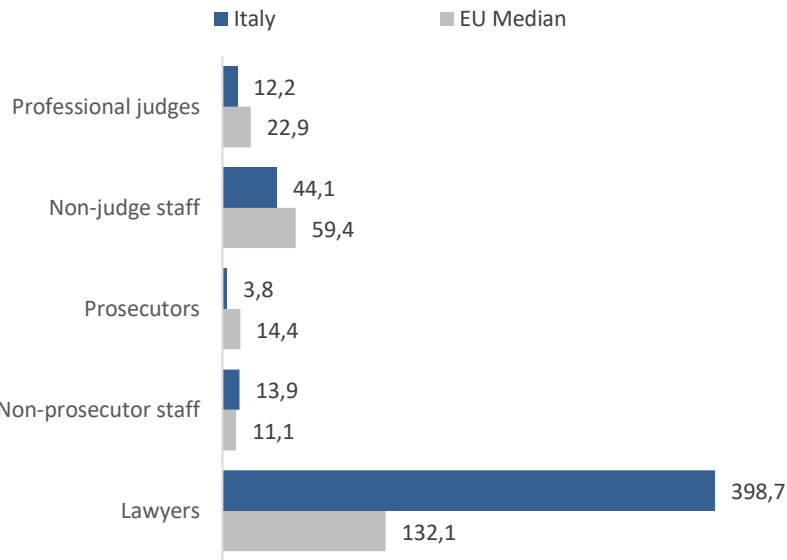

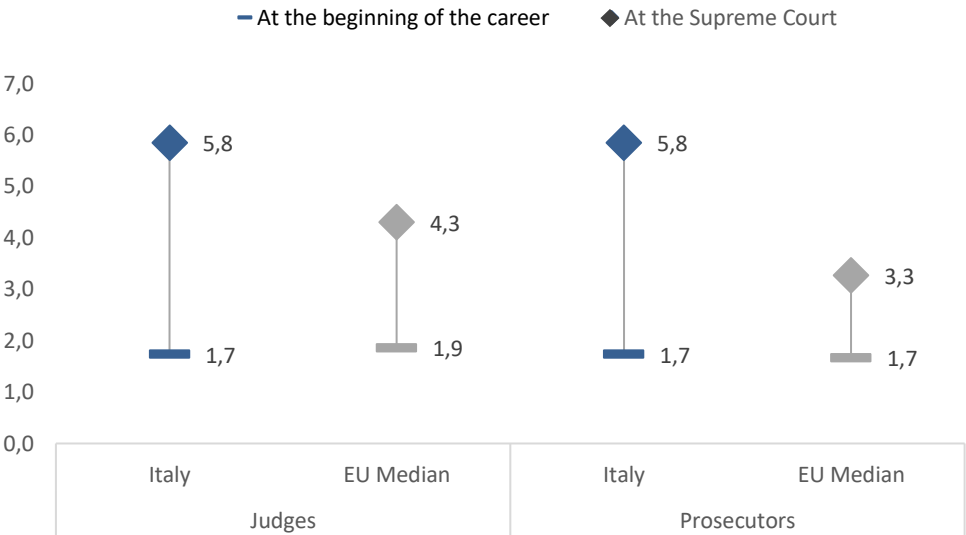

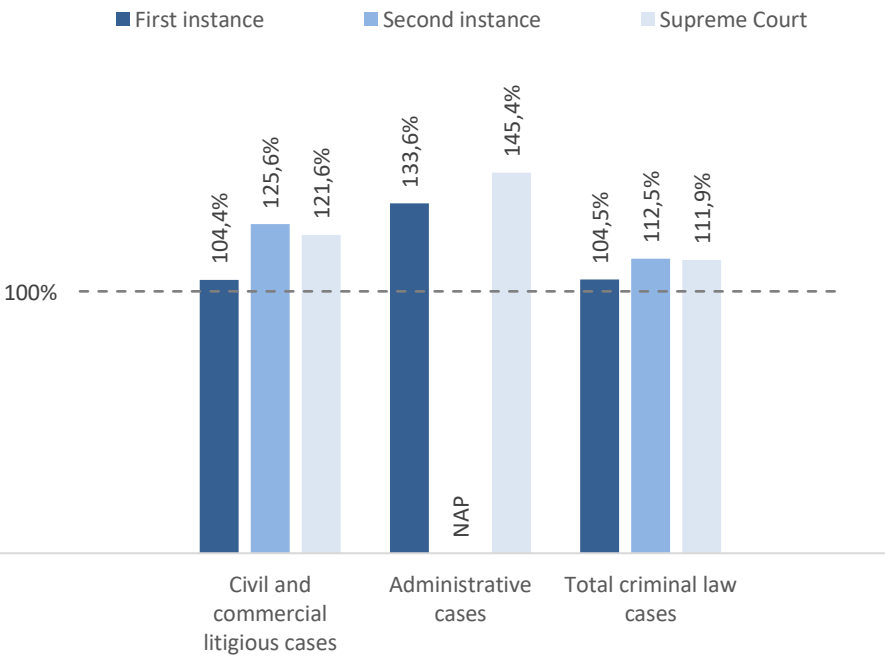


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2022

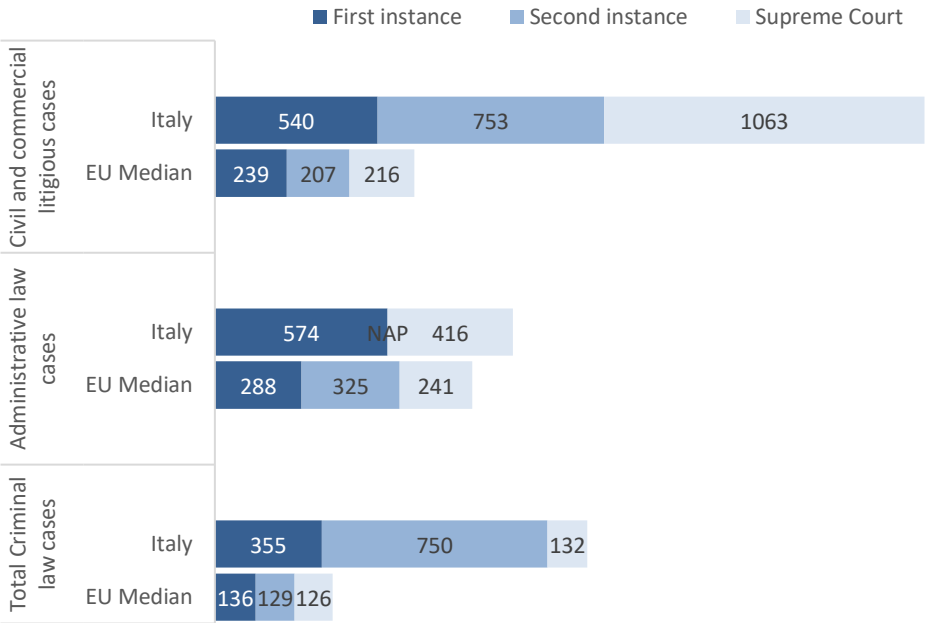

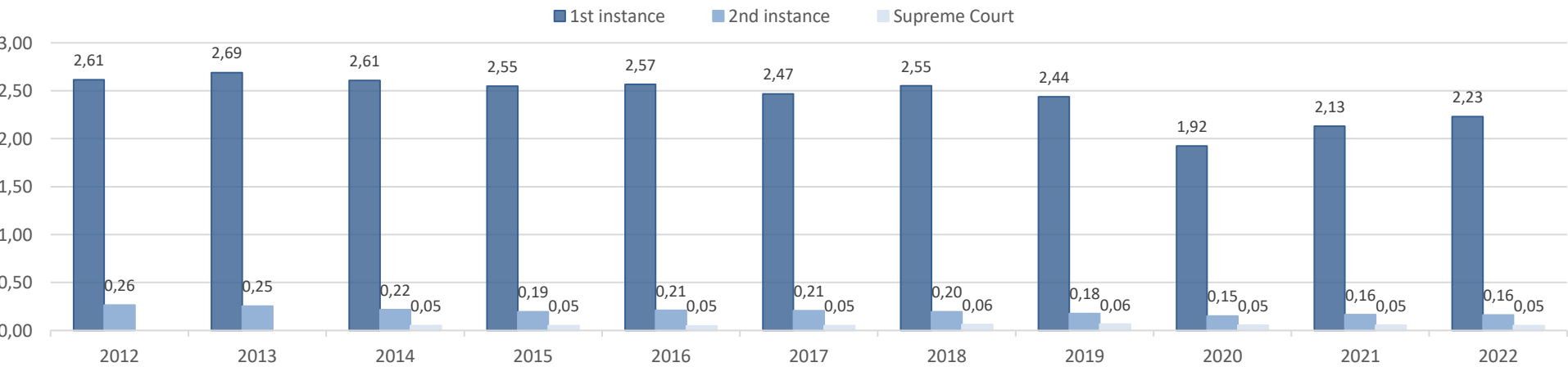


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)

