely the power to certify the authenticity of documents.
