General rules on early release:	A sentenced person is eligible for early release/parole on good conduct and after having served two-thirds of the sentence.
Scope of application with regard to transfer of mentally disordered persons:	
Scope of application with regard to nationals and/or residents:	Malta applies the provisions of Article 3 of the Convention on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons (CETS 112), which state that the person to be transferred must be a national of the administering state. Malta transfers residents who fulfil the said condition.
Other particularly relevant information (such as practice regarding time limits or revocation of consent):	As per the Convention on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons (ETS 112) or according to the relative bi-lateral Treaties/Agreements.