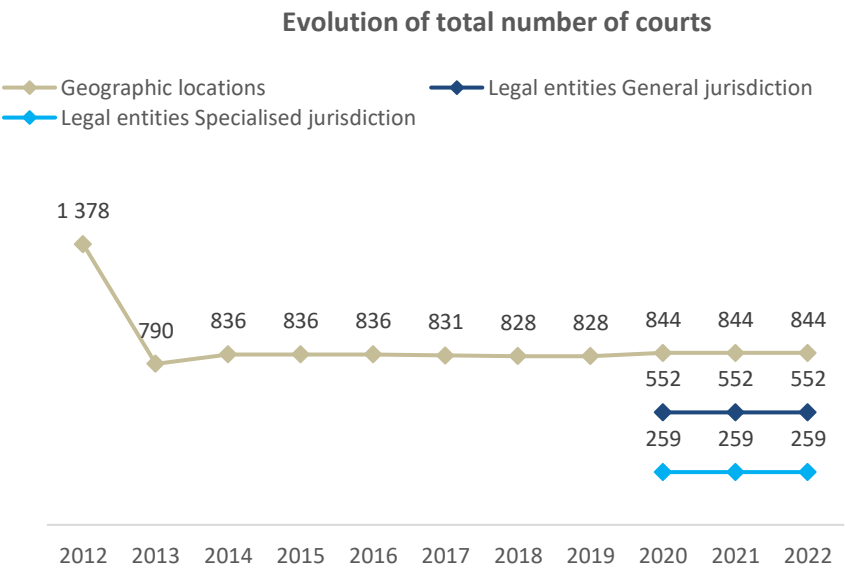

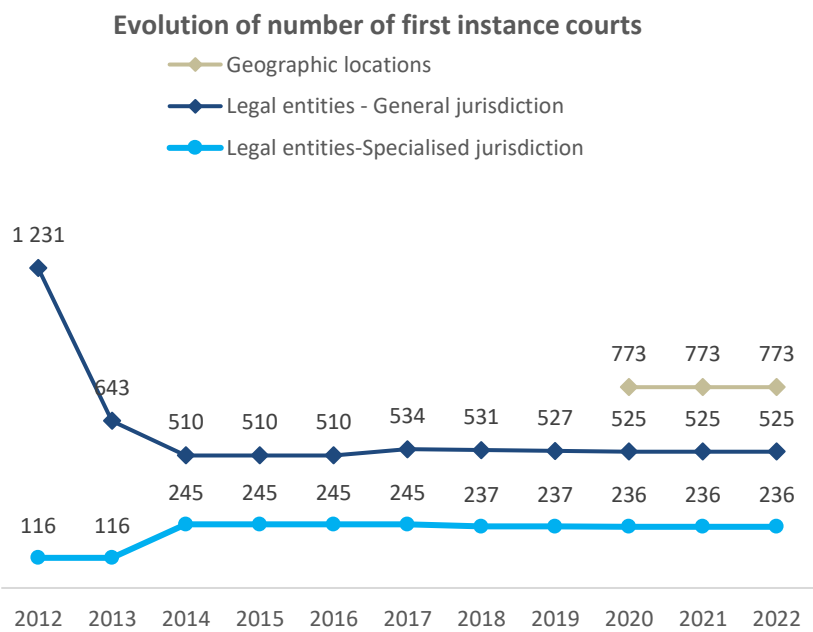

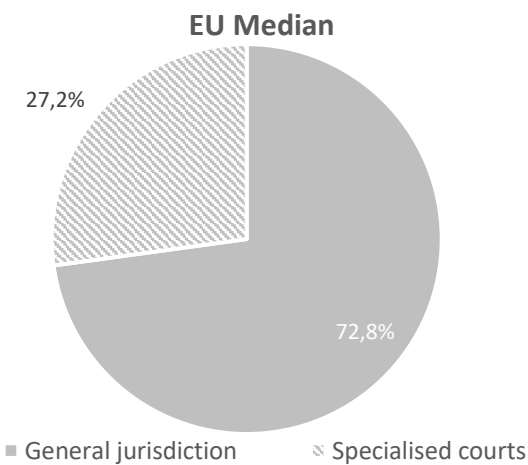
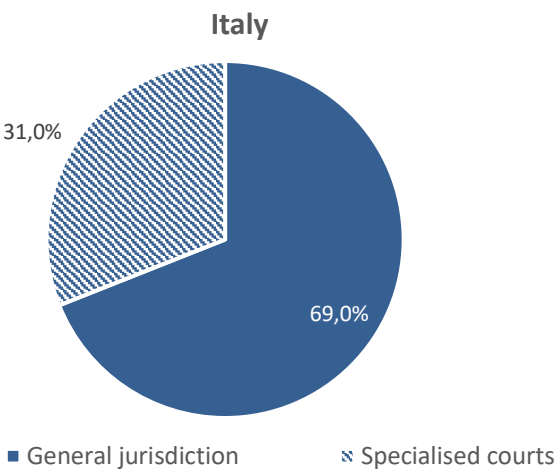

“Other specialised courts” refers to tax courts.

Since 2014 in Italy there are 22 Brand Commercial courts (Tribunali delle imprese) that are legal entities of their own and not just internal court divisions for organizational purpose (such as labour, family etc.).

It is noteworthy that in Italy, some of the specialized first instance courts are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice. This is the case for the regional administrative courts, the regional audit commissions, the local tax commissions and military courts. These courts are not taken into consideration for the replies to questions 6 (budget of courts), 46 (number of judges) and 52 (court staff) for none of the exercises.

In respect of the 20 first instance administrative courts (legal entities) and their supreme court, it should be stressed that they have been encompassed within the total under this question for the last four exercises, but only since 2014 this approach is reflected in questions 91 and 99 (number of administrative law cases).

Moreover, in Italy specific matters (such as labour, family etc.) are dealt by specific divisions within the same Court. There are also 26 divisions called DDA (Direzioni Distrettuali Antimafia) which deal specifically with mafia and organized crime.

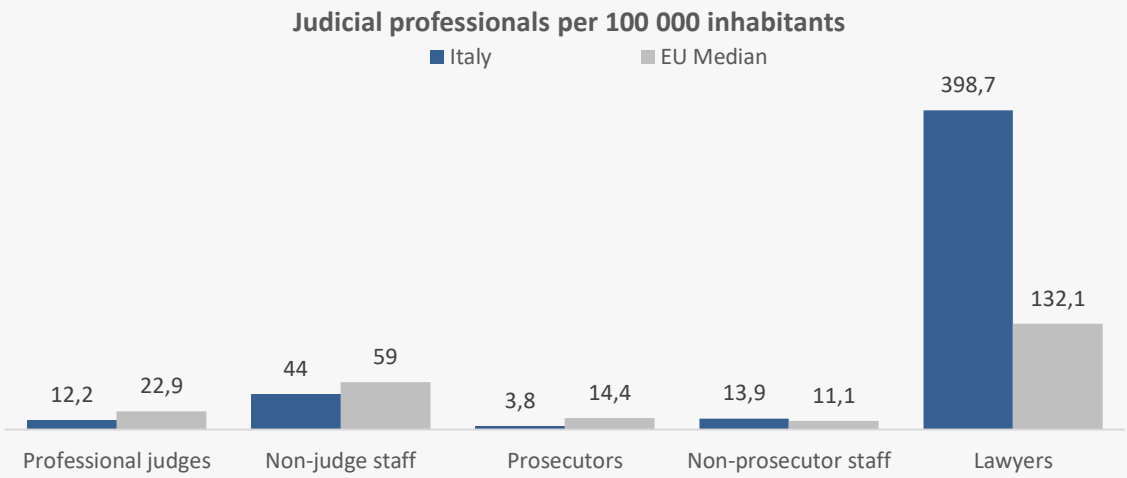
The appeal of some specialized courts (e.g. commercial courts, juvenile courts) are dealt by the general jurisdiction appeal courts. Specific subject matters (e.g labour, insolvency, family, fight against terrorism and organised crime) are dealt by specific divisions within general jurisdiction courts.

