Geographical location

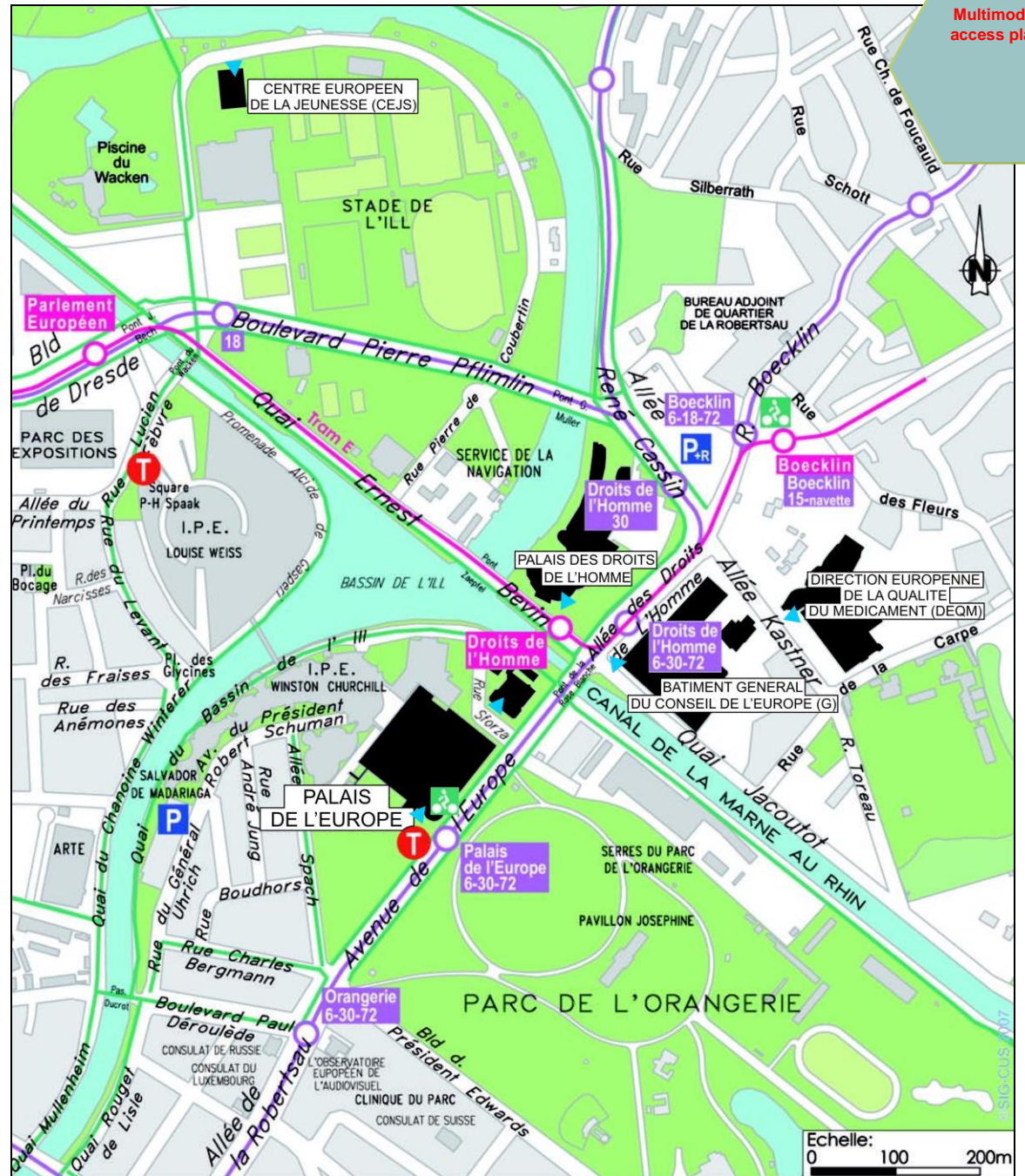

BY TRAM

BY TAXI

There is a **taxi rank** by the main entrance to the Palais de l'Europe.

BY BUS

BY BICYCLE

The Strasbourg municipal **cycle lane** network provides access to the Council of Europe buildings. There are bicycle racks by the main entrance to the Palais de l'Europe.

ON FOOT

Walking is undoubtedly the healthiest and least polluting means of getting about. The Council of Europe buildings are in a setting that lends itself to walking.

BY CAR

From the A35 **motorway**, take the "Wacken" exit, then follow the signposts marked "Institutions Européennes". Go along Avenue Herrenschmidt, through Place de Bordeaux, along Boulevard Ohmacht and Boulevard Jacques Preiss and up Allée de la Robertsau.
