WHAT IS THE EUROPEAN QUALIFICATIONS PASSPORT FOR REFUGEES (EOPR)?

- ► The EQPR is a tool that facilitates recognition of refugees' qualifications in the absence of full documentation.
- The EQPR is a document listing a refugee's highest education qualification, work experience and language skills.
- ► The EQPR is used by refugees when they wish to enter further studies or when they seek employment.
- ► The EQPR supports the implementation of the Lisbon Recognition Convention.



WHO CAN APPLY?

- Persons with refugee status.
- Persons with asylum seeker status.
- Persons with the right to temporary protection (as per Temporary Protection Directive, Council Directive 2001/55/EC).



WHY IS IT USEFUL?

- Many refugees might not be able to bring all their relevant documents with them. The EQPR provides an opportunity for fair assessment of qualifications even in cases when the documentation is missing.
- ► The EQPR can be used in other European countries, if and when the EQPR holder moves from the country where the EQPR was issued.



BENEFITS OF THE EQPR

- Credible evaluation of refugee's qualifications.
- ► Evaluation costs to host countries are reduced as refugees do not need to repeat the assessment procedure.
- The evaluation of a refugee's qualification(s) is provided for free and is easily accessible.
- ▶ Both host societies and refugees benefit from a faster integration.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- Individual application to participate in the EQPR
- Selection of participants
- ▶ Detailed description of educational background / Questionnaire
- Consent for participation
- Assessment of available documentation/reconstruction.
- Structured interview with the credential evaluators
- Issuing of the European Qualifications Passport for Refugees (EQPR)



THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS

- ▶ Refugees apply for the EQPR by creating an account on the EQPR IT platform and filling out a questionnaire. Then if selected, they meet with a team of credential evaluators for an interview (approx. 45 min) during which their qualifications are assessed. Credential evaluators are qualification experts. They have experience in foreign qualifications and knowledge of the education system of the countries of the refugees. The interview is conducted in the native language or in the language of instruction.
- After the interview, the decision whether to issue the EQPR will be taken.

- Higher education
- Technical vocational education and training
- Upper secondary education


How to apply for the European Qualifications Passport for Refugees?

STEP 1: Please create your EQPR account


- Go to the WEBSITE: https://coe.diplo-me.eu
- Click on "Create a new account"




Please insert your name, surname and email address and **REGISTER**



An email with the **activation link** will be sent to your inbox. Below is an example. Please also check the spam folder.




- In the email, please click on "Activate Account". The link will take you to the login website.
- Please insert your **username** (your email address) and **password** (please copy/paste the password you received in the email). Click "**ENTER**" to log into your EQPR account.




STEP 2: Please complete your EQPR profile

Please fill in the requested information in the "PROFILE - Account" section. You can also fill in or upload the **questionnaire** and add the **documents** (refugee status certificate, identity documents, consent form, photograph, other documents etc.)



STEP 3: Please submit your EQPR application

Please start your EQPR application and upload the required documentation as described under the "MY APPLICATION - EQPR" section:




A) First, you should add or upload the completed **questionnaire** required for the assessment.

The questionnaire is the main document for the evaluation process. Please make sure to include it in your application. It should be the first document in your application.




B) In order to proceed with your application, you should upload mandatory documents such as your Refugee Status Certificate, your ID Card and the signed Consent Form. Please also add your photograph in passport format.



IMPORTANT: You should upload a **signed** copy of the consent form. The template can be found under the section "**INFO** – **Consent form**".

C) If and where possible, under "OPTIONAL DOCUMENTS" please upload any documentation you consider relevant for evaluating your qualification such as: degree certificate, transcript of records, graduation diploma, language or other relevant certificates, student ID, thesis / research work, CV etc, and then click on "CONFIRM".



Finally, when all the necessary documents have been added, please click on "SEND REQUEST".

Your application has now been submitted.

The status of the application can be viewed in the section "MY PROCEDURE" on the home page. You will receive a notification by email when a change is made.