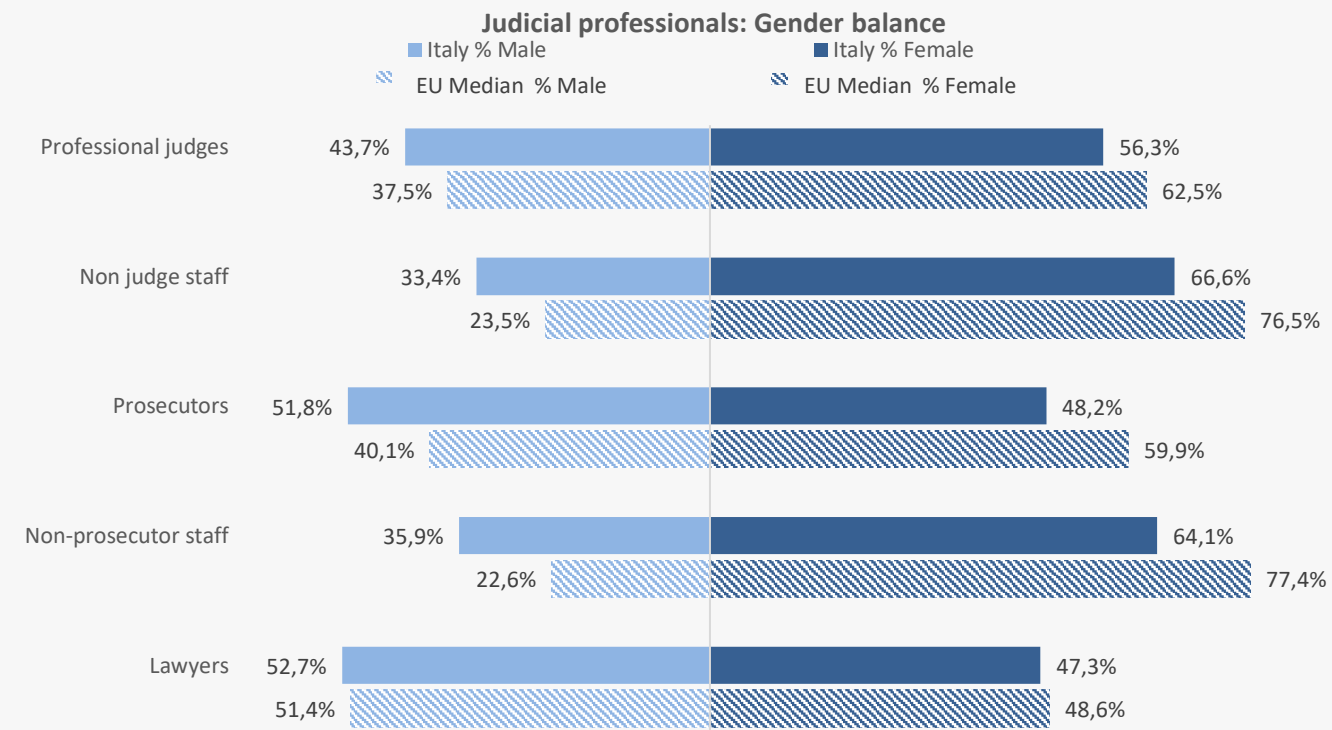

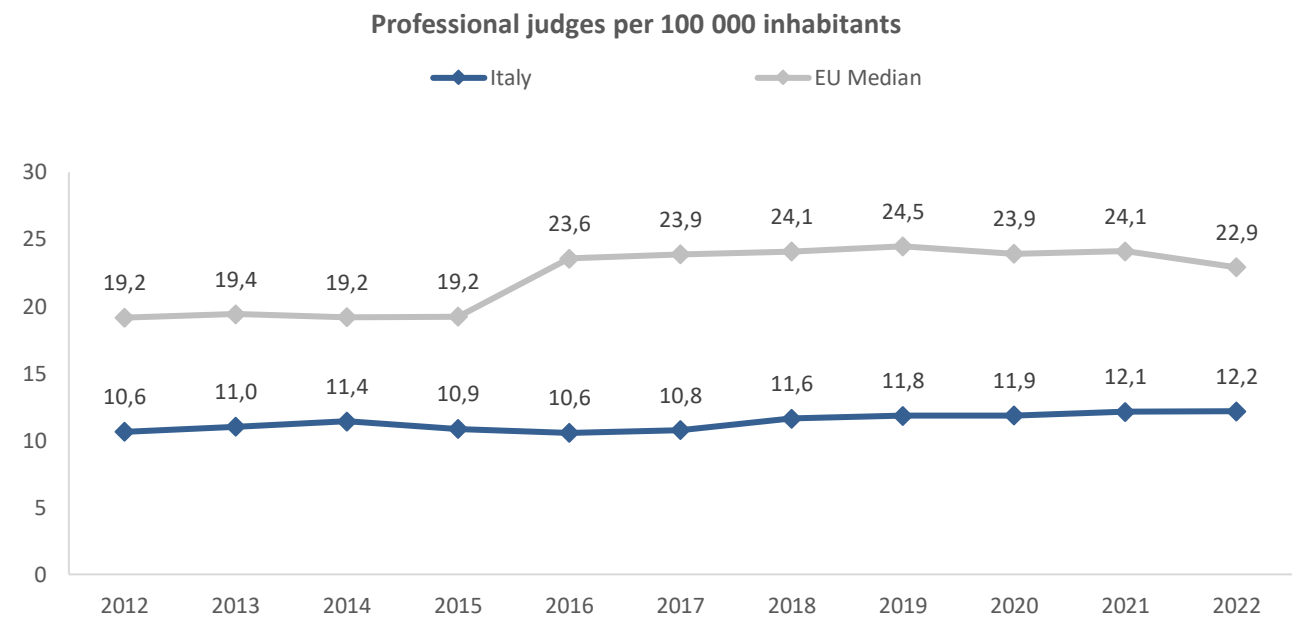

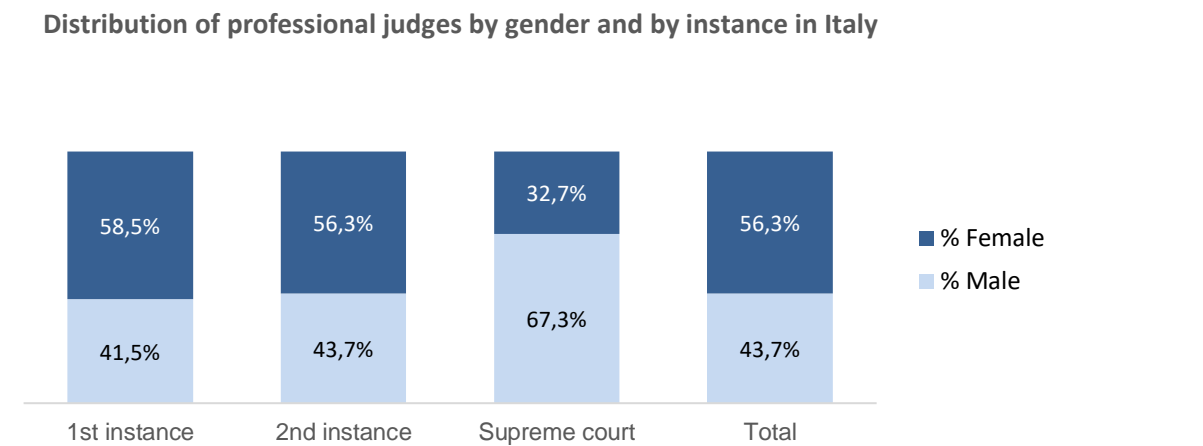
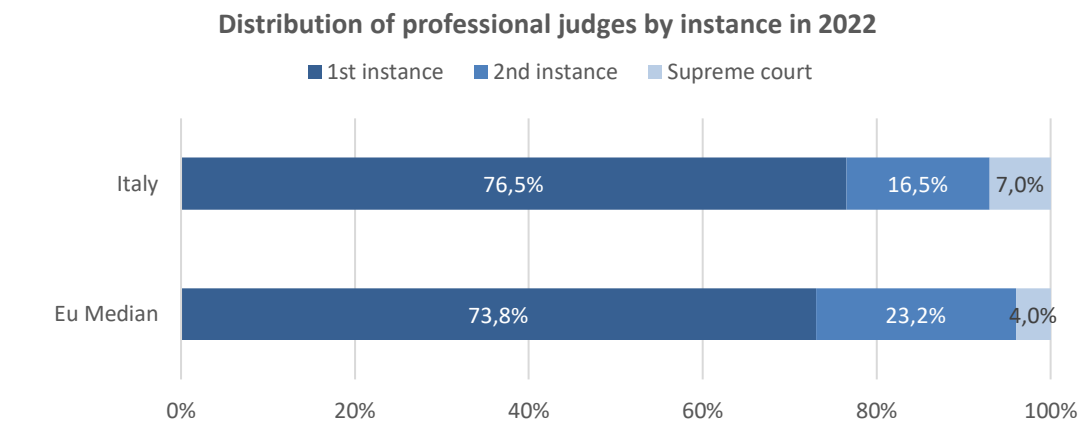
According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Italy is 7 166, which is 0,2% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Italy, there are 12,18 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 22,92 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

Judges serving in specialized first-instance courts, such as regional audit commissions, local tax commissions, and military courts, which operate independently and are financially autonomous from the Ministry of Justice, are not counted in this table.

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 4 038, which represents 56,3% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 5 483 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 3 209 are female); 1 179 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 664 are female) and 504 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which 165 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Italy has relatively less judges in the second instance (16,5% vs 23,2%). This is probalby due to the fact that there are no administrative courts and judges of second instance.

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, it should be noticed that the judges belonging to the specialized first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not counted under this question.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, as already mentionned, in Italy there is not a second instance for administrative cases, therefore, there are no second instance administrative judges.

As regards the distribution male/female, the percentage of females is higher in the first two instances and lower at the supreme court.

