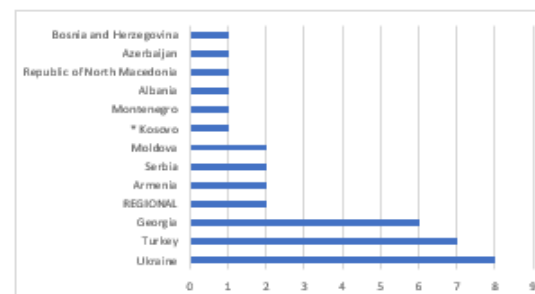

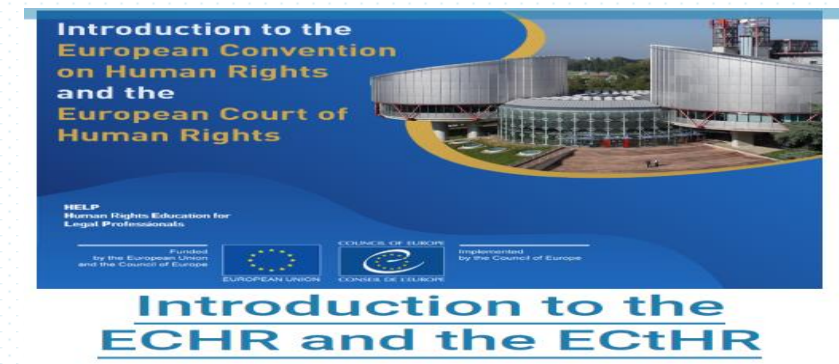
How we integrate HELP courses through cooperation projects?
