Hate Speech is a problem

Members of vulnerable groups:

- lack understanding of their rights
- reluctant to report hate speech and discrimination

Negative trends:

- Hate Speech is increasing
- self-segregation and deepen social divides
 ECRI's annual reports since 2016

Hate Speech intimidates and silences,

- e.g. Journalist & Politicians
- Sexist hate speech undermines the equal and full participation of women and LGBTI persons
- Intersectionality



- Provide a definition of hate speech for the purpose of the recommendation;
- clarify the need to identify and monitor hate speech;
- outline the necessary legal framework covering;
- riminal, civil and administrative law, including in the online environment;
- and propose non-legal measures including through
 - awareness raising,
 - education and victim support,
 - > self regulation,
 - national and international cooperation and
 - coordination between stakeholders.