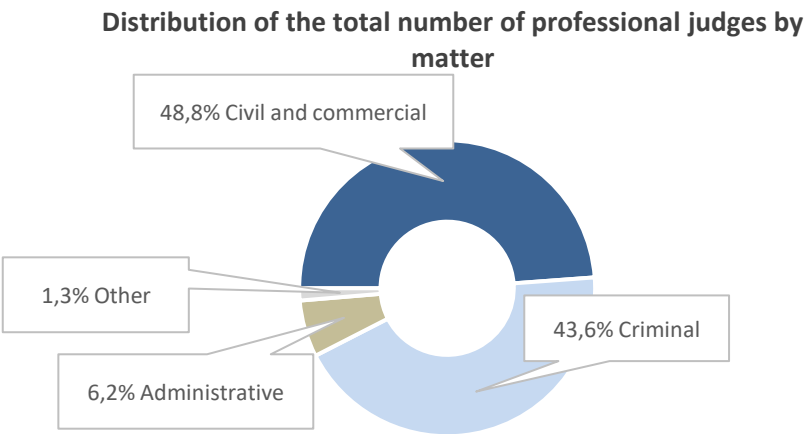

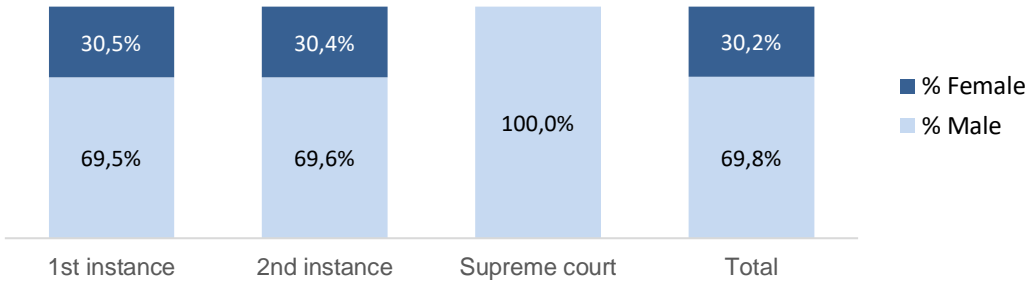

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Italy

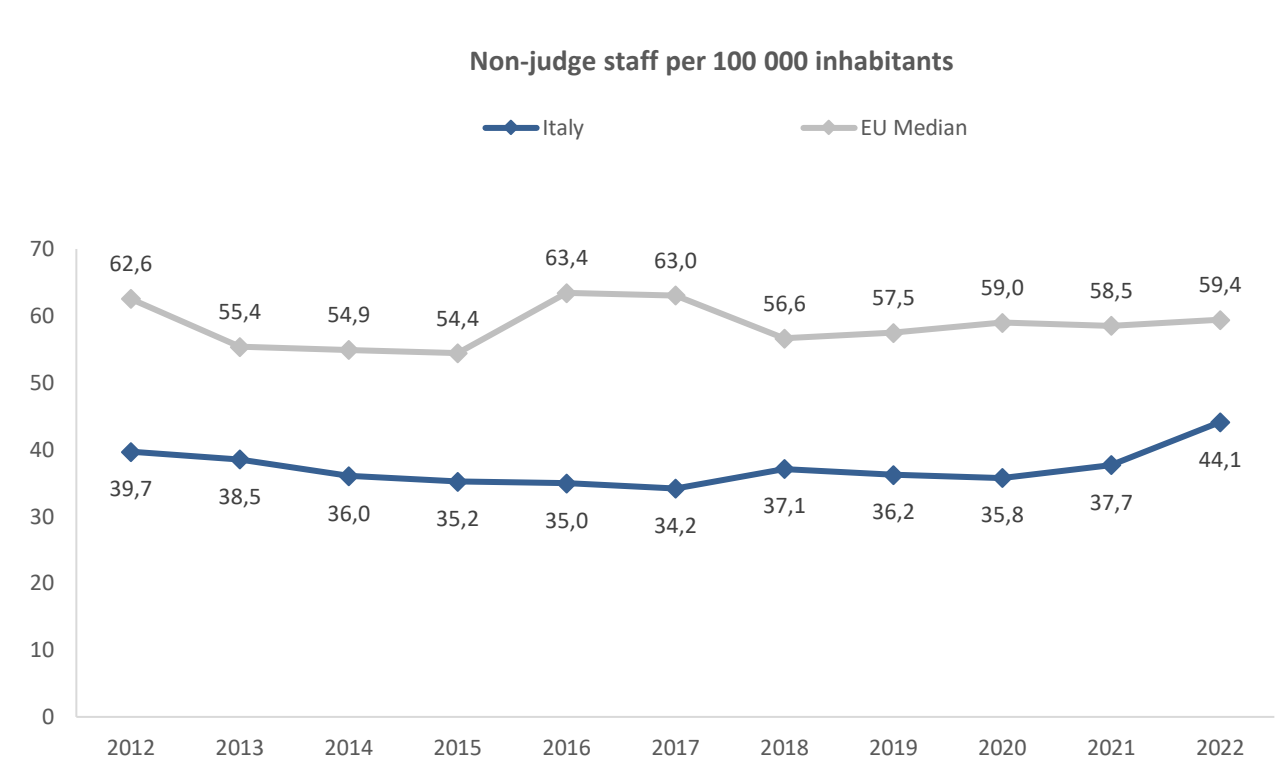


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 64, which represents 30,2% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 187 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 57 are female); 23 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 7 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (none of them are female).

In 2022, Italy has 25 947 non-judge staff (of which 17 271 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 16,8%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 37,7 in 2021 to 44,1 in 2022).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 12,1 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 12,2 in 2022.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

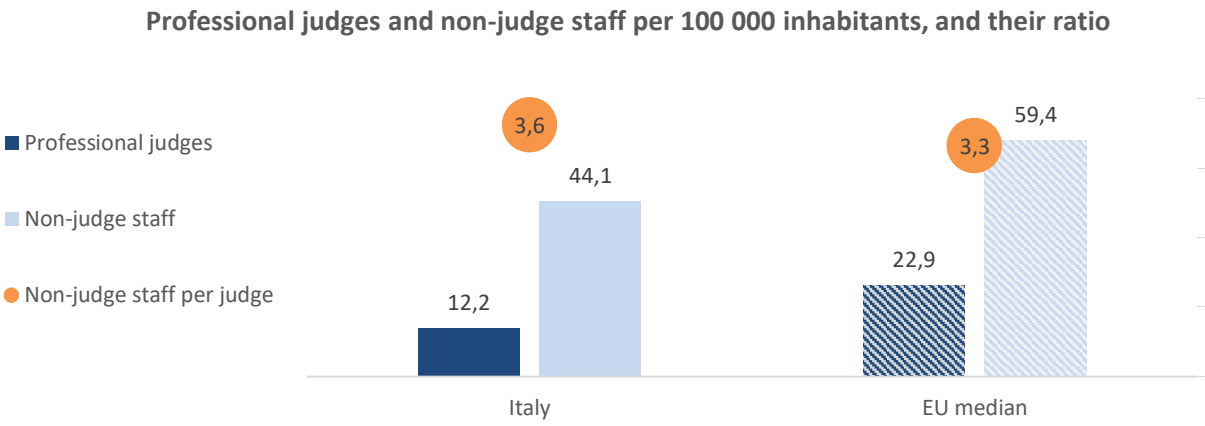
- 17 271 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 12 323 are Female);
- 4 757 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 3 313 are Female);
- 1 959 technical staff (of which 921 are Female);
- 1 952 other (of which 714 are Female);

The category “other non-judge staff” encompasses assistants, receptionists, porters and other judicial staff. As a general remark, it should be stressed that the high percentage of “other non-judge staff” in Italy is due to a very strict interpretation of the definition of the main categories. The specialized first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not taken into consideration for this question.

Within the framework of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), the Ministry of Justice has carried out an extraordinary recruitment process to strengthen the so-called "Trial Office". This is an organisational tool consisting in the creation or the reinforcement of support teams for judges, with fixed-term employment and with the aim of reducing the backlog and the disposition time. This measure also improved the quality of justice by supporting judges in their normal activities of study, legal research, drafting documents, organising documents and thus allowing judges to concentrate on more complex tasks.

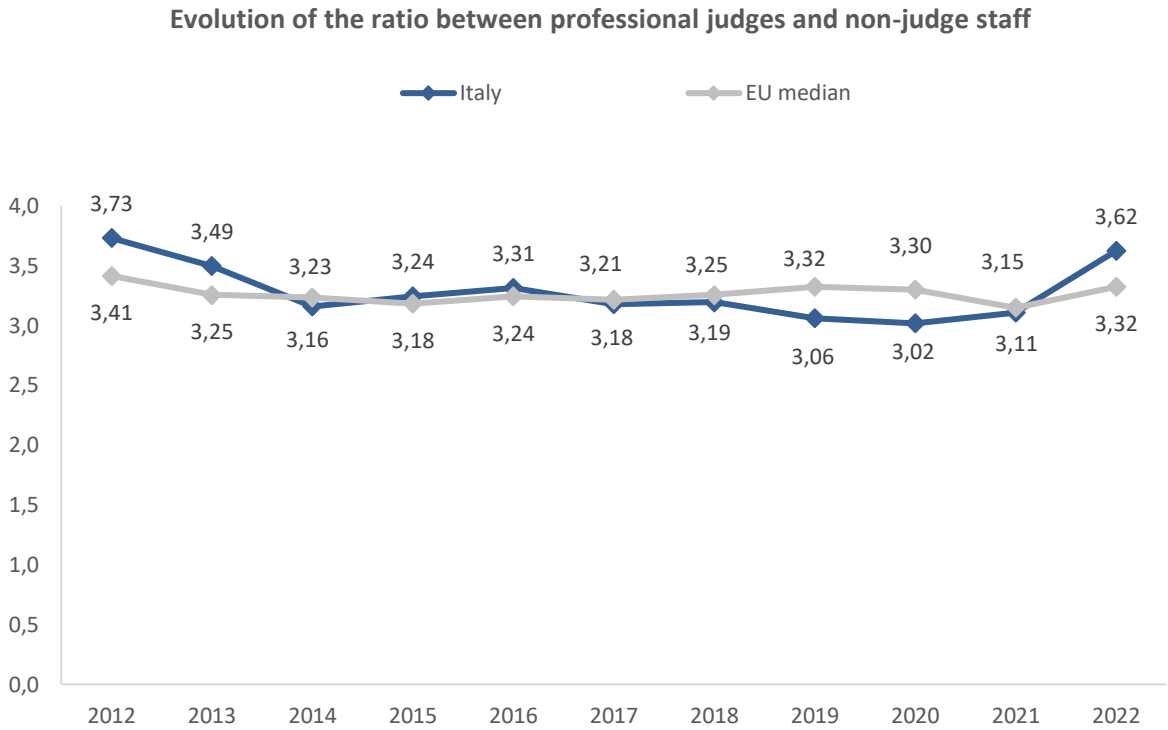


In Italy, there are 12,18 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 22,92 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,62 non-judge staff per judge.

