Set up by the Committee of Ministers under Article 17 of the Statute of the Council of Europe and in accordance with <u>Resolution CM/Res(2021)3</u> on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods.

Composition

Members

The Committee shall be composed of 13 members, comprising 7 member States' representatives, designated by the

CDMSI, and 6 independent experts, appointed by the Secretary General with recognised expertise in the fields of freedom of expression and information and digital technologies, with a special focus on artificial intelligence, media and democracy.

The Committee shall be composed in accordance with Article 6 of Resolution CM/Res(2021)3 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods.

The Council of Europe will bear the travel and subsistence expenses of these 13 members. Other member States may designate representatives without defrayal of expenses.

Each member of the Committee of Experts shall have one vote. Where a government designates more than one member, only one of them is entitled to take part in the voting.

Participants

The following may send representatives, without the right to vote and at the charge of their corresponding administrative budgets:

- Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe;
- Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe;
- European Court of Human Rights;
- Commissioner for Human Rights of the Council of Europe;
- Conference of INGOs of the Council of Europe;
- European Audiovisual Observatory;
- Committee on Artificial Intelligence (CAI);
- Committees or other bodies of the Council of Europe engaged in related work, as appropriate.

The following may send representatives, without the right to vote and without defrayal of expenses:

- European Union (one or more representatives, including, as appropriate, the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA));
- Observer States to the Council of Europe: Canada, Holy See, Japan, Mexico, United States of America;
- Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE);
- Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD);
- UN agencies (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO)).

Observers

The following may send representatives, without the right to vote and without defrayal of expenses:

- non-member States with which the Council of Europe has a Neighbourhood Partnership including relevant cooperation activities;

Observer status may be requested in accordance with Article 8 of Resolution CM/Res(2021)3 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods.
