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2 Intermediate Outcome

Strengthened capacities and skills of authorities, professionals and civil society organisations to design and implement effective responses to child sexual exploitation and sexual abuse measures

2.1 Immediate Outcome

Competent authorities and professionals in contact with children have improved skills and knowledge to respond to cases of child sexual exploitation and abuse

2.1.1 Output

Capacities to provide appropriate protection, assistance and support to child victims by properly trained professionals throughout the investigation and prosecution of child sexual exploitation and sexual abuse offences and related court procedures are assessed and adapted

Activities:

- Mapping of judiciary's capacities with respect to online CSEA1
- Study visit for judicial authorities (Theme: implementation of child-friendly justice principles)

2.1.2 Output

Specialised training courses are developed and piloted for non-legal professionals working for or with children at risk, or children victims of child sexual exploitation and abuse

Activities:

- Assessment of training needs
- Development of specialised training courses
- Piloting training with social workers

2.2 Immediate Outcome

Legal professionals and the judiciary have improved skills and knowledge on implementing child-friendly justice to support children victims of sexual exploitation and sexual abuse

2.2.1 Output

The HELP training course on children's rights and child-friendly justice is implemented in Moldova and a local platform is launched.

2.2.2 Output

An on-line pilot training is implemented with judges, prosecutors and lawyers

Activities:

- Adaptation of the model HELP course into Moldovan legal order,
- Creation and launch of the national online platform
- Online training by national tutors