There has been a significant increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,11 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

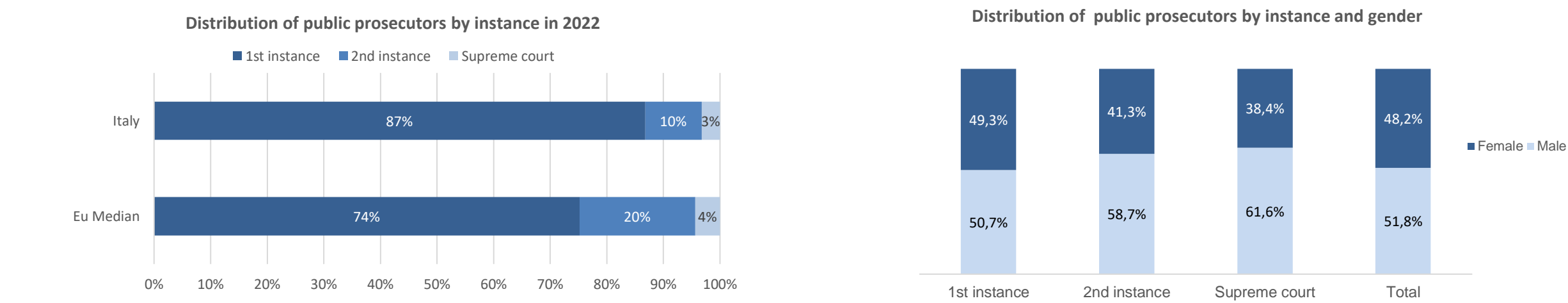

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 1 086, which represents 48,2% of the total number of prosecutors.

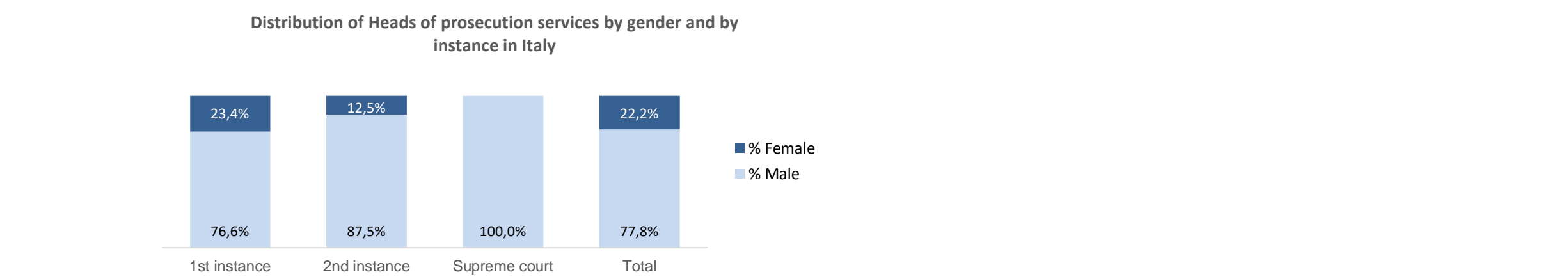
The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 957 in first instance (of which 965 are female); 225 are in second instance (of which 93 are female) and 73 in final instance (of which 28 are female).

As regards the distribution male/female, male prosecutors are more than 50% in all instances. Additionally, their representation tends to increase as the instance level progresses.

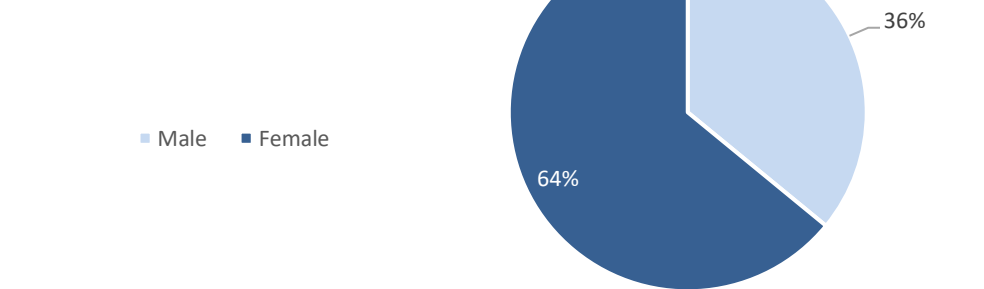
In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 36, which represents 22,2% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

