Spanish law. Título VI de la LO 2/23, del Sistema universitario

 Artículo 19. La cultura en la Universidad: "1. La creación y transmisión de la cultura universitaria en toda su diversidad constituye una misión fundamental de la Universidad. A tal fin, las universidades velarán por mantener y reforzar la dimensión cultural de todas sus actividades..."

A quantitative and qualitative comparative with other missions of University


• Teaching: mentions (USC, 48; USAL, 40)








The importance of university research in the contemporary Renaissance of the Camino de Santiago



Tradition and novelty in current scientific research on cultural routes
