A provision on 'ecological state' is integrated in the Montenegrin Constitution, following on the 1991 Parliamentary Declaration on the Ecological State of Montenegro.

Pursuant to Article 14 of the Law on Spatial Planning and Construction of Facilities ("Official Gazette of Montenegro", No. 64/17), the Government of Montenegro, at the session held on March 22, 2018, adopted REPORT ABOUT THE STATE OF SPACE DEVELOPMENT IN 2017 which gives an overview of the activities of the spatial arrangement and the treatment of landscapes in Montenegro.

"The content and goals of the spatial planning policy

The space is the basis for the development of the state, the strengthening of the fundamentally designed use of spatial potentials, as well as the preservation of the diversity of landscapes and biodiversity. Regional specificities are the basis for achieving local, regional and international identity of Montenegro. The way of using Montenegro's space is an important element in determining national culture.

Montenegro's strategic commitment to rationally and sustainably use its natural and created resources and to develop as an ecological state, in accordance with the constitutional definition is:

Implementation of sustainable development principles;

Continuation of the transition reforms;

Integration of Montenegro into European integration flows and the European Union and more fully use of various forms of domestic and foreign institutional and expert assistance and tips;

Expansion of international economic and other exchanges;

Faster and sustainable growth of the economy;
Achieving social development and social cohesion;
Developing forms of social communication and interaction;
Preservation and development of landscape identity and diversity;
Timely preparation of missing strategic documents.

The aim is to preserve the identity of the Montenegrin space by planning protection of the entire territory and incorporating the cultural and natural landscape into the system of spatial planning. In this way, the affirmation of the characteristics and values of the Montenegrin landscape will be management, preserved and sustainable development of cultural heritage and protected areas, as well as improvement of the design quality in the area."

Projects included three phases: Workshop, Publications and Exhibition. Students stay at the site for a period of 5 days and after the workshop work on selected topics during the semester in the course of landscape architecture. The result of the workshop is the presentation of the publication and exhibition at the location where the workshop was held. The most significant result and significant experience after continuity in the organization from 2006 to 2016 is that the students in the field of encountering real problems and challenges and provide their suggestions, new ideas and solutions and local communities used these ideas in terms of reduced professional capacity in municipalities especially in the north Montenegro this mode showed multiple values for both the student and the local government. Also, the cooperation of Montenegrins students with other students of the Universities from the Region, NGO, Local citizens, exchange of experience, has made a new quality solutions that are presented as a result of the

workshop.