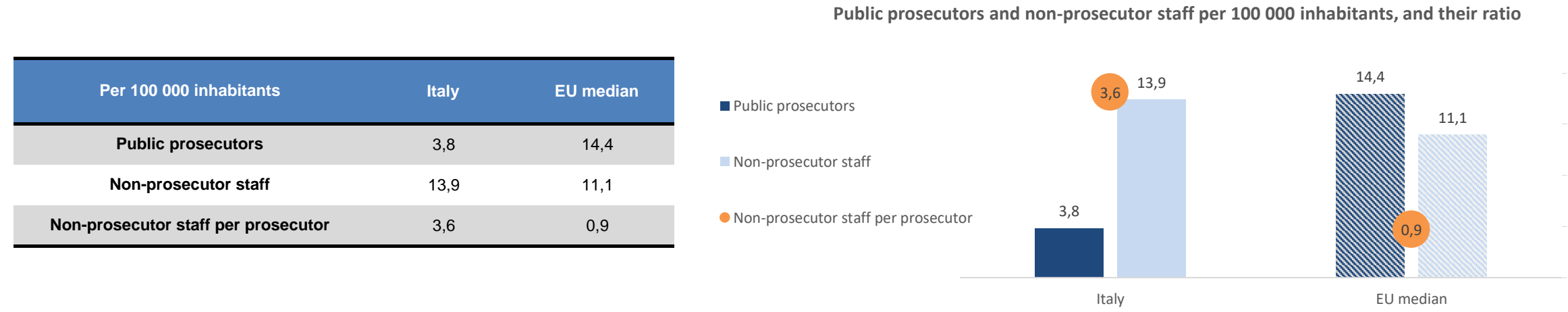

Non-prosecutor staff by gender

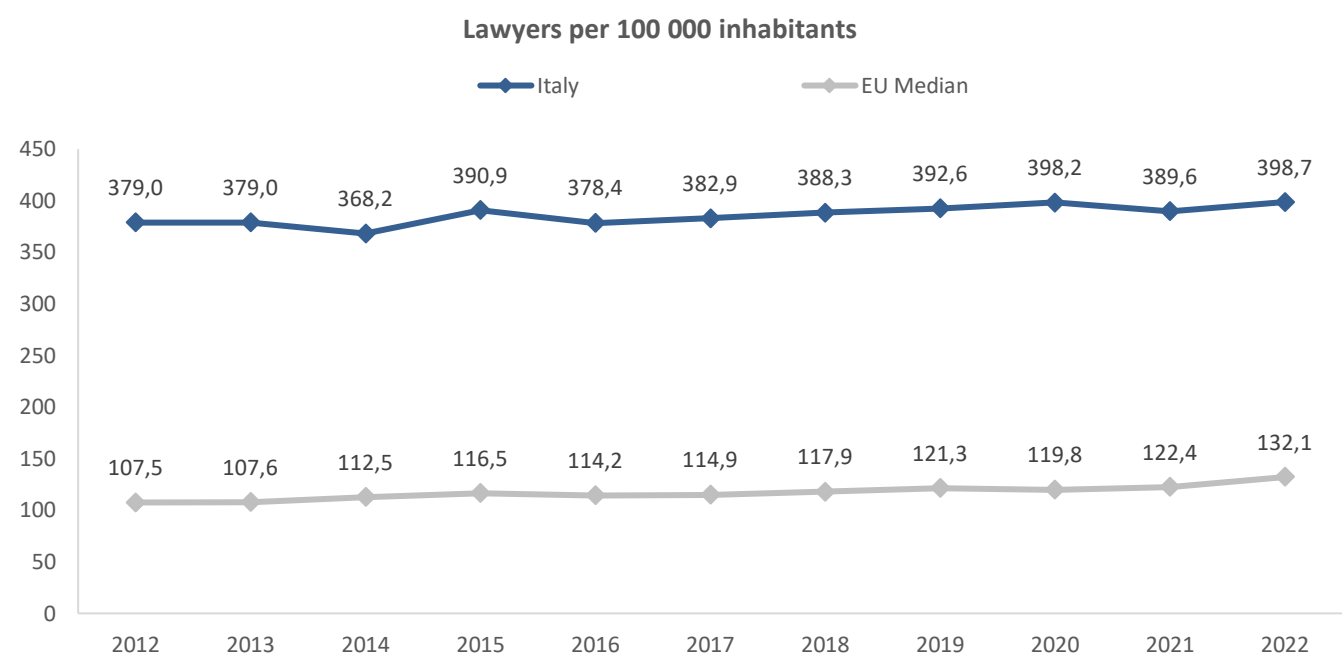


Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

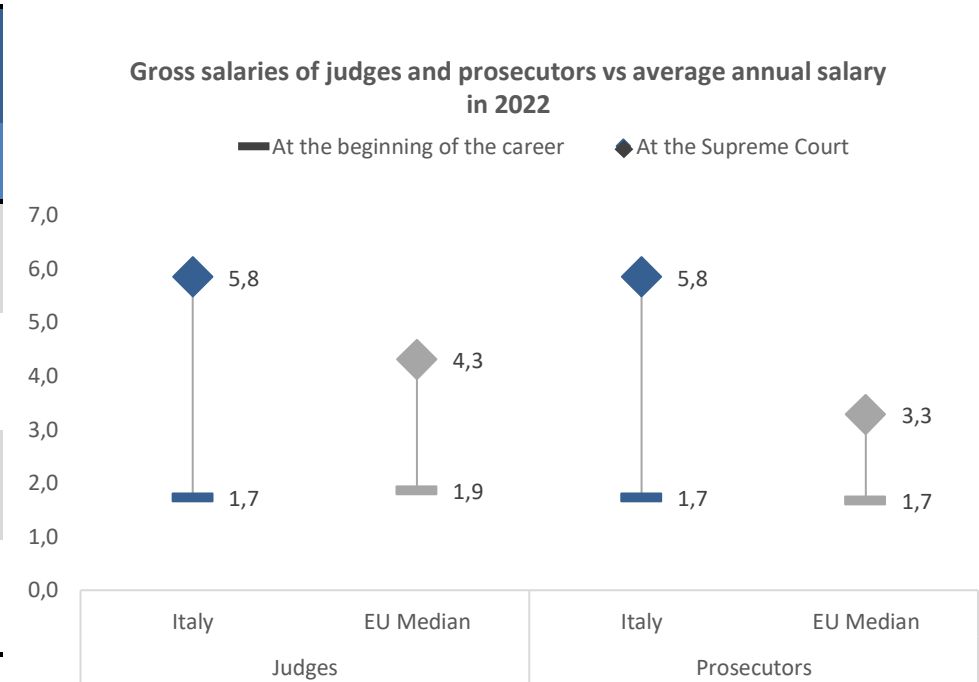


In 2022, there are 234 632 lawyers, which is 2,1% more than in 2021.
There are 111 058 female lawyers which is 47% of the total.

Italy has 398,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is above the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Italy is 57 500€, which is slightly above the EU median of 54 224€ (6% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Italy's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 82% above the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Italy of 57 500€ is rather above the EU median of 48 728€ (18% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Italy is the country with the maximum absolute gross salary in the EU.

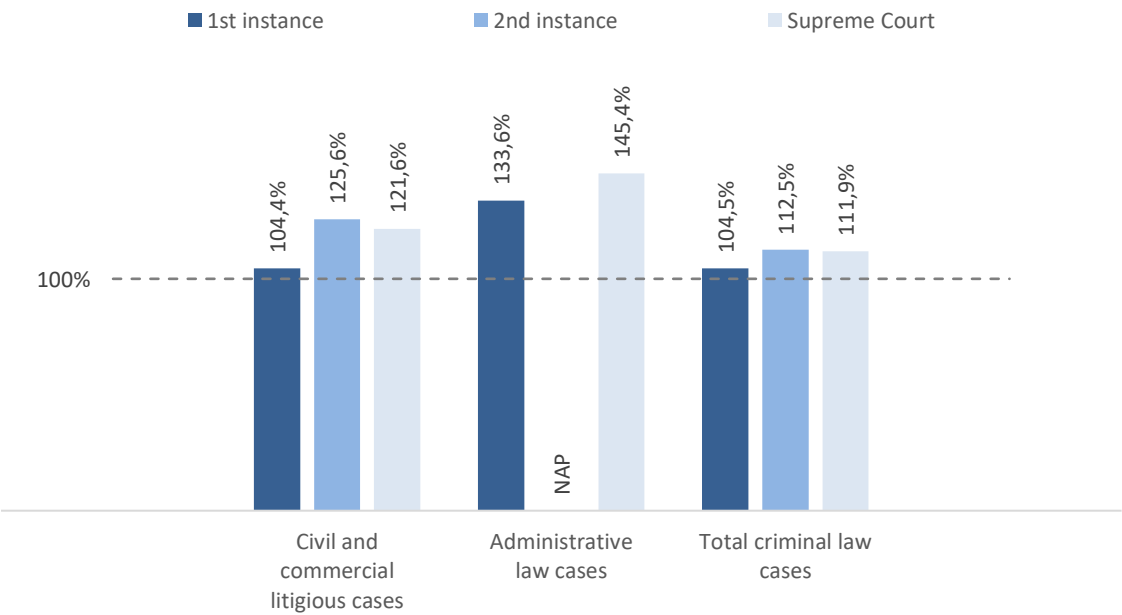
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

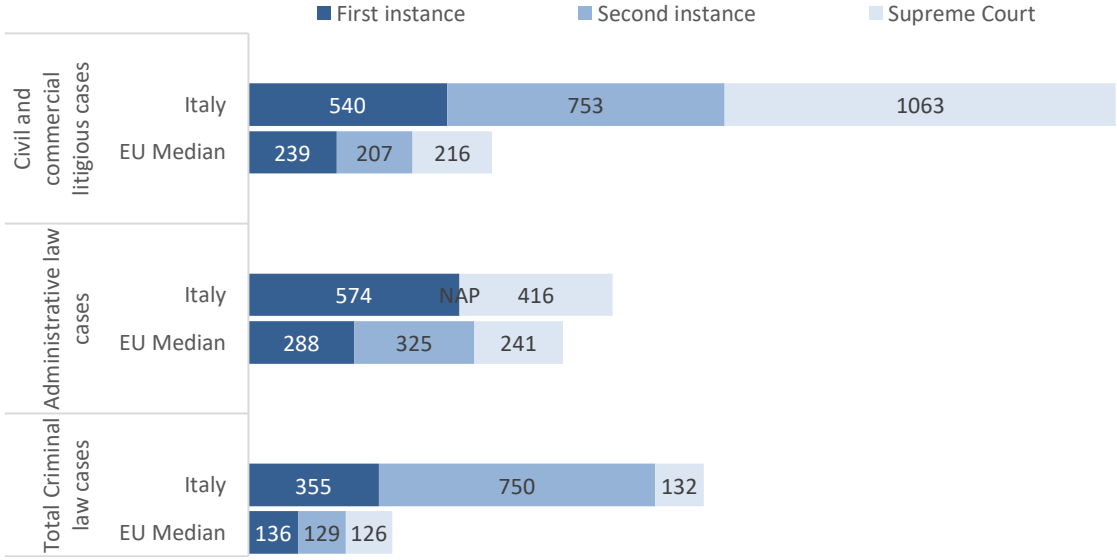

DispositionTime by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)



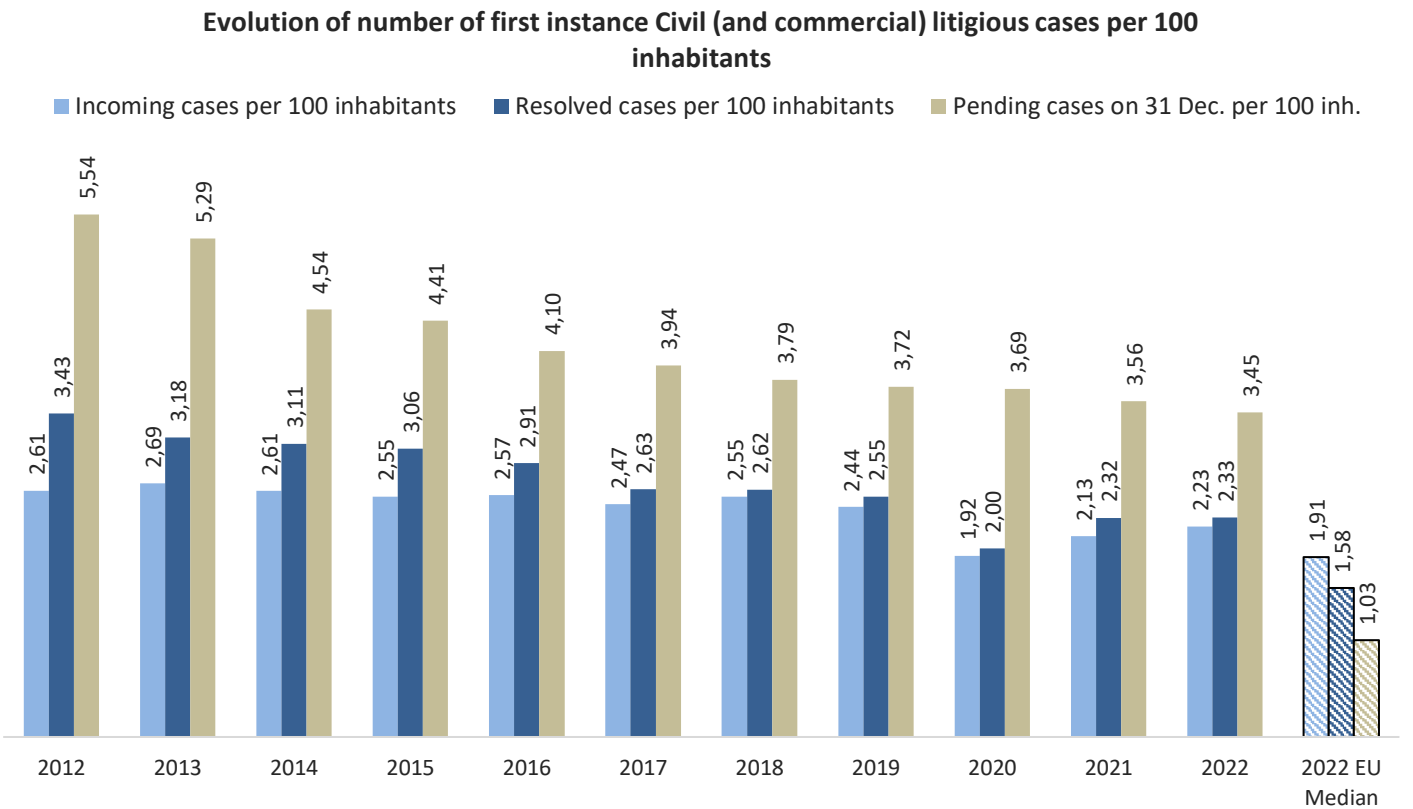
In the framework of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR) Italy has undertaken a series of actions in order to reduce both disposition time and backlogs. The main objective is an overall reduction of 40% in the civil sector and 25% in the criminal sector by June 2026 (all three instances together). More specifically a reduction of the civil backlog by 65% in first instance courts and 55% in appeal courts by the end of 2024; by 90% in first instance courts and appeal courts by June 2026. As far as the civil cases, such targets relate exclusively to litigious cases. As a result, in 2022 the number of resolved cases increased significantly, the clearance rate is well above 100% for all the categories of cases, and, consequently, the number of pending cases and the disposition time decreased. However, the total lenght of proceedings is still above the EU median, especially as regards civil and commercial litigious cases and crimina cases in all instances.

