# Strengthening multilevel governance and participatory democracy



### **PROJECT LEAFLET**

January – December 2025

Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe



The project **Strengthening multilevel governance and participatory democracy** (January – December 2025) aims to strengthen the co-operation between central and local authorities in Kosovo\* in local self-government reform and in the advancement of participatory and deliberative democracy.

The increased sought-after synergies between central and local authorities and the Association of Kosovo Municipalities (AKM) will lead to stronger multilevel governance and central–local consultation on legislative initiatives and reforms.

#### **OUTCOMES**

- Central and local authorities and the AKM engage in inclusive discussions to advance legislative initiatives and reforms.
- Municipalities pilot novel citizen participation initiatives and contribute to the implementation of the Kosovo\* Action Plan of the Open Government Partnership 2023–2025 in co-ordination with the Ministry of Local Government Administration.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

The project has a two-fold approach:

- Supporting reforms: the project will serve to update the 2021 Study on Local Self-Government in Kosovo\* to outline the legislative and policy changes in the past years and assist central and local authorities in addressing recurrent and new issues in line with the European Charter of Local Self-Government and other European standards. An action plan will be designed for the implementation of recommendations.
- Capacity building and peer learning: the project will facilitate peer exchanges and equip local authorities with the necessary tools and knowledge to lead change on open government and participatory and deliberative democracy.

#### **PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

- Conference of central and local authorities: a conference will be held with all relevant stakeholders to discuss and agree on policies and priorities for local self-government reform, based on the updated study's findings and recommendations.
- Engagement with Central Authorities: to enhance local self-government in priority areas, central authorities will undertake a <u>Peer</u> <u>Review Process</u> to exchange and learn from other European governments who have conducted similar reforms and legislative changes.
- Capacity Development: the capacities of local elected representatives and municipal officials in transparency, accountability and participatory democracy will be enhanced.
- Peer Learning: selected municipalities will participate in a Forum of Exchange to share knowledge and good practices for the strategic localisation of open government and democratic innovations.
- Local Initiatives: a small number of local projects designed by municipalities to promote open government and public participation in local decision making will be supported.

#### **PARTNERS**

The project is implemented in close co-operation with the Ministry of Local Government Administration and the AKM.
