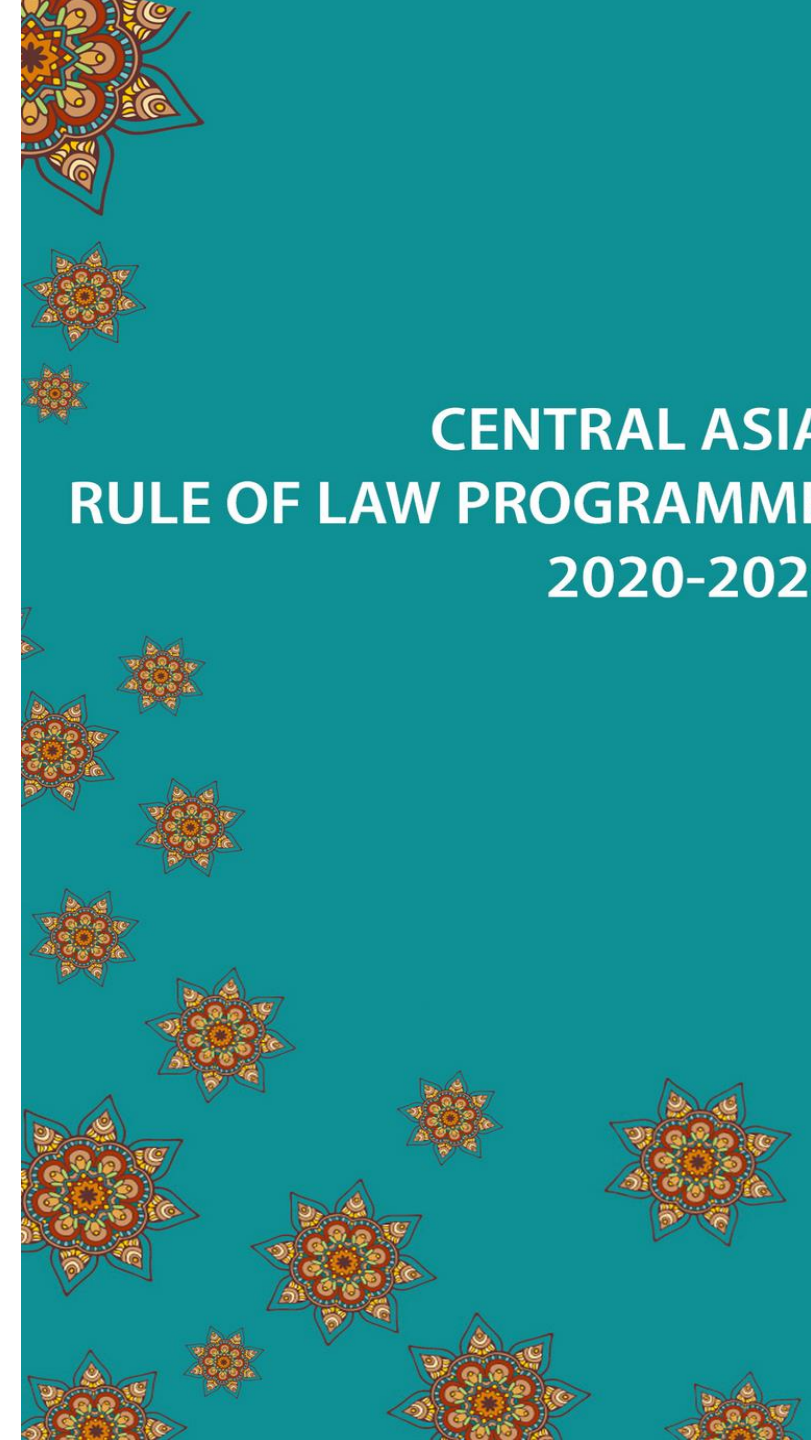

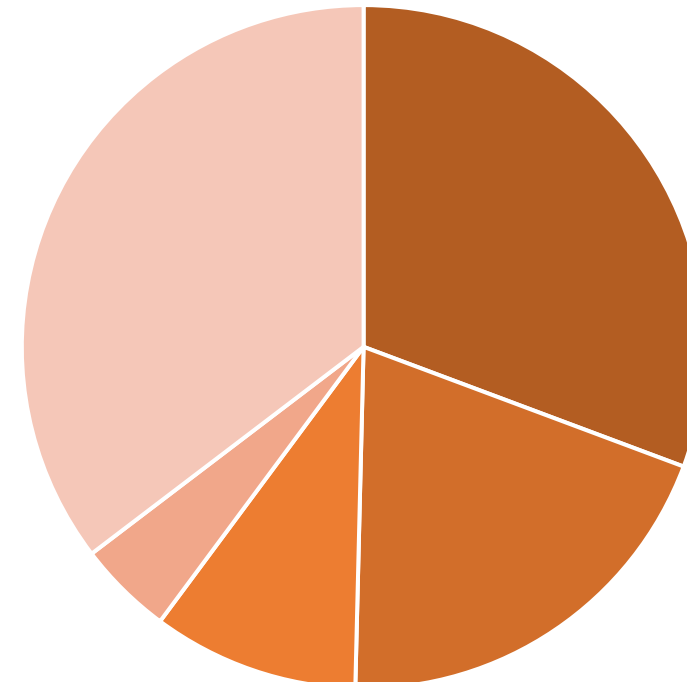
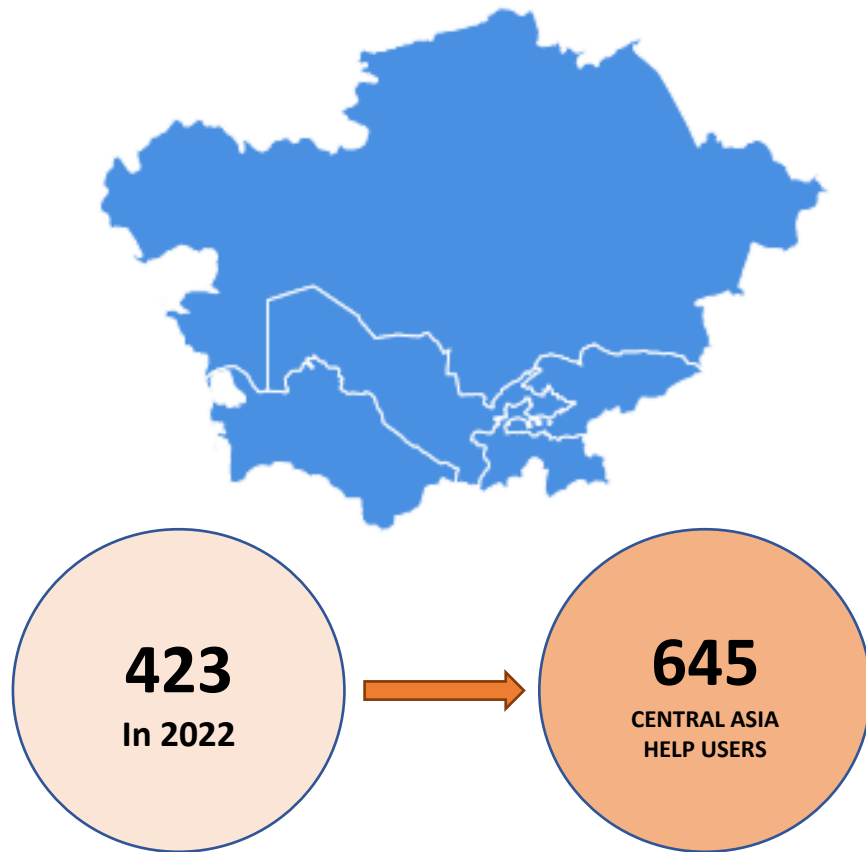

## **Uzbekistan**

- Rights of people with disabilities for judges;
- Violence against women and domestic violence for prosecutors;
- Combating trafficking in human beings for prosecutors;

- Violence against women and domestic violence for judges in **Tajikistan**;
- International co-operation in criminal matters for prosecutors in **Uzbekistan**;
- Prohibition of ill-treatment for prosecutors in **Kazakhstan**;