With regard to the administrative cases (which number is provided only since 2014), the appeals are dealt with by the Council of State (Consiglio di Stato) which is a legal-administrative consultative body ensuring the legality of public administration in Italy. The Council has jurisdiction on acts of all administrative authorities, except when these authorities lack discretionary power, in which case the dispute is considered to be one of civil law. Figures referring to the activity of the Council of State are inserted in the frame of question 99 (third instance cases) and not question 97 (second instance cases).

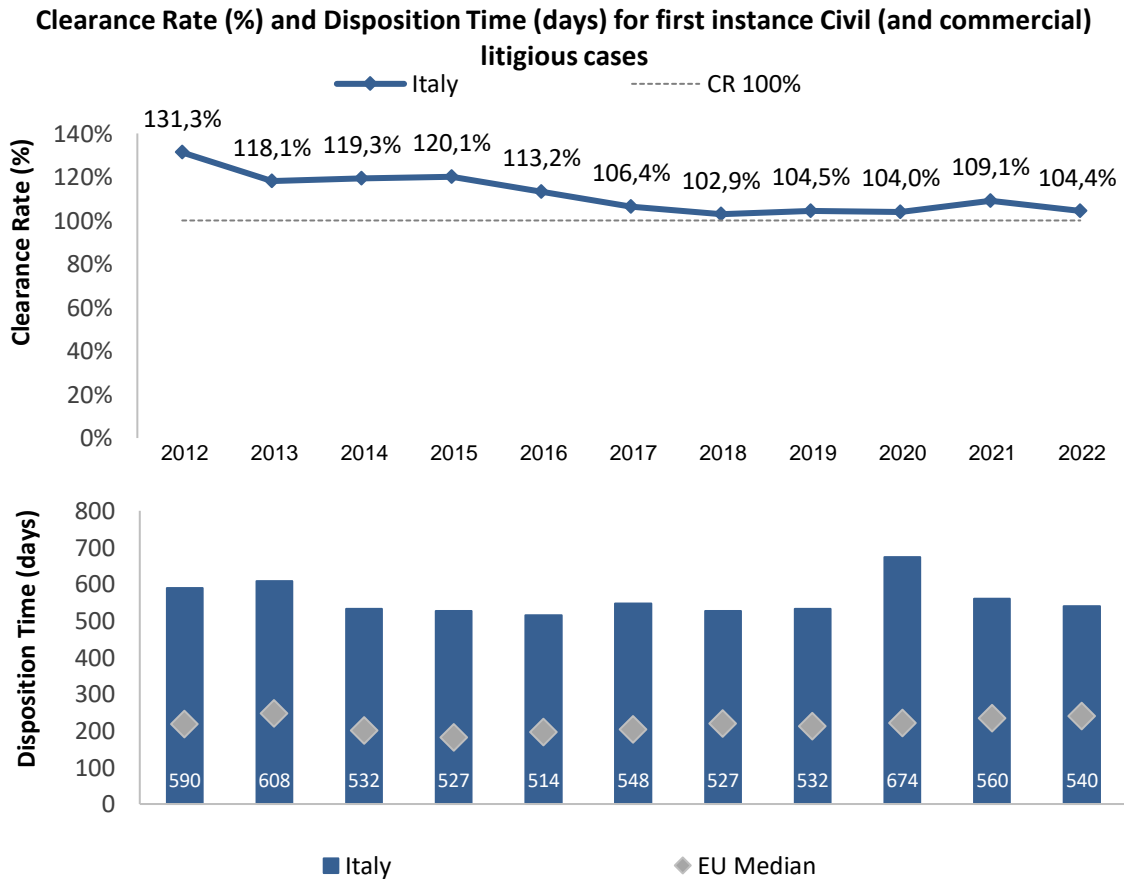

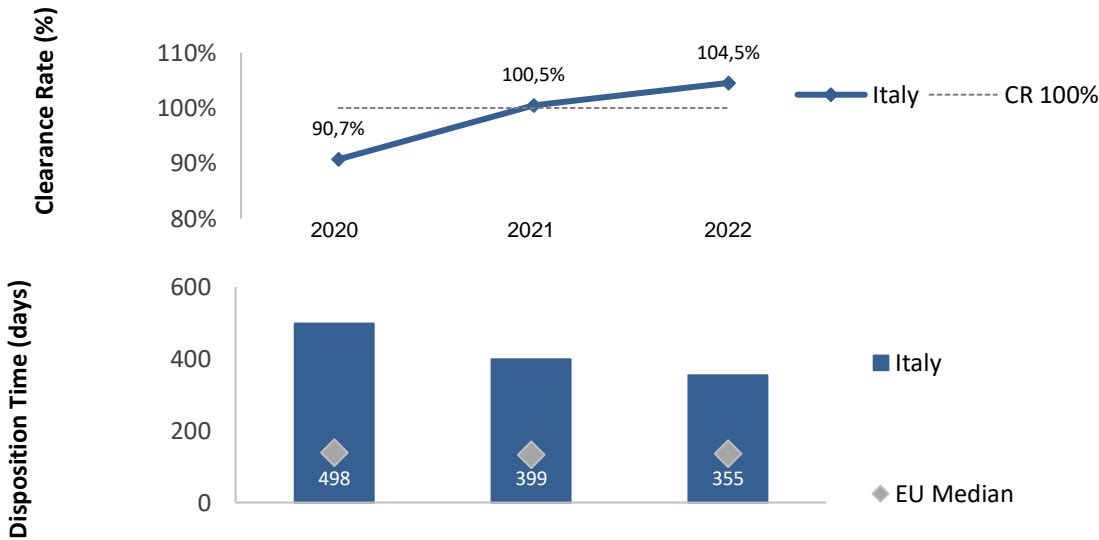

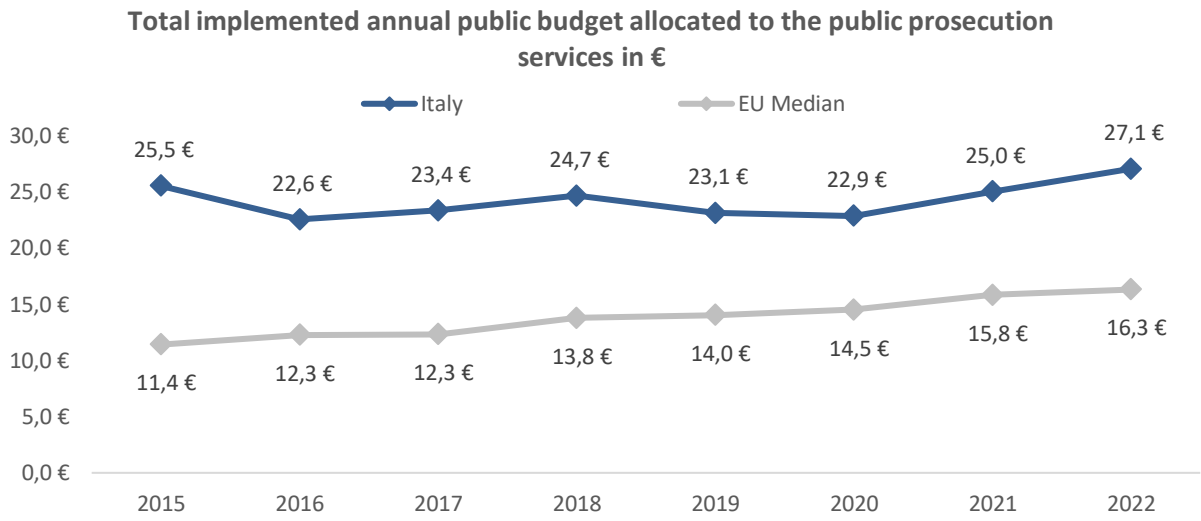

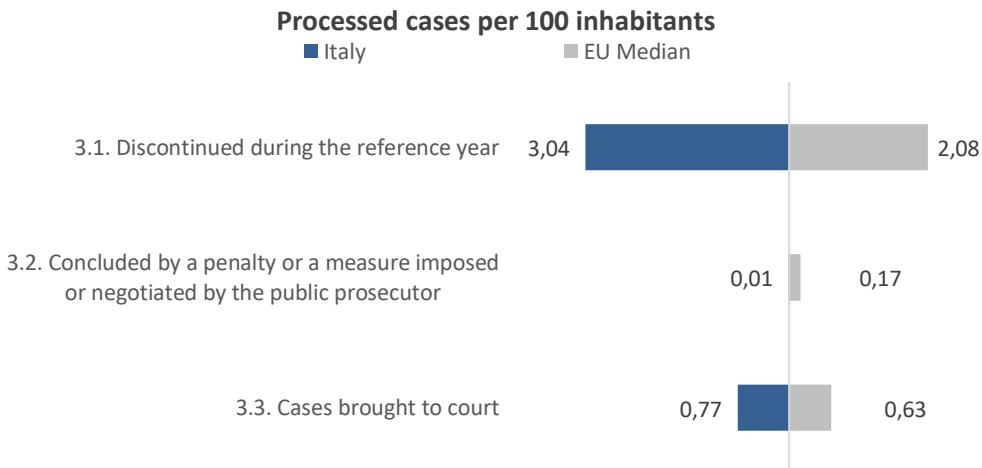
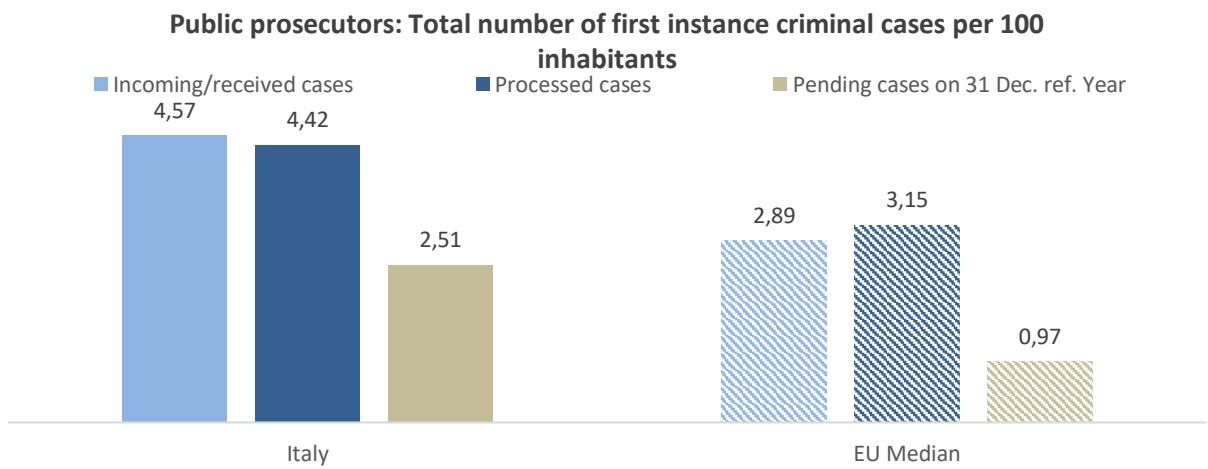
In general, due to the structure of the Italian judicial system, the Ministry of Justice has one single budget which does not distinguish between the budget allocated to courts, the budget allocated to public prosecution services and the one allocated to the administration. However an effort is made in order to provide the most reasonable figure for the budget of the prosecution services. The calculation is carried out taking into account several criteria (e.g. the number of staff allocated to the public prosecution services).

The increase since 2020 in the budget for training is due to the fact that in 2020 the training was mainly delivered online (less expensive) due to the pandemic.

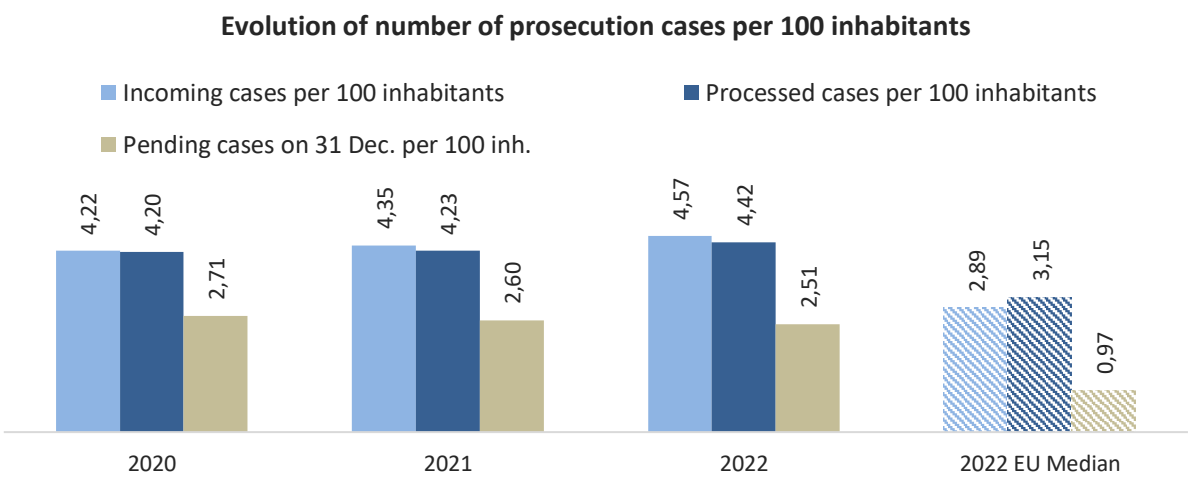

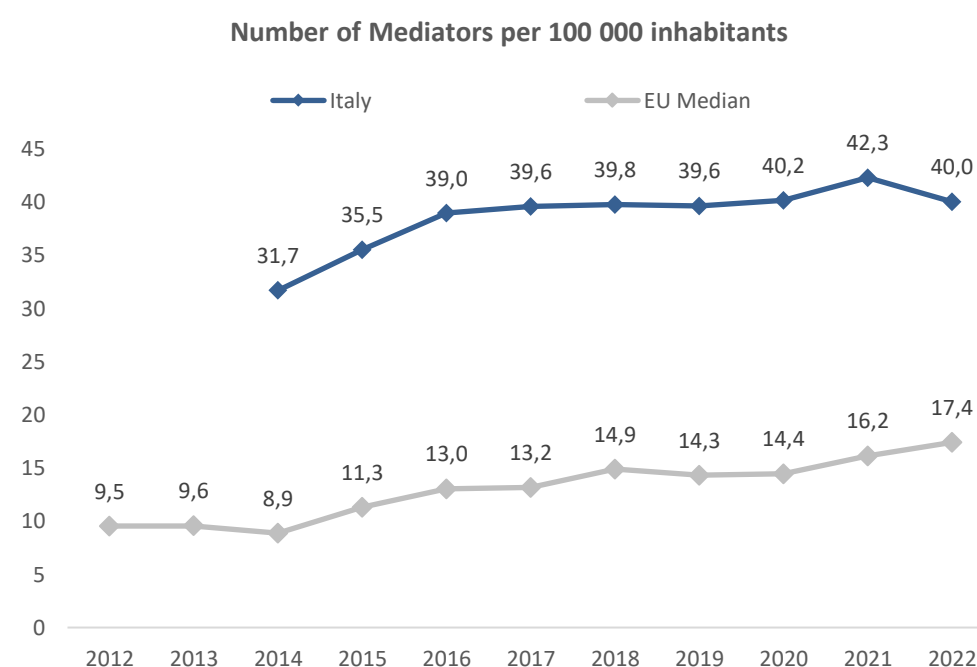

In 2022, there are 23 561 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 40,0 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2021 and 2022 is about -5,5%.

To become a mediator in Italy, individuals must meet specific requirements:

- Hold at least a three-year university degree or be a member of a professional association.
- Complete a minimum 50-hour training course, including theoretical and practical components, with a final evaluation.
- Undergo biennial updates comprising at least 18 hours of advanced training.
- Participate in supervised internships, renewing them every two years.
- Declare their availability to serve as a mediator for a maximum of five mediation organizations.

These criteria ensure the qualifications and competence of mediators in civil and commercial matters.

In 2022, there are 5 120 notaries which represents 8,7 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

The Notary as existing in Italy belongs to the “Latin (roman) notarial system”. The Latin notary is a public officer and a specialized counselor; his/her expertise must cover estate contracts, loans and mortgages, company law, family law, wills law, the relevant sections of fiscal law. The Latin notary also performs other judicial duties as a judicial auxiliary/assistant. Notaries as public officers are professionals who perform public functions. They are vested by the State with public authority and faith, which allows them to draw authentic deeds (or public deeds). Put differently, a notary can be defined as a public officer to whom the State delegates a specific public power, the power to assert (to affirm) the authenticity of a document. The profession of notary is characterized by the qualities of independence and impartiality.
