Work in committees lies at the heart of the Council of Europe and allows the direct participation of governmental and independent experts in its work. It significantly contributes to the Organisation's core mission, which is "to achieve **a greater unity between its members** for the purpose of safeguarding and realising the ideals and principles which are their common heritage and facilitating their economic and social progress", as stated in Article 1 of its Statute.

Two main types of committees can be distinguished:¹

Committees established by a convention or a specific resolution of the Committee of Ministers represent the Council of Europe's acquis in terms of protecting human rights and promoting the rule of law and democracy.

They are based on a consolidated body of **international treaties** and **resolutions** adopted by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe. These also include resolutions establishing **partial and enlarged agreements** in accordance with Statutory Resolution (96)36 on partial and enlarged agreements as amended by Resolution CM/Res(2010)2.

The terms of reference of these committees are set out in the respective convention or resolution and are in principle not time bound. Some committees have a monitoring function.

Steering and ad hoc committees and their subordinate bodies are set up by the Committee of Ministers under Article 17 of the Statute of the Council of Europe for a duration limited to the programme cycle. They are directly responsible to the Committee of Ministers and are governed by Resolution CM/Res(2021)3-consolidated on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods.

These committees are the main tool for developing common political instruments and legal standards, such as treaties or recommendations. This "**intergovernmental structure**" strengthens cooperation between member States through the sharing of knowledge, experience and good practices, and through the analysis of common and emerging issues.

The make-up of the intergovernmental structure is **priority driven** to ensure political relevance and thus inextricably linked to the Programme and Budget of the Organisation. As an integral part of the **Programme and Budget 2024-2027**, the structure was set for the quadrennium and reviewed in the framework of the revised Programme and Budget for the second biennium 2026-2027.

Steering and ad hoc committees are directly answerable to the Committee of Ministers. They are composed of member State representatives of the highest possible rank in the relevant field. While steering committees have planning and steering functions, ad hoc committees have a more focused task.

Subordinate bodies, in general to steering committees, bring together specific expertise on selected matters. They are usually composed of a limited number of member States' representatives and often also include independent experts. They may have terms of reference for a shorter period than the programme cycle, depending on the task assigned to them.

This revised intergovernmental structure 2024-2027 consists of **21 steering or ad hoc committees** and **17 subordinate bodies** for the Ordinary Budget. In addition, it includes 5 steering committees under the responsibility of the European Directorate for the Quality of Medicines & Healthcare (EDQM).

Programme Name of the Programme in the Council of Europe Programme and Budget

- **Committee composed of government representatives:** Members represent the parties to a convention, the members of a partial agreement, or all Council of Europe member States. Other actors such as international organisations, NGOs or experts can be involved in these committees' work but do not take part in decision-making.
- **Committee composed of independent experts:** Members are usually nominated or appointed by member States but sit in their individual capacity. These committees can be characterised as independent monitoring or advisory committees.
- ◆ **Committee with mixed composition:** Membership includes member States representatives, representatives of other actors such as international organisations or NGOs, and/or experts acting in their individual capacity.

Securing human rights and fundamental freedoms
