MEETING REPORT

Opening, agenda, elections

- 1. Ms Artemiza-Tatiana Chisca, Head of the Media and Internet Division, Council of Europe, welcomed members and participants. She remarked the importance of the work of the Committee of Experts, stressing that strategic lawsuits against public participation (SLAPPs) continue to be a pressing concern, and noted with appreciation the large participation to the meeting, held in full-presential mode. She encouraged taking a pragmatic approach in drafting the measures to provide guidance to the 46 member states of the Council of Europe, with a view to effectively addressing SLAPPs' adverse impact on public debate. She further invited the MSI-SLP to consider carefully what other organisations, national initiatives and experts in the field have proposed to address the SLAPPs practice, while remaining conscious of the peculiar Council of Europe's mandate, values and guiding principles, and its human-rights centric approach.
- 2. Ms Chisca also provided information on: the Organisation's fourth Summit (16-17 May, Reykjavik, Iceland); the Council of Europe <u>Campaign for the Safety of Journalists</u>, to be launched on 5 October in Riga, at the opening of the Conference on Freedom of Expression and the Safety of Journalists, jointly organised by the Council of Europe and Latvia, under Latvia's Presidency of the Council of Europe Committee of Ministers; and, the advancement of the work of the <u>MSI-INF</u> (Committee of Experts on the Integrity of Online Information) and the <u>MSI-RES</u> (Committee of Experts on Increasing Resilience of Media).

- 3. Mr Taavo Lumiste, Chair of the Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI), in his opening remarks, further stressed the importance of the topic noting that SLAPPs are prominent amongst the current and future challenges to be addressed by the Organisation. He complemented the information regarding the upcoming Council of Europe Summit and provided clarification regarding the modus of preparing the next cycle of programme and budget for the years 2024-2027. He also reminded that the next CDMSI Plenary meeting will take place on 14-16 June and invited the Chair and/or drafting rapporteurs to participate and provide updates on the work developments of the Committee.
- 4. The MSI-SLP members adopted the meeting agenda (Appendix 1) without amendments. The list of participants to the meeting appears in Appendix 2.
- 5. Ms Giulia Lucchese, Secretary to the MSI-SLP, presented the progress of the committee's work since the second meeting in October 2022. In particular, she informed that the MSI-SLP appointed Ms Beatriz Brown (United Kingdom) and Mr Željko Martyn Sampor (Slovak Republic) as drafting rapporteurs of the Explanatory Memorandum accompanying the draft Recommendation. The members of the MSI-SLP and participants to the meeting were invited to update the Committee of Experts on key developments that have bearings on the terms of reference of the Expert Committee.
- 6. Mindful of the working methods and procedures of expert committees, and in line with Resolution CM/Res(2021)3 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods, the MSI-SLP proceeded to elections for the committee's leadership. With only one candidate proposed for each of the functions, the MSI-SLP unanimously re-elected by show of hands Ms Karmen Turk (Estonia), as its Chair, and Mr Željko Martyn Sampor (Slovak Republic), as its Vice-Chair.

Discussion on the revised draft Recommendation on strategic lawsuits against public participation (SLAPPs)

- 7. The MSI-SLP subsequently examined the revised draft Recommendation. Before opening the floor for discussion, the drafting rapporteurs, Ms Flutura Kusari and Mr Tarlach McGonagle, presented an overview of their work progresses, main challenges and outstanding issues. They informed on the methodology applied to integrate relevant comments and expressed gratitude for the feedbacks received.
- 8. As general remarks, participants praised the work of the rapporteurs and noted that the draft recommendation covers all relevant elements to address SLAPPs by means of a

- Council of Europe recommendation. The experts then discussed the draft recommendation section by section, focusing on the elements necessitating further analysis and elaboration.
- 9. Regarding the preamble, the experts agreed to broaden the ratione personae, taking into due account the peculiar position of journalists and other media actors while also expressly acknowledging the broad range of public watchdogs targeted by SLAPPs. It was decided to ensure that all three legislative areas in which SLAPPs appear civil, criminal and administrative are sufficiently addressed and reflected in the preamble. The MSI-SLP agreed to add a reference to member states' negative obligations, in addition to their positive obligations, in accordance with the case-law of the European Court of Human Rights. Finally, they agreed to shorten the preamble and substantiate specific passages, operative part and appendix of the draft Recommendation, in its accompanying Explanatory Memorandum.
- 10. Regarding the operative part, the experts agreed that member states should be recommended to extend the promotion of the goals of the recommendation both at the European and at the international levels. They also discussed the benefit of illustrating in this section the different areas on which member States should adopt measures to address SLAPPs, while keeping into due consideration the overall length and structure of the text and committing to keeping the document accessible and enhancing readability.
- 11. Regarding the appendix, the MSI-SLP expressed common agreement on the need to ensure consistency in terminology throughout the text. On the structure, it was accepted to give more emphasis to the central aim of the recommendation. On substance, the MSI-SLP confirmed its agreement to provide comprehensive and inclusive definitions of the key terms, "public participation" and "public interest", and to strive for clarity in presenting the specific features of the SLAPPs indicators. Discussing the different forms of SLAPPs, the experts concurred that the section should address specific safeguards.
- 12. Members agreed to streamline and shorten the section on structural safeguards, with parts to be moved to the Explanatory Memorandum, and to add a structural safeguard in the form of obligation to publish decisions made by Independent judicial and regulatory bodies. They also decided to introduce a new paragraph at the opening of the part on procedural safeguards, to empower judicial authorities to manage actively the proceedings from a very early stage. The MSI-SLP also agreed that all proposed mechanisms should take into due consideration the national specific settings and procedures. The experts stressed the importance of collecting data and agreed that the Explanatory Memorandum should

- provide examples of what information should be collected and elaborate on the analysis of such data.
- 13. Members agreed that measures proposed to support targets and victims of SLAPPs should be as pragmatic as possible. The MSI-SLP concurred on the importance to stress the principles as well as to take a concrete approach, aimed at identifying measures whose implementation is feasible. Therefore, they agreed to make the narrative more strategic, including by looking closely at relevant instruments and experiences available.
- 14. Further proposals to sharpen the text were made in the chapters concerning "education, training and awareness raising" and "national coordination and international cooperation".
 On the latter, the MSI-SLP agreed on the importance to recommend the setting up and implementation of national action plans embedding specific actions to prevent and contrast SLAPPs.

Roadmap and date of the next meeting

- 15. The Committee of Experts discussed its roadmap for 2023 (Appendix 3). The MSI-SLP took note that the developments on the draft Recommendation are regularly presented to the CDMSI and that, following the Expert Group's meeting, the revised draft will be sent to the Steering Committee with a view to enabling its discussion during their next Plenary meeting on 14-16 June 2023. On this same occasion, the CDMSI will be invited to consider whether the draft was sufficiently advanced for public consultations.
- 16. The MSI-SLP agreed to hold its fourth meeting on 17-18 October 2023, in the premises of the Council of Europe, in Strasbourg.

Any other business

17. In line with the established practice, the Secretariat was instructed to send the draft meeting report to the Chair and Vice-Chair for consideration. Thereafter, the draft report will be sent to the MSI-SLP, allowing for comments within five full working days. In the absence of comments, the report will be deemed finalised and will be transmitted to the CDMSI for information and uploaded on the website of MSI-SLP.
