#### Context

The Joint European Union-Council of Europe Child-friendly Justice project is an innovative 27-month initiative driven by the combined efforts of the Council of Europe and the European Commission and implemented by the Children's Rights Division of the Council of Europe. Launched on 1 January 2024, the project aims to improve the protection of children in contact with the law – as offenders, victims, witnesses or parties in non-judicial, judicial (such as civil and criminal cases) and administrative proceedings – across Europe at national and local levels.

Belgium, Poland, and Slovenia have been selected as focus countries to pilot the implementation of activities at national and local level to collect data, identify gaps, improve legislation, policies, and practices. From July to December 2024, the three focus countries conducted their self-assessment through the roll-out of the Council of Europe Child-friendly Justice Assessment Tool. Data collected and analysed helped formulating recommendations to adapt Belgium's, Poland's, and Slovenia's legal and policy framework, in line with the Council of Europe's and European Union's standards, strengthen capacities of professionals working for and with children in contact with the law, and raise the awareness of children in contact with the law and their parents. These latter activities will be conducted in the three focus countries between June and December 2025.

The objective of the exchange visit in Poland is three-fold:

- Attending the first Training of Trainers session, based on the <u>Course: Child-friendly Justice</u> <u>Council of Europe HELP</u>, in Poland.
- Visiting and learning from Poland's experience on Child-friendly Justice, especially on Barnahus.
- Holding the third steering committee meeting of the Child-friendly Justice project.
