### What is the Joint Programme DISCO?

The European Union/Council of Europe Joint Programme "Democratic and Inclusive School Culture in Operation (DISCO)" funds projects promoting education for democratic citizenship and human rights education (EDC/HRE).

31 projects funded in 6 cycles

The Joint Programme started as a pilot project scheme in 2013 under the name "Human Rights and Democracy in Action".


#### How?

The projects are selected as a result of a call for project proposals. For each cycle, common thematic priorities are set in line with the current work of the European Commission and the Council of Europe.

In this way, we ensure that the outcomes of projects are timely and contribute to tackling current issues that our societies face.

## Who can apply?

Governmental and not-for-profit organisations from the 50 States party to the European Cultural Convention are eligible to apply.
