






1. Judicial organisation in Malta (2022 data)

According to 2022 data, the first instance courts in Malta include general jurisdiction and specialised courts, tribunals and boards. There are 16 courts in total, of which 4 first instance courts of general jurisdiction and 8 specialised courts (as legal entities).

In Malta, there are only 2 instances of courts. There is no Supreme Court, therefore the Court of Appeal is the second and highest instance court.









Professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants







In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 26, which represents 55,3% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 37 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 24 are female) and 10 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 2 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, the trend in Malta is similar. The number of first instance judges is predominant, while second instance judges are less numerous.

As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that although the total number of female judges represents 64,9% in first instance, the percentage of female judges in the second instance courts is significantly lower, namely 20%. However, these percentages increased from the previous cycle (from 61,5% to 64,9% in first instance and from 12,5% to 20% in second instance).



Some judges in the Maltese judicial system preside over both civil and criminal courts. In this instance, such judges have been distributed evenly between the 2 courts.


Administrative cases at first instance are heard by the Administrative Review Tribunal, presided over by 3 magistrates. If appealed, such cases are heard by the Court of Appeal Inferior Jurisdiction presided over by a judge who hears and decides cases appealed from a number of first instance courts (not only the Administrative Review Tribunal). Given that these cases constitute only a fraction of the caseload of this judge, it would be misleading to indicate him as a 2nd Instance judge over appeals from administrative cases.

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Malta



In 2022, Malta has 464 non-judge staff (of which 261 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 3,3%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 87,0 in 2021 to 89,2 in 2022).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 9,1 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 9,0 in 2022.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- $_{\circ}$ 298 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 206 are Female);
- $_{\circ}$ 50 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 25 are Female);
- 12 technical staff (of which 5 are Female);
- $_{\circ}$ 104 other (of which 25 are Female);

The increase in the number of non-judge staff compared to the previous cycle results from an increase in the staff making up the judicial teams of new judges. In addition, there has also been an increase in the number of technical staff with a new grade entitled 'Other industrial grades' being inserted for the first time in this evaluation.





In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 24, which represents 52,2% of the total number of prosecutors.

All the lawyers working in the Office of the Attorney General prosecute cases in the criminal courts, but it is not possible as yet to distinguish between 1st and 2nd Instance Courts. All full-time lawyers have been included in the above figure except the Attorney General herself.

The increase in the number of prosecutors is the result of a recruitment drive that was carried out in 2022.








In 2022, there are 1 523 lawyers, which is 15,7% more than in 2021.

There are 818 female lawyers which is 54% of the total.

Malta has 292,8 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is significantly above the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Malta is 97 161€, which is significantly above the EU median of 54 224€ (79% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 4,6 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Malta's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -1% below the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Malta of 56 958€ is rather above the EU median of 48 728€ (17% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 2,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€.


The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.



In Malta, the Clearance Rate is below 100% for all categories and instances, indicating a challenge in managing incoming cases, which are on an upward trend. The disposition time exceeds the EU Median for all categories and instances.


Notably, first instance civil and commercial litigious cases are processed most swiftly, while administrative cases tend to have the longest disposition times.

According to the comments provided by Malta, in 2022 there was an overall increase in the caseload of the civil courts when compared to the previous evaluation, primarily because this data reflects the normal caseload following the Covid-19 pandemic. Having said this, during this year there was also one specific first instance court that has registered an exponential increase in the incoming caseload as a result of legislative issues. This increase in the incoming caseload was reflected in a modest increase in the resolved caseload, but had a more pronounced effect on the pending caseload.
















According to the comments provided, since in Malta the vast majority of the cases contemplate the possibility of imprisonment, barring a few contraventions, the cases indicated as misdemeanors/minor offences are those cases which are heard by the Court of Magistrates (excluding those being heard as a Court of Criminal Inquiry) having a maximum punishment of 2 years imprisonment while the cases indicated as 'severe criminal offences' are those having a punishment of over 2 years (Criminal Court & Court of Criminal Inquiry).

In 2022, there are 385 notaries which represents 74,0 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

The Notary is a Public Officer and as such is an emanation of the State. At the same time, he/she is a free professional with his/her own personal office, independent of the State and of the parties. This dual-nature ensures the right balance between the legal-fiscal functions for which the Notary is the ultimate reference point.

Conveyance (property sales, purchase, leasing, etc.), financing collateral (hypothecation of immovable), succession (wills, trusts, etc.) and matters pertaining to civil status (matrimonial regimes, personal separations, etc.) are all within the ambit of the profession and form the portfolio of a notary's day-to-day work. It is only through a notarial act that most transactions related to the above are given legal effect and this adds certainty and improves efficiency. Being a necessary passage at Law, the notarial requirement makes for a very cost-effective way of crystallizing a state of certainty in that notarial tariffs are stipulated by law and the citizen is all the more protected. The notarial intervention is thus imposed by law to safeguard legality and ensuring at all times that the autonomy of the private citizen never goes beyond what is legally and statutorily permitted.
