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• Established in 2012 according to art. 6 UNCAC

 Independent administrative authority in charge of the prevention of corruption in public administrations and statecontrolled enterprises

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- Implementation of the National Anti Corruption Strategy
- Supervision of public procurement
- Promotion of integrity in the public sector and transparency
- Protection of whistlelblowers

Impact of the emergency



First quarter of 2020 - decrease of public contracts:

- 24% number of tenders and 33% economic value
- The majority of public contracts over 40.000 euro awarded through
 negotiated procedures with no publication of the tender (77%)
 direct award of contracts (20%),
 mainly by central purchasing bodies (around 57%)

Second quarter of 2020 - increase of public contracts:

Constant growth in supplies and works compensated for the decline in services occurred in the first quarter of 2020





Emergency legislation

- Negotiated procedures without prior call for tender
- No stand-still period of 35 days between contract signing and execution
- Increased threshold values for direct assignment and negotiated procedures
- Postponement of checks on sub-contracts after contract awarding
- Departure from the Public Contract Code standards for strategic procurement

The role of ANAC during the pandemic



Technical Assistance to Government ANAC is working with the Government on simplification and transparency transparency of public procurement Through the National Data Bank of Public Contracts (BDNCP), ANAC is promoting the digitalization of public procurement digitalizzation Through the BDNCP ANAC also release a code for each public procurement to allow the traceability of financial flows financial flows
