### **Network of Contact Parliamentarians for a healthy environment**

Minutes of public hearings Held in İzmir (Türkiye) on 23 September 2022 (Concerns points 4 and 5 of the agenda)

1. Mitigating the climate crisis: municipal action for the sustainability of energy and water supplies

**The President** welcomed the guests, recalling that the city of İzmir was the winner of the Europe Prize 2022 and that a prize-giving ceremony was scheduled for the following day. İzmir was one of the largest cities among the member States of the Council of Europe, with a population as large as that of the Flanders region.

Before giving the floor to Mr Soyer, Mayor of İzmir, he explained that he had had an exchange with Mr Bart Sommers, the current Federal Minister of the Interior of Belgium and former Mayor of Malines/Mechelen, who had been recognised in 2016 as the best mayor in the world by the City Mayors foundation. Mr Sommers was interested in co-operation between the city of İzmir and his municipality of Malines/Mechelen.

Mr Soyer explained that it was a huge honour to welcome the members in İzmir and to have the opportunity to present what had been achieved by his city in the last four years. Each municipality had to prepare a strategic plan aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). His first objective was to create parks accessible by public transport. The total area of green spaces had increased from 16 to 50 ha. The municipal strategy, distributed to members, applied the concepts of "Natural Green" aiming to use native plants and of "Sponge City" to recover and recycle water. 5000 buildings had already been equipped for that. The city had been able to develop public transport with the launch of tramway lines and the optimisation of riverbeds. İzmir was a modern city where neither the poor nor the rich needed cars. Waste was treated as raw materials, which could also help create jobs. The preservation of the environment was a high priority to allow the city to develop in harmony with nature.

**Mr Gümrükçü**, Mayor of Çiğli, was also a member of ICLEI. Çiğli was a green city, crossed by a river where 300 species of wild bird nested, including flamingos. The city had a tram and a sailing boat service for transportation.

**Mr Tugay**, Mayor of Karşıyaka, explained that his city, which worked with six other municipalities, was committed to fighting against the Anthropocene. The city had identified areas to store carbon and created positive energy zones.

**Ms Estrela** thanked the mayors and shared her admiration for the work accomplished within the framework of their mandates. She had been mayor for eight years and knew the difficulties faced by local elected officials. She asked how mayors approached the environmental education.

Mr Grin congratulated the mayors for their accomplishments and asked them about the origin of the municipalities' drinking water.

**Mr Moutquin** also congratulated the mayors for their ambitions in terms of access to green spaces. He asked if, as in Catalonia, they had already considered the creation of refuge areas to escape the strong summer heat and enquired about the state of relations with neighbouring Greek municipalities.

**Ms Arslan** paid tribute to the mayors for the use of police officers near schools. The diversification of their tasks was beneficial to the local community.

**Mr** Özsoy noted that the central government had poor relations with opposition mayors, including in Southeastern Türkiye, but not only there. There were also pressures on municipalities. His question concerned relations with the central administration.

Mr Famellos questioned the mayors on the balance between local economy and ecology.

**Ms Ovchynnykova** asked about the proportion of protected areas in Türkiye, which, in comparison, was only 7% in Ukraine.

Mr Schennach questioned the relationship between tourism and sustainable development.

**The Mayor of İzmir** responded by insisting on the need to protect the land and nature. It was necessary to redefine the rights of nature, to understand them and to respect them. Environmental education must be linked to the definition of democracy. İzmir was part of an alliance of Mediterranean cities. Regarding technical questions, he explained that most of the answers could be found in the strategy "İzmir's nature-based living strategy 2021–2030" which had been distributed to the members.

**The Mayor of Çiğli** explained that the cities of the region had put in place environmental services long time ago. There were some problems with water, especially because of the salinity of the soils. Cities often clashed with national authorities. His municipality, for example, opposed the construction of a bridge imposed by the national authorities; this had been replaced by a ferry service.

**The Mayor of Karşıyaka** called for direct exchanges between opposition cities and Europe. He insisted on the desire to take care of everything and cited the situation of stray dogs (who are identified and tagged).

Finally, **the Mayor of İzmir** explained that three hours would not be enough to describe the relations between the cities in opposition and the central government. He always sought the best solutions for his fellow citizens, above all.

### 2. Public governance of environmental policies: interplay between local authorities and national parliaments

**Mr Bozoğlu**, President of the Environmental Policy and Research Association, Deputy Director General of Ankara Municipality Water Services, was working on the implementation of the Paris Agreement. He had worked in a local community and explained that some laws were not applicable at the local level. Dialogue was needed for the law to be effective. Unfortunately, on waste, water, and energy transition there was no help from central authorities and cities were falling behind in deploying their plans.

**Mr Bas**, thematic spokesperson on environment and climate of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe, underlined that consultation was a central subject in the work of the Congress. Cities were at the heart of the solutions.

**Mr Arikan,** ICLEI Global Advocacy Manager, explained that many taboos had been broken. Cities dealt with a wide spectrum of issues, but environmental challenges were also the responsibility of national authorities.

**Ms Tanguy** returned to the issue of water and spoke about the means to reduce waste.

**Mr Cegonho**, as a former member of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities, spoke in favour of enhanced co-operation between the Assembly and the Congress.
