Committee of Experts on Media Regulators in a Platform-Based Environment (MSI-eREG)

1st meeting, 26-27 March 2026, Strasbourg (hybrid)

MEETING REPORT

Opening and agenda

1. Artemiza Chisca, Head of the Freedom of Expression and [CDMSI](#) Division and Secretary to the CDMSI, opened the meeting and welcomed members and participants. She recalled that the [MSI-eREG](#) operates under the authority of the CDMSI, the Council of Europe's main intergovernmental body responsible for media and information society issues, which brings together representatives of all 46 member States and guides the development of standards and policy responses in this field. In this context, she underlined that expert committees such as the MSI-eREG provide technical expertise and support the CDMSI in the preparation of deliverables, including guidance notes, through an inclusive and multi-stakeholder process. She further stressed the importance of the Committee's work in addressing the evolving role of media regulators in a platform-based environment, noting that the transformation of the media ecosystem driven by platforms, algorithmic systems and cross-border information flows requires regulatory frameworks to adapt, while ensuring the continued protection of freedom of expression and media pluralism.
2. Elena Brodeala, Secretary to the MSI-eREG, informed participants of the practical arrangements of the meeting, including recording for internal purposes and interpretation. She also presented the agenda.
3. The MSI-eREG adopted the agenda (Appendix 1) without amendments.
4. The members and participants to the meeting held a tour de table, introducing themselves and outlining their expertise and their motivation to contribute to the work of the Committee. The list of participants to the meeting appears in Appendix 2.
5. The Secretariat further presented the [mandate](#), working methods and procedures of Council of Europe expert committees, in accordance with *Resolution [CM/Res\(2021\)3-consolidated](#) on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods*.

Discussion of the timeline for the MSI-eREG (2026-2027) and elections

6. The Secretariat introduced the proposed timeline and working plan for the Committee (Appendix 3), outlining the different stages of the drafting process and the expected interaction with the CDMSI.
7. The Committee agreed on the overall roadmap and, in principle, on the following in person meeting dates: **14-15 September 2026**, **11-12 February 2027**, and **9-10 September 2027**, with the understanding that these could be reconfirmed if necessary.
8. The Committee proceeded to elections. With one candidate proposed for each function, the MSI-eREG elected:
 - Stephanie COMEY (Ireland) as Chair, with a mandate of one year;
 - Rowena BURKE (United Kingdom) as Vice-Chair, with a mandate of one year;
 - Maida ČULAHVIĆ (Bosnia and Herzegovina) and Tanja KERŠEVAN (Slovenia) as Co-drafting Rapporteurs;
 - Michèle LEDGER (Belgium) as Children and Youth Rapporteur;
 - Krisztina ROZGONYI (Austria) as Gender Equality Rapporteur.

Background study and external presentations

9. A number of presentations followed, providing an overview of relevant international and regional work, including within the Council of Europe, and highlighting initiatives relevant to the work of the MSI-eREG.
10. First, the Committee heard a presentation by Kristina Irion and Ronan Fahy (Institute for Information Law (IViR), University of Amsterdam) of the [background study](#) prepared to inform the development of the Guidance Note. The study examines the role and independence of media regulators in a platform-based environment, identifies key challenges such as cross-border issues and the impact of platforms, and outlines possible approaches to support the Committee's work.
11. The Committee welcomed the study as a comprehensive analytical basis for its work and underlined the importance of building on existing Council of Europe standards.
12. The Committee then heard a series of presentations on relevant instruments and activities of the OSCE, the European Union and UNESCO, which are of direct relevance to its work.
13. Julia Haas, Adviser to the OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media, presented the [OSCE Policy Manual on Safeguarding Media Freedom in the Age of Big Tech Platforms and Artificial Intelligence](#), highlighting the impact of the growing influence of platforms and AI systems on journalism, media sustainability and the broader information ecosystem, and outlining related policy recommendations and ongoing work to support their implementation.
14. Mathilde Desanges, Policy Officer at the Secretariat of the [European Board for Media Services](#), presented the Board's work programme for 2026, which focuses on strengthening cooperation among national regulators, supporting the implementation of the European Media Freedom Act, and enhancing coordination in relation to platform regulation and cross-border issues.

