The official Marathon Village will host an information booth on the activities of the Congress in promoting local democracy.

It will be broadcast live, in a special programme from 10:00 (and will last 3 hours) on all channels of the Vià network and will be streamed on the desktop and mobile websites of the channels concerned. This program will also be broadcast on a giant screen in the village of the Marathon, Place de la République. Retransmission will also be possible and offered to European local channels who request it.

Participants can register for the different races of the marathon on https://www.marathon-metz.fr/inscriptions-en-ligne. The prices of the various races can also be viewed on the web page.

Runners registered at the Marathon, Marathon Relay and 10km Haganis, will be able to download a free application that will allow them to find their locations in real time. It also gives spectators and fans the opportunity to follow their favourite runners as well as receive notifications at key moments of the race.

The Council of Europe is the continent's leading human rights organisation. It comprises 47 member states, 28 of which are members of the European Union. The Congress of Local and Regional Authorities is an institution of the Council of Europe, responsible for strengthening local and regional democracy in its 47 member states. Composed of two chambers – the Chamber of Local Authorities and the Chamber of Regions – and three committees, it brings together 648 elected officials representing more than 150 000 local and regional authorities.