15. Ana Cristina Ruelas, Senior Programme Specialist at UNESCO, presented [UNESCO's Guidelines for the Governance of Digital Platforms](#), as well as updates on the [International Conference on Digital Platform Governance 2026](#) and its call for action. The presentation emphasised the need for a human rights-based approach to platform governance and highlighted ongoing efforts to promote global cooperation among regulators.
16. Finally, Ethan Shattock of Queen's University Belfast, co-author of UNESCO's report on [Good Practices in Digital Platform Governance by European Media Regulators](#), presented the report, providing practical insights for the Committee's discussions on how regulators can address platform-related challenges and strengthen cooperation.
17. The Committee underlined the importance of ensuring coherence and complementarity between the future Guidance Note and these initiatives, with a view to promoting consistent approaches to media regulation and platform governance, and avoiding fragmentation in international standards.

Discussion on the New Democratic Pact for Europe

18. The Committee heard a presentation by Roberto Olla, Head of the Democratic Institutions and Freedoms Department, who introduced the Council of Europe's [New Democratic Pact for Europe](#). The Pact aims, among others, to strengthen democratic security by enhancing the resilience of democratic institutions and processes in the face of challenges such as disinformation, the concentration of influence over online information and the impact of digital technologies on public debate.
19. It was underlined that the work of the Committee on the role of media regulators in a platform-based environment is directly relevant to the objectives of the New Democratic Pact for Europe, in particular by supporting the development of a trustworthy and pluralistic information ecosystem and addressing the impact of platforms and algorithmic systems on public discourse. The Committee took note of the relevance of this framework for its work.

Discussion on the future Guidance Note on media regulators in a platform-based environment

20. The Committee held an in-depth discussion on the scope, aim and structure of the future Guidance Note.
21. Members agreed that the Guidance Note should be grounded in existing Council of Europe standards and reflect the structural changes brought about by platformisation, including the increasing convergence between traditional media and online platforms.
22. The Committee underlined the need to clearly identify the target audience of the Guidance Note, primarily member States and relevant regulatory authorities, while also addressing other relevant stakeholders, including platforms, civil society and research institutions.
23. Members discussed key regulatory challenges arising in a platform-based environment, including jurisdiction and cross-border issues, the application of country-

of-origin and country-of-destination principles, and the implications of platform governance and algorithmic curation for media pluralism and democratic discourse.

24. The Committee agreed on the main elements to guide the drafting of the Guidance Note. It was agreed that the text should begin with a preamble setting out the context and rationale of the instrument, including a reference to the New Democratic Pact for Europe, a clear problem statement and a reflection on the evolving notion of media regulation and media regulators. The preamble - or an introduction - could also identify key actors and gatekeepers in the information ecosystem and set out the overarching principles and objectives guiding the role and functioning of media regulators in a platform-based environment, including considerations related to cross-border cooperation.
25. It was agreed that the operative part should contain concrete and actionable recommendations addressed to member States, relevant regulatory authorities and other actors, including regulated entities, platforms, civil society, and research institutions.
26. The Committee also agreed that the Guidance Note should clarify key concepts, including through the definition of new notions where appropriate.
27. In drafting the text, the Committee stressed the importance of taking into account the diversity of regulatory models, focusing on issues directly arising from the platform-based environment, and remaining within the scope of the Committee's mandate. It also emphasised the need to mainstream children's rights, gender equality and the rights of persons in vulnerable situations.

Discussion on stakeholder consultation

28. The Committee took note of CDMSI's recent decision to organise public consultations in the drafting process of guidance notes.
29. Members also agreed on the importance of conducting hearings with relevant stakeholders, such as platforms, regulators, international organisations, civil society, journalists' organisations, academia, as well as competition and data protection authorities.

Conclusions and next steps

36. The Committee agreed on the overall approach to the development of the Guidance Note and on its preliminary structure.
37. The co-drafting rapporteurs were tasked with preparing an extended outline of the Guidance Note, taking into account the discussions held during the meeting.
38. The Committee agreed to continue its work in line with the agreed roadmap (Appendix 3), in particular through written consultations on the draft outline and an intermediate online meeting to review and address comments prior to its submission to the CDMSI.
39. The outline will be submitted to the CDMSI Plenary Meeting of 17-19 June 2026 for discussion and initial endorsement.

Date and place of next meeting

40. The Committee agreed, in principle, to hold its next meeting on **14-15 September 2026**.

Any other business

41. No other business was raised.
